

and see what else we have to offer."





This comic duo has comedy mentors of the highest calibre in the form of Damian's uncles, The Chuckle brothers.



Interesting reaction to Chancellor's Autumn statement

"IT was interesting to hear the reaction

"Il was interesting to hear the reaction from business representatives to the Chancellors' Autumn Statement.

The Confederation of British Industry (CBI) welcomed the spending on infrastructure, the increased housebuilding and increased housebuilding and support for energy-intensive sectors including advanced manufacturing. The CBI did however feel there was a 'sting in the tail', despite continued work on deficit reduction, and industrial strategy and an emphasis on nurturing a vibrant business community, the size and scope of the Apprenticeship Levy caused concern

This concern being echoed by the Institute of Directors (IoD), who described the new levy as ".. a new payroll tax". At 0.5% of payroll, the IoD claim it will be a big new cost for many companies including medium-sized ones.

Infrastructure something that investment is the business community across the UK has been asking for a long time, and in particular John Longworth (Director General of the British Chambers of Commerce) was 'delighted' businesses were now being listened to on infrastructure matters.

Infrastructure matters.

Infrastructure investment is of particular importance to Warrington given its proximity to the U.K.'s main motorway and rail networks, a position which has undoubtedly been part of the touch.

undoubtedly been part of the town's economic success story. The 'Pinchpoint' project to help alleviate congestion in Birchwood is nearing completion, consultation is underway (until 11 January) regarding the Centre Park Link project and, later this month, there will be announcements regarding consultation on Junction 8

consultation on Junction 8 improvements on the M62. Warrington & Co continues to work closely with Warrington Borough Council and the Local Enterprise



Partnership to ensure government funding is available to help develop the towns strategic infrastructure.

An undoubted success of the work done by Warrington & Co, in conjunction with partners, was the creation and designation of birchwood as an Enterprise Zone. This is great news. It's the first ever This is great news. It's the first ever Enterprise Zone in Warrington and was announced as a part of the Cheshire Science Corridor in the Chancellor's Statement. It's recognition of the strategic importance of the Birchwood/Warrington East area which employs over 27,000 people, 20% of whom are employed in the nuclear industry.

Chancellor announces Birchwood as first Enterprise Zone

THE Chancellor of the Exchequer George Osborne has announced that Birchwood in Warrington is to be given Enterprise Zone status.

The announcement came within Mr Osbourn's Autumn Statement where he announced that twenty-six new Enterprise Zones will be

where he announced that twenty-six new Enterprise Zones will be created across the U.K. including a new Cheshire Science Corridor that will join together Cheshire and Warrington's nationally and internationally significant research facilities at Alderley Park and the nationally significant nuclear cluster at Birchwood in Warrington.

Earlier this year, led by Warrington & Co., the Cheshire & Warrington Local Enterprise Partnership submitted an application to the Government for a new Enterprise Zone to be created around the Cheshire Science Corridor across Cheshire and Warrington that included the nuclear cluster area at Birchwood.

Enterprise Zones were established by the government in 2012 with the aim of creating jobs, boosting businesses and encouraging businesses growth for both new and expanding companies, with the assistance of Government backing. Prior to yesterday's announcement there were 24 enterprise zones across the country, with five of them located within the North West of England, there are now 44 with eight in the North West.

The benefits to companies within an Enterprise Zone can include business rate discount for occupiers worth up to £275,000 over five years; the development of a simplified planning approach that can assist in the growth of new

build and subsequent infrastructure; and more support for superfast broadband. The retained business rates are also used by the Local Enterprise Partnership to then fund development required on the Enterprise Zone sites.

Warrington has a long established nuclear industry resulting from the UK Atomic Energy Authority (UKAEA) and then BNFL being headquartered in Warrington and has led Birchwood Park to be the location of an internationally significant nuclear cluster. The National Nuclear Laboratory and Amec Foster Wheeler's Nuclear Analytical Services laboratory, Europe's largest commercial radiochemical analysis laboratory, are now both also based in Birchwood's nuclear cluster has

led to a wide range of nuclear
related companies establishing a presence in Warrington so as to be located at the centre of an important

located at the centre of an important nuclear industry, and the diversity of operations in Birchwood has led to a deep and broad cluster around engineering, design, R&D, project management and project delivery.

Further benefits to Warrington's local economy are also being achieved through Local Growth Fund resources from the Cheshire and Warrington LEP in terms of Investment in Warrington's strategic road network. This investment will enable the strategic transport network in and around Warrington to be substantially upgraded. Key schemes include Warrington East phase 1, (Birchwood Pinchpoint) project M62 Junction 8 and Centre Park Link.



Housing Trust one step closer to £10.6million for local projects




GOLDEN Gates Housing Trust (GGHT) has moved one step closer to receiving millions of pounds in funding to transform lives in Warrington and Cheshire. The Trust has been

The Trust has been awarded almost £50,000 to further develop plans for the New Leaf project. If successful in stage two, the Trust and its partners would receive up to £10.6million in funding from the Building Better Opportunities programme to deliver the New Leaf project.

Peter Fitzhenry (pictured), GGHT Managing Director said; "We are really excited about the New Leaf project because of the huge potential it has to change lives, create opportunities and a positive future for thousands of local people.

If we are successful, the project would allow GGHT and its partners to support 2,800+ residents across Cheshire and Warrington into work which will make a really positive contribution to local communities and the regional economy."

The Building Better Opportunities programme is a key part of the Cheshire and Warrington Local Enterprise Partnership's European Funding Programme. The scheme sees the Big Lottery Fund matching funds from European Social Fund (ESF) 2014-2020, to provide joint investment in local projects that tackle poverty and promote social inclusion. Over the next few years the funding will be delivered in 38 Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) areas according to local priorities. If successful the New Leaf project would run from 2016 – 2019. GGHT and their partners will find out if they have been successful with their Stage 2 submission in 2016.



WARRINGTON residents are being given the chance to shape the future of libraries in the town as LiveWire conduct their biggest survey ever.

People who complete the survey will be entered into a free prize draw to win £100 worth of shopping vouchers to spend at Golden Square. The survey will run until 15 January, and the results will be published in late Ignuary

Council must bridge £22m gap in its budget

CASH-strapped Warrington Borough Council is working hard to bridge a £22m gap in its budget

outlining the position and the various challenges it faces to balance its books for the coming

year.

Squeezed on both sides by a combination of escalating costs and reduced funding from central government, the council has already saved more than £94 million since 2010.

Town Hall chiefs say that among other things, the bill for adult social care continues to rise while at the same time the government has again decided to award Warrington the lowest settlement funding position in the North West.

Warrington has the fifth lowest

Warrington has the fifth lowest council tax in the North West and owing to the two per cent referendum limit, is only able to raise its Band D council tax by £24.11 compared to neighbouring Stockport who can charge an additional £27.94 for a Band D



This discrepancy compared to other local authorities equates to a shortfall of £34m, Warrington

says.
The council adopted an outcomes based budgeting approach in 2014/15 and says this has proven effective in providing a long term strategic and sustainable financial

plan. It will enable the council to operate in a way that works better, costs less and focuses on delivering outcomes which put residents first. It puts accountability and innovations at the heart of what the council does and is focused around its pledges of "Growing a Strong Warrington"

The council will consult on the proposals before a second report goes to the scrutiny committee in early February, ahead of the full council meeting at the end of that

Cllr Russ Bowden (pictured), lead member for corporate finance said: "Yet again the council is facing a challenging budget and some tough decisions will need to be

assured that we are working hard to identify every practical way of delivering on our pledges of growing a strong Warrington.

"We have a track record of innovation and delivering value for money and I'm confident that will continue that despite the will continue that despite challenging budget position."

UTC champion Lord Baker visits new University Technical College

University (UTCW) WARRINGTON'S Technical College (UTCW) received a visit from former Conservative Education Secretary and UTC champion Lord Baker as he attended the site of the new facility being built on Dallam Lane

in Warrington town centre.
As co-tounder and Chairman
of the Baker Dearing Trust, (an educational trust that was set up in 2009 to promote the establishment of University Technical Colleges in England), the purpose of Lord Baker's visit was two-fold; to see Warrington's new cutting edge educational institution, that when it open sit to students in September 2014 will residue the students of the second state of the second 2016 will specialise in engineering and energy, and secondly to meet and present to a number of the UTC's employment partners and prospective students.

prospective students.

During his visit Lord Baker met with the UTC's employment partners, including representatives from Sellafield Ltd, Manchester Metropolitan University, Atkins, Nuvia, Tenet Consultants, Warrington & Co, Flamefast, National Nuclear Laboratories, National Decommissioning National Decommissioning

Authority and ISG.
Lord Baker then took part in an open discussion with the employment partners about the benefits and opportunities that UTCs can provide to students in



preparing them for the world of work and in working towards achieving productive careers. This was then followed by a meet and greet session with a small number

of prospective students.

With the launch of the Baker
Dearing Educational Trust Lord
Baker pioneered the idea of
"career colleges" that would provide technical education for 14 – 19 years, enabling them to access training and educational in a wide range of subjects including construction, healthcare, catering with many UTCs, such as Warrington, specialising in the

"STEM" core subjects of Science, Technology, Engineering Maths.

Construction of the new £10 million, 620-place UTCW began in July 2015. Located in the heart of Warrington within the Stadium Quarter, UTCW will have excellent access to rail and bus networks. Completion of the build is scheduled for the summer of 2016.

UTCW is Manchester sponsored Metropolitan University and local employers.
UTCW will specialise in energy and engineering and will offer an outstanding opportunity for the young people of Warrington and the wider region to work with major energy and engineering employers based in the town. The aim of UTCW is to integrate technical, practical and academic learning and create an environment where students can thrive and develop the abilities that industry needs. Lord Baker said: "This was a

wonderful opportunity to visit the UTC Warrington site. Next time I visit I am looking forward to seeing the completed facility and meeting the students. UTC's prepare the students for work, teaching skills that mix the brain and the hand. Students leave work ready. Of the 1700 students in the UK who graduated this year 99 – 100% have now found employment".

Principal and Chief Executive of UTCW, Lee Barber said: "Lord Roker's visit to University Technology

Introduction

Chairman and Chief Executive's Report

In mission terms, Warrington Disability Partnership (WDP) and our social enterprise the Disability Trading Company (DTC) continue to deliver a wide range of high quality mobility and independent living services.

Our performance against contracts is subject to regular inspection, and it is satisfying to report that we have continued to receive excellent outcome results. Our financial position has improved thanks to increased self-generated income from DTC and an excellent year of fundraising and community engagement.

WDP as it is today is a charity which has an excellent team of staff, volunteers and trustees, as well as a substantial customer base. During the past 24 years we have benefitted from the selfless involvement of hundreds of people. It would be easy to forget, given our present size, with over 50 staff and 200 volunteers, just how much voluntary effort went into the early years.

The reason for reflection on those early pioneering efforts – which shaped the charity's mission and its early direction – is because, regrettably, two very significant people from that era have passed away in the past year – and it is appropriate to acknowledge their major contribution. Two of the founders, Alan Shaw and Eric James sadly passed away. Alan played a critical role in the development of our disability information systems, and Eric was fundamental in us establishing Shopmobility and our Market Information Point.

Sadly we also lost one of our longest serving volunteers Terry Gatley earlier this year. October and November this year tested the teams' resilience when we also lost Elaine Ives, Julia Derbyshire, Andrea Glenn, Richard Ward and Marie Whitfield. Their passing has been felt by everyone involved in WDP.

Other major changes saw the two of us taking up new roles, (John) moving from being a Patron to Chairman and (Dave) resigning as Chairman to apply, and after successful recruitment, take up the post of Chief Executive.

As we head towards our 25th Anniversary Year we would like to thank everyone involved in 'Team WDP' for their valued support. We would also like to thank our partners, our funders, supporters and customers.

We are mindful of future challenges, in a climate of continuing funding pressures and strong competition for corporate support. This environment makes us mindful of following a commercial/social enterprise approach, albeit, we will stay consistent with our values.

Together with other members of our Board and Senior Management Team we are committed to closely monitoring our strategic direction, and we are confident that we will continue to thrive in the deliverance of our mission.

Volunteer spotlight:

Colin Whitfield

From competing as a Welsh international at the World Curling Championships in Prague to singing on the pitch at Wembley Stadium at the Rugby League Challenge Cup Final 2015, proud husband and father Colin Whitfield - aged 59 - exemplifies WDP's 'can do' philosophy.

A wheelchair user for more than 40 years, Colin has physical disabilities and experience of mental ill-health. He first met Dave at Warrington Sports Club in 1991. "He asked me: 'What do you do during the week?'" recalls Colin. "I started as a volunteer at Warrington Disability Information Service, which would go on to become WDP. Since then I've had many roles - including Access Advisor to the Head of Cheshire Disability's Federation. I'm a 'Jack of all trades'.

'When I'm not directing traffic at Disability Awareness Day (DAD), you'll find me performing in the Arts Marquee with Warrington Community Choir - Wired for

Sound. I love everything about it! The dynamics... the crescendo... My favourite song that we do is One Day Like



This by Elbow."

Colin's curling career started in familiar fashion... "I was asked: 'What do you do on Monday nights?'" he laughs. Five years on, he now captains the international team, which practises weekly at Deeside Leisure Centre. It's a passion he shares with his wife Ann, aged 45, who he met at Beaufort Street. "She came in to WDP for some advice and we just hit it off," says Colin. The couple married last year. "It was the highlight of my life," he adds. "That, and the birth of my daughter, Hannah - now 15. Ann is a 'curling convert' and Secretary of our club!"

Looking ahead to our 25th anniversary, Colin is hopeful about the legacy appeal: "We've gone from being a purely voluntary organisation to a place of employment; a support network to help our service users towards employment too," he says. "The appeal is about empowering

the next generation of young disabled people to carry our work and values forward."

Volunteer spotlight:

Enid & Tony Newens

Mother-and-son team Enid and Tony Newens, from Latchford

Hard-working Tony, aged 55, has found new life after redundancy - becoming a much-valued WDP volunteer, along with his doting mum Enid, aged 76.

"Tony was made redundant from his job at a steelworks in 2008," she recalls. "He has learning difficulties, is diabetic and has lost 70 percent of his hearing. The Job Centre told us about WDP's computing courses. Tony has panic attacks, so I asked if I could sit in the building to be near him. The course tutor said I may as well do the course too! 'Computers for the Terrified' was our first taster. Learning about spellcheck was life-changing for Tony, who has Dyslexia."

Fast-forward to today; Enid and Tony are a 'hands-on' addition to the Administration Team - helping out with crucial fundraising tasks, such as event publicity mailouts and folding raffle tickets.

"We've been wrapping gifts for Santa's Grotto, and I have used my learning from the computer courses to help Tom Coleridge out with his accessibility audits," adds Enid. "We support all the events like A Walk in the Park and, of course, DAD.

'Losing my lovely husband of 47 years, Arthur, was devastating. Our WDP 'family' has become a lifeline for me and Tony. At a time when others were focused on what they thought Tony couldn't do, WDP took the time to ask him what he could do. That's a lovely legacy after 25 years."



Disability Awareness Day 2015: Highlights and Special Thanks

Against the backdrop of a new Head Steward, two new Deputy Head Stewards, a new Sports Zone Co-ordinator, and 28 new Volunteer Stewards, our Founder - and now Chief Executive Officer - Dave Thompson MBE DL declared Disability Awareness Day (DAD) 2015 'without doubt one of the best yet'.

Disability Trading Company — an inspirational story of success

A little over four years ago the internationally acclaimed Warrington Disability Partnership (WDP) launched their trading arm the 'Disability Trading Company' (DTC).

Founder and Chief Executive of WDP Dave Thompson MBE DL explained what led to the decision to extend the charity to include a trading initiative.

"Whilst reviewing our 5 year strategy we realised that to maintain the range of services we were offering, which included a team of over 40 paid staff and nearly 200 volunteers, we would need to find new ways of generating income. It was clear to see that statutory services were looking to make radical cuts to their contracts with 3rd sector groups".

The Department of Health guidance titled Transforming Community Equipment Services provided the opportunity for WDP to create an arm's length trading arm that is built on the philosophy of a true social enterprise, with the needs of disabled customers at its heart. We also received the support and encouragement of senior leaders from local and regional health & social care sectors.

In October 2011 we opened our first Mobility & Independent Living Store (MILS) in the Golden Square Shopping Mall in Warrington Town Centre. This was achieved in a partnership with the centre owners.

Our second MILS opened in April 2012 in the Disabled Living Centre in Brunswick Dock, Liverpool. The service is supported by Liverpool NHS and Social Services, and its development was actively supported by local disabled people including Sir Bert Massie. Our staff have completed Trusted Assessor

Training, which enables them to undertake assessments for a range of independent living equipment including wheelchairs and specialist seating.

As part of a £1.3million refurbishment of our Warrington Centre for Independent Living we included a purpose built Workshop and Service Centre, which was to be used to maintain our Shopmobility and wheelchair loans fleet. As our MILS services have expanded, interest has grown in our repairs service, which led to an extension on the workshop. In late 2013 we launched a Mobility Aids Recycling Service which has provided the opportunity to develop a rapidly expanding second hand sales market. New for 2015 is our car adaptation service, fitting hoists, hand-controls and special seating.

The development of DTC has attracted interest from dozens of teams nationally comprising of 3rd sector groups and health and social care partners looking to establish similar services. Earlier this year several national equipment suppliers met with our management team to review partnership opportunities.

This resulted in opening a number of new accounts including being selected as the North of England official dealer for the new Roma Vida sports and recreational wheelchair.

Exhibition brings town 's past back to life



A NEW exhibition at Warrington Museum and Art Gallery brings the town's past to life – through the lenses of local photographers.



New year tax changes

Now that Christmas is over it's time to get back down to work. We are still busy sorting out the final 2015 tax returns that need to be submitted by the end of the month. But it is also time to look at the tax changes that will be taking place in April, one of the main one's for many small companies being the change in the taxation of dividends.



From April, everyone will David Watkinson and Margaret Black be entitled to receive up to \$25,000 of dividends free of tax. Above that, dividends will be taxed at a rate of at least 7.5%. As that income has already been taxed at 20% within the company then this means that the effective tax rate will be about 27% even for basic rate taxpayers. This is a substantial increase in the amount of tax payable, but there are some things that can be done to reduce the impact.

Firstly, many companies operate from premises owned by the director/shareholder. Currently, rent is frequently charged at a nominal rate, or at a rate that will result in no profit or loss after taking account of interest charged on any loan taken out to buy the property. Consideration should now be given to ensuring that any rents charged to the company are at a commercial level. Be aware, however, that the tax office will most likely look at any increase in the level of rents

to the company are at a commercial level. Be aware, however, that the tax office will most likely look at any increase in the level of rents charged very carefully.

Secondly, the £5,000 tax free allowance for dividends is per person. Therefore, if all the shares are held by one spouse then consideration should be given to transferring some of those shares to a spouse, thus ensuring that both allowances are utilised. Care must be taken, however, to ensure that any transfer is not caught by the "settlement" legislation.

Thirdly, if you are paying privately into a personal pension scheme out of net income then you should transfer those payments into a company pension scheme. Any contributions made, subject to quite substantial annual limits, will obtain full Corporation Tax relief and not attract any personal tax liability on the director as a benefit-in-kind.

Similarly, a fourth measure is to look at any life cover that is held. If you are currently paying life insurance premiums personally then you should consider changing these to a "Relevant Life Policy". Premiums are then paid by the company and are not a taxable benefit-in-kind on the director. The policy is then held in trust, so any pay-out is made directly to the director's dependents.

Finally, buy-to-let mortgages are increasingly available to limited companies. Therefore, rather than drawing a dividend to pay the deposit on a new buy-to-let property, the company could, instead, buy the property. This will avoid the dividend tax on the deposit but may result in additional tax later on. Do the maths!
