Editor's Comment

MY heart goes out to the families and friends of Warrington band Viola Beach which ranks as one of the most heart-breaking tragedies I have ever reported on during a career spanning more than three decades in my home town.

The inquest which took place in Warrington has left many questions unanswered and we will probably never really know what happened that tragic night in Sweden.

Five young men tragically lost their lives on the brink of achieving their dream of making it as a band. It has come as some comfort that

they achieved a number one album and their memory will live on with

a lasting legacy. As a town Warrington has already led by example in the way we have remembered the young boys, Tim Parry and Johnathan Ball, who lost their lives in the Warrington bombing and I am sure Viola Beach will also forever have a place in our hearts.

As Warrington approaches the first anniversary of the tragic death of the band members this coming February hopefully a lasting memorial can soon be unveiled in the town.

Meanwhile as we approach another new year Warrington continues to develop as a town at great pace, with the redevelopment of the town centre, going hand in hand with new housing developments.

While this is all fantastic news I do fear how our highways will cope with the increased traffic.

Yes new bridges are on the horizon - but will they help alleviate the ongoing problems every time there are road works or accidents on the surrounding motorway networks? It doesn't take much to bring Warrington to a complete standstill.

Then when I see the ongoing work on bus lanes (do we really



need them?) and traffic lights on roundabouts I do wonder whether our highway planners actually drive around town during rush hour to see the outcomes of their work.

There seems to be no shortage of money when it comes to carrying out roadworks or "highway out roadworks or "highway improvements," yet the ongoing traffic problems persist. If we want to continue to prosper as a town the road networks need sorting out!

How Warrington got to be so active!

WARRINGTON'S achievement, in becoming the most active borough in the North West, is due to a number of local organisations working together to increase the number of people taking part in sport.

The town's biggest provider of sport and leisure activities is, however, LiveWire, which last year provided 4,233 hours of sports activity across 2,498 sessions activity across 2,498 sessions through their Active LiveWire team.

Emma Hutchinson, managing director of LiveWire, said: "It's fantastic that Warrington has topped the regional chart for the first time following significant increases in adult participation.

"This builds on the consistently strong performance we have seen

in participation among young people for some time. "Becoming the most active local authority in the region was one of the headline aims of our last business plan, and it is testament to the hard work of staff at LiveWire and our partner organisations to have achieved this

The figures released by Sport England and Active Cheshire, also show that the Cheshire and Warrington sub-region was the second most active in the Country.

second most active in the Country. They show that 43.1 per cent of over 16s in Warrington took part in at least 30 minutes of physical activity at least once a week – an increase of 7 per cent on last year. It was also revealed that Warrington is the second best

Warrington is the second best performing area in the region for junior sports participation with 42.9 per cent of 14-16 year olds taking part in at least 30 minutes of moderate, intensity sport each week.

The survey, which assesses every local authority in England, propels Warrington into 36th place nationally for over-16 participation and 43rd position for 14-16 years



participation. Nationally, the Active People Survey also showed that more people than ever are getting active. The number now stands at 15.97 million people over the age of 16 playing sport weekly. That's up 229,400 from 12

months ago and is 1.88 million more than when London won the right to host the Olympic and Paralympic Games.

In Warrington, LiveWire ran their own "This Girl Can" programme and supported 32 inactive females from across Warrington to take part in a range of activities such as horse riding, indoor wall climbing, archery and golf as well as tennis,

archery and golt as well as tennis, running, trampoline classes and ladies only boxing. Anne Boyd, Active Cheshire CEO said: "I know local partners will be thrilled with this result as it demonstrates what's possible through collaboration. Improving levels of physical activity locally can have a dramatic effect on the can have a dramatic effect on the health of our communities and must not be overlooked as a 'nice to do' but viewed as an important part of everyday life. Congratulations and thanks to all involved in achieving this impressive result."



Warrington Means Business

At the time of writing, last Saturday (3 December) marked, for me, the start of the Christmas season and of course the joys of Christmas shopping! It was perhaps no co-incidence that Small Business Saturday launched their campaign to support local businesses, and encouraged shoppers to shop local.

Warrington & Co. lent its support of the need to shop local and support our grass roots businesses, so that they can grow and flourish.

and grow and flourish. At this time of year you can't help thinking about the opportunities and resolutions for the New Year, and reflect on the past 12 months' achievements. Warrington's skyline changed significantly this year, with the rise of The Base and the University Technical College along with the demolition of the old market multi storey car park, and the pace of change isn't set to slow any time soon. The temporary market hall will be finished early in the New Year ready for its comprehensive fit out, and market traders will move in during the summer. At ground level there have been some positive changes too such as

the summer. At ground level there have been some positive changes too such as the underpass works that link Foundry Street and the Bus Interchange, these have significantly improved the link through from Stadium Quarter across to Golden Square. In March we'll be announcing the winning contractor for the main build of the Time Square scheme. This will include the new market hall, council offices, public realm, cinema and restaurants. We'll also be in a position to announce the first four family friendly restaurants who have signed

up. And there are some exciting names in there too!

To support the developments and the new Warrington market, the 1,160 space multi storey car park will open up mid-summer, with state of the art electric car charging points and family friendly parking friendly parking. In the town centre it's encouraging

In the town centre it's encouraging and great to welcome many new business arrivals including Crawshaws, who opened in the Summer, A & D Needham jewellers who have moved from Legh Street, Phone Clinic, Barbers No.1, Peter Walsh Hairdressing and Hop & Co., also the many new arrivals at the Market including Italian Produce Direct, the Thai delicatessen and the Craft Room and over at Golden Square, Footlocker and Lambretta amongst others. amongst others.

amongst others. Elsewhere, across the town, Omega continues to thrive. The speculatively built 365,000sq ft unit is complete and Omega Warrington Limited will shortly be announcing who has taken occupancy. The massive 600,000 sq ft unit for Asda Walmart will open in March 2017. It is the most advanced logistics facility in Europe and cost £80 million to fit out. The Hut Group are already operating from their similarly sized unit at Omega, which when fully operational it will employ up to 3000

people. The new manufacturing unit for Domino Pizza is under construction and will be completed in Summer creating hundreds more jobs.

and will be completed in Summer creating hundreds more jobs. We know that growth can't happen without some significant infrastructure changes, and we're looking at plans to address this, to keep Warrington moving. Next year we'll begin improvement works to Junction 8 of the M62 to assist traffic flow. We're also planning to build a bridge over the River Mersey off Chester Road on to Centre Park and assist traffic flow at Bridge Foot. Subject to funding work will begin on the construction of Warrington West Railway Station too. It was very positive news that last month the Government announced in the Autumn Statement funding for further feasibility studies into Warrington Western Link; the high level bridge that would link Warrington West across to Warrington South. An additional £11.2 million was also granted through the Local Growth Fund for further infrastructure improvement works at Birchwood and at Omega. There's so much happening, and at such pace that we have had to update 'Warrington Means Business' ahead of schedule. This important document

This important document is Warrington Borough Council and Warrington & Co.'s ambitious framework for economic growth. The first version launched in 2013 has achieved development projects totalling £750 million creating over 4 500 ibits 4,500 jobs.




The Burtonwood airfield first opened in 1940 and was transferred to the US Army in 1942. It was at one time the largest airfield in Europe, with 18,000 servicemen and women stationed there and played a key role during the Berlin Airlift in 1948-48.

It again became a major US

base in 1966 when it became what was said to be the largest military storage depot in Europe after the US were forced to close down depots in France. The main warehouse was said to be the largest building under a single roof in Europe

in Europe. The base finally closed in 1994 and the site is now largely occupied by the Omega development site and Chapelford urban village.



'Making Tax Digital'

Well that's Christmas and New Year over for another 12 months. Hopefully, you have found this period fulfilling and that you are now set up to face the cold, damp and dark days that we have ahead of us before that spring sunshine arrives again.

Of course, an accountant's New Year only arrives at the end of January when all of his client's tax returns have been submitted.

But if the taxman is to be believed all that is set to change when "Making Tax Digital" is rolled out. People in business have already had a few taster sessions of this digital "revolution". Payroll information is already required to be submitted monthly on-line in "Real Time", the new workplace pensions rely heavily on electronic submission of data, and VAT returns are now workplace and a compart

reiy neavity on electronic submission of data, and VAT returns are now exclusively electronic, as are Corporation Tax Returns and payments. However, "Making Tax Digital" will affect everyone in the tuture. For individuals the "Personal Tax Account" ("PTA") service is currently being rolled out, and will be available to all taxpayers from April. To get one you will need to first register for a Government Gateway account. You can then create your PTA, the aim of which is to bring together all of your dealings with HMRC. So what does this do? this do?

Currently, the service enables a taxpayer to:

See their tax code

Obtain a forecast of state pension entitlement Check the details held by HMRC regarding any benefits-in- kind

Check the details held by HMRC regarding any benefits-in- kind received and incorporated into your tax code
 Speed up the issue of a refund if you have overpaid tax. Normally, HMRC take up to 45 days after the calculation of a refund to send out a cheque. This can be cut to 3-5 days by entering your bank details on your PTA. However, this is only the start, and it is the aim of HMRC that the PTA will eventually replace the annual tax return, reducing under and overpayments of tax. It is also the aim to amalgamate all of the information held by HMRC in one place. This includes all of the data currently received from employers, banks, building societies, and other aovernment departments.

As part of "Making Tax Digital" all businesses, including the self-employed and landlords earning in excess of £10,000 per annum, will be required to make returns of income to HMRC every quarter. Search for descendants of World War 1 school children

THE search is on for the descendants of school children who wrote letters to a much-loved Warrington teacher after he went away to fight in World War 1.

Sadly, George Arthur Whitfield, who lived in Stockton Heath, was killed in battle and never returned

to see his pupils or his family again. But Warrington Museum has a collection of his belongings – including letters sent to him by pupils at a school where he taught

in Arpley Street. Now the Relationships Centre and Life Skills Academy are engaging with young people through a Heritage Lottery Project, "Us and Then and Way Back When" which looks at life for young people in Warrington during

When" which looks at lite ror young people in Warrington during the years from 1912 onwards. As part of their research they are looking at the lives and outcomes for young men who left Warrington to find in the Great War. The academy is looking to trace descendants of the pupils who sent the latters to George when he was

the letters to George when he was away fighting in battle. The letters no doubt cheered him up to a great extent as he in return sent letters

William Bibby, who lived at 17 Arpley Street, Jack Isaac who lived at 20 Crosfield Street, and Jack Murray who lived at 23 Wilson Patten Street were three of the boys who George was in contact with.

Jack Isaac and John Bayly Isaac who was born in 1906 may have been one and the same person with parents named John Bayly Isaac, and Mildred Parry Isaac. The family lived at 20 Crosfield Street according to the 1911 Census

William Bibby may have been born in 1905, and his parents were John and Emma. It is believed that some of the family went on to live in Sheffield.

Jack Murray and John Barrie Murray, born in 1905 – possibly

one and the same person – may have been the son William Murray and Janet McEadin Murray.
