## Editor's comment

IF a reminder were needed that Stockton Heath is a village with its own waterfront – onto the Manchester Ship Canal – there could have been no more tragic one than the accident last year in which great grandmother Valerie Pritchard died when her car crashed through the flimsy railings in Ellesmere Road and into the water.

The key word, apparently, in the above, is "accident", for the verdict of the subsequent inquest into 72-yearold Mrs Pritchard's death was, entirely predictably, that it was a case of "accidental death."

This leads Peel Ports, owners of the Ship Canal, to come to the conclusion that there is no need for them to do anything to improve safety along the canal.

Quite apart from its insensitivity, such a decision seems to fly in the face of the evidence. In addition to Mrs Pritchard's tragic death, we have had other incidents along the canal. Twice recently, people have had to be rescued from the embankment. Not so long ago, a bus was left teetering on the edge of the water after crashing through the railings.

And of course, there was the terrible tragedy of 2004 when two teenagers died after their car plunged into the Bridgewater Canal from Stockton Lane, Grappenhall. All were accidents – but surely this is not an excuse for disregarding the rather obvious fact that roads running along the edge of canals pose a threat to life.

Stockton Heath Parish Council has been campaigning ever since Mrs Pritchard's death for some kind of improved safety railing along the canal. They will be dismayed at the canal company's stance.

We are astonished by it – and would urge the parish council to continue to press for action to make all canal-side roads safer.

MEANWHILE on a more positive note, credit where credit is due to Warrington Borough Council's highways department and their money saving efforts on maintaining grass verges on roadsides.

The colourful displays, especially on Lumb Brook Road, Appleton, have been quite simply outstanding.

Throughout the summer they have been in full bloom and even now as the days are drawing in, the wildflower borders are still in near full bloom.

It certainly makes for an uplifting journey into work each day for many motorists.

I am told the mix of flowers being used by Warrington is pretty unique, so much so, they are now being asked for details of their "secret formula" by



other authorities.

We are often quick to criticise and complain over issues regarding our highways - usually the length of time we spend on them stuck in traffic jams.

So it is very refreshing to be able to report on a positive - I look forward to seeing more of these attractive borders which are obviously also a boost to local wildlife with the bees still buzzing well into October!

## Gypsy caravan park plan thrown out

A CONTROVERSIAL application to give a temporary gypsy caravan site permanent status at Walton – and increase the number of caravans – has been thrown out by borough council planning chiefs.

Members of the development management committee decided, after visiting the site, that the proposal would result in too many caravans.

The application was submitted on behalf of traveller families living at the Two Acre Caravan Park, Warrington Road, Walton.

It sought permission for 24 permanent pitches, with a total of 33 caravans, including mobile homes, day room, site office and four amenity buildings.

Gypsy or traveller families have been living on the site, alongside the Bridgewater Canal, since 1997 after winning temporary planning consent. But the temporary consent expired in December last year so the site is currently unauthorised.

Cllr Paul Kennedy, who represents the area on Warrington Borough Council, told the committee the site was overcrowded.

He said the application gave the impression that all that was being asked for was permanency for what already existed. But if that was so, the site was already in serious breach of previous permissions which limited the site to 15 families and 22 caravans.

The current application sought permission for 27 families and 35 caravans – a "massive scaling up" of the site

Fifteen nearby residents opposed the application on the grounds an increase in the size of the site would increase traffic to an unacceptable level. Amenity buildings on the site had never had planning permission, they claimed.

Planning officers said the scheme should be refused because it was an inappropriate development in the Green Belt causing demonstrable harm to the character and appearance of the countryside.



## Beatle house plan turned down

A PLAN to build a new house in the grounds of an existing property once occupied by the parents of Beatle George Harrison has been thrown out by Warrington planners. Members of the borough council's development management

Members of the borough council's development management committee decided the proposal put forward by David Mantle in the grounds of Sevenoaks, Old Pewterspear Lane, Appleton, was too large for the site.

Almost two years ago, planners approved an outline application for the house, but planners were told the new, detailed scheme, was almost one third larger.

Six nearby residents had objected to the plan, complaining of loss of privacy, overlooking, overshadowing, draining issues, etc and Appleton Parish Council were concerned that the proposed access to the site was close to a children's playground and on a bend.

The plan was for a mainly twostorey dwelling with four bedrooms, two en-suites, two dressing rooms, living and dining rooms and access from Hatfield Gardens.

from Hatfield Gardens. In the 1960s, Sevenoaks was bought by George Harrison for his parents to enable them to escape from the "Beatlemania" which was sweeping the country and leading to hundreds of fans descending on their home in Liverpool.

## Village Purple Flag group is wound up

THE group that steered Stockton Heath towards becoming the first village in the UK to be awarded a Purple Flag for the management of its night-time economy, has disbanded.

Stockton Heath Purple Flag Association (SHPFA) has handed over its responsibilities to Stockton Heath Parish Council, together with its remaining assets.

Parish council chairman Cllr Celia Jordan said: "We are very proud of being the first village in the country to win a Purple Flag and the SHPFA has sufficient money left for us to commission signs at the two main entrances to the village stating that we were the first.

"The problem has been a lack of resources. The SHPFA was supported by the borough council with officer time at the beginning of the five year project. But this has been withdrawn because the borough are no longer able to spare the resources.

"The police have also withdrawn because they feel the objectives have been achieved.

"There was also a risk of duplication of effort between the SHPFA and other bodies and the volunteers in the group - residents and councillors - had to free themselves for other calls on their time.

"The Purple Flag Association achieved a great deal - not least the arrangement by which local shopkeepers and others have made their toilets available for use by members of the public.

"We are also hoping to arrange defibrillators outside the police station and in the Forge Shopping Pricinct. We will keep the Purple Flag flying in Stockton Heath.

Purple Flags are usually awarded to cities and large towns to acknowledge that they have safe, well-managed evening economies. Stockton Heath, with its bustling night life, was the first village, in 2011, to receive the award. So far, more than 50 Purple Flags have been awarded nationally.

## **Margaret reaches 65**

The 56-year-old grandmother 56-year-ou ground up a simply by setting up a started Facebook page appealing donations which she intended storing in her own portacabin prior to sending them on to the Manchesterbased charity Syria Relief. But within hours, the response

convinced her much more was needed. "I was overwhelmed – the kindness

and generosity of so many people was humbling." Nora knew there were empty offices

at a haulage depot near her home so she approached owners Mark Crook and Andrew Wright who were more than happy to let her use them on a short term basis.

Adjoining company UK Site Security also pledged support with access to toilets and kitchen and paying the electricity bill, as well as supply bags and ties to pack the donations in.

As donations began to pour in, Nora decided to expand the appeal beyond the immediate Warrington area across the whole of the North West.

Originally the idea was to help refugees at Calais but the scope of the exercise soon broadened.





## Lottery boost for Walton Hall

EXCITING plans for the transformation and restoration of part of historic Walton Hall and Gardens have moved a step closer thanks to a winning bid for initial support from the National Lottery via the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF).

The borough council - who own the hall - worked with partners Myerscough College, Walton Lea Partnership and the Friends of Walton Estate on the winning bid which includes plans to restore the historic conservatory and stable buildings and transform the old buildings into a dedicated learning centre.

The stable yard, once occupied by Lady Daresbury's prized Kerry cattle, will become classrooms and offices, with the historic conservatory and vinery used as teaching, growing and display space.

Subjects taught at the new learning centre will include horticulture and animal care, with students carrying out project work on the Walton Estate and in the Children's Zoo as part of their course.

Walton Lea Partnership's work will be carried out side-by-side with the College, allowing people of all ages and abilities to learn and thrive together. The project also includes a

schools "model garden" that will allow children from Warrington schools to learn how to grow their own plants and vegetables.

An important part of the project will be to re-open the conservatory area to visitors. Part of the main conservatory will be a public space where visitors can learn about the horticultural heritage of the site and see development and training work being undertaken.

Cllr Kate Hannon said: "We have worked very hard with our partners over the past year to bring forward this project vision, which continues our ongoing work to restore the Walton Estate. With Heritage Lottery Fund support, we will now be able to restore the grand conservatories and beautiful buildings to their former glory and setting within the gardens. Even better, we will be able to dedicate these buildings to a new useful life providing facilities for

young people and disabled adults, inspiring a whole new generation.

As part of the project, a programme of events and activities will be planned that will aim to connect visitors to the popular gardens to the heritage and history of the site. Volunteer group "Friends of Walton Estate" will play a major role in

the transformation and in public engagement.
