## Editor's Comment

A MEETING is planned, as this edition of Culcheth Life goes to press, between local councillors and Cheshire Police and Crime Commissioner John Dwyer, to discuss the controversial' operating model for policing in the

county.
Cllrs Chris Vobe (Culcheth), Russ
Bowden (Birchwood) and Mary
Greenslade (Rixton) will no doubt tell Mr Dwyer of the disquiet the

tell Mr Dwyer of the disquiet the new system is causing in the local area and they will have a petition signed by more than 1,000 people to back them up.

The issue that is causing most concern is the fact police officers and PCSOs in outlying areas like Culcheth, Croft, Glazebury, etc. now have to start and finish their shifts by travelling back their shifts by travelling back and to between their "beat" and Warrington town centre to be "briefed."

As we pointed out in this column last month, the changes effect the whole county, not just the Culcheth area, with some officers having to travel longer distances than our local team. Some areas are more affected than others – and some communities are more concerned than others. Some see no problems at all.

We have heard the police

We have heard the police argument for making the changes from various senior officers, including admissions that they are not just for operational reasons but also to save money. Worryingly, we have been told the police had to either bring in the changes or make people redundant.

Assurances have been given that local police stations will not be closed – but some communities have since discovered that while their police stations are technically still "open" they are unmanned most of the time and rely on the use

of a video link.
So there will be plenty for our local councillors to talk about when they meet the Commissioner – enough for there to be no need for time-wasting party political point scoring. We all know the police, like most other public services, are required to make savings they would probably prefer not to have to make, so there is no need to spend time on that.



make their journeys unnecessary. If they cannot provide such an explanation satisfactorily then they should be reminded of their pledge that the new system is flexible enough to be changed if it falls short of expectations.





## Care home residents adopt a donkey

WHEN residents from Holcroft Grange, t in Culcheth, visited a donkey sanctuary, it quickly became clear that it was not a one-time trip.

After much deliberating, the residents decided that Cocoa the donkey was in need of some extra help, and so they asked whether the home could adopt her. Cocoa now receives regular support, and visits, from residents at Holcroft Grange, who are delighted with their new friend!

Two carers from Holcroft Grange took nine residents to the sanctuary in Manchester, where ill, neglected, and homeless donkeys are taken in, nursed back to health, and cared for. Residents and staff alike were moved to tears by the stories of how some of the donkeys came to be at the sanctuary.

However, the day was by no means a sad occasion. The visit ended with a lovely picnic in the blistering summer sunshine, and the residents were given the chance to get up close and personal with several of the more sociable animals, including Cocoal One resident, 95-year old Edna Daintith (pictured), seemed to make very good friends with Cocoa during her time at the sanctuary.

Nicola Newens, Activity Co-Ordinator at Holcroft Grange, commented on the visit: "The trip to the donkey sanctuary brought a tear to my eye. The residents fell completely in love with the donkeys, and they made them all so happy – seeing them all bonding over these brave rescued animals was too much for me!"

Shirley Paton, Home Manager of Holcroft Grange, also commented: "Animal interaction is incredibly beneficial for older people, particularly those who are struggling with mobility, or have become more withdrawn in later life. I am thrilled that the residents took so much joy from visiting the donkeys. Having adopted Cocoa, we can now go and visit her on a regular basis, which will be great for keeping the residents active and engaged."

Studies have repeatedly shown that regular animal interaction has a positive impact on mental health in older people. This effect is particularly pronounced in people already living with conditions such as dementia and Alzheimer's.


Members were told about the autumn meeting of the Mosslands Group on October 28.

## Anger over

ANGRY residents who fought and won a battle over public rights of way across farm land at Culcheth claim they are now the victims of vindictive retaliatory action.



Hedges have been "massacred", a dangerous barbed wire fence erected and rubbish has been left piled at the side of paths.

Now the residents, who have sought advice from the Ramblers' Association, are calling on Warrington Borough Council to take action over what they see as breaches of footpath regulations.

It was only in May that residents were celebrating after a planning inspector ruled that footpaths which had been used for more than 20 years were in fact public rights of

years were, in fact, public rights of

way.

The paths ran across farm land owned by Peel Estates between Culcheth Hall Drive and Withington Avenue but were ploughed over by a tenant farmer.

Residents complained – and the borough council decided they had been used for more than 20 years and, as such, were public rights of

and, as such, were public rights of way.

Peel Estates appealed against the decision but after a public inquiry, an inspector ruled in the council's favour and ordered that the footpaths be reinstated.

Residents were delighted and said an attractive walk through a succeed area and along a stranger.

wooded area and along a stream had been preserved as a valuable amenity for Culcheth.

"Huge tree branches, easily 10 inches in diameter, have been ripped off and the tree limbs left in a ditch. Shrubs have been hacked back, uprooted and left lying there.

I had to move some to get passed.

## Northwest Home Owners Set for Moderate House Price Growth

Victoria Barlow, Head of Courtyard

Predictions for house prices are often vague and based on the unknown, however recent research conducted by several bodies including surveyors, estate agents, lenders and the treasury predict a steady but slow growth over the next 5 years.

The treasury forecasts now expect prices will rise by 7.4% in 2015, 5.9% in 2016, 5.8% 2017, 5.1% in 2018 and 3.8% in 2019. In total, house prices are anticipated to increase by 31.4% by the first quarter of 2020.

Prestigious estate agent, Savills, said that after a period of strong house price growth, affordability constraints and new mortgage regulators have begun to slow the rate of growth, which combined with interest rate rises, will cap the potential for future growth.

London, which had experienced the strongest price growth in 2014, will be most affected and it is predicted that it will flat line this year with 0% price growth and the lowest expected five year price growth totalling 10.4%.
