The Savings Gap

I noticed in the financial press in the last few weeks that the country's largest building society the Nationwide is offering 95% mortgages again. Then I saw NatWest were offering interest only mortgages. All this makes you think "have we not been here before?" And what is really worrying is that yet again all the financial emphasis appears to be on borrowing money, and not saving it.

In a recent survey conducted by True Potential research showed that Britons are putting aside an average of £1.72 per day into their

pension pot – less than the cost of a high street coffee. The survey asked over 12,000 people, as part of ongoing campaign and found that, overall, people are spending more on impulse buys like coffee and snacks in a month than they are investing in a comfortable retirement.

Britons are investing £51 per month on average into their retirement funds. However, they are spending £56 per month on impulse purchases and getting into increasing amounts of debt. This rises again in 18-34 year olds, who confessed to spending £75.90 per month on impulse buys – that's £2.53 per day.

The research concluded that Britons took on an average of £1,272 worth of debt in the last three months, with a majority believing it is easier now to get into debt than it was 10 years ago.

The pension freedoms introduced earlier this year have given savers more control than ever over their retirement funds. The earlier people start saving and the more they are prepared to put into their funds, the more options they will have when the time comes to access their pension.

We live in an impulse debt culture but we need to impulse save instead. The fact that many people choose to spend money on small items like coffee and snacks than their retirement funds points to a culture of complacency and a lack of awareness.

Editor's comment

THERE has been considerable disquiet south of the Manchester Ship Canal over the Boundary Commission's draft proposals for ward boundaries — and this is hardly surprising.

It seems to make little sense to move the historic Appleton Thorn village out of Appleton and insert it into Grappenhall, nor to move Thelwall into Lymm.

And moving Hatton, Stretton and Walton into Appleton, while it might make some kind of mathematical sense, would totally ignore existing communities, history and traditions.

Why do the Boundary Commission want to make these changes – and what qualifies them to do so?

Well, it's all to do with how many constituents are represented by each member of the borough council. The Commission points out, quite rightly, that the borough has high levels of electoral inequality and suggests its proposals will make things fairer.

Its first mistake is to suggest that the borough council needs an extra

member. The council shares this view but we would rather see a reduction from the current 57 – we don't see much evidence of borough councillors being overworked. If they were, there would not be so many willing to take on the extra role of parish councillor!

Then it ignores the obvious advantages of having parish councils which cover, as far as possible, the same areas as borough council wards. Under their proposals, Appleton Parish Council, for instance, will find itself involved in the affairs of three borough wards.

The Boundary Commission claim to take existing communities and geographical boundaries into account in their deliberations, but there is precious little evidence they have done so. The Bridgewater Canal, long considered a suitable natural boundary, no longer seems to be so. Party politics are not supposed to enter into the equation and here, at least, the Commission seems to have got something right, because none of our local politicians like the proposals!



One is left with a vision of members of the Commission, none of who have any local knowledge, sitting in some ivory tower in London, working with slide-rules and computers, and coming up with a solution that still has an electoral variance of up to 10 per cent and won't please anyone either.

Fortunately, everyone can have a say and we would urge everyone to do so. Villages could be wiped off the map

HISTORIC villages could be erased from the electoral map if draft recommendations from the Boundary Commission are given the green light.

Hatton, Stretton and Walton would become part of Appleton, Thelwall would be "taken over" by Lymm – which itself would be split in two – and Appleton Thorn would become part of Grappenhall, which would also lose a small area to Lymm.

proposals have councillors in all areas – including Cllr Paul Kennedy, who represents Hatton, Stretton and Walton on the borough council and has launched a campaign to preserve the ward.

The Commission says the review is being carried out as the borough currently has high levels of electoral

inequality.

Overall, 41 per cent of wards currently have a variance of more than 10 per cent from the average, they claim.

Cllr Kennedy said: "The Boundary Commission have erased Hatton, Stretton and Walton as a ward.

"Not only that, they do not acknowledge these three important local and distinct communities in the wards of Appleton and Stockton Heath, that they are proposing they

merge with.

"It is accepted that Hatton,
"The same of the same of geographically large, has a small population, but while the Commission talks about equality of votes, residents are much more concerned about quality of representation and accountability. As it is now, that is exactly what residents receive.

"In my opinion, that will not be the case if the ward is broken up, and the names of the three parishes are erased as a borough ward."

Cllr Kennedy urged residents to write to the Boundary Commission to help save the ward.

Appleton councillor Judith Wheeler said: "The proposed changes came as

said: "The proposes a great shock to us. "We can't understand why the condised Appleton. The Bridgewater Canal is no longer a natural boundary as we lose many roads to Stockton Heath. Taking in Stretton and Hatton made some sense but we thought Walton might go with Stockton Heath to increase its electorate.

"Losing Appleton Thorn to Grappenhall is awful. If approved, Appleton Parish Council would cover three electoral wards.

Cllr Ian Marks, of Lymm, said: "Lymm is a distinct community with its own identity and lumping it in with Thelwall makes no sense.

"Common sense has gone out the window because it is much better if borough and parish councillors represent the same areas.

Community interests identities are more important than arithmetic equality based on an exercise done by people using maps and population numbers but no real local knowledge."







Self Assessment Tax Return deadline

The time beloved by all taxpayers and accountants alike is fast approaching; the January 31st Self Assessment Tax Return deadline. The last sentence contained two very important words

– self and assessment. It is the - seir and assessment. It is the taxpayers responsibility to submit a return of income and to calculate and pay any tax liability if they fall into the self assessment system. Penalties will be charged on late returns and tax payments even if a return has not been issued by the tax office.

 So who must complete a return? You must inform the tax office that you are within the self assessment system if:

 You receive self employed income at any time within the tax year.

 You may need to complete one below this limit and should contact the two office further advices. the tax office for further advice
- You received total savings or investment income of £10,000 or more
- You made a profit from selling chargeable assets, such as shares or a second home
- You were a company director at any time in the year, unless your directorship was both of a non-profit making organisation and you received no pay or benefits from the directorship You or your partner claimed child benefit and one or both of you had income in excess of \$.50,000
- You received income from abroad that was subject to tax You lived abroad and received income in the UK
- You received company dividends and were a higher rate taxpayer You received total income in excess of £100,000
- You were the trustee of a trust or a registered pension scheme.

If any of the above applied to you in the tax year then you have until 31st October in the following tax year to inform the tax office. Penalties can be charged if you fail to do so, and most certainly will be charged if you fail to pay any tax due by the following 31st

It you have received a notice to complete a tax return then you must complete and submit it by the following 31st January. If you fail to do so then penalties will start being charged immediately, and will increase over a relatively short period to £1,600 even if you do not owe any tax. There is one exception. If you have received a return and, having read the above, you consider that you do not fall into any of the categories then if you contact the tax office and they agree then they will withdraw the notice. However, ignoring the notice and doing nothing is not an option. Please note that this "get-out" is not available if any of the above do apply to you even if no tax is due. If you have received a notice to complete a tax return then you

End of the road for historic Ship Inn

THE former historic Ship Inn at Walton was demolished by housing developers after a wall collapsed during work on the site.

Contractors were working on the conversion of the old pub into apartments when the collapse occurred - forcing police to close the A56 Chester Road to

The development, by Elan Homes, involved building 14 four and five bedroomed houses behind the old pub, which in recent years had been used as an Indian

restaurant, but which had been closed for some time. Chester Road was completely closed between The Stag and Walton Lea

Crematorium for some time, causing lengthy traffic delays in the area. Cllr Paul Kennedy, who represents the area, visited the site shortly after the collapse.

He said: "I spoke to a structural engineer on site who told me the police had said the building should be demolished as a matter of public safety and I can see

why the police would say that - the building was in a perilous state.

"But some local residents are annoyed because the only reason they did not object to the development was that they believed the old pub would be restored.

"I am reserving judgement until I see the planning application that comes in.

"It won't affect the rest of the site - work is continuing on the houses. But it would be good if the developer could recreate the Ship Inn as apartments, as originally intended, as this would give some character to the site frontage.

The main thing, however, is that no-one was killed or injured.



An up and down summer for cricket

IT was an up-and-down summer for local cricket clubs.
UP went Warrington, Stretton, Appleton and Lymm Oughtrington Park. DOWN went Grappenhall.

One outcome of the changes is that old rivals Warrington and Grappenhall will be playing each other again in "derby" matches.

Grappenhall finished bottom of the Vivio Cheshire County League ECB premier division, picking up only two league wins in the season. This was a big disappointment following two seasons when the village club had survived in the top tier of Cheshire cricket with comfortable mid-table positions.

Toft, who looked set to be champions until Grappenhall, in a rare class performance, held them to a draw a few weeks before the end of the season, ended up in third place.

Warrington were crowned champions of the first division. In the TACS Partnership Cheshire League, Lymm Oughtrington Park were division two champions despite losing their last three matches.

Stretton were champions of the Cheshire Alliance first division and Appleton also gained promotion by claiming runners-up spot. Both clubs will now go up to the Cheshire League next year.

Knutsford, who had started the season hoping for promotion from division two

ended up only narrowly avoiding the drop to division three.

Natasha bounces back to be crowned number one!

JUST 14 weeks after being in intensive care fighting for her life Warrington gymnast Natasha Coates bounced back - to be crowned Number One Disability Gymnast in the UK!

Natasha, aged 20 from Appleton, who suffers from a rare condition which makes her body allergic to exercise, won another five gold exercise, won another five gold medals at the recent Disability British Championships at Bolton Arena.

She suffers from a condition which affects cells in her body known as Mast Cells.

The full name is Spontaneous and Urticaria Spontaneous Angioedema leading to Idiopathic Anaphylaxis.

Alongside this she also suffers from Asthma, Eczema, Allergic Rhinitis and Oral Allergy Syndrome.

Natasha, who only recently battled back from another stay in hospital with the condition said: "My goal this year was to just compete. Competition day marked only 14 weeks since I was getting out of intensive care, so it was a tough time, going from barely being able to take more than a few steps to competing gymnasts routines at elite disability level. However, compete I did!

"I hit all my routines and made it through the competition without getting too unwell, so I was happy just to have made it through the competition.

"I was completely overwhelmed to find that I had come 1st on all of the apparatus, as well as the all-around champion for my category and the highest female all-around score of the

day!
"It felt so surreal and it makes it a total of 14 British titles won in just over 11 months because of the timing

of the competitions.

"When I developed this life threatening condition just over two years ago things were really tough and if someone has told me that in just a few years' time that I would be the number 1 Disability Gymnast in the UK, I certainly wouldn't have believed them."

"For this year's competition my leotard was specially designed with the help of Quatro leotards from a design I drew up on a scrap of paper when I was in intensive care.

"The heartbeat across the sleeves represents life and hope, and the awareness ribbon on the back with wings represents all those who have lost their life to this condition.

"I was particularly emotional after my floor routine as my new floor routine is called 'My immortal' and it tells my story with a sad ending, showing that people are dying from a condition that no-one even knows about.

"My friends and other coaches were crying because they all knew how much that performance meant to me after losing a few friends to this condition this year; I was competing for them.'

Natasha is a member of The Wire gymnastics club, which is currently fundraising for a foam pit to help

Natasha and her teammates develop harder skills safely. Natasha added: "My club has been so supportive of me and understanding about my disability that I would love to find some sponsors to help fund the new pit as a way of saying thankyou."
