This is where a pension provider starts to transfer your more risky assets into safer ones as you are closing in

on retirement. So if for example you have 10 years to retirement age, the idea was, that it protected

your pension fund as you moved ever closer to the retirement date.

The trouble is, if you are not cashing out by purchasing an annuity – and clearly nearly 80% are not if the above figures are right, is life-styling right for you? **Well almost certainly not.** Simply because if you are going to use your pension fund to go into flexi access drawdown (FAD) for example, then your assets are still invested. And retirement age is therefore not an end date, as it used to be with the comfort of a guaranteed annuity for life.

The fact of the matter is that if you do choose FAD then your money still has to last for another 15, 20 maybe even 30 years. You now risk it running out. So whether you like it or not, you now need investment risk more than ever before, just to make your pension fund last the course.

So these days when somebody starts a pension at 35 for example, the end date is not 60 or 65, it is probably until death.

And on that lovely note may I wish you season's greetings and a happy and prosperous New Year!

### Editor's comment

people will have been touched by the plight of refugees

– particularly those from war-torn Syria – arriving by the thousand in Europe. Ordinary mums and dads, children, grandparents – all driven by the desire to find a safe haven away from conflict.

But not everyone is sufficiently moved to do anything about it, so the remarkable story of local businesswoman Nora Carlin, and the volunteers who have responded to her call for help is one we take great

pleasure in reporting.

Nora started her "Refugees – Aid from the Northwest of England" group after seeing photographs of tragic Aylan Kurdi, the little Syrian boy found drowned on a Turkish beach. But she did not expect her appeal for

food, clothing, tents, sleeping bags, etc., to get the response it got. She thought her own portacabin would be large enough to hold any donations she received.

She was wrong and soon she was overwhelmed by the goods being sent from all over the region. If it had not been for the help offered by local businessmen Mark Crook and Andrew Wright, who made empty office space available, by UK Site Security, who provided access to kitchen and toilets and paid the electricity bill and by Thorn Cross Prison, who provided storage space and willing she could not have coped.

Her volunteer force is largely made up of local people who share her spirit of generosity and want to do something to help those in need. They have worked hard and long



to send desperately needed goods, donated by people all over the North West, to refugees in France, Turkey, Greece, in Syria itself and elsewhere.

We read often about the refugee problem, and often it focusses on the negative. So it is indeed good to be able to report instead a story of hope coming not from some major international charity but from a tiny village in Cheshire.

## Motorists urged to cut speed as thousands exceed limits

MOTORISTS are being urged to cut their speed on a road where volunteers have recorded literally thousands of drivers exceeding the 30mph limit.

During a three day period on Knutsford Road, Grappenhall, local councillors Paul Wenlock and Mike Biggin, checked the speeds of more than 21,500 vehicles in the 30pm limit and found 4,680 were travelling at 41 miles an hour, with a further 1,445 clocking 46 miles an hour.

More than 600 were exceeding 50 mph with over 100 doing more than twice the limit at over 60mph!

Cllr Wenlock, who is Chairman of Grappenhall and Thelwall Parish Council and Cllr Biggin, who is also a borough councillor for the area, set up the speed checks following complaints from local residents.

complaints from local residents.

The council has invested more than £7,000 in three speed detection devices – and although both councillors were aware of speeding issues, they were shocked by the extent and high speeds.

Cllr Wenlock, who is the Speed
watch Co-ordinator for the area said:
"Since we have been using these
devices we have been able to prove or
disprove the perception of speeding.

"Some areas the problem is not as bad as people think – but there is clearly a big issue on Knutsford Road, near the junction with Bellhouse Lane.

"The information we are collecting is extremely useful and we can pass it

on to the Police Traffic Management team in order for them to carry out enforcement."

Other surveys in the area revealed that in the 20mph zone on Bellhouse Lane, during a five day period in October involving 1,268 vehicles, more than 800 exceeded 21mph, with six above 36mph and one over 41 miles an hour.

During a 12 day survey on 30mph Thelwall New Road in September, out of 9.466 vehicles, 4492 were over 30mph, 387 were above 40mph and nine were over 60mph!

Meanwhile on 30mph Bradshaw Lane, during a period of six days in September and October, out of 5,528 vehicles, only 663 exceeded 30mph with only 34 over 40mph.

Cllr Biggin added: "The data has given us some very useful information and in most cases prove residents' concerns over speeding motorists.

"The problem is particularly bad on Knutsford Road and motorists need to cut their speed before there is a fatality

"In fact even though I am not a big fan of them I would support a speed camera being installed on this stretch of Knutsford Road to help alleviate the problem."

### Free trees for green fingered pupils



THOUSANDS of green fingered school children across Cheshire are to receive free trees as woodland conservation charity the Woodland Trust marks a historic tree planting milestone.

Over the last year the Trust will have planted a million trees to honour those who died in the First World War.

As well as starting planting at four new woods it has provided free trees to thousands of schools and communities.

Some 9,345 are being distributed in Cheshire, including 6,645 to schools.

These free trees will help boost tree cover which is just 6.1 per cent in the county compared to 13 per cent in the UK as a whole.

One of these trees could contain a golden ticket that identifies one lucky group as the custodians of the millionth tree of the charity's First World War Centenary Woods Project. The tree will provide a poignant reminder to the fact that Britain lost around a million people during the war.

First World War project manager Philippa Borrill said: "This week is a really exciting and poignant time for the Woodland Trust. Not only will hundreds of schools be receiving free trees – bringing the important educational and health benefits of nature to many, but the millionth tree marks an important milestone in our First World War Project.

"We are a quarter of the way through the project to plant millions of trees as a lasting tribute to those who lived and served in the First World War.

"One group will receive a golden ticket – and essentially will become custodians of our millionth tree. While this is a fun idea it is also a symbolic mark in the commemorations as one million people also lost their lives in the First World War."

The school or community group which receives the ticket will be asked to contact the Woodland Trust which is organising a special surprise for them.

Schools and communities can now apply for tree packs for spring 2016 – the Woodland Trust will have 3,250 available

They are Huayaca alpacas and have soft, fluffy coats.

Alpacas are kept in herds that graze on the level heights of the Andes in southern Peru, northern Bolivia, Ecuador, and northern Chile, at an altitude of more than 11,000 feet above sea level.

Walton's alpacas are now sharing

an enclosure with the goats. A special shelter has been built for them

with help from zoo volunteers and offenders from Thorn Cross Prison. Cllr Kate Hannon, the borough council's lead member for leisure, community and culture, said: "The children's zoo is a fantastic asset to Walton Hall and Gardens and I'm thrilled to welcome three new additions to the much loved attraction.



### The end of wear and tear allowances

Sorry but instead of us bringing you 'glad tidings' this December the Government seem intent on dealing out 'sad seem intent on dealing out sad tidings' all year. Unfortunately landlords are to lose the longstanding 'wear and tear' allowance, a recognised tax relief against rental income.

This cut was announced in the summer budget of 2015 and to be implemented by April 2016 with the explanation from the government that the 'tax deduction had outlived its usefulness'. Landlords please note all is not quite lost, the government plan to bring in a different allowance, one, practically the same as one they had decided to discontinue some years prior. The proposal is to introduce a 'renewals allowance', this will allow landlords tax relief for the cost of replacing furnishings and equipment e.g. beds, curtains, crockery, TV's etc.

Watch this space now as there is a catch! Landlords will only be

Watch this space now as there is a catch! Landlords will only be able to claim 'like-for-like'. What does this mean you ask? It means able to claim 'like-for-like'. What does this mean you ask? It means when a replacement is necessary it cannot be an improvement i.e an updated version of the original. In other words if a basic £450 HD TV is replaced with an ultra £750 HD TV, the tax relief would only be allowable on £450, however, if in a number of years the ultra HD TV is replaced at a greater cost than £750 the whole of the replacement cost will be allowed as this is 'like-for-like!'

HMRC have not yet announced any special rules which will apply during the transition period from the original Wear & Tear allowance to the renewals system. It is for this reason that we suggest you consider carefully any replacements which may need to be made you for any residential lets.

The Wear & Tear deduction will continue to work out the same

We suggest a delay on buying any renewals until after 5 April 2016. That way there will not be any 'Wear &Tear' allowance lost plus there will be an entitlement to claim the renewals allowance for any 'like-for-like purchases.

### Food, clothing and goodwill provides refugees with hope

A 40ft container packed with food, clothing and other basics of life for refugees has been sent to the Greek island of Samos – thanks to the generosity of people across Cheshire and the hard work of volunteers at Appleton Thorn.

When it arrives, it will be greeted by volunteers from Cheshire who will help distribute the goods to the thousands of refugees - mainly from Syria - who are arriving on the island

every day.

It is the first container to go directly from the group "Refugees – aid from the Northwest of England" started by local businesswoman Nora Carlin, who runs lifestyle management firm Arley's Angels.

Although the group have sent tonnes of goods previously, the earlier cargoes have been sent via other established charities, such as Syria Relief, in Manchester, who have experience of relief work overseas. But the latest consignment was sorted locally and sent directly from

Appleton.
About 50 volunteers are involved in the local operation, working in shifts, and at least 20 are travelling to Samos to be there when the

container arrives.

Nora said: "They are desperate for volunteers out there because the island has virtually been overwhelmed the sheer numbers of refugees arriving. Having packed the container at this end, we will be best placed to unpack it over there.

"I also want to see the situation on the ground for myself so that I can make sure we are doing everything right – sending the stuff they need and making sure it goes to the right people.'

Donations are coming in at Appleton Thorn from all over the North West following Nora's Facebook appeal for help. She has been given free use of vacant offices near her home and storage space at Thorn Cross Young Offenders Institution. A team from the prison has helped sort

and pack the goods.

"Everyone has been wonderful" said
Nora. "I have been quite overwhelmed
by the generosity of people."

With the refugee crisis showing

little sign of coming to an end, Nora's group is continuing its good work. The main demand is for food, clothing, tents, sleeping nappies and hygiene items.

improvement and investment.


In the short term, LiveWire plan to upgrade the gym equipment as part of a £1 million to improve gyms across the borough.

### **Improving** access to defibrillators

STOCKTON Heath Parish Council is looking into the possibility of improving access to life-saving defibrillators in the village, following an approach from a local resident who is a paramedic.

He has carried out a survey of existing defibrillators and found that although there are a number of machines, few are available 24 hours a day.

One idea is that a machine inside the police station should be moved to an outside wall so that there would be 24 hour access in the centre of the village. Another machine is in Alexandra Park, but it would benefit from better signage.

Most schools have defibrillators, as well as some sports clubs, but they are not available all the time. Council chairman Cllr Celia Jordan

said: "We are looking at the issue and hope to be able to make more machines accessible 24 hours a day. It may be that we already have enough machines if more can be made more accessible."


