Muddy marvels raise £200,000 at Race For Life

TWO thousand "muddy marvels" descended on Warrington's Victoria Park in a "Race for Life" helping raise £200,000 for Cancer Research UK.

It was the first time the women only event has taken place in the town and attracted people from all over Warrington and further afield.

Those taking part included local councillor Kerri Morris, fresh from her election success at Orford, alongside her sister Laura Harper, being cheered on by their parents Mike and Kate Hannon.

The 2,000 women taking part

have raised a total of £200,000 towards Cancer Research and many of those taking part in the event had been touched by cancer.

Cancer Research UK's Race for Life is an inspiring women-only series of 5k and "Pretty Muddy" events which raise millions of pounds every year to help fund lifesaving research.

nave you describing emotional similar varying as being states similar to the changes in weather patterns that happen on any given day?

on any given day?

For instance, the recent changes in our weather that occurred during the last few days of April; with the sudden shift from sunny spells then cloud, to rain and sleet, then to hail and snow, and very quickly back to sunny spells; then repeating similar patterns throughout the day. Hopefully the good feelings would remain during the day, and all experiences that day would remain positive, just like the sun shining bright positive, just like the sun sinining origin for the rest of the day. However, there may have been further difficulties to test your patience and affect your mood throughout the rest of the day, or for several days after, just like a cold front bringing wind and rain that stays around for days.

If you can relate your emotional states as being similar to the patterns of the weather, then perhaps you may recognise how quickly your emotions can shift and never stay the same for too long. Fears grow after wildlife habitat and trees destroyed

FEARS are growing over the future of a wildlife corridor on a disused railway embankment at Latchford, Warrington, following the destruction of trees.

Angry residents are now calling on Warrington Borough Council to take urgent action to ensure no further unauthorised works take place on the land which is earmarked for development.

Last year a pre-planning "scoping report" submitted by ADS Limited, outlined a proposed mixed residential and commercial development involving 280 dwellings, open space, landscaping and car parking for the land which includes an elevated disused railway line North of Station Road, which has not been in use since 1985 and has developed into semi-

natural woodland and scrub.
Local resident Thérèse Charlton
said residents of nearby Grammar School Road, were extremely concerned because trees and part of the local wildlife habitat had been destroyed prior to a planning application being received.

"We need reassurance that there

will be no further work done in a will be no time. Work doline in a similar way without proper process being followed and understand what the council has actually done to make sure this doesn't happen - saying they will monitor the situation is too vague.

"There will be strong opposition to any developer seemingly intent on ignoring regulations railroad to development through.

Local councillor Hans Mundry said: "I have asked officers to keep me informed and I have met with and talked to local residents

"I am expecting a planning application to be put forward at some point and when this happens we will hold a public meeting to hear the residents views.

"Meanwhile council will keep a check on any other work taking place on the site and use any powers they have to take enforcement action if required."

The site was visited last year

as part of a pre-planning Scoping Report by the Greater Manchester Ecology Unit.

They recommended that an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) should address various issues including the wildlife corridor, bat, badgers breeding birds, bat, badgers breeding birds, amphibians, reptiles and invasive species as well as including a general habitat assessment of the

The EIA should include full ecological surveys undertaken to an appropriate standard, fully assess the impact of the proposals on the identified features and provide full details of any mitigation/ compensation measures.

"We are aware of the recent works that have been undertaken on this plot of land and are monitoring the situation very closely.

The Angels Walk is a fundraising event established by the Harry and Co charity. The main aim of the charity is to provide support facilities to help bereaved parents following the still birth or neo-natal death of their baby.

Kate said: "Our Angels' Walk is important to us and other families as it gives those affected by the loss of a baby the opportunity to share with others their experiences and form networks of support and

and form networks of support and friendships with one another.

As in previous years the event was very well supported with over 80 people taking part. The

Melanie McKay ran the nine
and a half mile course from the Crematorium to the Maltings and then started the walk again with the other participants.

This year the walkers were greeted by a carved oak Harry bear statue at each of the baby gardens which have recently been commissioned and installed by the charity, from funds donated by WBC Bereavement Services.

The services and facilities provided by Harry and Co. include bereaved family forums for parents and grandparents, a Facebook page for general support purposes, private, comfortable facilities for counselling, regional support provision for parents and families following the North West Palliative Care Pathway, private, non-clinical accommodation for parents and provided the support of the and memory making facilities including hand and feet casting, photography services and memory books to name just a few.

The charity was founded by Kate and Chris Tinker following the stillbirth of their son Harry at 41 weeks in May 2010.

Age of steam returns to Warrington with Royal Scot

STEAM train spotters in Warrington were given a rare treat when the historic Royal Scot passed through town on it's way to Carlisle from Crewe on a special rail enthusiast trip.

The train passed trough the Warrington area where bridges and any spot available en route were lined with train spotters.

The Royal Scot was brought back into service in February after a three year revamp which cost almost £1m.
Royal Scot was built in 1927 and

was the first in a new breed of steam locomotives, built by the LMS for their fastest passenger services from London to Birmingham, Manchester

and Glasgow.

She was chosen to appear on behalf of Britain at the 1933 'Century of Progress' exhibition in Chicago, USA. The locomotive as well as a full rake of carriages were shipped to the United States and appeared not only at the exhibition, but also toured the USA and Canada, even crossing the Rocky Mountains!

Royal Scot was rebuilt by British Railways in 1950 and went on to serve another 12 years in traffic on the West Coast Main Line. She was eventually retired in October 1962 and was purchased by Billy Butlin. She became a star attraction at Butlins in Skegness as a static exhibit.

Royal Scot briefly returned to steam at Bressingham Steam Museum from 1972 to 1978 before spending almost the next 30 years as a static exhibit. She briefly steamed in 2009 before it was discovered that a major overhaul was required.

Royal Scot returned to steam at the Severn Valley Railway in September 2015. She made her successful main line debut on December 22 and 23 with test runs from Crewe to Carnforth and return.

A Passion for Peace

Earlier this year I found a VHS video tape of an ITV Granada programme called 'A Passion for Peace' that was first broadcast in 1999. It contained a documentary featuring the Foundation's first programme which was a cultural exchange between young people from Warrington, Dublin and Belfast, who came together to learn about their differences and also share their similarities. It was this simple activity that formed the basis of the work undertaken by the Tim Parry Johnathan Ball Foundation for Peace.

21 years on, and the charity has evolved, but still those simple steps matter, in people sharing their experiences, understanding that conflict exists in all walks of life and learning that we can resolve matters without resorting to violence.

Reading your newspaper, watching TV or listening to the radio may suggest otherwise. Extremism, terrorism and war seems to be ever present in our world. That is why what we do at the Foundation is so important. The horrific events that have punctuated the last year such as attacks in Tunisia, Paris, Brussels and many others around the world, have affected our fellow citizens. That is why the national Survivors

Assistance Network (SAN) that we operate has grown. Our skilled team of case workers supported by clinical professionals are working with hundreds of people affected by terrorism in providing assistance and helping them to cope and recover. We still lead the way in offering the hand of friendship across these islands and in engaging with the people of Ireland and Northern Ireland, continuing the work to find a lasting peace through reconciliation. In communities, towns and cities where there is conflict we are working to facilitate communication and dialogue, bringing people together to help them resolve conflict and to build peace. Our portfolio of education projects such as 'THINK', 'My Former Life' and 'Holding Difficult Conversations' are planned to be delivered across the North of England in schools and colleges, and of course many people will visit Warrington and the Peace Centre set up in memory of two boys who lost their lives to terrorism.

Warrington should be proud of what it contributes to global peace. The Centre is unique and the Foundation is growing and responding to contemporary challenges. We can only do that with public support - your support and your willingness to offer your time, donations. I encourage you to read this newsletter

about our work and hopefully you feel inspired to help us and develop your own passion for peace.

BBC's Jeremy Bowen delivers 2016 Peace Lecture

Every year, the Foundation organises events to mark the anniversary of the Warrington bombing. This year, the 23rd anniversary, Jeremy Bowen the BBC Middle East Editor, TV & Radio presenter, was invited to deliver the Foundation's bi-annual Peace Lecture.

Bowen addressed a sold-out lecture on the nature of the conflict in the Middle-East and in other parts of the world. He spoke of the innocent victims of conflict, of his own experiences and the dangers he has faced, and of the friends he has lost and of the unique insight he has gained into war and its consequences.

On the day of the lecture, Radovan Karadzic, the former Bosnian Serb leader had been convicted of genocide and crimes against humanity, which prompted Bowen to recall his time reporting on the war crimes during that conflict and his experience giving evidence against Karadzic at the War

Crime Tribunal. During the lecture a lady from Bosnia stood up and thanked him for the part he played in bringing Radovan Karadzic to justice.

The Foundation would like to thank Jeremy for an interesting evening and for giving freely of his time in coming to Warrington.







Chairman's 'Peace'

The seemingly continuous news of terrorist attacks and atrocities from all corners of the globe, serves to prove the invaluable and ongoing need for the work of the Foundation. When Wendy and I set up the Foundation, we could never have imagined a world 23years on, where terrorist groups would declare themselves as 'states', with an agenda for expansion throughout the Middle East and parts of Asia, whilst committing the most horrific attacks on everyone not espousing their cause.

For many people, one of the most worrying aspects of the spread of militant Islamic groups is the fact that young people are attracted by their messages of hate and actively seek to help them achieve their aims. Many of these young people are well educated and yet they choose to abandon their planned careers and instead join this most unholy campaign at home or abroad.

Combatting the spread of this evil

doctrine, is first and foremost, the responsibility of governments, but it is now recognised more than it ever was previously, that governments alone cannot defeat the forces who want to destabilise and defeat democracy. The Foundation and its work are central to the struggle to mount the counter narrative of non-violent conflict resolution and, we do it very effectively through a range of programmes developed over many years by our excellent team of professionals.

Successive UK Governments have turned to the Foundation to lead in the development of programmes which address the tide of violent extremism by presenting non-violent ways and means of enhancing and encouraging cross community dialogue, especially where the community profile is one marked by division, separation and antagonism, all of which help sow the seeds and spread the message of militancy.

Our services have been developed and evolved over 23 years and we are the only

provider of its kind, with programmes and a dedicated Centre, which is able to meet the current and emerging needs, not only of individuals and communities, but also of governments.



Remembering Tim & Johnathan on the 23rd Anniversary

On a cold but beautiful sunny day, members of the public and representatives from Warrington Borough Council joined family members & the Foundation team to remember Tim and Johnathan on Bridge Street where the bombing took place 23rd years ago.

Rev Steven Kingsnorth conducted the service followed by heart-warming speech by Colin Parry who spoke about the day being a celebration of all that has been achieved since this tragedy in Tim and Johnathan's memory. The Mayor of Warrington laid a wreath and spoke on behalf of the local authority.

Nick Taylor, the Foundation's CEO said: "This event is about remembering and reflecting but also is carried out in a very firm sense of hope for the future that what happened in Warrington never happens again.

"The water carried from Bridge Street to the Peace Centre symbolises the ongoing work for peace and reconciliation and coincides with the beginning of spring and the peace tree blossoming.

The water carried from Bridge to the

Peace Centre was poured onto the Peace tree which was planted in the Peace Centre grounds 10 years ago by Terry Waite.

Women stand up for Peace in Manchester

Manchester Moss Side March 2016 – it is a cold but bright end to the winter day and I am at a 'world cafe' lunch with a table of women answering the question – 'As an individual how can you contribute towards peace in your community'? At the far end of the table is a woman who shares my second name and describes herself as an elder of the local church – she tells me peace is about getting involved in your local community and smiling at each other.

A few hours earlier, I am near my home in Warrington, Cheshire, walking the dog on the local recreation field when a car turns up and out step three women who put on gloves and pick up bin bags and collect litter. It isn't long before I am talking to them. At first I think that this is part of an initiative being undertaken for the Queen's 90th birthday, but I learn that the women are Parish Councillors and that twice a week they help clean up the 'village' – I cannot help telling them how impressed I am and thank them for what they are doing-We are all smiles.

Peace isn't always about national security, violence and extremism. Sometimes, peace starts with yourself and a search for inner harmony through compassion, courage and wisdom. It progresses to dialogue with others and then through people taking action – however small. Many of the courses offered by the Foundation lead to small changes such as coming together to undertake a project like a community clean-up or, like today, to organise a

lunch for women (and men) to join together as a community and consider what peace means to each of us, what makes us happy, motivates us and puts a smile on our face. But more than that, the women today also looked at what they loved about Manchester, how the city has changed in their lifetime, how they would describe it to a visitor or how they would make someone welcome. And their minor actions suddenly seem major.





Community Dialogue Programme 'Women 4 Peace'

Fifty five Women have participated in our 'Women 4 Peace' courses in Manchester and Liverpool from November to March. The courses brought together women of Muslim, Jewish, Christian and no faith to explore conflict and peacebuilding their own communities. Participants have achieved Open Awards accreditation in our new Foundation unit 'Understanding Conflict and Extremism: Building Peace. In addition, they learned about public speaking and interpersonal skills to help them plan and speak at community dialogue events which bring communities together to discuss building peace and resolving conflict.

The courses ran at the Kuumba Imani Centre in Liverpool and the Armani Centre in Manchester. Both venues kindly supported us throughout a 20 week programme in each city.

The final dialogue events took place on International Women's day (March 8th) and March 10th. Over 160 community members attended the two events led by the women. At the community dialogues, participants shared stories of women who had inspired them, whilst 'table dialogues' explored the barriers to peace within their communities and focused on how these could be overcome.

The women from Manchester and Liverpool have continued to work together and will be invited (along with our Blackburn Women for Peace participants) to a daytime event at the Peace Centre in June where they will receive their Open Awards Certificates.

Radicalisation - A new approach

In a project facilitated by the Foundation, Manchester City Council and Greater Manchester Police have worked with the city's diverse communities to understand their views on the Prevent programme and to look at ways of tackling radicalisation.

As part of the 'Rethinking Radicalisation' programme, more than 200 people from faith groups to schools and universities attended a series of events across the city to discuss issues such as national policy and legislation, Islamophobia and hate speech.

They also looked at how terrorism is portrayed in the media and how the resilience of young people is being built up against all forms of extremism in schools.

Discussions explored how local people can help build community resilience and support those who are vulnerable within communities, and the important question of how to create safe spaces where people can discuss contentious issues.

The Foundation, created by Tim's parents to promote non-violent conflict resolution, was commissioned to independently guide and facilitate the dialogue.

The Foundation's report, 'Rethinking Radicalisation' which can be seen on the website www.foundation4peace. org, makes recommendations based on contributions from these sessions, which the city council with its strategic partners and communities, will now review.

Councillor Nigel Murphy, Manchester City Council's Executive Member for Neighbourhoods, said: "Manchester has a long history of working with diverse

communities and, in preparing this report, we've brought members of our many communities together to create a new approach to tackling the problems posed by extremism.

"We have very strong communities here in Manchester, and we've listened to what they've got to say to create a new way of engaging with them, which I hope will be watched very carefully by organisations across the rest of the country."

THINK PROJECT – Developing Leadership Skills for the Future

Over the past 12 months, the THINK project, which works intensively with small groups, has involved eighty young people and twelve teachers. The project helps young people to contemplate the many aspects of conflict and develop leadership skills, by encouraging them to question what is the "truth". The programme helps young people to better manage their conflicts by thinking before they act and thereby avoid negative consequences. Ultimately the project seeks to break the cycle of violent conflict.

Participant quotes:

"I learnt that anger and violence is never, NEVER the answer to anything. It is better to just sit down and talk to each other".

"I found it overwhelming that former extremists can change their whole point of view".

" I found it inspiring how small factions can disagree peacefully and make a difference".

Participant reflection:

"When you hear the word 'peace', some imagine everyone dressed up as hippies and sticking up peace signs. Not so! Here at the Peace Centre, I have come to understand the causes of terrorism, and how perceptions inform our choices in respect of the groups we choose to join. Speaking to survivors and perpetrators is how we should deal with terrorism, NOT by fighting physically or verbally. If you want to bring about change, you must do it peacefully, together and with dignity. Harming others is unjust and creates inequality and sows the seeds of conflict".

Survivors Assistance Network update

The Survivors Assistance Network (SAN) team has been busy this year delivering the Survivors project, with the backing

of the UK Ministry of Justice (MOJ). The Foundation, which supports people in England and Wales who have been affected

by terrorism, is pleased to announce that the MOJ has committed to continue its contract with the Foundation for 2016/17.

National Memorial to British Victims of Overseas Terrorism



The Government is launching a public consultation to help inform the creation of a National Memorial to the British Victims of Overseas Terrorism.

We are all aware of the devastating terrorist events which have taken place overseas in recent years, not least the atrocities in Paris. Following the attacks in Tunisia last year, the Prime Minister announced that funding will be made available for a memorial dedicated to UK nationals who have been killed in terrorist atrocities overseas.

The consultation will ask victims and their families whether they would prefer the National Memorial to be in central London, where it might be seen by some to give due prominence to the memory of those who have been killed, or at the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire

which is a peaceful location for personal reflection at the heart of the UK. The Chancellor of the Exchequer announced that the national memorial would be funded by banking fines.

Minister Ellwood said: "It is a sad fact that we live in very difficult and dangerous times. Sadly, there are victims of terrorism whose families do not have a place where they can grieve. "It is, therefore, appropriate that we have a national memorial for those caught up in terrorism abroad. These people must never be forgotten.

The MOJ contract does however place limits on our ability to work with some groups we have worked within the past and may include some military veterans and some who have fled war and conflict abroad.

Notwithstanding this however, we remain committed to helping veterans and those fleeing war and conflict abroad wherever and whenever we can. Furthermore, we are committed to seeking the funding to maintain our work with existing participants. Negotiations are ongoing to secure the long-term funding for our work with Survivors, and Nick Taylor, our Chief Executive, and the SAN team will strive to get recognition of the gap in provision that SAN fills. No other organisation is equipped to support Survivors in the aftermath of a terrorist incident. Recent events have highlighted the importance of being prepared for this.

We have been successful in bidding for funds from the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) Reconciliation Fund to deliver a programme of Dialogue and Storytelling on the theme of 'Building East West Relations'. This will bring people together who have been affected by the 'Troubles' in Ireland and also on this side of the Irish Sea (including veterans).

The Survivors Assistants Network (SAN) team held a Leadership Weekend to end all others!

Not only did the team hit record numbers of participants, they were fortunate enough to have people from all over the British Isles take part. Participants also had the opportunity to hear from several facilitators who were kind enough to take a platform and share their invaluable knowledge and time.

Liz Staffell and David Gould offered an insight into the importance of leadership in helping our growing refugee community. Their presentation was informed by the mistreatment of refugees fleeing persecution in areas of deep conflict and their problematic and often fatal journey into Europe and beyond. Lee Lavis offered a personal view of conflict in Northern Ireland from the perspective of a British soldier who became interwoven in the peace and reconciliation process. Lee's since become a leader in cross community dialogue and plays a central part in

bridging communities from all sides of the 'Troubles'. Ali Alma concluded the weekend with an in-depth look at the role of leadership in sustaining lasting community cohesion. Although, Ali doesn't see himself as a leader, he understands the importance of working together and as individuals to bring peace.

The weekend brought both old and new faces together in a series of activities, discussions and lectures. One new face that brightened up the Peace Centre was Kieran Allen from a peace centre Glencree in Ireland. The SAN team look forward to working closely Kieran and his team in the future. All who attended were in spectacular form and worked together over the weekend to improve not only their own understanding of leadership, but improve the understanding of others.

The terrible events in Paris are to being commemorated in a new single release by singer-songwriter Chase Williams.

The profit will be donated to the Foundation to further our charitable work in assisting victims and survivors of terrorism, including those affected by recent events in Paris and Tunisia and in support of our work to prevent violent conflict.



The Foundation tackling Extremism on an international stage

It has been a busy few months for the Foundation as the agenda to combat violent extremism has been an increasing priority for politicians, policy makers and communities across Europe and beyond. Bomb attacks in Beirut in November and deadly attacks targeting children in Lahore, Pakistan in February were among the atrocities inflicted further afield. Events such as the Paris attacks in November, followed by the attacks on the airport in Brussels in March provided stark reminders for European member states of the reality of the IS threat much closer to home. The realities of these atrocities has meant a concerted focus by policy makers, politicians and wider influencers alike in the focus on how to counter, but also how to prevent violent extremism. The Foundation's work has been recognised as leading the field in some of its initiatives and practice and has been invited to share that in these forums.

Presidents and Prime Ministers present and former from across the world convened at a 'Stop Violent Extremism' Conference hosted for the 'Club De Madrid' in Madrid in October 2015. I was invited along to the event which was also addressed by the UN Secretary General Ban Ki Moon. The panel focussed on education sharing the Foundation's approach to 'prevention' work in this field. The following week, I also attended a UNSECO UN Education event in Paris as a 'rapporteur' on a panel focussed on

education on 'CVE' providing practice based recommendations on how to approach prevention education in this context. A third and final even in Aarhus, Denmark in November '15 saw the presentation of the Foundation's Rethinking Radicalisation programme to Mayors and leaders from some of Europe's' leading institutions at the 'Stronger Cities Network' event. The project first undertaken in Manchester by the Foundation was showcased as a model for engagement and dialogue with communities on this challenging topic.

The plight of refugees fleeing the horrendous conditions they face in places such as Syria and Iraq cannot fail to have escaped peoples' notice in recent months. Concern around the increasing numbers of people seeking asylum and the pressure on countries, their security and their resources are amongst some of the issues that have played out over recent months. As the worries grow about how we deal with these issues, tensions are increasing in some of those areas receiving refugees as well as worries about how people are integrated and the threat of 'radicalisation' removed. The Radicalisation Awareness Network hosted a themed event in Vienna last week. home of the memorable scenes of refugees arriving at the train station on route from Hungary. The event brought together 90 leading practitioners and policy makers from the EU focussed on how to tackle

and their communities. The Foundation's Community Dialogue engagement work was once again showcased as an example of good practice in connecting those at the grassroots with the decision makers. An example of inclusion and peacebuilding in practice.

Colin Parry Chairman said: 'It is quite amazing to think that the work of this charity is reaching such audiences. Whilst we have remained focussed on developing really good practice through our centre here in Warrington, we have engaged with conflict and groups from across the world for over 20 years now. It is clear that what we have been doing here is impacting those close to home but also has lessons for those further afield. This was always part of our dream to see the organisation and its work impact in those places where conflict can seem so hard to resolve and it is events and platforms like these where we are able to take and share our learning and messages.'

Radicalisation Awareness Network

As many readers will be aware, the Foundation has been dealing with the threat of 'violent extremism' since it was founded in 1995. The experience we took from the Northern Ireland conflict and the application of 'lessons learnt' to new contexts since the London bombings of 7th July 2005, have placed us firmly at the heart of UK and European efforts to combat and prevent violent extremism.

I have chaired the European Commission's Radicalisation Awareness Network since 2012, steering the 'Prevent' group and latterly taking the chair of the 'Youth Families and Communities' working group in 2015 on behalf of the Foundation. The network of over 1800 practitioners, connecting over 800 organisations, is the biggest in the world comprising of practitioners from the fields of health, police, prison and youth, amongst others. These working groups tackle issues ranging from education to rehabilitation in relation to violent extremism, bringing some of the top experts from Europe together to share best practice, identify opportunities for growth and formulate policy recommendations for their respective member states. The RAN is recognised as one of the world's leading practitioner networks and a step change was achieved in 2015 when it was established as a European Centre for Excellence. 'Member state support' for strategy and policy and policy influencing are amongst the work of the Centre for Excellence. I have already represented the Foundation on this panel, delivering training in Slovenia and Spain.

Wolves' war hero remembered



FORMER England Rugby Union international Mark Cueto visited the Halliwell Jones Stadium to be presented with his great uncle's heritage shield in memory of the only Warrington rugby league player not to come home from the war.

Life-long fan Harry Hayes, aged 83, who posted about his memories of Frank Ceuto on the **warrington-worldwide** forum, had the honour of presenting the heritage shield as one of a number of events to mark

the 140th anniversary of the club. Flying Officer Francisco ("Frank") Cueto was an English airman of the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve who died during the Second World

He was born in 1917, in Wigton, Cumberland, the son of Spanish-born parents Antonio and Emilia Cueto (née Ruiz).

His father became the proprietor of a fish-and-chip shop in Maryport, Cumbria, and was the great-grandfather of the rugby player Mark Cueto.

Cueto, a pilot in 56 Squadron, died on 9 February 1944, when his Hawker Typhoon (serial JR442) crashed into the North Sea off the

crashed into the North Sed off the coast of Dungeness.

He had married Vera Dutton shortly before his death.

He has no known grave and is commemorated by the Runnymede Memorial and the Stockton Heath War Memorial.

A resident of Stockton Heath, he played 79 first team games for Warrington, as a halfback, scoring 10 tries his first being on 31st October 1936 and his last on 7th September 1940. His Heritage number is 418. Mark said: "He was my great

uncle; he was my pop's (grandad's) brother. It's a story I've known about over the years but we've not talked about it much as I suppose it's quite a sad story.

"I'm really pleased to have been

invited over to see the timeline. It is brilliant and it does hit home when you see his name on the wall. It makes you feel proud especially

with our family name as it's a pretty rare name in this part of the world. rare name in this part of the world. I wish my old man had come. He's a proper northerner. I'll be showing him the pictures and the plaque. "I'm grateful to Warrington for having to have done this for us. The plaque is a really nice gesture."

He added a little story about the name too. "My dad is called Frank because of his uncle and bizarrely lactually get called Frankie: it's just a

actually get called Frankie; it's just a name from when I was 20/21 and started off playing at Sale. People got to know my old man and he's a bit of a character. As with all the best nicknames they have the worst stories, so when people ask me why I get called Frank, it's because it's my dad's name, that's it!

Harry from Grappenhall, posted his memories on the Forum back in 2009 saying: "I was recently trying to pass on my football "skills" to my grandson and I was reminded of an old memory.

"After the war my dad told me to wait for the soldiers to come back from the war, they would teach me rom the war, they would leach the some skills. I remember feeling very sad when he said 'Frank Cueto won't be coming back'.

"How awful that a career could be ended like that.

"He must be smiling down to see his talent passed on."

his talent passed on."

Harry added: "I am privileged to present the shield on behalf of the Warrington Community in the year we celebrate the club's 140 year

history."

Wolves' Foundation CEO Neil
Kelly found Harry's comments while he was searching for information on the club's war hero.

"It seemed a fitting tribute to invite Harry down to the club to present Mark with his great uncle's heritage shield," added Neil.





A look-back on taxes in 1999

It may have taken 17 years to get here, but the 200th edition of Warrington Worldwide has finally arrived.

It is fitting, therefore, to start by congratulating Gary, David and the rest of the staff at Warrington Worldwide on achieving this milestone. Everyone at WatkinsonBlack is looking forward to the next 200 editions. To mark this



is looking forward to the next 200 editions. To mark this occasion we thought that we might have a look at how things had changed in this period.

In 1999 there were three rates of income tax – 10% on the first £1,500, 23% on the next £26,500 and 40% thereafter. Allowing for inflation the 40% tax rate would start at about £42,000. Today there are still three rates, but they are now 20% on the first £32,000, 40% on the next £118,000 and 45% thereafter.

In 1999 the personal allowance, that is the amount that you can receive before paying tax, was £4,335 but this increased to £5,720 if you were over 65, and one party within a married couple received an additional £1,970 making £6,305 in total. Had these rates increased in line with inflation then they would currently be about £7,000, £9,000 and £10,000 respectively. However, whilst the age allowance and the married couples allowance have disappeared, the personal allowance is now £11,000 for everyone.

Average wages in 1999 were £290 per week, and this had increased to about £435 in 2016. Therefore, someone on these average earnings would currently be paying about 10% in income

increased to about £435 in 2016. Therefore, someone on these average earnings would currently be paying about 10% in income tax, compared to 15% in 1999. Not bad, hey?

For Capital Gains, the annual exempt amount in 1999 was £7,100 which, after allowing for inflation, would be about £11,500 in today's money. The actual exempt amount is a bit lower than this at £11,100. The good news, however, is that the rate at which the tax is paid has reduced dramatically for all gains except gains on residential property. For instance, a basic rate taxpayer would currently pay 10% on any gain above the exempt amount compared to a rate of 23% in 1999. Gains on residential property have also fallen from the 23% in 1999, but to only to 18% today. Of course, any gain on your private home has remained tax free throughout.

The rate of Corporation Tax for companies in 1999 was 20% for companies with profits below £300,000 and 30% for larger companies. Since then the rate for small companies has remained constant whilst the rate for larger companies has fallen, meaning that
