Here at warrington-worldwide we will continue to follow the club home and away throughout the season, giving extensive coverage online.



Warrington Town crowned league champions in emphatic fashion

WARRINGTON Town created history as the club secured the league title in emphatic fashion, thrashing Prescot Cables 6-1 in front of a packed Cantilever Park

The Yellows will now compete in the Evo-Stik Premier League next season - the highest level the club, formed in 1949, has ever played at. The title success was the first for the

club since 2001 and follows many years hard work behind the scenes.

The league's top scorer, and Town captain, Čiaran Kilheeney broke the deadlock on 13 minutes with his 39th goal of the season.

When Scott Metcalfe doubled the lead two minutes later, the atmosphere amongst the 1411-strong crowd turned in to a carnival one.

Needing just a point to guarantee top spot and promotion it ultimately didn't matter as closest challengers Spennymoor Town were beaten by Northwich Victoria.

The third goal came shortly after the half hour mark when midfielder

Gerard Kinsella found the back of the net at the second attempt as the ball bounced around the goalmouth.

Home crowd favourite, Warrington born Chris Gahgan made it 4-0 at the break

Prescot got on the scoresheet nine minutes in to the second half but that proved a mere blotch on the Town copybook, and they added a further two goals later on through centre-half Daniel O'Donnell and skipper Kilheeney with his 40th goal of the season.

The celebrations continued well

into the night and the following evening when Warrington picked up numerous awards at the Evo-Stik Player awards night. Keeper Karl Wills, centre half

James McCarten and skipper Kilheeney were all named in the team of the year - with Kilheeney also being crowned league Player of the season, rounding off an excellent weekend for the club.

ypnotes monthly column . . . by Michael Mahoney Relationships

Personal relationships are our greatest gift, where we learn about ourselves as well as the other person. We connect with certain people for a reason, not by accident, sometimes temporarily or for a lifetime.

Our choice of partner or friends is influenced by our relationship with our parents, our childhood experiences and even the relationships and life experiences of our ancestors.

Relationships can be rewarding but also extremely painful, and it is at our most difficult times when our most important lessons are learnt. No matter how much we may resist the difficulties and changes circumstances imposed on us, it is through these difficulties and challenges where we discover the depth and meaning of the relationship and our own values and our strengths and weaknesses as an individual or within the relationship. Even if we only connect with someone for a short period of time, we always take something away from that connection, and have learnt something important about ourselves, even if we are not aware of it at the time. We tend to be attracted to someone

who may mirror either or both positive and negative aspects of ourselves and can also reflect the areas in our lives that we need to improve or change. We can also be attracted to familiarity, i.e. a partner who reminds us of a parent, however, this can be experienced negatively as well as positively as many people attract people into their lives who treat them badly or are abusive to them, if that is something that they have experienced in childhood. This is because we tend to attract what we think we deserve, or subconsciously the issues we need to work on. For instance, if you are a very passive and submissive individual and allow others to walk all over you, then perhaps the lesson here is to work on your confidence and self-esteem in order to become more assertive.

When things go wrong in a relationship, both parties need to step back to assess what the relationship is teaching them, what they are getting out of it, and what experience they are giving the other person. However many people rarely do that, and continue to repeat the same patterns of behaviour. It is often when a person chooses to leave the relationship that they can then reflect on what has been the problem and ensure that the next relationship will be different. However, many people are unaware of why they repeat the same mistakes in relationships as they may always blame the other person, and

Solar installation should make £642,860 in 20 years

INSTALLATION of a solar photovoltaic array on the roof of a building on Warrington's Omega development site will cost £821,000 – but should earn the borough council at least £642,860 "profit" over the next 20 years. The revenue generated will be used to support essential services, reduce CO2 emissions equivalent over 20 years to the average annual emissions of more than 1,000 Warrington residents, provide a substantial energy supply independent of the national electrical network and provide environmental and economic benefits through the use of zero carbon energy. The installation will be placed on the roof of a distribution centre owned and operated by the Plastic Omnium Group'

Group'


Omega is regarded as an ideal location for the installation of solar photovoltaics, with large roofed building not over-shadowed by surrounding buildings or trees. In addition, the electrical network in the area is newly installed and very robust. The building itself was designed so that solar panels could be installed on its roof. The project should provide a minimum return of £7,622 in its first year, according to Cllr Russ Bowden, the

council's lead member for corporate finance. After 20 years, the solar panels should still be producing electricity at 80 per cent of their original rating so will remain a valuable asset.

It is anticipated the installation can be commissioned and in use by June or July. Because of the height of the building, the panels will not be visible from neighbouring buildings nor by nearby residents.

Spring has sprung in Warrington

SPRING has definitely sprung in Warrington as we at Warrington & Co. look forward to the new ventures and regeneration projects that are continuing to take shape across the town.

The Base – Warrington's brand new, £8.5 million office space that has been developed by Warrington & Co., on behalf of Warrington Borough Council has only been open for ten weeks and already the interest in companies wanting to take space within the building is encouragingly high.

Earlier this month we welcomed Carpe Diem and R & O Tax Company The Base's first tenants and others

Another new announcement for Warrington came this month when Warrington Borough Council (WBC) proudly revealed the striking new brand identity that will be used for the £107 million re-development of the Time Square and Warrington Market area of the town centre, formerly known as the Bridge Street Regeneration Scheme. WBC's flagship scheme's new visual identity and brand name will be based around the name Time

Square - retaining the existing name of part of the site. The regeneration of the area

marks an exciting new chapter for Warrington town centre and it was felt that it deserved an appropriately fresh, strong new look that accurately reflects what Warrington town centre has to offer and compliments Warrington are and compliments

centre has to ofter and compliments Warrington as a modern, sociable and exciting destination. The scheme is progressing well with planning approval granted last month for the construction of the scheme's new, 1,160 space multi storey car-park, the construction contract for which we are pleased to say has been awarded to a local company.

to say has been awarded to a local company. The mighty Omega has also made announcements including Domino's Pizza signing up for a £30 million, 100,000 sq. ft. supply chain unit that, subject to planning, will create around 130 jobs for the area if approved and also Omega Warrington Limited's (OWL) intention to construct a 100,000 sq. ft. spec build unit. 2016 will also see the Travis Perkins Facility, The HUT Group, Plastic Omnium and Asda, all become operational. Construction of the University Technical College Warrington is also well underway. The £10 million educational facility that sits adjacent

What's happening with Twitter?

#RIPTWITTER - a worldwide trend #RIPWITTER – a wondwide trend that started with a rumour that Twitter was changing its layout and adding an algorithm to show relevancy over recency. Outrage has ensued since. I'd imagine a few agencies have put in a bit of overtime to work out what the potential change means for their matication glace. Layon means for their marketing plans. I even got approached for a soundbite by an American journalist for CBS News!

The rumour has now become reality and it could have implications for your

social media marketing efforts. Ignoring the decisions of Twitter to become like a hybrid Facebook – the character limit increase and the timeline changes – you might think that it's becoming a 'big brand' paid advertising network. But ignore the death knells from the recent reports about user growth stagnating and diving share prices -Twitter's not going anywhere for a while vet

Regarding the change on Twitter -the relevancy of a tweet shouldn't matter too much to you. Yes there's a lot of time and energy spent into perfecting the perfect

time to tweet to your audience. But if you make sure your audience. But in you make sure your audience is clearly defined, your content is perfectly matched to them and your individual tweets are engaging to your market then you should still reach a lot of people. It's something you should be doing now, so it's not going to alter after this change to alter after this change.

So I'm not going to bang on too much about Twitter. But if you have all your social media marketing eggs in one basket, it might be time to look at some other options.

Now more than ever requires you to make sure that you are on the right platform for your audience. It's probably basic thinking but it's so important. Look at your audience to determine which are the best channels for you. If one you're on is performing poorly compared to the others work out if it's time to put it to one side and spend more time on the rest.

Reviewing your social funnel

Reviewing your social funnel The customer journey – every part of it – should be planned out. Do you have contact details on your bio? Does your landing page match the message you send out? You want your customer to take action – so make sure that it's as easy as possible for them to do this. From seeing a post on your account to the final step

it should be simple and well thought out. It's important you keep a lookout for the next big thing. Instagram should now be a 'primary' platform – something you should automatically think about being on. For retail Pinterest as a selling platform

is something you should be looking as vital for your marketing efforts. Periscope, Snapchat, Meerkat – the list of new platforms is endless. So keep an eye on these and if you're the first on there ahead of your competitors you can wickly become a leader on it

quickly become a leader on it. So it's not quite #RIPTWITTER just yet, it's about adding a defib to kickstart adaptable plans.



Rare bird makes it home near historic canal

AN increasingly rare bird has made its home at Warrington's historic New Cut Canal.

The Willow Tit was once a common sight in the British countryside but is estimated to have

countryside but is estimated to have suffered a near 90 per cent decline since 1970 with less than 3,500 breeding pairs in the country. It has declined so much that it merits a red alert from the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds. Members of the New Cut Heritage and Ecology Trail Group are delighted the Willow Tit has made its home in the heavily wooded section of the New Cut Canal at Paddington. Sightings are all the more

Sightings are all the more remarkable because the canal formerly part of the historic Mersey and Irwell Navigation - has been abandoned for decades and has a polluted bed resulting from the Industrial Revolution.

Willow trees have colonised the area close to the River Mersey – and Willow Tits like habitats that have a good tree canopy and are dark and damp.

They feed on insects, seeds and berries and are a similar size to the Blue Tit, a species that frequently competes with the Willow Tit for nesting sites. The canal has, since 2002,

been progressively improved by Warrington Borough Council and more recently by the newly formed

Member Lynda Eagan said: "It is marvellous to think that this important stretch of historic canal has new life both as a nature reserve and an area of recreation. This new and an area of recreation. This new discovery provides more evidence of value to the environment that Warrington's wonderful waterway history provides." Group press officer Anne Price added: "Local residents first alerted us to the possible presence of the species and now they have been even one in the aroun is

of the locations to be surveyed as part of a co-ordinated surveillance

of this species. "The survey is being undertaken as part of the Carbon Landscape project under the guidance of Lancashire, Manchester and North Merseyside Wildlife Trust."

The survey has already recorded sightings of one bird, plus information of confirmed sightings of at least three additional birds seen on other occasions

Lottery bid to create living history of Burtonwood airbase

As time passes these stories, anecdotes and verbal histories are being lost forever so archiving these precious memories is of real importance to the history of the town and beyond. The Imperial War Museum are supporting the bid and have offered to host the recordings area created recordings once created.

Strategic Director Stephen Tasker said: "The Oral history recording project is being enthusiastically received – the more support we can get the greater the probability of making this happen. "The project is to be maintained by The Imperial War Museum and will be available on line and in the

"We have recordings planned with veterans attending a reunion in May- several coming from the USA – the oldest is aged 94 and served in WWII.

"We would welcome contact from local people associated with the base, not only military, who would have an interest to

participate." RAF Burtonwood has α fascinating history and is inextricably linked to the lives of many Warrington people. Over 7500 marriages were conducted during the airbases operational lifespan and a genuine Nissan hut was acquired by the Burtonwood association from near Gatwick and relocated and converted into a chapel where a wonderful exhibit of GI brides memorabilia can be viewed including a selection of genuine GI brides dresses.

Centre manager, Roy Thorpe Apps, conducts tours and talks to many groups including local schools, interest groups and of course many ex-servicemen who come to revisit their old base. A lot of the articles on display have been donated by local people and the Association are always on the look out for more donations from people who come across relevant items in their attics.

There are also regular dances where you can turn back the clock and enjoy an evening of entertainment.

Crime prevention scheme saves estimated £2.5m

A CRIME prevention campaign is celebrating its first anniversary and bringing peace of mind to thousands of potential victims in Warrington and across Cheshire.

When Operation Shield was launched last year, it placed a protective shield around homes and businesses, making life tough for criminals and sending out a message that their activities will not be tolgrated in Checking be tolerated in Cheshire.

De rolerarea in Cheshire. Since then thousands of homeowners have been issued with SelectaDNA home property marking kits, while hundreds of street signs have been rolled out across the county warning would be burglars against targeting those areas. And it appears to be working

against targeting those areas. And it appears to be working as the most recent figures released by the Office for National Statistics showed that Cheshire Constabulary had recorded a 19 per cent year-on-year fall in burglaries – the biggest drop in England and Wales. It is thought that Operation Shield has contributed significantly to this success with an estimated 1,300 fewer victims and a saving to victims of more than £2.5m in a seven-month period alone.

period alone.

Assistant Chief Constable Sarah Boycott said: "Operation Shield is not just about placing a protective shield around our homes and places of work, it is also about making its mark on those who profit from these crimes

"It has and continues to help us

build stronger and more resilient communities by making homes less attractive to those who want to cause harm, as well as playing its part in expanding schemes such as Cheshire Alert, Home Watch and Rural Watch

in our rural communities. "Having a criminal enter your home and take your possession is home and take your possession is often a very upsetting and unsettling experience. Criminals who make their living from breaking into homes and business and stealing other people's possessions now know that across Cheshire, Operation Shield will provide officers with essential evidence to bring them to justice."

will provide officers will essential evidence to bring them to justice." Operation Shield uses a forensic liquid containing DNA unique to each property. It can be used to mark belongings, allowing it to be returned to the owner no matter where it is recovered from. Offenders committing, crime, can also find committing crime can also find themselves marked with the forensic liquid – which stays on their hair, skin, and clothes and cannot be washed off.

Every person arrested in Cheshire is screened under a special ultra violet light in custody – if they have committed a crime in an Operation Shield area, they will be marked, and the unique DNA will link them directly to the individual crime scene.

Town to receive £161,000 to repair potholes

WARRINGTON is to receive £161,000 from the Government's £50 million

Pothole Action Fund. It is one of 22 councils across the North West to receive a share of £6.4 million to help remove about 121,000 potholes. Some 3,008 potholes will be filled in Warrington.

tilled in Warrington. Transport Secretary Patrick McLoughlin said: "I know how important well-maintained roads are to people across the North West. Almost every journey starts and ends on a local road, so the government is giving councils in the North West £6.4 million specifically to tackle the blight of potholes in their area. "This is just one part of our unprecedented investment in local road maintenance over the next five years. We are giving a record £625 million to local authorities in North West that will support the Northern Powerhouse and improve journeys for all."

In total, the government is spending a record £6.1 billion nationwide on local highways maintenance between 2015/16 and 2020/21, giving councils long-term certainty for the first time to plan future work with the aim of preventing potholes and improving local roads, bridges and street lighting. As part of this investment, the Pothole Action Fund will give local authorities in England £50 million a year, over the next five years, to help them tackle more than four million potholes. Funding is calculated according to the size of the local road network in the area.

early hours of February 13th after their first concert abroad.


All proceeds from the show will go to all their families.


Student radio station wins national award

Changes to tax on savings

A small change occurred at the start of the current tax year, but it is one that affects the majority of people in some way. As from 6th April 2016 banks and other savings institutions have stopped deducting tax at source. Instead, tax will be payable at the taxpayers margingl rate at the taxpayers marginal rate on interest received. However, a Personal Savings Allowance ("PSA") has been introduced as follows:



For basic rate taxpayers the first £1,000 of interest and other relevant savings interest received in any tax year will be exempt from tax. For higher rate taxpayers this allowance is reduced to £500 in any

tax year

For additional rate taxpayers, ie people with total relevant earnings in excess of £150,000, the allowance is withdrawn completely

It is estimated that this measure will remove the vast majority of savings income out of the tax net. However, it is important to bear in mind that interest has not been exempted from taxation. In certain circumstances this may lead to some surprising or unfortunate results. For instance, a married couple may have a joint bank account previously paying total net interest of £1,620. They will in future receive interest of £1,800 which, as it is divided between them equally, results in them each receiving £900. Assuming that they are both basic rate taxpayers then this will be tax free as it is below the new PSA. However, it one of the account holders dies then the whole interest will become income of the survivor, meaning that they will have a tax liability on interest of £800. Similarly, the taxpayer may be a self employed trader with a tax and national insurance liability of just under £1,000. This change in the final self-assessment tax exceeding £1,000 resulting in the tax office demanding payments on account. Whilst this does not increase the tax eventually payable it does accelerate the payment of that tax and could result in cashflow problems.

Another source of possible confusion is from a "one-off" interest receipt such as interest on compensation for PPI mis-selling. Previously, basic rate taxpayers would have no additional tax liability above that deducted at source. However, they may well now find themselves with an unexpected tax liability.

Some commentators suggested that this rule change spelt the end of the Individual Savings Accounts ("ISA"). However, by judicious use of an ISA, the interest from which is tax-free, it may be possible to avoid interest received exceeding the new PSA.
