THE ongoing saga over the future of the town's libraries looks set to rumble on until at least November.

Following the extensive public members of consultation the borough council's executive board have now decided to go back to the drawing board by forming a working party to oversee the next phase of the "modernisation" of the town's libraries.

A draft report by library operators LiveWire, which aimed to keep libraries open pending ongoing negotiations has now been shelved while representatives from the council, LiveWire and independent advisers form α working group.

One wonders what cost it has taken in man hours to get to this stage following the various public consultations – with many more hours head – all brought about by a need to cut £300,000 a year from the library budgets.

I'm glad I'm not the one who has to plan budgets for the year ahead! Meanwhile LiveWire have

yet again come under fire from Warrington North MP Helen Jones, this time for not paying their staff the Living Wage.

While Warrington Borough Council, who are implementing the squeeze on LiveWire may have agreed to pay their staff the Living Wage, they are set to put up council tax by 4.98 per cent, which is way, above the state of inflation is way above the rate of inflation.

Many businesses up and down the country are struggling to pay the minimum wage, let alone the Living Wage and in comparison to many in their industry, the rates of pay at LiveWire, which will be £7.50 an hour from April 1st are above the average market rates in their sector.

Maybe it is time for Helen Jones to sit down with the LiveWire Board and help come up with solutions. There is an open invitation on the table from LiveWire.

It is always easy to criticise



but not so easy to come up with solutions - particularly during these times of austerity and budget cuts. Negative thoughts and comments can create negative outcomes.

We all need to try and pull in the same direction for the benefit of our town. Even if you don't get on with people it is better to sit down at a table and discuss solutions rather than firing bullets.

Flood defence gets go-ahead

PLANS for a proposed flood defence embankment and the realignment of

PLANS for a proposed flood defence embankment and the realignment of Padgate Brook have been given the green light. The scheme, submitted by the Environment Agency, is a continuation of the major flood defence works which have been ongoing in Warrington for several years. It is part of a third phase of works and involves land at the rear of Orford Road. They include flood defence works to a gas regulator station, with landscaping and other associated work. Warrington planning committee was told the location and site of the work

Warrington planning committee was told the location and site of the work remained largely unchanged from that envisaged in an outline application submitted in 2011.

A new earth flood embankment will be constructed on land off Orford Road and a stretch of Padgate Brook will be realigned and de-culverted. The new embankment will tie in to higher ground at Birchwood Way and to a Network Rail embankment to the south.

The Burtonwood airfield first opened in 1940 and was transferred to the US Army in 1942. It was at one time the largest airfield in Europe, with 18,000 servicemen and women stationed there and played a key role during the Berlin Airlift in 1948-48.

It again became a major US base in 1966 when it became what was said to be the largest ilitary storage depot in Europe after the US were force to close down depots in France. The main warehouse was said to be the largest building under a single roof in Europe.

The base finally closed in 1994 and the site is now largely occupied by the Omega development site and Chapelford urban village.




Council leader's fury over Mersey bridge U-turn

Warrington Continues to perform well **By Steve Park**

IT'S the time of year that independent stats are produced relating to the economic performance of the previous year. These are a great barometer to assess how Warrington is performing collectively as an economy in relation to the rest of the

UK. Despite the global market uncertainty, I'm pleased to report that Warrington continues to fare well economically. The annual statistics produced by the economic think tank, Centre for Cities, continue to show Warrington out performing most of the UK in terms of economic indicators. The Centre for Cities consider Warrington to be in the top 64 cities in the UK. Warrington continues, its prove

64 cities in the UK. Warrington continues its proud status as the only place in the North of England classed as a high wage and low welfare city. Warrington is also ranked in the top 20 for average earnings and has the 16th lowest welfare spend per capita in the UK along with the 22nd lowest claimant count. The borough has the 9th highest employment rate in the UK and is 8th highest in terms of residents who possess formal qualifications. In previous years Warrington has

In previous years Warrington has always been ranked in the bottom

10 for high speed broadband but encouragingly has now moved up considerably and is ranked 40th out of 64 and well above the action of or of a dirad well above the national average, as a direct result of the Connecting Cheshire initiative. Great news but clearly still some way to go, which I know the Connecting Cheshire programme is on with. New businesses are the lifeblood of Warrington's communication

of Warrington's economy and the borough is ranked at 15th highest in the UK for the number of highest in the UK for the number of business start ups per capita and encouragingly are 5 paces below the national average for business closures. Business survival rate is therefore strong. The Centre for Cities stats are based on figures for 2015. Start-up Britain have released their stats for 2016 and rank Warrington at 13th highest number of business start ups in the UK. Next month Warrington & Co. will be announcing the findings of our Annual Property Review which looks at the trends and uptake in the commercial and residential property market over the last 12 months. These stats are now in their 19th year and provide an interesting

19th year and provide an interesting measure of the growth and strength of Warrington as a residential and business location. I've had a preview of some of the figures and, once again they are very encouraging. I'll report more next time.

Mum's bid to ease son's pain

A WARRINGTON mum has launched a fund-raising campaign to help her six-year-old son receive specialist surgery to alleviate daily

pain in his legs. Little Leon Hoey has cerebral palsy of the lower limbs and is in

constant pain. Leon went to Alder Hey Hospital on January 16, to see a a surgeon for the results of his gaiter analysis.

This shows how Leon walks and holds himself as he is walking. His mum Annemarie Dougan from Longford, said: "From the results the doctor decided that he wouldn't be able to do anything to the bones as Leon is too young to have the surgery and would have to wait until he is 9-11 years old. "He then suggested a SDR* operation which it's a neurology operation. This inverse key hole surgery in the sping and it auts all the tendens in his

This involves key hole surgery in the spine and it cuts all the tendons in his legs and helps them to release." Annemarie added: "For Leon to have that done would be a massive change as he currently walks on his tip toes causing him to go over to the back of his foot.

"Leon has to wear splints everyday and he doesn't like them as they are big and bulky and he knows that he looks different with them on. But it's the only way that he can keep his feet flat."

the only way that he can keep his feet flat." She said an SDR operation, which costs £20,000 was not funded on the NHS anymore as there wasn't a 100 percent success rate. Following the operation Leon will need a priviate physio which will also require funding and it will take up to two years to get his strength back. Annemarie added: "It's a lot of hard work and will need a lot of help but if this op will save him some of the pain that he gets all the time it would be worth it. We really need the good people from Warrington to help us out. Everyone that meets Leon falls in love with him." As we approach the end of another tax year it is time to look again at some of the valuable exemptions available to you before the end of the tax year. Inheritance Tax

The following annual gifts immediately reduce your estate



- can be used, but only in David Watkinson and Margaret Black addition to the current year's allowance. Any gift taking the value of gifts in the tax year to above £3,000, and all subsequent gifts, are taxable.
 Wedding gifts to your own child of £5,000 or less, to a grandchild or great grandchild of £2,000 or less, or £1,000 or less or £1,000 or less.
- grandchild or great grandchild of £2,000 or less, or £1,000 or less to anyone else.
 3. Gifts totalling under £250 to any person unless that person has received other gifts in the same year. This cannot be used to reduce tax on a larger gift, so a gift of £251 is wholly taxable.
 4. Gifts to help with the living costs of an ex-spouse, an elderly relative or a child under 18 or in full time education.
 5. Normal gifts from surplus income, such as Christmas and Birthday presents, or a regular gift.
- presents, or a regular gift.

Capital Gains Tax

The first £11,100 of net Capital Gain, after deducting losses, in any tax year is exempt. It may be worth considering selling an asset to realise a gain. There are anti-avoidance provisions to prevent "bed & breakfasting".

Pensions

The annual amount that you can put into a pension fund is restricted to the lower of the amount you earn in the tax year and £40,000. to the lower of the amount you earn in the tax year and £40,000. Tax relief will increase any investment within these limits by 25%. Pension contributions can be particularly valuable where income is just above £50,000 or £100,000 as they can prevent child benefit or personal allowances being withdrawn. Contributions of £2,880 can be made by anyone, even children with no income, and the government will increase that to £3,600. **Transfer of Personal Allowances** If you pay tax at 20% and your spouse or partner earns less than the personal allowance of £11,000 then they can transfer 10% of that allowance to you. To do so they must go online to the HMRC website and have both their own and you National Insurance number and be able to answer a number of security questions. In the current year, this is worth an additional net income of £220.
