# Sixth form students to help Keep Lymm 'Kleen'

A group of Sixth Form students from Lymm High School are helping to launch a "Keep Lymm Kleen" campaign.

The campaign is a revival of Keep Lymm Tidy previously led by Lymm Parish Council and will be rolled out over the next few months.

The scheme under the banner "Keep Lymm Kleen" is being led by Parish Councillor Anna Fradgley, who is working closely with Lymm High School and the group of Sixth Form students.

The village has seen an increasing amount of litter over the Summer, especially around The Cross, the Lower Dam and in Ridgway Grundy Park. Further out from the village centre, more litter is creeping in and there is the bigger issue of dog fouling left by

inconsiderate dog owners.

Cllr Fradgley said: "The Parish Council has reacted to the need for more bins and extra staff are being recruited to pick up litter, but this is an upward hill battle if litter is aimlessly discarded. It's also an absolute disgrace if dog owners leave dog foul on the floor. So I want to run this campaign to raise awareness that we all need to do

awareness that we all need to do our bit to keep the village tidy.
"The Keep Lymm Kleen scheme will incorporate posters throughout the village and I am hoping to encourage children in Lymm to provide the artwork. Students from Lymm High School will be involved

in making this happen."

The official launch is due to take place on Dickensian Day.

Councillor Fradgley is keen for a group of volunteers to revive the litter picking group to help keep the village clean. If anyone is interested in creating and running this group, please contact her on cllrafradgley@sky.com. Also, if anyone knows of groups or individuals who go out of their way to pick up litter and dog foul, please let Anna know. She would like to thank them for their help.

Fines can be enforced by the Borough Council of up to £2,500 for anyone found littering or dog

fouling.
"It is vital that we all work together to keep our village clean, as not only does it make a pleasant place to live, but it makes it a pleasant place to visit," she added.



# Lymm – in the days of the great "Salt Rush"

LYMM and surrounding areas figure prominently in a new book by local historian and author Keith Warrender.

Bollin Valley, Past and Present, is a lavishly produced 208 page book and is Keith's second volume about the people and places of the Bollin Valley and follows the course of the River Bollin from where it rises in the hills at

Macclesfield Forest to where it joins the Manchester Ship Canal near Lymm It is packed with photograph's by the author and also historic pictures of

The area in times past.

Of particular local interest is a section on the Grade II listed Burford Lane Farm, designed by acclaimed architect John Douglas in 1866 which includes a drawing of the farm as it used to be.

There is also an account of the great Lymm "salt rush" of around 1900 when an area of high-quality bring was discovered at Heatley.

when an area of high-quality brine was discovered at Heatley.

The story goes that a farmer's wife could not understand why her ducks would not go into a brook. In exasperation she took a duck by the neck and held it in the stream. But she had a cut on her hand and the sting she suffered convinced her there was salt in the water.

There were salt works at Lymm, Heatley and Agden but the last of them closed in 1959. The book includes photos right up to the present day with the Lymm Historic Transport Day.

# Lukewarm reception to 15 minute free parking concession

WARRINGTON Borough Council has made a u-turn on axing free nas made a u-turn on axing free car parking in Lymm and nearby Stockton Heath, allowing a 15 minute concession for school runs.

The change of heart comes after more than 2,600 people signed a petition objecting to the loss of free car parking.

car parking.

The concession has been given a luke warm reception by Lymm councillor lan Marks who said:"Although the Council is not legally obliged to consult, we could have told them that no free parking for the first hour would cause problems if they had cared to consult with local councillors, businesses, schools and nurseries in the first place. "Instead they thought they knew

best and put out a press release in September saying that the changes to parking charges would lead to 'an improved parking experience'.
Most local residents regard this as nonsense which is why 2600 have signed our petition objecting to the

changes.
"It will do little to help people wanting to pick up a prescription or do a small amount of shopping because they cannot be certain that they won't be stuck in a queue. They might not want to risk getting fined by wardens who always seem to be around.

"We object strongly to these proposals because the only "We object strongly to these proposals because the only two Council areas that have been targeted are Lymm and Stockton Heath. The new charges are planned to raise an extra £212,000 which nearly trebles the money currently taken. This is unfair and is yet another attack by the Council on the south of the town. The Council justifies this because it The Council justifies this because it is claimed there are free carparks near the Council owned ones in other parts of the Borough. We do not accept this argument because there are free carparks nearby in Lymm and Stockton Heath – they

"Stopping or limiting free parking for the first hour will just create more congestion on the streets which local people will not welcome.

Traders in Lymm fear that the new charges will deter shoppers and be bad for business. Is this what the Council intends – surely not. We ask the Council to put



these charges on hold until proper soundings have been taken with local people. I take a small amount of comfort that they have listened and made a slight change to their proposal but they need to do some

more listening."

A council spokesperson said:
"After receiving feedback on the car parking charges decision we have incorporated a free 15-minute slot to allow for dropping off at schools and nurseries.



The 23-year-old said: "I've always wanted to make music my career and


now I'm hoping to do just that. It's an exciting time and I am really looking

# **Short-sighted library closures!**

Dear Sir

It was with regret that I read in your November edition that Warrington Borough Council is considering the closure of the Lymm, and other local libraries throughout the Borough. What short-sightedness.

Local Authorities have a legal responsibility to provide a quality library service and by statute they must provide "comprehensive and efficient" library services and Government must oversee and improve libraries. The Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) should provide these services to local Authorities using "Statutory Guidance". These rights are not widely understood and are often neglected in the face of economic

Libraries are models for sustainability and social development and they allow access to ideas without restriction or control They are essential for many people – the housebound, the lonely, the unemployed, young families and the elderly who, often, cannot afford to buy books or travel to a main library. They are vitally important to children and young people. Books allow them to make sense of their experiences, to consolidate what they are taught, to explore being different, unique and complex. All that in an orderly place where one is assured of safety and being treated like an individual who can make choices and to socialise with other children in an out-of-school environment.

I find it quite ironic that while the Lymm residents were gleaning names for a petition to challenge the proposed closure, Lymm Rotary Club, with some financial help from the Rotary Foundation (Rotary's worldwide charity) despatched nearly £1,000 worth of Usborne Young Readers books to ITEC, a Non-Profit Organisation in East London, South Africa, to support their own classroom libraries in the Eastern Cape where less than 10% of the 9,000 plus schools have library resources. For more than 8 years the club has been partnering ITEC's endeavours to promote quality education to ensure that children have the best start in life. Millions of South African pupils suffer significantly because the lack of libraries contributes to their poor grasp of literacy and numeracy.

There might be a ray of hope for Lymm's and the other Borough libraries

There might be a ray of hope for Lymm's and the other Borough libraries facing closure. On the 13th of October, The Chartered Institution of Library and Information Professionals gave a briefing to the House of Lords which warned that the UK is on the brink of an unprecedented literacy and skills crisis. They outlined opportunities for the Lords to constructively intervene by urging the Government to make provision in the Autumn Statement for the emergency relief from closure of public libraries in Local Authorities that are

implementing budget cuts.

We hear the word "austerity" used quite a lot these days but I lived through WW11 and its aftermath. They were years of real austerity, but the Government did not close libraries. Quite the opposite. The Government re-established the Ministry of Information (created during the First World War) and enlisted the public library network to distribute information and resources to support the population. This was in addition to the use of library buildings for holding meetings and displaying propaganda material.


