"In my opinion the debate should be about the issues and decision made as a consequence of the facts, skills and arguments of those debating or asking questions.
"We should not follow the poor

examples often seen in the House of Commons.

He added that Cllr Peter Carey did offer an invitation during his mayoral year of a prize for the best debater and the award went to Cllr Paul Kennedy.

Last year's former mayor Cllr Ted Finnegán made similar pleas.

"I hope that everyone will enter

with respect to other members,' added CII Settle.

After the meeting he said "most members" had entered into the spirit of the occasion.

# Omega plans unveiled for 1,100 homes, shops and a hotel

PLANS for 1,100 new homes on the Omega South development at Great Sankey, Warrington, as part of mixed residential/retail offering, including a pub, hotel and care home have been submitted for outline planning Application for the next stage of development on Omega South which includes much needed new homes for the borough plus retail, leisure and community uses.

Omega Warrington Ltd is a joint venture between Miller Developments and KUC Properties Ltd, in partnership with landowner the Homes and Communities Agency and supported by Warrington Borough Council and the Cheshire and Warrington LEP.

Proposals include 1,100 new homes along with local shops, restaurants and cafes, public house/ bar, a care home, and a hotel, supported by extensive landscaping and wildlife habitat preservation; transport studies are also being undertaken to inform local road and junction improvements.

The submission of the plans follows extensive local consultation in May and June this year, including public events and a month-long online consultation involving local residents, businesses, community groups, parish councils and ward councillors. ward councillors.

Progress is blazing ahead at Omega with The Hut Group and Plastic Omnium set to open for production early next year. 





#### Leo's story

Leo, from Latchford, was born at 40 weeks following an uneventful pregnancy. During delivery his heart rate dropped and he required resuscitation, but was discharged home the same day. Following discharge home Leo progressed with his gross motor skills, he crawled at 5 months and walked at 9 months. Leo's parents became concerned at 17 months when he was not pointing, or babbling and following a visit to the health visitor he was referred to a paediatrician. Following assessment Leo was given a diagnosis of autism.

Leo's family contacted Brainwave following a search on the internet. The concerns at the time centred on Leo's speech and his behaviours. An initial assessment took place in September 2013. At the time of the assessment Leo was 3 years 9 months. The assessment involved the Occupational Therapist (OT) and Speech and Language Therapist (SLT).

Leo's family have returned to the North West Centre, for three re-assessments to date in 2014 & 2015. Leo has made significant progress since his initial assessment in all developmental areas. Within his gross motor skills he can now run, hop and jump. He can manage to use the stairs without help. His expressive language skills had flourished and he is now putting 4 word sentences together. Leo is now toilet trained and is dry both in the day and at night. He can manage to dress himself with the exception of fasteners. Leo's eye contact has improved and he is using more facial expressions. Leo is now able to attend parties and is using more social skills. He is also more tolerant of haircuts and visits to the dentist.

Leo has now settled into school well and receives one to one support full time. There are school based services which monitor Leo for occupational and speech and language therapy. Leo continues to respond well to sensory strategies which have been put into place and his family report he enjoys the physical rough and tumble type play. At his last reassessment Leo was awarded certificates for:

- Initiating social interaction with children
- Hopping



# Natasha bounces back!

JUST 14 weeks after being in intensive care fighting for her life Warrington gymnast Natasha Coates has bounced back – to be crowned Number One Disability Gymnast in the UK!

Natasha, aged 20 from Appleton, who suffers from a rare condition which makes her body allergic to exercise, won another five gold medals at the recent Disability British Championships at Bolton Arena.

She suffers from a condition which affects cells in her body known as Mast Cells.

The full name is Spontaneous Urticaria and Spontaneous Angioedema leading to Idiopathic Anaphylaxis.

Alongside this she also suffers

from Asthma, Eczema, Allergic Rhinitis and Oral Allergy Syndrome.

Natasha, who only recently battled back from another stay in hospital with the condition said: "My goal this year was to just compete. Competition day marked only 14 weeks since I was getting out of intensive care, so it was a tough time, going from barely being able to take more than a few steps to competing gymnasts routines at elite disability level. However, compete I did!

The NLW was announced at the July 2015 Budget and is due to be introduced in April 2016. It will apply to workers aged 25 and above and will initially be set at £7.20 per hour; in effect, it tops up the NMW, which is currently £6.50 and will increase to £6.70 from October 2015.

The new measures include

- doubling the penalties for non-payment of the NMW and NLW increasing the enforcement budget
- setting up a new team in HMRC to take forward criminal prosecutions
- for those who deliberately do not comply ensuring that anyone found guilty will be considered for disqualification from being a company director for up to 15 years.

In 2014/15 HM Revenue & Customs investigated a total of 2,204 cases. It found arrears in 735 of those cases involving 26,318 workers and over  $\pounds 3.29m$  in underpayments. Penalties in excess of  $\pounds 934,000$ 

In addition to the above financial penalties, HMRC has the power to 'name and shame' the worst offenders and to put forward the most serious cases to the Crown Prosecution Service for prosecution.

The calculation of penalties for those employers who do not comply will rise from 100% of arrears to 200%. This will be halved if employers pay within 14 days. The overall maximum penalty of £20,000 per worker will remain unchanged.

There will be a new Director of Labour Market Enforcement and Exploitation who will oversee enforcement of the NMW, the Employment Agency Standards Inspectorate and the Gangmasters

Licensing Authority.

In conjunction with the enforcement measures, the government has promised improved guidance and support to help employers with compliance. It will also work with payroll providers to ensure payroll software contains checks that staff are being paid at least the minimum wage. Let us hope that these measures to assist employers to meet their obligation are given as much or more prominence than the financial penalties, although we somehow doubt it!
