In the meanwhile the Parish Council has put up a stalwart fight to save Lymm Library and to campaign against the current parking fees. Both issues are still under review and hopefully by the time the next letter is published things will have been resolved in our favour. Many thanks to all those who have campaigned on behalf of Lymm's residents.

If you are on line you can read the Parish blog on Facebook. This is a user friendly version of the Parish meeting and reflects the main items discussed. If you are a local organisation or charity and are holding an event please let our Parish Clerk, Amanda Riley know so that it can go on our website/blog/twitter.

The Parish Council has agreed to buy a replacement bus shelter in the centre of the village. We will be looking for a suitable alternative that will also include seats. We are also looking to expand our Ground Maintenance Team and are hoping to have a few new faces by early Summer.

The Parish Council has supported the idea of a 'Green Gym' for Lymm and we are backing all funding streams so hopefully this will be built in the near future. Warrington Borough Council will be applying to WREN and are hoping to situate the equipment in Ridgeway Grundy Park.

We are also looking to reduce speeding through the centre by buying an additional speed awareness sign. Cllr R Barr and Cllr A Fradgley have also met with the Police to discuss the issue of HGVs travelling through restricted areas.



Council "comfortable" with new parking charges

CLAIMS that Warrington Borough Council's decision to increase parking charges at Lymm and Stockton Heath was illegal have been refuted by the council's transport chief.

Cllr Hans Mundry, lead member for transport, said: "We are comfortable that we have followed all the correct procedures in introducing these charges.

"The pricing is appropriate and comparable with neighbouring authorities but we will continue to review the situation."

The claims came from Lymm parish councillor Anna Fradgley after the borough introduced a new charging system in Lymm and Stockton Heath shortly before Christmas.

She raised a number of Freedom of Information questions with the council and claimed that the borough's parking task group had received inadequate information before it reached its decision.

As a result, she argued, the new charges contravened the Traffic Management Act 2004.

She demanded a review of the situation by the borough's legal department and said if she did not receive a satisfactory response she would have no option but to raise the matter with the Local Government Ombudsman. Cllr Fradgley said: "I certainly don't regard Cllr Mundry's response as

Cllr Fradgley said: "I certainly don't regard Cllr Mundry's response as being adequate. I am still awaiting a response from the council's legal department but I do not believe the council have followed correct procedures.

"Nor are the charges comparable with comparable authorities. You can park for 10p in Altrincham and for free in Northwich."

The changes at Lymm and Stockton Heath involved abolishing a free one hour parking period and replacing it with a 15-minute free period and increasing the minimum charge from 50p to £1.

Local shopkeepers claim the changes have resulted in a loss of trade.

Heritage Group seek lottery funding to k

LYMM Heritage Group is looking forward to an exciting year after submitting a lottery bid to establish a core exhibition at the new heritage centre which is taking shape in the village.

The Group submitted a bid to the Heritage Lottery fund at the end of January which if successful will not only help establish a core exhibition in the new centre on Legh Street but would also equip it is as a base for learning, research and archive building. The centre would tell the story

of the village's rich heritage particularly through the periods of the transport and industrial revolution based on the themes of Trades, Transport and Tradition.

The group's chair, Alan Williams said:" We have learnt a lot over the two years since our formation and put in an enormous amount of work to understand what makes a successful centre. We have talked to potential local users and key contributors like the local History Society, schools and clubs as well as visiting many other centres and listening to industry experts."

The outcome of all the research

is a project with three areas . There will be a core exhibition , telling the story of Lymm's history through storyboards, artefacts, images, video and models. A second important area will be a set of learning resources and activities that will help local schools introduce children to a better understanding and appreciation of the history of the area where they live. Finally the group aim to launch a digitisation project that will ensure that as much as possible that is still available today, like documents, photographs and film

and stored to ensure it is still there for future generations" Ray Banton who is the group's secretary explained: "We are aiming to create a space that has an interesting and engaging main exhibition but also to be able to adapt that space to welcome in groups for talks and school classes as well as having a series of smaller temporary exhibitions perhaps mounted by schools." Volunteer Recruitment is the

perhaps mounted by schools." Volunteer Recruitment is the responsibility of Trish Cockayne and Scott Smith. Scott, who is still in his twenties has only lived in the village a couple of years but soon became fascinated by its history. He said: "I am really enjoying being part of such a dynamic team and I am picking up more knowledge of Lymm history as I go along. The response from people on social media and through our volunteer response from people on social media and through our volunteer campaigns has been terrific. We have over 1,700 people following us on facebook from all over the world, many of whom grew up in Lymm and moved away. It really feels like we are building a worldwide community." worldwide community.

People using the village have already commented of how much the appearance of the building is being improved and the final step being improved and the final step will be replacement of the front of the building, the former Royal British Legion in Legh St, with a striking modern look, mainly glass, that will offer a welcoming facade for visitors to the village. year. We need to be promoting this to people outside the village, which in turn will bring in trade. The Heritage Centre, which is due to open this year, will provide a focal point for residents and visitors keen to explore and learn more about Lymm's rich heritage."

It was agreed to set out to "Market Lymm" to local residents and to visitors.

Parish councillor Anna Fradgley said: "I am so excited to be part of this working group. Lymm is a great place, full of exciting, energetic people and we need to build on this to really help boost the local economy."

HS2 at "high risk" due to historic mining

SECTIONS of the controversial HS2 rail line near Lymm will be at "high risk" of collapse because of historic mining activities. This is claimed in a new report by HS2 Ltd, the company overseeing the

project.

project. It identifies five former salt mining or brine extraction sites near Lymm which it classifies as "red" – the highest risk – and 14 others that are classified as "amber" – the next highest risk. Lymm experienced a "salt rush" around 1900 after a large area of high quality brine was discovered at Heatley. Eventually there were salt mines at Lymm, Heatley and Agden – with the last of them closing as recently as 1959. Lymm councillor Ian Marks said: "This is frightening. The route through Cheshire has already been changed to avoid salt mines but why has it taken until now to find out about the risk in Lymm?

until now to find out about the risk in Lymm? "The Parish Council has just sent off its response to the HS2 consultation. We welcomed the move of the rolling stock depot from Golborne to near Crewe. This removed one of the reasons for having the link/spur to the east of Warrington. People have differing views about the merits of HS2, but most people object to this link. We think it is a waste of money and will have a datimental difference " a detrimental effect on the environment in our village.'

The new report also reveals that the current suggested line for HS2 would cross Britain's biggest active salt mine, at Winsford, where there are plans to extend its workings.

to extend its workings. Salt mining has gone on in Cheshire for 400 years and the £56 million rail line would cross areas notorious for subsidence. The report warns of "the potential for the rapid development of significant movement" due to the weight and vibration of trains, "with a consequent risk rating as high"

Salt mining involves hollowing out vast caves, many not far below the surface, often leading to subsidence and damage to property. The route for the 225mph trains has already been changed once to avoid

running over underground caverns that could cause a "catastrophic ground loss", the report says. The new route will require the closure and rebuilding of the A556, as well as miles of new embankments and viaducts, adding up to £750million

to the cost.

HS2 Ltd said: "Development of HS2 is a detailed process ... We are now consulting on the route through Cheshire."



Expansion plans get the go-ahead

BOROUGH planning chiefs have given the go-ahead for Lymm Rugby Club's ambitious plans for the redevelopment of their ground and clubhouse in Crouchley Lane.

But they had added additional conditions to try and accommodate the concerns of local people worried about parking problems, including coach parking.

Fifteen nearby residents had objected to the proposals which include include construction of a new purpose built clubhouse, multi-sports facility, four tennis courts, a 3G playing pitch, conversion of the existing clubhouse into four residential dwellings and construction of 10 new houses, together with landscaping, infrastructure and engineering works.

The objectors were mainly from people living in Manor Road and Crouchley Lane and there was also an objection from Lymm Parish Council.

The main objections related to parking issues in Crouchley Lane where, objectors claim there are existing problems which would be worsened by further residential development.

There were also concerns about late night social activities, the scale of buildings having a harmful impact on the Green Belt, loss of privacy, noise, dust, glare from floodlights, etc. The club had more than 60 letters of support – but residents claimed these

were mostly from people outside the local area.

Lymm Parish Council said it appreciated the club needs improves facilities but objected in line with its policy of opposing all building within the Green Belt

Planning officers acknowledged that the development was inappropriate in the Green Belt – but recommended approval because of "special circumstances"


