Golden Gates Housing toasts five successful years

GOLDEN Gates Housing Trust (GGHT) has marked its milestone 5th birthday by celebrating the completion of its 'Investing in Neighbourhoods' programme.

The housing association, which is the largest in Warrington, has invested £105million in the town over the past five years – that's around £400,000 every week

around £400,000 every week since the company was formed. GGHT Managing Director, Peter Fitzhenry, reflects on the GGHT journey; "Five years ago 92% of customers voted in favour of the Warrington Borough Council housing stock being transferred to GGHT. In return an ambitious

range of promises was put on the table. As an organisation we have worked incredibly closely with our worked incredibly closely with our customers and partners to improve homes and neighbourhoods. I'm really proud of my team who work incredibly hard every day to make a real difference to the lives of the people we serve and would like to thank our customers and partners for their contribution and partners for their contribution to our achievements and ongoing

support." Promises delivered include a £74.5million investment in home including improvements new windows, doors, bathroom, kitchen and central heating upgrades.

Estates have been made cleaner and greener thanks to a $\pounds 2.5 \text{million}$ spend on environmental improvements. Six hundred local people have been helped into work and hundreds more supported to become work ready. At the point of environmental transfer customers were particularly keen on GGHT taking a harder line on anti-social behaviour (ASB). As a result extra staff were brought in and ASB has reduced by 24%

Orford Resident Mr Verdon aged 91, said "I have been a tenant for 20 years. The concern GGHT has shown me has been greatly appreciated and the improvements they have made are wonderful.

Leader of the council, Cllr rry O'Neill, praised GGHT Cllr Terry on its achievements by saying; "Congratulations to Golden Gates Housing Trust on five successful years. The council has maintained strong links with GGHT through the work of the Warrington Partnership

and our community initiatives have improved housing and quality of life for local people." In April 2015 GGHT joined forces with St Helens based Helena

Partnerships to form a new housing

Partnerships to form a new housing group called Torus. Rob Young, Torus Group Chief Executive, explains what the future holds for GGHT and Torus; "GGHT should be very proud of its achievements which have undoubtedly touched the lives of thousands of people and brought much needed investment to homes and neighbourhoods. Being part of Torus will enable GGHT to continue to invest in the town. As a group our priority is to address the shortfall of affordable homes in the region by building more homes for sale and rent. This in turn will boost the local economy and the prosperity of local communities."

Warrington's £89 million tobacco bill

QUITTING smoking could lift 3,830 people in Warrington out of poverty, according to a new survey If a Warrington resident who smokes 20 cigarettes a day at £8.50 a packet was to quit smoking, he or she would save £59.50 a week – or £3,094 a year! About 19,000 households in the town include an adult smoker – and 5,300 of them are living below the poverty line, according to figures from Action on Smoke and Health (ASH). An estimated 2,061 households – comprising 3,830 people, including 925 children and 588 pensioners – could he little out of poverty in the smoker in them auti

be lifted out of poverty if the smokers in them quit. A total of £89 million is spent on tobacco in the borough. The figures have been published alongside a health inequalities toolkit advising local authorities and the NHS on

how to reduce smoking rates among those experiencing health inequalities.

THE 2015 Rugby World Cup has focused the world's attention on a sport where injury is the norm. Some teams have played games that are just four days apart and, because of the intensity of the action, injuries become part and parcel.

Overuse injuries build over time and are the result of the combined negative effects of a mildly traumatic

action that's repeated over and over again. Shin splints that result from regular training and practicing are an example of overuse or chronic injury. The injury usually starts as a niggling discomfort with increasing pain developing over time.

Rapid stopping, starting and changing direction also places stress onto the knees and ankles. The structure of the knee means a ligament injury is most common, with anterior cruciate ligament (ACL), posterior cruciate ligament (PCL) and medial collateral ligament (MCL) strains, ruptures and tears, the most common.

Often, subtle differences in the way we move can place more stress on the joints of our body. The best way to minimise the chances of an injury taking place is to ensure your body is working optimally. A chiropractor will be able to assess how your joints are working, and identify any areas that could potentially lead to an injury. A special service took place on the cenotaph at Bridgefoot, thanks to local Campaigners Julie Francis and Steve Peacock, who have successfully campaigned for improved access to the town's main war memorial.

They were joined by the Mayor and Mayoress of Warrington Cllr. Geoff and Mrs Jean Settle, for a service led by Borough Minister

Rev. Stephen Kingsnorth. The British Legion Riders Branch is for anyone who has an interest in motorcycling and now in the second decade pf activity, they have a well deserved reputation in community

repatriation ceremonies. They have more than 5000 members from Cornwall to Scotland, as well as Canada, France, Spain, Germany, Switzerland, Australia and the USA – all brought together by their enthusiasm for motorcycling and willingness to support the charitable aims of the Royal British Laciao Legion. Meanwhile a structural survey

has been carried out on the

Cenotaph as part of the borough council's continuing investment in the memorial.

The results of the survey are now being collated – but in the meantime the council has worked with partners, including members of the Friends of the Cenotaph group to carry out improvements. Agreement has been reached

with the Friends to ensure the Union flag is flown correctly at the site. The agreement is on a trial basis until July next year.

Since the structural survey an interim pedestrian crossing has been installed near to Knutsford Road.

Deputy leader of the council and chairman of the Armed Forces/ World War 1 Commemoration task group, Cllr Mike Hannon said: "The council is committed to maintaining the Cenotaph in a respectful manner. We have been working with interested partners including the Friends of Warrington Cenotaph and liaised with veteran organisations as we develop plans to do this.

"We are investing in the Cenotaph and I am pleased that improvements have been made and we will continue to do this with the help of our partners."

WHEN Tony Longmore was made redundant from his job in the energy management industry he could not have foreseen what the future held. But now, eight years later, he and his partner, former teacher Julie Darbyshire, are running innovative photography business Oculus Studios





Christmas cheer

As we approach Christmas we thought we would spread some Christmas cheer amongst our readers by looking at a major change in the taxation of dividends that is taking place from April next year.



that is taking place from April next year. Currently, dividends carry a "notional tax credit" of 10%. A dividend of, for instance, \pounds is treated as if it is actually a dividend of \pounds 10 from which tax of \pounds 1 has already been deducted at source. If the person receiving the dividend is a basic rate taxpayer then there is no further tax to pay. A higher rate taxpayer will pay additional tax at an effective rate of 25%. However, the tax credit is notional because the right for a non-taxpayer to reclaim this tax was removed several years ago. From 6th April 2016 the tax credit is totally abolished. Instead, each taxpayer will have a dividend allowance of \pounds ,000 and will, therefore, be entitled to receive the first \pounds ,000 of dividend income to the recipient. If the taxpayer is subject only to tax at basic rate taxpayer will be taxed on the recipient. If the taxpayer is subject only to tax at basic rate then the dividend income will be taxed at 7.5%. However, a higher rate taxpayer will pay tax of 32.5% on dividends, with additional rate taxpayers paying 42.5%. If you are a typical small business operating through a limited company and paying yourself mainly by means of dividends then you will be hit particularly hard by this change. For instance, a company making a profit of \pounds ,000 a year and which pays the owner a small salary of about \pounds ,000 with the balance paid out as dividends will find its overall annual tax bill increasing from about \pounds 1,000 to about \pounds 13,000. If the profits were \pounds 70,000 then the additional tax payable will be nearly \pounds 3,000. So where does the Christmas cheer appear? Well, anyone receiving dividend income of \pounds ,000 will, if those dividends are all taxable at higher rate, be 1,000 better off. £1,000 better off.

And even some high-earners with substantial dividend income will find themselves better off. For instance, someone earning about £75,000 a year through their PAYE employment, such as a typical Member of Parliament, and who is also receiving dividend income of about £30,000 will find themselves about £600 better off each year!
