



FRODSHAM'S Neighbourhood Plan has the potential to be a hugely important document, helping to shape the future development of the town.

But unfortunately, Frodsham got off to a late start in drawing up its plan and even though the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group is now working hard to make up for lost time, there still seems to be some confusion about what a Neighbourhood Plan actually is and what one has to do

actually is and what one has to do to get involved.

Things are not improved when we hear that, at a time when the Steering Group was short of members, a local resident who expressed an interest in joining was approachly told that he could not expressed an interest in joining was apparently told that he could not because he was too late. So much work had been done that there would be no point in him joining.

Another member of the public who joined, attended only one

meeting and then stepped down because he could not attend meetings called at short notice.

In fact, the situation is that any resident of Frodsham who wants to get involved in putting together a plan that could have a major impact on planning applications affecting the town in the future, is welcome to join.

It is important to stress that the Neighbourhood Plan is not a Town Council initiative, even though there are a couple of councillors on the Steering Group. It is supposed to be led by the people of Frodsham – and there are local residents already working hard to do just that.

But they would welcome more local people on board and, we are told, they really mean that.

It is true that a lot of work has

already been done and newcomers will have to accept that. But this does not mean they cannot stlll play a useful role.
Frodsham needs to get its

Neighbourhood Plan in place sooner rather than later because it can affect many local issues including housing, Green Belt, traffic, parking. Almost anything..

At the end of the day, everyone

will get a chance to have a say through a local referendum. But the Steering Group will decide what questions the referendum will ask.

Question:

As a keen cyclist, what are my legal rights on the road?

Answer:

I am a regular cyclist myself and we are not alone; British Cycling have stated that more than two million people cycle at least once a week; an all-time high

people cycle at least once a week; an all-time high.
Last year 3,237 cyclists were seriously injured
on our UK's roads and therefore it is important that
you take precautions with reflective clothing, a full
understanding of the Highway Code and a cycle
helmet. It is not a legal requirement to wear a helmet
but aside from the safety aspect, it is worth noting that
if you do have to make a claim then compensation
could be reduced if you do not wear one.
If you do happen to suffer a cycling accident you

- Report the accident to the police within 24 hours. If you're injured you're legally required to do this.
 Get medical treatment; call an ambulance or see
- Get medical treatment; call an ambulance or see your GP. Even if you only have minor injuries, get checked out.
- Obtain all the details of the other party involved in the accident and look for witnesses who are willing to comment.

An innocent injured victim would get compensation to reflect pain, injury and suffering and repayment of any financial losses that are incurred, such as loss of wages, damage to a bicycle and clothing, and other expenses.

Be fully aware of the situation under which the accident occurred as even small details. You have three years from the date of the accident to do so to make a claim, and it is recommended that you seek professional specialist legal advice as soon as possible, particularly if there were witnesses to the accident or if you are receiving medical attention.

Councillor's conduct 'below that expected of those in public office'

AN independent investigation into the conduct of outspoken Frodsham councillor Tom Reynolds has concluded that it has fallen below that expected of those in public office.

Cheshire West and Chester Council's Standards Complaints Panel decided unanimously that in an email sent on November 2 last year, Cllr Reynolds failed to comply with Frodsham Town Council's Member Code of Conduct which requires that members treat others

with respect.
Cllr Reynolds has responded by saying he wishes to appeal against what he calls the "biased"

He said: "We are one step closer

to a Judicial Review.

The investigation arises from a complaint made by Clir Andrew Dawson and Clir Lynn Riley, members of Cheshire West and Chester Council (CW&C) that in an email of November 2 last year, Cllr Reynolds made false accusations against them implying they had acted "inappropriately and heedless of conflict of interest" relation to Frodsham Town Council's decision to move its office to the ground floor of Castle Park

They also alleged this was part of a "sustained pattern of unjustified, vitriolic abuse, harassment and disparagement.

Às a result, CW&C arranged an investigation by an independent

investigator who concluded that Cllr Reynolds had failed to comply with the Town Council's code of conduct because he had failed to show others respect in his email.

The investigator, Alex Oram, added: "I would strongly would added: "I would strongly encourage Cllr Reynolds to reflect strongly on his use of email in general, in particular whether his approach conducive to encouraging constructive communication.

The matter was then referred to CW&C's Standards Complaints Panel who heard representations from Mr Oram, Cllr Reynolds and Cllr Dawson.

Cllr Reynolds did not dispute sending the email which alleged the complainants had acted improperly and illegally. He did not improperly and illegally. He did not provide any evidence to support the allegations and when asked if he would withdraw the email said he would not.

Cllr Reynolds his intentions the email content was hostile, unjustified, abusive and inaccurate.

The panel recommended that Cllr Reynold's behaviour should be censured by the Town Council and that they arrange suitable training for him so that he has a clear understanding of the ways in which queries and concerns could be raised, acceptable standards of

behaviour as a town councillor and the Localism Act 2011. The panel also recommended that Cllr Reynolds carefully consider the circulation list for emails and limit it to those involved in the

Members of the Town Council, at their monthly meeting, decided to defer consideration of the panel's report, pending receipt of further documents relating to other complaints made against Cllr


The performance, accompanied by old photographs and stunning new images, will feature work from Lynn's new book 'Salford Quays Unlocked – Voices of Manchester Docks'.

ELEVEN pupils from Frodsham CE Primary School were admitted to Communion at a service at St Laurence Church.

When pupils are in Year 4 at Frodsham CE Primary, their reliaious education lessons religious education lessons incorporate a six week course which explores the basics of the Christian faith and what Christians believe about Communion.

The event will be officially opened at 3.3opm on the Friday by Frodsham Mayor Mallie Poulton, followed by singing by the Manor House School



In-house coaching course was huge success

MORE than 30 soccer coaches attended an in-house FA Level One coaching course held by Frodsham Junior Football Club over several weekends and evenings at Frodsham Community Centre.

Cheshire FA tutors Gary Banister and Carl Wild delivered the course the first to be held by a junior football club in the Cheshire FA.

The FA's Level One is the entrylevel qualification for anyone looking to pursue a career in football coaching or simply football coaching or simply improve his or her coaching abilities. The qualification provides an introduction to the organisation and delivery of safe and enjoyable coaching sessions, includes modules on safeguarding and emergency first aid, and is ideally suited to those working with groups of young players.
Frodsham JFC chose to run the

course with the aim of ensuring high standards of coaching across the club.

More than half the club's 70-plus

coaches already hold the FA Level One qualification with five coaches qualified to FA Level Two.

Seventeen of the club's current coaches attended the course and were joined by 16 coaches from

other local clubs.
Frodsham JFC's head of coach and player development Joe Bell, who arranged the course, said: "Our aim is to have competent and confident coaches across the board and the FA Level One qualification moves us towards that, as a club.

"As a grassroots club, Frodsham JFC is committed to values of teamwork, respect and resilience. Our coaches have an enormous impact on the lives of our young players – beyond footballing ability – and we fully understand that. The Level One is a benchmark for all of our new coaches from now on"

The club was extremely grateful to receive a donation of £500 from Frodsham Mayor, Cllr Mallie Poulton, presented on behalf of Frodsham Town Council's grant scheme. These funds contributed towards the cost of the venue hire and were donated on the understanding that three of the FJFC coaches participating would be under the age of 21.

Overall the course was a resounding success with all the coaches passing their individual assessments and achieving the FA Level One qualification. The new skills they have gained will now be used to benefit many of the 400-plus local children who play football for Frodsham Juniors FC.
