Editor's Comment

BEING a father and a grandfather I cannot imagine anything worse than losing a child.

Over the years I have covered many heart-breaking stories where someone has lost a child, none more so than the tragic death of 16-yearold Julia Derbyshire.

Her father Adrian Derbyshire made the difficult decision of sharing photographs of his dying teenage daughter with the world, on what would have been her 18th birthday. Instead of sharing a glass of champagne with his beautiful champagne with his beautiful daughter he was placing roses on her grave.

She took the decision of ending her own life after being a victim of



online bullying which led to mental health issues.

I can't even begin to imagine the pain Adrian has been going through since that tragic day in October 2015 when he discovered his daughter's lifeless body in the family home.

But I salute his campaign to raise awareness of teenage suicide, online bullying and mental health issues and will continue to support him.

I am honoured to be a trustee of his new charity and I hope the good



people of Warrington will do what they can to help Adrian through these difficult times

While we shared the tragic photos of Julia online we have chosen to use this beautiful picture of her which I know is one of Adrian's personal favourites.

What a tragic waste of a beautfiul oung life - we must all do our best to help ensure other young lives are not wasted due to online bullying.

Exploring the dark history of 'film noir'

THE classic Hollywood movie genre "film noir" is coming to Warrington's libraries in May with a touring photographic exhibition, special film screenings and a display on the history of cinema in the town.

Paint it Black, a joint project between Warrington photographer Paul Jackson and partners Culture Warrington, LiveWire and the borough council, will explore the dark and mysterious world of film noir, a genre of American crime thrillers such as The Maltese Falcon, Double Indemnity and The Killers.

An exhibition of photographs inspired by these highly stylised black and white films, which are so evocative of mystery and intrigue with their dimly-lit nightscapes and



smoky silhouettes, will go on tour, spending a week at five of the town's libraries – Warrington Central, Penketh, Culcheth, Stockton Heath and Padgate.

The retro images will be accompanied by special screenings of classic film noir movies and promotion of the "hardboiled" American crime fiction novels which inspired them.

Warrington Noir, an exhibition exploring the history of cinema in the town during the 1940s and 1950s, will also run at Warrington Museum and Art Gallery to coincide with the film noir celebration, and will feature images and memorabilia from the period.

Paul, of Unit 8 Photography, said he was excited about the opportunity to promote the town's library offer. He said: "I love our libraries and

want to help promote what a great range of services and activities they have on offer.

"I am also quite a fan of old black and white films so Paint it Black provides an opportunity to explore both interests, and to have fun while hopefully doing something worthwhile.

Models, make-up artists, hair stylists, set and costume designers, and production assistants needed to help recreate some of the most memorable and iconic scenes

from this period of filmmaking in 24 photos.

Those involved in the project include Woolston resident Rosa Silvia, owner and designer of lingerie and swimwear business RS Intimates, who as well as being a model is helping with styling. Paul added: "We're after models with all sorts of looks and volunteers

with a variety of skills to star in the exhibition."

All participants will be invited to the opening night. Derek Dick, outreach

and engagement manager at Culture Warrington, said: "Paint it Black is designed to encourage people into Warrington's libraries, to showcase their unique offer and highlight their importance as community hubs."





THE memory of a Warrington woman who gave up a promising career to help others is set to live on after her life was tragically cut short.

The Relationships Centre in Museum Street recently lost one of their key members of staff, Lucy McGuire (Hindmarch).

Lucy aged 44 passed away after a short illness, leaving a husband and young son. Typically of Lucy, she was thinking

of others and donated her organs so that nine people could achieve an increased chance of an improved quality of life.

Having worked at the centre for many years, she touched the lives of many local families and individuals through both her work at the Relationships Centre and her strong association with St. Thomas' church in Stockton Heath.

She gave up a promising career in business to retrain as a counsellor to be able to support and empower young people to achieve their dreams through engaging with them and building their life skills.

She set up many young people's programmes and was passionate about reducing the effect of about reducing the effect of social isolation and increasing opportunities for a wide range of young people by listening, supporting and engaging with them. A spokesperson for the relationships centre said: "Lucy's legacy is the charity which she helped build and which has had such a tremendous impact on so

such a tremendous impact on so many people's lives. We will miss her physical presence but her

essence lives on in the daily work of the charity.

Smart transport scheme wins £300,000 grant

A HIGH-tech integrated transport scheme to ease congestion has been secured by Warrington Borough Council after winning a \pounds 300,000 grant from the government.

The fund from the Department for Transport is used to encourage highway authorities to make road transport increasingly smart through the use of data, connectivity and internet to improve safety, efficiency and emission's.

and emissions. Warrington Borough Council's bid was successful and was the joint highest in the country. The scheme will use Bluetooth technology to provide a real time communication link between drivers and Warrington's Urban Traffic Management and Control system. This will allow more effective control of the key junctions.

Clir Hans Mundry, the council's lead member for transport, said: "We're delighted to have secured this money for another one of our innovative and forward-thinking schemes. We hope this will help make journey times more efficient and more predictable, and address some of the current problems of traffic emissions caused by queuing.

"We also hope the scheme will boost the borough's economy, benefiting local businesses with fuel and travel time savings."

The project will also provide realtime information to businesses and the public via on-street information displays, interactive web pages, social media and an innovative local mobile phone app for drivers and bus travellers. The app would provide information on the causes of any delays and also give likely journey times, therefore allowing them to make an informed decision

It is hoped the scheme will be operating by March next year.

The Warrington Wolves PANDAs are The Foundation's Inclusive Football Team who have gone from strength to strength over recent years.

With 4 specific targeted sessions per week, participants are able to thrive in an inclusive environment, make new friends and take part in regular physical activity, whilst also developing their football skills.

As part of the Liverpool County Football Association, 6 tournaments are arranged each month where the teams compete against the likes of Everton and Liverpool.

There are currently four teams that are incorporated as part of Warrington Wolves PANDAs – Under 13s, Under 16s, Open Age and the Down's Syndrome Specific Team. Participants have the opportunity to take part in 34 hours of football each month.

Over 75 participants take part in the weekly sessions, currently ranging from ages 7 to 25.

2016 saw the Open Age PANDAs Team participate in their first overseas tournament in the Isle of Man, where they were able to spend the weekend living like professional footballers and compete against teams from as far as Gibraltar and Iceland.

The PANDAs also provides pathways for talent ID with two of the current squad having trials with the England Learning Disability team.

The Pass it Back Project was created as an extension of the thriving Wire2Wolves Project; celebrating the rich heritage of Warrington Wolves Rugby League Club.

Through support from the Heritage Lottery Fund, 25 volunteers were recruited to deliver aspects of Wire2Wolves within the Warrington community, educating local groups and allowing them to share their memories of the popular Rugby Club and also their town.

Through visits to local residential homes, it was found that sport was an emotive tool that could connect communities in other ways. A 6-week programme has been developed and is now being delivered within residential settings across Warrington.

Foundation volunteers have delivered the programme across 7 residential homes to date.

Over 100 people over the age of 60 have benefitted from regular interaction while residents have recorded over 65 memories through the Pass it Back website. AEAGUEAT

EVENTS & CHALLENGES

Along with weekly activity sessions delivered within Warrington Schools and the Warrington Community, The Foundation also have their annual flagship events that help to promote charitable messages and raise the profile of the organisation, whilst also raising much-needed funds for the charity.

In 2016, 30 cyclists travelled 230 miles from Warrington to Newcastle ready for Magic Weekend at St James' Park, many of which had never completed a similar challenge before. Over £8,000 was raised from this event, whom is now cemented as a favourite in The Foundation calendar. 2016 also saw the inaugural 'Foundation Mile' take place at the scenic Walton Hall and Gardens. Over 200 people were part of the event with Super League's favourite mascot; Wolfie! Families and local amateur sports were amongst those who joined in on the day and it is hoped it will encourage regular physical activity and annual participation in the event.

The Wire2Wolves Beer Festival is an event with a difference. Based in the South Stand concourse at The Halliwell Jones Stadium, real ales are sourced from the areas of all Super League Clubs and rugby and ale fans attend to sample the tipples whilst viewing the Wire2Wolves heritage timeline and learn about the history of the Club. All funds raised from the Beer Festival go back into the development of the Warrington Wolves Heritage Project. It is these events that really make a difference and enable the charitable work of The Foundation to continue to make the impact that it does.

RUGBY LEAGUE

With The Foundation's affiliation with Warrington Wolves, Rugby League is cemented at the heart of the organisation. Through funding from Sky, a dedicated team deliver Rugby League across Warrington and the surrounding areas.

In 2016, over 6,000 children received rugby coaching from The Foundation through 30,000 contact hours.

753 hours were coached within the academic year within schools across Warrington.

1500 children were part of the Warrington Wolves match day as mascots or flag bearers.

'Winning and Losing' Assemblies were delivered to 8,000 children within Warrington Primary Schools.

60 adults have gained coaching qualifications through The Foundation's Rugby League Programme.



SKY TRY Success Story – Harvey Keogh

Harvey's first experience of rugby was when Wolves Foundation coaches visited Chapelford Primary School as part of the SKY TRY programme. The coaching team identified that Harvey had attributes that would be suitable to progress in Rugby League and he was signposted to his local community club Crosfields Cobras Under 9s.

Harvey attended the sessions and enjoyed his experience with his new team. Following this, Harvey and his family were invited to the Warrington vs Wakefield game where he had the opportunity to be mascot and lead out the team.

After the game Harvey met Man of the Match, Ben Currie, where he was able to ask advice on how to develop his future career.

Harvey and his family's experience with the Wolves has led to them purchasing 2017 memberships and him becoming an integral part of the Crosfields Cobras team.

PLAYERS & WOLFIE

The support of the Warrington Wolves players and coaches is extremely important to The Wolves Foundation.

They assist our Charity in many ways, not only by their hands on involvement across all aspects of our work but just as importantly, in passing on some of their own life experiences to help benefit others. Held in high esteem as role models across the town, their words of encouragement have inspired many to engage and achieve through our projects. During 2016, members of the Wolves squad made 139 community visits.

Warrington Wolves Mascot, Wolfie, is one of Rugby League's favourite Mascots and is loved and recognised by young and old alike. Wolfie visits many of our activities and events and due to his great popularity, is a great tool to help engage with members of our community. In 2016, Wolfie supported 144 activities and events.

Closure of Future Tech School confirmed

Warrington Collegiate The Education Trust has announced, with regret, that the Future Tech Studio School will close on 31 August 2017

Unfortunately, pupil numbers at the school are low, which means the school is not financially viable in the longer-term.

Nichola Newton, principal and CEO of the Trust said: "The decision to close the school has been taken only after extensive discussion with the Department for Education and Education Funding Agency to

explore all available options". "Our priority is to ensure the wellbeing and highest standard of education possible for our pupils over the remainder of the academic year. Pupils in year 10, and their parents, will receive tailored

parents, will receive tailored advice, guidance and support to find alternative places to complete their studies from September 2017. "We will continue to support pupils in Year 11 and Year 13 to plan their next steps."

Disappointed parents have launched a petition for the school to remain open. The Future Tech Studio



Freemasons celebrate 300 years of tradition

FREEMASONS from all parts of the North West attended a special church service at Warrington celebrating the creation 300 years ago of the first Grand Lodge in the world.

The Province of West Lancashire holds a unique place in the chronicled history of English Freemasonry as the earliest known record of anyone being initiated into an English lodge appears in the diary of Elias Ashmole, of Lichfield.

In an entry for October 1646 he wrote: "1646, Oct: 16, 4.30 P.M. I was made a Free Mason at Warrington in Lancashire, with Colonel Henry Mainwaring of Karnicham in Cheshire. The names of those that were then of the Lodge (were) Mr Rich. Penketh, Warden, Mr James Collier, Mr Rich. Sankey, Henry Littler, John Ellam, Rich. Ellam and Hugh Brewer."

Freemasonry in Warrington is still very strong today with 14 lodges meeting at the Masonic Hall in Winmarleigh Street. The oldest lodge still meeting in Warrington – the Lodge of Lights No 148 was founded in 1765, while the youngest was founded as recently as 1990. The celebration at St Elphin's Church, Warrington of the creation 300 years ago of the first Grand Lodge was attended by the Provincial Grand Master Tony Harrison and his wife Maureen, the Deputy Provincial Grand Master Philip Gunning and nine Assistant Provincial Grand Masters, and many hundreds of Masons and their families from Warrington, Wigan, Widnes, Liverpool and other towns across the region.

From its earliest days, Freemasonry has been concerned with the care of orphans, the sick and the aged. This work continues today and in Warrington more than £30,000 is raised annually for charities such as St Rocco's Hospice, the Elderly Persons' Unit at Warrington Hospital and to the Warrington Crossroads Carers' Scheme, Warrington Disability Partnership, British Heart Foundation and many others.



Tax rise, tax lies

The verbal contortions exercised by our politicians appear straight. The self-employed are facing a tax increase from April 2018 despite previous promises made to gain electoral favours. But significantly, the government is lying through its teeth about it. We do not necessarily object to an increase in Class 4 NIC of



2% over the next two years and many readers will feel the same.

many readers will feel the same. David Watkinson and Margaret Black Firstly, we accept that employees pay NIC contributions of 12% whilst the self-employed currently only pay 9%. Secondly, whilst the self-employed do not enjoy the benefits of Statutory Maternity Pay or unemployment benefits, we also accept that the state pensions received by employees and the self-employed have been equalised. There is, therefore, a valid argument that the amounts paid should be brought closer. Thirdly, whilst this equality of benefits has been achieved primarily by reducing employees' pensions down to the level received by the self-employed, only the most optimistic (or deluded) taxpayer would expect the deductions to follow the same route follow the same route.

We do, however, object to the contempt shown to the taxpayers by the Chancellor. Our message to him is that we can all recognise blatant lies when we hear them. Lie one. This increase does not break the manifesto promise made

by the Conservatives that they would not increase Income Tax, National Insurance or VAT during the course of this Parliament. Their justification is that the small print in the subsequent Act of Parliament,

justification is that the small print in the subsequent Act of Parliament, which for reasons known only to themselves at the time they felt was needed to make themselves keep their promise, narrowed these promises somewhat. Now we know that the purpose of that Act was to give them a "get out" clause. Lie two. This increase in the rates of NIC will lead to a reduction in the NIC paid by self-employed taxpayers earning £16k or less. Well, we don't think Einstein could make that work. OK, last year the Chancellor reduced Class 2 NIC payable from 2018. Very good, but the praise and accolade earned by that reduction has already been heaped upon the government. It also created the new, reduced, level from which future movements should be measured. Mr Chancellor, the simple fact is that an increase in NIC is an increase in NIC! Respect can both be described in many ways and also must be earned. Any respect earned by the Chancellor this week equates to the respect that is shown by an OAP on a dark night in a back street towards a gang of muggers!

towards a gang of muggers! To all politicians, if an increase in taxation is required then tell the truth and admit it! You might then begin to get back some proper respect!

Boxing club aims to reduce antisocial behaviour

OLYMPIC and Commonwealth boxer Courtney Fry and Cheshire's Police and Crime Commissioner David Keane have helped launch a new boxing club to tackle anti-social behaviour (ASB) at Chapelford, Warrington.

Chapelford Boxing Club was officially opened at Chapelford Village Primary School to provide a base for young people to exercise, learn new skills and socialise.

It has been set up by LiveWire following a spate of ASB incidents in the area and is funded by the Police and Crime Commissioner.

Police and Crime Commissioner. At the launch event, the Commonwealth gold medallist encouraged the young people to take part in a range of activities including boxing workouts and team building exercises. Courtney, who also represented Great Britain at the 2000 Sydney

Olympics, has worked with young people for a number of years and has gained his Level 3 in Sports Mentoring.

It's hoped that the activities on offer will help promote community cohesion and deter young people from causing trouble on the streets

in west Warrington.

In west Warrington. Paul Flannery, neighbourhood engagement officer at LiveWire, is leading the project. He said: "It was fantastic to see so many young people turn up for the first session we've held in Chapelford.

"This is the second boxing club we've launched across the town to help tackle ASB, and we hope to see a reduction in calls out in Chapelford – just like we've seen in Westy, where we launched a club back in 2015."

David Keane said: "It gives me great pride to be able to fund community focused projects such as the Chapelford Boxing Club which aim to tackle ASB and promote community cohesion."

The club will run every Friday night between 7pm-9pm with young people aged seven to 16 years welcome.


