Ancient Buddhist stone carving discovered in a farmyard

AN ancient stone carving depicting a scene of Buddhist gods and deities discovered in a Cheshire farmyard and used as a garden ornament, has now found its way to Warrington and could be worth thousands of pounds.

The huge carved stone panel was uncovered by **warringtonworldwide's** James Balme, who has previously made archaeological discoveries, including a lost Roman settlement near Lymm which later featured on Channel 4's Time Team with Tony Robinson.

James from Woolston, who regularly searches the area looking for old or ancient objects noticed that a large stone garden ornament was for sale at a Cheshire farm.

Having seen photographs of the stone carving James suspected it was not an ornament and was actually something far more special. The carving was covered in moss and dirt obscuring much of the details.

He decided to pay a visit to view the carving to see for himself whether or not it was what he believed to be ancient and he was not disappointed. James said: "When I arrived I

James said: "When I arrived I examined the object to make sure that it was actually hand carved. I was astounded to find that it was indeed a hand carved statue portraying two gods and two deities in a carriage being pulled by two horses. In the background were three servants looking on. The procession was being led by an elephant, a classic symbol of Buddhism."

He agreed a price for the carving of a "few hundred pounds" and took it away for cleaning and restoration. He spent over three weeks gently removing the soil and moss from the carving to reveal fantastic details of the statue. Once cleaned he contacted a London based specialist in Asian art. James added: "The expert was

James added: "The expert was amazed at the carving and was very happy to confirm that it was indeed an ancient Javanese stone carved panel dating between the 11th to 13th century this being a time when Buddhism was the main religion of Indonesia and in particular the Island of Java. The question now is to work out how this ancient carving made its way to Britain? ".

An expert from the BBC Antiques Roadshow recently paid a visit to see the statue for themselves. Due to the size and weight of the carving it was agreed that it was not safe or practical to transport the carving to Arley Hall for filming.

Arley Hall for filming. James said: "It was a great experience having a famous face from the Roadshow pay a visit to see the carving. Unfortunately as the statue is over four feet in length and weighs well over 300lbs it was just too risky to move it for the purposes of filmina.

and weighs well over 300lbs it was just too risky to move it for the purposes of filming. "My research will now continue and I will be consulting experts via universities and museums over the coming months to find out the true meaning of what the carving represents. It is amazing that such a rare and ancient object was being used as a garden ornament!

used as a garden ornament! "The fact that it is worth a lot of money means little compared to the ancient history that it represents."

Arctic Convoy veterans honoured by Russia

RUSSIA has bestowed one of its highest military honours on local World War 2 Arctic Convoy veterans at a ceremony at Warrington Town Hall.

The borough council and Mayor Cllr Faisal Rashid hosted the mayors of Halton and St Helens and representatives from the Russian

representatives from the Kussian Embassy at the special ceremony. Konstantin Shlykov, from the Russian Embassy in London, said: "These brave men have been awarded, by decree of the President, Ushakov Medals. "This is Russia's highest award for naval merit second only to Hero of

"This is Russia's highest award for naval merit, second only to Hero of Russia. Being a high state award, these medals can only be presented in person, by an embassy diplomat or a high ranking British official." At the ceremony it was described as "the equivalent of one step below the Victoria Cross". As part of the ceremony, renowned Russian sculptor Leonty Usov also donated a wooden bust of Mikhail Sholokhov, the Russian Nobel prize laureate in literature, to Warrington Borough Council.

The donation was on behalf

of the people of Tomsk and was received by Mayor Faisal Rashid. Cllr Rashid said: "We are honoured to be presenting these courageous men with awards to work the second se mark their gallantry in serving their country in the Second World War.

"We are also delighted to be able to thank Mr Usov for his wonderful work of art that will be displayed in the Town Hall."

The Arctic Convoys of the Second World War sailed from the UK, North America and Iceland to ports in northern Russia between August 1941 and May 1945. About 1,400 merchant ships delivered supplies to aid the Russian fight against Nazi Germany and were escorted by Royal Navy ships. The Navy lost 16 warships and 85 of the merchant vessels were sunk.

is now in Belize for a month working in energy-sapping humidity and temperatures of more than 30°C. Martin said: "I actually joined the Army for a bet. I had a mate who joined the Royal Logistics Corps and he was telling me I would not be able to cope with it, so I did it to show him that I could. It was the best thing I ever did." Martin is in Belize along with


Martin is in Belize along with more than 100 others from the battalion's Blenheim Company, learning how to survive and fight in some of the toughest conditions on the alaret the planet.

the planet. He said: "We're based in the primary jungle which is very dense, hot, humid and sweaty. We work really hard during daylight but at night we get to rest well in our hammocks – which are great; they keep us off the ground and away from the bugs. We've also got a river nearby which we can dip in and have a wash after training."

Perhaps the hardest work has been at Sibun Gorge. The location's holiday brochure natural beauty hides a deadly arsenal of snakes including the giant boa constrictor and the venomous Fer de Lance. The region's lush vegetation, hilly terrain and still air, thick with humidity, add an extra dimension to the daily tests of survival, navigation and attack.

Exercise Mayan Warrior examined how well adapt to such a personnel a demanding adapt to such a demanding environment. Soldiers live in the wild, sleeping in tree-slung hammocks and drinking river water they purify themselves. British Army jungle warfare instructors and soldiers from the Belize Defence Force educate the 2 LANCS personnel in how to navigate the teatureless jungle, move through it undetected and strike enemy positions fast and hard from close quarters.

Martin, who is married to Emma, said: "I love my job. I've been in Belize through the Army once before and I thought that would be a once in a lifetime opportunity, but lucky enough here I am again. I do enjoy the big exercises like this one and I'd rather be doing this here than on a cold training area back in the UK!



WARRINGTON swimmer Kathleen Dawson has talked about her hopes for the 2020 Olympics following her victory at the European Swimming Championships. The 18-year-old was selected to

represent Great Britain for the first time at a senior international meet after narrowly missing out on a spot at this year's Olympics. She won a bronze medal in the 100m backstroke at the London

The A-Level student has taken her exams in Geography and Art while she's been travelling to competitions and she hopes to secure a place to study at the University of Stirling next year.

The university is known for its sporting excellence and four of its students have been chosen to represent Team GB in Rio this summer.
