

Editor's Comment

THE big talking point in Warrington over recent weeks has been travellers and "secret" plans for a transit camp.

Following claim and counter claim between Cllr Kev Bennett and his former colleagues in the Labour group no one is entirely sure whether a permanent transit site has been earmarked for land off Birchwood Way near Padgate

or birchwood vay hear radgate
or not.
We are told a special task group
set up to find a suitable location had
voted on Padgate last December.
But the controlling Labour group on
the council are adamant no site has been selected and that the land at Padgate will not be considered.

Considering the number of issues being caused in the town by travellers setting up illegal camps the need for a permanent site requires addressing urgently – but if a task group was discussing it last December and we are now heading into September, with no clear option or a site – just how long is it going to take? Hardly a week passes without reports of travellers setting up camp

So come on Warrington Borough Council let us all have an open and honest debate on where to site such a facility – sooner rather than later - and not behind closed doors.

It is likely to be a sensitive issue wherever such a site is located so transparency is the best policy so everyone can have their say before

any decision is made.

Priorities

Life moves on, sometimes at a steady pace, and at other times it seems to speed up or slow down. It is important to make the most of each day and the time that we have, however, busy lives, commitments and routines often take over. "There are no plans or decisions on any specific site and this includes the site referred to in the media (land near Bennett Recreation Ground) as this site is unacceptable due to its proximity to residential properties.

"Any future decision regarding a transit site will be conducted on an open and transparent basis."

The statement was issued as rebel councillor Kevin Bennett – the former Labour councillor who now represents TUSC (The Trade Unionist and Socialist Coalition) revealed further information which he claimed was evidence of a "war" between back bench Labour councillors and the council's executive board.

Cllr Bennett revealed the content of emails sent by Cllr Colin Froggatt which criticised executive board members Cllr Hitesh Patel and Cllr Maureen McLaughlin for poor communication

communication.

He said: "The secret plan to put a gypsy traveller 'transit site' in Padgate has re-ignited the 'infighting' in the Jabour Group.

in the Labour Group.

"Cllr Colin Froggatt has revealed that he and Cllr Maureen Creaghan have been kept 'in the dark' over these plans.

"There is obviously a growing culture in the Labour Group where the executive board operates like a 'secret society' and keeps information from their own Members."

No slowdown for Warrington's regeneration

THE summer months are arguably some of the quietest in terms of work, with people going off to enjoy well-earned breaks, and sometimes, as a

earned breaks, and sometimes, as a result things tend to slow down.

However, I think that it is fair to say that despite it being summer time the evidence is to the contrary as far as Warrington's regeneration is concerned, with a number of the town's development schemes moving significantly forward.

Business incubator

At the Stadium Quarter, work has started on site to construct the £10 million state-of-the-art University Technical College (UTC) Warrington which will open its doors for business in September next year. Next door, the new business incubator is nearing completion, on time and on schedule. Fit out is underway, local management company Langtree Property Partners have been appointed and it will be open in October.

Anyone who has been into Warrington Town Centre recently

cannot miss the remarkable headway that has already been made on the Bridge Street Quarter project with the former Time Square area now demolished.

Shortly we will announce the appointment of the construction of the temporary market building, that when completed in early 2017 will become the markets' home until the fantastic new market building opens in 2019. Throughout all of this the market will not cease to trade and will remain open to customers as usual. usua

usual.

It is also our intention to provide a temporary surface level car park onto the former Time Square site that will be open in plenty of time for Christmas this year.

Over at Omega the 250,000 sqft manufacturing unit being built for Plastic Omnium who manufacture automotive parts will be finished any day and they will then fit out the building and work is on schedule for completion of the huge 685,000 sqft unit for The Hut Group in November. The extension of Skyline Drive which

will connect Junction 8 of the M62 across to Omega Boulevard by the Royal Mail building is also very

nearly complete.

These are exciting times indeed for the regeneration of Warrington.

Green light for £16m community hub at Great Sankey

PLANS to build a £16m state-of-the-art community hub to provide leisure, health and cultural services

leisure, health and cultural services in Great Sankey, Warrington have been approved by planning chiefs. LiveWire's proposal to transform the existing Great Sankey Leisure Centre into a neighbourhood hub was given the go-ahead at Warrington Borough Council's planning committee meeting. planning committee meeting. Councillors voted unanimously in favour of the plans.

The dementia friendly facility will The dementia triendly facility will include a fitness suite, swimming pools, sports hall, tennis courts, 3G pitch, GP surgeries, library, cafe and health and wellbeing facilities including a spa. Construction on the first stage of the development will start later this year with phase 1 of the project set to open in Autumn 2016.

The £16 million project will revamp the existing centre to

revamp the existing centre to provide residents with a one-stopshop for all their leisure, health and wellbeing and cultural needs.



Services will be delivered by LiveWire, Warrington Borough Council, the NHS, Culture Warrington, Warrington Clinical Commissioning Group and Health

More than 700 local residents took part in consultation exercises and in excess of 60 of their suggestions have been incorporated into the design of the hub. The building designs have been made dementia friendly to took support local need.



Former MP publishes untold story of World War One

FORMER Warrington MP Mike Hall has published an untold story of World War One which story of World War One which has been 14 years in the making and inspired by his "war hero" grandfather who miraculously survived the hostilities, including two postings at the Somme.

The former Warrington South MP, who went on to represent periphonuring Weaver Vale started

neighbouring Weaver Vale, started researching the book, which comes in two volumes due to its sheer size, after being "sacked" by former Prime Minister Tony Blair as a junior whip in 2001.

Mike, who still lives in Warrington of Whittle Hall had always been

at Whittle Hall, had always been



intrigued how his Manchester born grandfather of Irish descent, who received the Military medal for bravery, had ended up doing active service with the "die hards" of the 18th Battalion Middlesex Regiment (1st Public Works) Pioneers of the 33rd Division.

33rd Division.

Spending many long hours researching the national war archives Mike has now put together a detailed war diary of the day to day life of the battalion - a story which has not previously been told - and coincides with the 100th anniversary of his grandfather Thomas McBride, who died aged 52 in 1939, before Mike was born, aging to war.

born, going to war.

"My research soon told me that
my grandfather, who had been
working as a miner, enlisted with one of the special regiments which consisted mainly of miners and other tradesmen," said Mike, who thanks the former Prime Minister in his book for helping him find the

time to carry out the research.
The 18th Battalion Middlesex Regiment were not infantry men whose primary job was to go 'over the top' at the start or during battle. They had a different job - to build the infrastructure necessary to

prosecute the war.

These 'miners pals' played a vital role in the war. They dug and drained trenches, wired No

Man's Land, mined under enemy lines, made and repaired roads, filled in craters, constructed dugouts, stock piled ammunition, built and improved billets, fetched and carried, kept open communications with the front, made and repaired railways, built and demolished bridges, gased the enemy, picquetted roads and held the front line

line.

If a job needed doing, they did it - no matter where, when or how

dangerous.

At times they fought back the Germans with only their picks and shovels, and in High Wood, at the height of the Battle of the Somme, they were deployed to fight the enémy at bayonet point.

By this, amongst other events, the 18th Battalion earned the right to use the Middlesex Regiment nickname 'die-hards'.



Mike's grandfather received the military medal for bravery after



going into no man's land under fire with his commanding officer to

bring back the fallen.

During the war he also survived being gassed and even returned to the front after being sent home inj<u>u</u>red.

The book is a goldmine of information, laden with incidents from the war and facts that have been cross-checked and verified.

Mike admits the book became an "obsession" and has been proof read by his wife Lesley nine times!!!

The book is officially launched at Waterstones in Warrington on Thursday September 10th at 7pm.




do a once-in-a-lifetime challenge that would stretch me and put me outside my comfort zone. This is definitely that challenge!

New childcare support system

The government were originally planning to bring in a new on-line system of childcare support from this Autumn. However, some childcare voucher providers raised a legal objection, but the Supreme Court has now ruled in the governments

The new scheme is now expected to start in 2017 and will provide up to 1.8m families across the UK with up to £2,000 of childcare support per year,

per child, via a new online system. The existing childcare voucher scheme will remain available to both existing and new claimants until the new scheme starts. After the new scheme starts, the current scheme will not be available to new entrants, but those already in a scheme will have a choice of remaining within that scheme, provided that it continues to be offered by their employer, or moving to the new one. The key points of the new scheme are as follows:

• The scheme will cover all children up to the age of 12, and up to the age of 17 if the child has disabilities

In order to qualify for the tax-free childcare, the parents will have

to be in work, with average earnings of between about £50 and £2,885 per week, or £2,600 and £150,000 per year. The tax-free childcare will be available to all employees and, unlike the current voucher system, will not be dependent on the employer making the scheme available.

The scheme will also be available to self-employed parents. There will be special rules for people starting up in business and there will be an initial period during which there will be no minimum income level requirement

 The scheme will be available to parents on paid sick leave and paid and unpaid statutory maternity, paternity and adoption leave

and unpaid statutory maternity, paternity and adoption leave
Anyone wishing to use the scheme will need to open an online
account via the government website and make transfers to cover the
cost of registered childcare. The government will then top these up with
20% of childcare costs up to £2,000 per child, or £4,000 if disabled,
up to a maximum of £10,000 per year.

Where circumstances change, and the parent no longer wishes to
pay into the account, it will be possible to simply withdraw any funds
that have built up. However, where applicable, the government will
also withdraw its corresponding contribution.

The scheme is designed to be as flexible as possible in respect of the
timing and amount contributed. Therefore parents will be able to build
up a balance in their account for when they need more childcare than

up a balance in their account for when they need more childcare than usual, for example, over the summer holidays.

Wolves' guard of honour for lifelong fan Jock Maguire


