Editor's Comment

THE jury is still out on whether or not Culcheth Library and a number of others across the borough should close or be radically changed in some way to enable them to continue serving their local communities.

By jury, we mean Warrington Borough Council, who have pledged to [']consider representations received during the consultation carried out by library operators LiveWire, including those attached to a 10,000 strong "save

our libraries" petition.

We must, certainly at this stage, take the council's word stage, for it that the matter will receive proper consideration and that the consultation was not just an exercise in preparing the public for bad news. We are sure people do not become councillors to close down libraries.

But there are worrying features about the whole affair. How can it be that a library in a highly literate community like Culcheth is one of

the ones apparently most at risk of closure?

How can it be that despite the furore over the proposals, the 10,000 petition and repeated "use them or lose them" calls from campaigners, there has been no increase in the number of people actually using the libraries?

The petition is the largest we can recall ever being raised in the borough, so presumably there is a genuine desire among a significant proportion of the population – including many in Culcheth - to keep the library service we enjoy today. But where are they? Was the petition signed by

people who will, when accosted by a campaigner in the street, sign rather than appear some kind of Philistine, but don't have the time to

actually read a book? Perhaps they signed because, although they personally are far too busy watching television or using their mobiles and computers, they think there are other people out there who do still need books?

One thing is clear. Even if the current campaign results in some kind of temporary reprieve for our libraries, we will still lose them eventually if we do not use them

So if you have read this far, get out there, visit Culcheth Library, borrow a book, and read it!

Residents still concerned about HS2

MORE than 60 concerned residents attended the recent CADRAG public meeting held in the village recently to discuss the proposed changes to HS2 and its impact on Culcheth.

The changes, announced by Chris Grayling in November, were discussed and it was evident that all

those who attended were still "very concerned", says event organiser Frank Allen, Chair of CADRAG.

Although the change to the route to avoid the Taylor Business Park and the Culcheth Linear Park were welcomed by most, it was noted that this now affected other properties and businesses. However, the HS2 Golborne Link is still seen as unnecessary, expensive, and hugely damaging to the Warrington area both environmentally and economically.

There was unanimous support for the programme proposed by CADRAG which was:

1. To continue to oppose the Golborne Link and support the alternative, to upgrade the West Coast Main Line, which will have less adverse impact and provide many additional economic benefits

to Warrington and the surrounding

2. To enter into discussions with HS2 over the next two years regarding refinements to the route

regarding retinements to the route to reduce as far as possible the impact if it does go ahead.

3. To prepare for petitioning the Houses of Parliament regarding the Hybrid Bill, expected from 2019 onwards, if a satisfactory position has not been reached by then.

There was also general agreement that it was essential that the community's elected representatives - particularly local Councillors - took a leading role in

these discussions and preparations.



Village to lose its last bank

CULCHETH is to lose its last remaining bank.

Only weeks after Barclays closed their branch in the village, NatWest has announced that it is to close it doors on May 31. Earlier, the TSB closed down in

Culcheth

Warrington North MP Helen Jones – who lives in Culcheth – has expressed her concern at the closure.

She said: "Over the years Culcheth has lost a TSB branch and a Barclay's branch - now NatWest will be closing. I do think this represents a real concern.

'I recognise that more people are using online and telephone services but this is not appropriate for everyone.
"Culcheth has a significant elderly

population who are not as skilled in the use of new technologies and may find the alternatives to a branch setting difficult. People often find that interacting face to face with bank staff is the best way to deal with their queries and concerns.

queries and concerns.

"There is also likely to be a problem with the reduction in the number of cash points in the village.

"The loss of the cash point in Croft had a major effect on local

businesses and there is a danger that Culcheth is going the same way."

The closure is the latest in a series

involving various banks across Warrington.

All give the same explanation - that people's banking habits are changing and fewer and fewer people are visiting branches.

She expressed concern about the consultation which, she claimed, did not provide enough information for it to be considered sufficient for a decision to be made. The ideas and input it encourage were limited

by bias and poor quality.

Even so a huge number of people fed in some great ideas, people ted in some great ideas, informed by proper and balanced information, for the future of the borough's libraries. And it resulted in more than 10,000 people signing the petition – one of the biggest petitions ever presented in

The message was clear. The proposals should be rejected and the council should work with the public for the future of all the libraries.

Cllr Tony Higgins, the borough's lead member for culture and leisure, said that the council would take time to fully digest, process and understand fully the findings of the report and consultation and only then would they make it openly available.

He welcomed the petition and

thanked the organisers and those who had signed the petitions for giving the cause heart. He was himself an advocate for libraries – and people should understand that the issue was not a "done deal."

All councils were struggling to cope with the unprecedented cuts the Government had imposed upon them, he added.






