## **Grieving dad's tragic journey**

#### GRIEVING dad Adrian Derbyshire is preparing to embark on the most difficult journey of his life following the tragic death of his teenage daughter.

Julia Derbyshire was just 16 when Adrian found her body at the family home in Warrington.

He desperately battled to save her life with CPR, trying to start her heart again until the emergency services arrived. But after five days in hospital on a life support machine, Adrian had to make the heart-breaking decision for it to be switched off.

"The lack of oxygen to her brain meant she would have had no meaningful life," said Adrian, who suffers from an inoperable brain tumour and relies on a wheelchair to get about.

The irony of the situation was that Adrian, who battled on with his disability to become a medal winning Great Britain swordsman, has dedicated his life to speaking to more than 58,000 children and young people in schools and over 100,000 in communities around the ÚK as an anti-hate, stigma and anti-bullying campaigner, with Julia joining him on many occasions, helping spread the message to help

neiping spread the message to help save young lives. Adrian was aware his daughter had suffered years of abuse during her formative years in America and was eventually successful in bringing her "back home to Warrington" where she had appeared to have settled during the past 18 months past 18 months.

But unknown to Adrian, Julia had

a secret life – with hidden phones and a false identity as a member of website groups which promoted teenage self-harming and suicide and glorifying a "beautiful death." This secret life only became apparent when he looked through her things following her death

her things following her death. Through the Internet via phones and computers she had access to graphic and disturbing pro selfharm and pro-anorexia websites and materials.

Adrian said: "If as a trained counsellor and ambassador for anti-stigma, bullying and hate crime I was unaware of what was going on, what chance have other

parents got? "Even though I tried to prohibit unsuitable use of the internet she was able to access these through

other sources such as friends. "She was able to talk with and 'meet' strangers online who encouraged her to self-harm without thinking of the consequences. I also discovered Keyboard Warriors' and 'Trolls' who criticised her online.

Through social media she was able to create an online persona who she created to be a 'bad' girl but then felt the pressure of living up to that in reality.

"She didn't talk to anyone utilise the services she had or available to her so no one was able to help her.

"I am now left wondering if I could have done more to help as a father and through mental health services and school etc. She was clearly deeply troubled due to an abusive and neglectful past. I keep asking the question was she let down?"

Now, despite, questioning his own mortality, Adrian has made the difficult decision to continue on his anti-hate and anti-bullying campaign and will include his daughter's name in a new campaign attached to his own charity which he was in the process of setting up.

"I can certainly tell any young person out there, there is nothing beautiful about self-harming and taking your own life," added Adrian. "I now plan to keep Julia's name

alive raising awareness about the problems of teen self-harming and suicides and providing support for families who have gone through something like this, as from my own experiences there is certainly a lack of a support network due to the pressures teens face online.

## David writes 'In The Name of Ali'

DESCRIBED by boxing legend Muhammad Ali as his "greatest fan" former Warrington amateur boxer David Leigh has written a book about the boyhood hero he has met seven times.

"In the name of Ali" is a rhyming biography of all of Muhammad Ali's 62 professional fights, including one tough exhibition contest, including key episodes to contest, including key episodes to define the man many acclaim to be the "greatest boxer of all time."


David, first became aware of Ali through his late father Ken, and still runs the family motor mechanic business Ken Léigh Motors at Bruche.

David was aged just eleven when his father sat him down to watch the Ali v Jerry Quarry contest in October 1970. David was so impressed he took up the sport as an amateur at the Raven Boxing Club.

He went on to meet Ali seven times, the first occasion as a 19-year-old in May 1979 at the Grosvenor House Hotel in London after Ali had been involved in an exhibition contest at the Royal Albert Hall. He had earlier "wrangled" his way into the boxer's dressing room the get an autograph.

The final time they met was in January 2001 at the Hilton Hotel when Ali was in London promoting a charity event.

In between meeting they have corresponded with David building up an impressive collection of autographed photographs.

## 100 empty homes to be brought back into use

MORE than 100 long-term empty properties in Warrington will be brought back into residential use over the next three years by the borough council. Fewer than 800 properties are classed as long-term empty in the borough – one of the lowest figures in the North West. But with the borough's population expected to increase to 222,000 by 2021 the council anticipates significant demand for homes, particularly in the private rented sector.

The authority's vacant homes strategy outlines proposals to bring 50 long term vacant properties back into use this year and a total of 125 by October 2019. As well as bringing properties back into residential use, the council is also targeting eyesores that blight neighbourhoods and attract anti-social behaviour behaviour.

Clir Maureen McLaughlin, lead member for public health and wellbeing, said: "Demand for housing in Warrington is only going to increase, so it's right that we should be focusing on turning empty houses into decent homes. We want to ensure that everyone has access to a decent and affordable home.


"Empty dwellings, especially those that are poorly maintained, can also cause significant problems for neighbours and wider communities. We'll use

the full range of powers at our disposal to tackle the problem." Government grants have enabled the council, in partnership with Warrington Housing Association, to establish a low-cost loan scheme to help property owners carry out repair works and bring them back into use. The council will also work with local registered providers to gain further funding for the purchase and renovation of long term vacant dwellings.

"I will be sending him a copy of the book for his birthday," said David, who admits that his love affair with the sport is now over.

## More affordable homes coming to Warrington

Northwest housing group Torus is set to build more new affordable homes in Warrington.

The group, a partnership between Golden Gates Housing Trust and Helena Partnerships, is actively making good its promise to deliver new homes in the region.

Torus group chief executive, Rob Young said: "The UK is experiencing a massive shortage of affordable homes. We are committed to developing homes in the right places and at the right price, for rent or sale at genuinely affordable prices."

Current projects include a £10 million development of over 100

homes on a former brownfield site near Marsden Avenue, Latchford. The derelict land, once redeveloped will house 64 two and three bedroom homes for affordable rent and a further 40 two and three bedroom homes for sale through shared ownership. Phase one is due for release in July 2016.

The transformation of Harrison Square, Dallam starts in April this year. The construction of 24 bungalows and two bedroom homes for affordable rent along with two retail units, is part of the

wider 'Delivering Wellbeing in Bewsey and Dallam' initiative. The development will replace a number of disused shops. Once completed the homes will be available for affordable rent through GGHT.

These two major projects come hot on the heels of completed developments in Orford and Howley. Priced for first time buyers,

growing families or people looking to downsize, a collection of newly released three bedroom homes are available at Howley Meadows, Howley Quay. Offered for sale using Government backed Shared Ownership, also known as part buy, part rent, prices for a 50% share of a three bed riverside

property start at £77,000. Orford saw the development of 18 two and three bedroom homes on Howson Road. The Edenhall Grove development was available for affordable rent and was built to appeal to small families, growing families and those keen to downsize. Due to its success it was fully allocated within weeks of completion.

Mayor 'de-selected' by Labour Party

## WARRINGTON'S Mayor, Cllr Geoff Settle, has been 'de-selected' by the Labour Party and will be standing down as a councillor ahead of the all-out May elections.

What is a slipped disc?

The shock decision, by national party officials, has surprised local councillors and party workers.

But Cllr Settle - who has proved a popular Mayor – says he is not bitter and sees his de-selection as

an opportunity. He said: "I have no problems with anyone locally – in fact no problems with anyone. I just failed an interview, probably because of the way I answered one question. I could have appealed and got in. "But I thought about it and

decided it was time to go. I am 62, I will have been on the council for six years and I think the time is

"I am involved with so many other organisations and charities that I will still have plenty to do." The Poulton North councillor says

his Mayoral and council duties can take up to 90 hours a week. He will have attended about 500 events as Mayor by the time he finishes and has already raised about £5,000

for the Mayor's charities. "The Mayoress, my wife Jean, and I have thoroughly enjoyed the Mayoral year and will continue working hard for the town until our

year of office ends. " Cllr Settle swiftly became known as Warrington's first digital Mayor, because of the way he kept in touch with the public through social media.

He also became famous for "Teddy George" – the teddy bear he took to many engagements and which he found a useful fundraising aid. "If I go somewhere without him

now, people ask me where he is" he laughed Cllr Settle believes he will

be able to devote more time to helping charity groups and other organisations he is connected with to cope with the difficulties that have arisen due to financial cutbacks.

He has known about his deselection since last year but has only now decided to announce it.

The term 'slipped disc' is recognised by most people, but it is actually a rather inaccurate term, as discs cannot actually slip out of place. While it is possible for them to wear, split or herniate, they can't slip!

So, what exactly are discs? The spine is made of a series of bones, the vertebrae, which can bend and twist because there are flexible, shock-absorbing 'cushions' between each of the bones. These are discs.

A normal, healthy disc is very strong. It is stronger than the vertebrae itself. If you have a vertebrae itself. If you have a compression injury in a healthy spine it is more likely to cause a fracture of the vertebrae rather than a disc intervent a disc injury. However, over time as the disc

undergoes wear and tear following cumulative strain from repeated bending, twisting, lifting, and even prolonged sitting, the strong fibres of the outer disc can tear, allowing 'leakage' of the nucleus out of the centre of the disc. This is known as and sometimes put pressure on the spinal nerve that runs next to the

disc, resulting in leg pain (sciatica) if it affects the discs in the lower back, or arm pain if it affects the discs in the neck.

a disc herniation. This 'leaked' material may then cause an inflammatory reaction

How can you prevent this?

- sitting, Avoid prolonged bending, twisting and carrying.
- Avoid prolonged driving. Improve physical fitness through exercise.
- Improve core stability through specific exercises.
  - Avoid smoking.

If exercising regularly, it is also important to avoid exercises that involve repeated bending and twisting, especially whilst sitting. Sit-ups and twisting stretches of the back are not as good as people might think!

# Oldest Masonic Lodge donates £14,800 to charity

## WARRINGTON'S oldest Masonic Lodge, launched the same year as Lord Nelson's HMS Victory, celebrated its 250th anniversary by donating nearly $\pounds14,800$ to charity.

The Lodge of Lights No 148 were highly honoured by the presence of the Deputy Grand Master, Jonathan Spence and the Provincial Grand Master, Tony Harrison who joined over 150 Masons, at the anniversary event at the masonic hall on Winmarleigh Street.

Gwilym Jones, a senior member of the lodge, rose to give a short history of the lodge. An excellent oration was delivered by Rev Canon Godfrey Hirst, which was concluded with a solemn prayer of rededication.

Stanley then presented charity donations to Tony, to the grand total of £14,800 which was the target the lodge had adopted some time ago, being the lodge's number with two zeros added

two zeros added! Response by Tony was initially complete silence, which later at the social board he referred to as: "being gobsmacked". Upon regaining his thoughts he said he was: "speechless to receive such truly magnificent charity donations and the largest he had ever received". He continued by saying it would give him great pleasure to hand the cheques to the recipients and thanked the lodge for their tremendous generosity. An excellent five course

An excellent five course celebratory banquet followed supplied by the Masonic hall staff, which was enjoyed by all.

In response to the toast to the grand officers, Jonathan began by relating some of the events occurring in 1765, the year of the lodge's consecration. A year when the HMS Victory, ship of the Royal Navy was launched. She is best known as Lord Nelson's flagship at the Battle of Trafalgar.

Tony also presented a history booklet to all present and recommended its perusal saying it was very informative and thanked all the brethren who had brought the booklet to its present published form.

Tony continued by saying the brethren in 1765 could not have foreseen the future leading to this sestercentennial celebration event. He congratulated the lodge on its achievements thanking the lodge members for the support they have given down the years and continued to give to the Warrington group today.

Tony went on to give an account of some the historical events happening in the year when the lodge was consecrated: "Back in 1765, George the third was on the throne of this country. His reign was blighted by mental instability as depicted in the film The madness of King George`. This lodge was consecrated 50 years before Waterloo!

Tony continued: In 1865 when the lodge celebrated its centenary the year that was dominated by the American Civil war which ended on 23 June. It is interesting to note that the last act of that war occurred nearly five months later when on 7 November that year, in the River Mersey, the Confederate ship CSS Shenandoah finally surrendered her colours. On 14 April that year in the Ford Theatre, Washington, Abraham Lincoln was assassinated by John Wilkes Booth. It was also the year that the New York Stock Exchange was founded, as was HSBC and the Salvation Army.

In 1965, the lodge celebrated its bi-centenary, the 'Swinging Sixties', were well established and it was the year that saw the death of this country's greatest statesman Winston Churchill. In America,



the Vietnam War had begun, and racial tension was being fuelled by marches of the civil rights movements.

Having been consecrated in 1765 the lodge has existed under the reign of two of the longest serving Monarchs, Queen's Victoria and Elizabeth. There have been nine others, three of whom were either Grand Master or Past Grand Master. The lodge has survived 35 major conflicts, witnessed man take to the air and land on the moon and goodness knows what else in terms of life on earth. It has witnessed the greatest advancement in technology in every possible dimension. The lodge has been in existence for a total of 91,325 days. If you have had eight meetings a year for 250 years that means there have been 2,000 meetings, which means that the lodge could easily have had 60,000 brethren attending meetings.

meetings. He closed by proposing a toast to the Lodge of Lights No148. Stan Churm, responded to the

Stan Churm, responded to the toast, explaining and confirming that he was not a founder member but the most senior one!

He said the membership of the lodge stood at 41 with two candidates in the pipeline. He felt confident about the lodge's future. In conclusion Stan said that the lodge was continuing on the very solid foundation placed 250 years ago.

### Adopted Police rescue dog helping to sniff out trouble

A POLICE dog "adopted" from a rescue centre just three months ago is now helping enforce a Warrington college's zero tolerance policy on drug use.

Eighteen-month-old Springer Spaniel Rufus – a passive scanning dog – was given a guided tour of one of his new beats at Warrington Collegiate's Winwick Road campus by Health and Safety Officer Gary Lindsay.

## Finance Bill 2016

Many people operate their business through a limited company. Whilst one reason for choosing to do so is to reduce their tax liability, there are a large number of other reasons why they may wish to do so.

Last month we looked at the new rules regarding the taxation of dividends and possible ways in which the effects could be mitigated. However, whatever the



However, whatever the reason David Watkinson and Margaret Black was for operating through a company, these new rules could have a large effect on the proprietor's taxation and net income. But there are further changes that could have an impact on the owner of a small limited company.

Proceeds from the disposal of shares is a capital receipt and subject to Capital Gains Tax. The rates of CGT are substantially lower than Income Tax especially if Entrepreneurs Relief is available, which it would generally be to a small businessman. This difference will be even greater after April when the new dividend rules come into play. It has always been the case that the final transfer of funds from the company to the shareholder when the company is dissolved is taxed as the proceeds of disposal of the shares rather than a distribution,

and therefore enjoying the more favourable tax rate. The Finance Bill 2016 introduces measures that change this treatment in certain circumstances and which will mean that large cash sums taken on the winding up of a company may be liable to Income Tax rather than the more favourable Capital Gains Tax. This change will apply if after receiving the payment the shareholder is involved in a similar trade within 2 years. The abuse that this measure is intended to counter is where someone retains cash within the company, liquidates the company which then distributes the cash, and the recipient subsequently sets up a new company and repeats the process. Many people would not necessarily disagree with this. However, not only are there many commercial reasons that may explain this sequence, but also the government is looking to widen the impact, and it is this potential wider impact that is most worrying. However, it is not all bad news. Rumours were rife before Christmas that the government intended to introduce measures to force contractors to be put on a client's payroll if they were working for the same client for more than a month. This first appeared in a couple of newspapers, and caused such consternation that an online petition to parliament was raised. The good news is that no such measure measure is intended to counter is where someone retains cash within

to parliament was raised. The good news is that no such measure appears in the Finance Bill. But there is never smoke without fire, so keep watching this space!

## **Death of former** full-back and Coach

## WARRINGTON Wolves former full-back and Coach Brian Johnson has died in Australia following a long battle with Alzheimer's disease.

The popular full-back was Head Coach at the club from 1988 to 1996 and led Warrington to a Challenge Cup Final in 1990 against Wigan at Wembley.

Johnson, aged 59, joined Warrington as a player in 1985 from St George in Australia, playing more than 100 games including in the Premiership Final victory over Halifax at Elland Road in 1986 – scoring a memorable try.

Final victory over Halifax at Elland Road in 1986 – scoring a memorable try. The Wolves released the following statement. It is with great sadness that Warrington Wolves learned of the passing of former full-back and coach Brian Johnson, who died on Monday 11 January. He died peacefully at home surrounded by family and friends. Brian was born in Dapto a suburb of Wollongong in the Illawarra region of New South Wales. He played for the local junior club and was selected for the New South Wales Country team in 1978. He then joined St George in 1979 and was at full-back in their Grand Final winning side that year. He scored a try as the Harry Bath coached Dragons defeated Canterbury 17-13.

17-13. He developed into an exciting attacking player who was a frequent try-scorer from full-back. In six seasons at St George he scored 54 tries in 144 appearances. In 1980 he was the Dally M Fullback of the year. He joined Warrington in September 1985 and in only his second game for the club scored a spectacular 70 yard try. This was the opening score of the Lancashire Cup Final, which Warrington lost to Wigan. By the end of his first season at Wilderspool Brian was scoring in Warrington's Premiership Final win over Halifax. He once again scored a long range spectacular try, after coming on a a substitute after coming on as a substitute. He returned to Australia at the end of the season and played 12 matches

for Eastern Suburbs, scoring two tries. Now 30 Brian returned to Wilderspool and made 51 consecutive appearances at full-back. That spell included three finals, all unfortunately lost to Wigan. They were the 1986 Lancashire Cup Final, 1987 Premiership Final and the 1987 John Player Final.

Such was Brian's attacking prowess that he scored a record 25 tries from full-back during the 1986/7 season, in which he made 39 appearances. At the end of the 1987/8 season Brian retired. His final appearance was as a substitute in the Premiership semi-final loss at Widnes on 8 May 1988. Brian made 103 appearances for The Wire, including 3 as a substitute and scored 48 triac scored 48 tries.

By the autumn of 1987 Brian was helping with the coaching as an assistant to Tony Barrow. When Tony left in November 1988 Brian was a popular replacément.

As coach Johnson guided Warrington to two trophies the Lancashire Cup in 1989 and Regal Trophy in 1991. He also took Warrington to Wembley in 1990 and the 1995 Regal Trophy final, when yet again Warrington lost

to Wigan. In 1993/4 Warrington finished top of the league for a day after beating Sheffield, before Wigan's defeat of Oldham gave them the title on points difference.

difference. In January 1996 Brian resigned as coach after a humiliating 80-0 defeat at St Helens in the Regal Trophy semi-final. This brought the curtain down on a 10-year career at Wilderspool, three as a player and seven as a coach. Brian was always popular with fans and players alike. Brian and his family returned to Australia and he took up teaching. His skills were not lost to Rugby League and he became head coach of the Australian Institute of Sport Rugby League team. He returned to the UK many times bringing over his young teams of future Rugby League stars. He always made sure that he popped into Wilderspool and the The Halliwell Jones Stadium to see his friends at Warrington. "The club and Players' Association pass on their condolences to Brian's wife Karen and two sons Brett and Liam."
