incidents involving police officers being delayed into responding to an incident due to having to travel from Warrington to Culcheth - but I fear it will only be a matter of time before we recéive some complaints.

From our own perspective the centralising of the policing units in Warrington have not improved lines of communication - if anything they have become more fragmented.

We will be watching this issue with interest over the coming months.

Meanwhile it is hard to believe Culcheth Victorian Day and Christmas is only just around the corner!!

#### Decision delay

PLANNERS have put off a decision on a retrospective application to change a piece of open land in the Green Belt into a domestic garden.

The application - a resubmission of one made in March which was refused – came before committee a second time with a recommendation for refusal.

# Police take up to two hours to reach Culcheth beat

POLICE officers and PCSOs are taking up to two hours to reach their "beat" areas in the Culcheth area,

"beat" areas in the Culcheth area, according to a local councillor. The delays caused by the new police operating model are, at best "worrying" says Cllr Chris Vobe. But most people find them "astonishing," he says. Cllr Vobe has already met Cheshire Police and Crime Commissioner John Dwyer to voice his concerns. But he remains unconvinced by the explanation he has received

The new police working system requires officers to attend The working a 20-minute briefing session in central Warrington at the start of each working day.

Only after that do they travel to the Culcheth area.

#### Assurances

Cllr Vobe says he has heard from officers who say they sometimes take up to two hours to reach their patrol areas following the briefing. The Police and Crime Commissioner had given assurances, but local people were not convinced. "We've heard from officers in

the Warrington East area that, on occasion, it is taking them up to two hours to reach their patrol areas from Charles Stewart House in the centre of Warrington. "This is time that officers could spend on the beat. By blindly

continuing to drive this programme forward, it is tantamount to him forcing police off our streets.

"We are told by officers that there is no defined way for them to reach their destination. Sometimes, a car is provided, most times it is not. PCSOs are having to 'catch a lift' from whoever is heading in the same direction as they are.

#### Bus

"When a lift is not available, they are having to walk to the Bus Interchange and wait for the next bus to their patrol areas. The whole journey is taking as much as two hours.

"These delays are putting PCSOs and local officers in an untenable position, all for the sake of a 20-minute briefing which the Commissioner refuses to utilise new technology to deliver. "Villages like

Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft are feeling the effects

The effects. But Mr Dwyer hit back. He said: "I met with Cllr Vobe, and senior officers of the Constabulary, last month to discuss the implementation of the new policing approach in Warrington.

"At the meeting the Constabulary provided substantial detail and assurance about how centralised deployment was benefitting deployment was benefitting intelligence-led policing in the town. It was clearly explained that officer and PCSO time on patrol is not being adversely impacted by the changes. The local Chief Inspector also spelt out the positive impact that the new approach is having on the unit's productivity and its ability to combat crime, which, as was explained, is at its lowest level for a generation.

"The changes which have been introduced have enabled us to make savings while investing more in the frontline. Across Cheshire this means committing an additional 130 officers to frontline police services, recruiting 53 new officers by April 2016, and maintaining the 220 existing PCSOs who work across the county. "Cllr Vobe's ongoing attack on the operational effectiveness of the

Constabulary does not reflect the reality of the brilliant work that is being done."



- There are a surprising number of plants that perform well over the winter period, often they are well scented - examples include Sarcococca, Hamamelis and Mahonia
- With the colder weather and the decrease of natural foods wild birds will need feeding regularly, especially with high calorie fatty foods
- Areas of the border, that are currently empty, can be dug over and enriched with blended manure ready for next year's plantings
- Cut down any herbaceous plants that have finished flowering and that do not have a strong winter structure. Weed and fork gently between them



#### Councillor tells developers to "get their act together"

A COUNCILLOR has called on developers to "fulfil their obligations" following completion of a housing estate on a former wartime camp site at Croft,

wartime camp site a Warrington. Cllr Chris Vobe, a member of Warrington Borough Council and Croft Parish Council, says developers Elan Homes must "get their act together" and deliver on promises they made before completing the estate off Lady Lane. He said: "It is not acceptable for them to ignore the surrounding community now that their

community now that their development is complete. "We want to see the village environment kept at a high standard and I will be holding the developers to account in this regard.'

Elan Homes recently completed work on the Gosling Park Estate but a number of residents have complained that work has been left undone. Cllr Vobe said: "I am very

strongly supporting residents on Lady Lane, Emerald Drive and Latona Close, who have put up with a great deal of disruption whilst Elan Homes have developed their new estate

"We warmly welcome the new residents on the former HMS Gosling site to our village community and we are sure that they will find that the village has a great deal to offer. "However, now that development is complete. Flan Homes have

However, now that development is complete, Elan Homes have outstanding obligations which they must fulfil. A large section of the pavement on Lady Lane has been dug up during the construction and hasn't been relayed – it looks a

disgrace. "This is a very-well used route through the village and pedestrians are currently having to struggle across rough stones where tarmac backd root should rest.

should rest. "There is a large section of open space between the new housing development and existing properties on the lane. This is overgrown with shrubbery and Himalayan weeds.

There is no sign of any swift action on the part of Elan Homes in

"On the new housing estate itself, part of the public footpath has been uprooted and cones laid around the kerb. It has simply been left like this for weeks on end with

no sign of any reinstatement work. "Finally, the council have been assured that the developers will bear the cost for the resurfacing of Lady Lane from Emerald Drive to the junction with Mustard Lane. "This will be crucial in helping us to address long standing highway.

maintenance issues which have been heightened by construction vehicles' heavy use of the road." A spokesperson for Elan Homes

said: Contractors are scheduled to complete all outstanding finishing


works to roads and footpaths at Gosling Park in Croft within the next few weeks. This work will include any resurfacing of Lady Lane that is stipulated in a legal agreement with Warrington Borough Council. Work on the treatment of Himalowan weeks is ongoing and Himalayan weeds is ongoing and is being undertaken in accordance with the long term management plan required by the planning permission. We apologise for any inconvenience caused during the completion of these works."

# Cost-effective kitchen and furniture re-spraying



SINCE deciding to expand at the start of 2013 it has been a very busy time for Howard, Matthew and the rest of the team at Matt Finish. The company specialise in transforming tired old kitchens, fitted bedrooms and furniture, making them look like brand new again.
