
Erin, from Year 6, said: "I thought the workshop was interesting I enjoyed learning about other people's situations and how to deal with them."

# Village groups receive community grants

FOUR groups who were awarded funding from Kingsley's first-ever Community Fund received cheques at the monthly meeting of the parish council.

They were the 1st Kingsley and Newton Scout Group, Kingsley Players Youth Theatre, Kingsley Youth Group (formerly KU17) and Kingsley Garden and Produce Club

Council chairman Cllr Danny Moores said: "Kingsley is so Moores said: "Kingsley is so lucky to have so many incredible volunteers who give up their time to organise and run groups, put on events in the village, for the benefit of all its residents. The parish council values the work of all those who make such a positive contribution towards village life. all those who make such a positive contribution towards village life, which is why we are especially pleased to be able to provide some much needed funding to these four groups via our first ever Community Fund. We look forward to working with and supporting the work of other local groups in future years."

The Community Fund came about when in February 2016, the parish council established a working group to look into the possibility

group to look into the possibility of providing a community fund which would allow groups within the parish to undertake projects which they could not afford to fund themselves and which would benefit the residents and children

benefit the residents and children within the parish of Kingsley.
Following on from the work undertaken by the working group, in April last year, the council formally approved the creation of the Community Fund and in November the council invited arrange or organisations within the groups or organisations within the parish to submit a bid for a grant of up to £1,000. The application process required groups to provide details of their structure, constitution, previous year's accounts and details of the project they wished to undertake. The closing date for bids was January 31.

Bids were received from four organisations, were reviewed and assessed by the Community Fund working group and approved by the parish council in February. Kingsley Parish Council hopes to run the Community Fund each

year subject to future priorities and budget demands, providing further funding for projects within the village from a wide range of community groups.

# Remembering the Battle of Passchendale

MEMBERS of Frodsham Town Council's World War 1 working group are organising events to mark the 100th anniversary of Passchendaele - a major campaign to capture ridges near Ypres.

At least seven Frodsham men are known to have taken part in the campaign and more than 30 died during 1917 and the working group want to ensure they are never forgotten.

A cascade of poppies, last displayed at Frodsham Health Centre, will be on show at Frodsham Community Centre from September 13 to October 25. On October 4, the film "Passchendaele" will be screened at St Laurence Church.

Church.

Anyone with WW1 memorabilia - documents, photographs, medals etc. - are invited to Frodsham Library on Saturday, October 21 to have the memorabilia scanned or photographed for preservation for posterity. The event will include a talk by Paul Knight, a major in the Army Reserves and a history scholar. Talks are going on with Cheshire West and Chester Council over the creation of a poppy/wildflower bed in Castle Park.

# Pubwatch digital scheme launched to help reduce antisocial behaviour

A DIGITAL scheme to help reduce anti-social behaviour and public space violence has been set up by a Pubwatch group in Frodsham and Helsby with the support of officers from Chester Local Policing Unit.

Pubwatch online – an internet

Pubwatch online – an internet and text message based communication and information sharing portal designed specifically for Pubwatch schemes – has been introduced to help members of the group including licensees and PCSOs (Police Community Support Officers) to better engage with each other and share information. The new system will help to improve the identification of

The new system will help to improve the identification of revellers who cause trouble and prevent them from entering licensed premises. It will also include photographs and information of people who are known for causing

anti-social behaviour or violence making it easier for members of the group to recognise them.

The scheme can be operated from and accessed through computers, mobile phones, social networking and real-time communication, which will help to move the Frodsham and Helsby Pubwatch scheme forward.

#### Protect

Working with licensees Pubwatch is part of the force's county-wide 'Street Safe' initiative, which aims to protect communities from antisocial behaviour and public space violence.

Sergeant Ian Wilson, of Chester Local Policing Unit and responsible for managing the night time economy in Frodsham and Helsby, said: "We fully support the new Pubwatch online scheme, which will help officers and partner agencies work better together to combat anti-social behaviour and violence.

"We want to ensure people who come to socialise in Frodsham and Helsby can do so safely and not have their time spoilt by those who behave violently or antisocially. Those who choose to drink irresponsibly and cause trouble can expect to be banned from all of the pubs.

"This new online system will give licensees the knowledge and confidence to identify and prevent offenders entering their premises as well as notify all other licensees to give them the opportunity to reintorce the ban too.

"I want to further reassure



communities in Frodsham and Helsby that we will continue to make it a safer place to visit and will deal with those who choose to behave or intend to behave badly."

Pubwatch online will also enable licensees and PCSOs to communicate and share information with neighbouring schemes such as Chester City Centre and Runcorn.

# Partnership brings high speed broadband to 100 homes

A PARTNERSHIP between local residents and BT is to make high-speed fibre broadband available to around 100 homes on the Kingswood Park estate in Frodsham.

Openreach, the local network business which is part of BT Group, will install new fibre optic cabling and a new green road-side cabinet equipped with the latest Fibre-to-the-Cabinet (FTTC) technology as part of BT's Community Fibre Partnerships scheme

Partnerships scheme.

Speeds of up to 80Mbps will be available for the first time to the Kingswood Park community from a wide range of broadband service

providers.

The partnership is benefitting from funding through the Government's Better Broadband subsidy scheme and will see local residents get the high-speed service by Spring next year.

The scheme allows households and businesses with internet speeds of less than 2Mbps, who are

The scheme allows households and businesses with internet speeds of less than 2Mbps, who are not included in any current programme to rollout high-speed fibre broadband, to get funding for better broadband using any technology. The Kingswood Park residents were awarded £350 per eligible household for a new fibre broadband network.

The cost of bringing fibre broadband technology to residents in the community has been covered by the Government scheme and Openreach's investment.

Dr Peter Simpson, who led the local community group to campaign for faster broadband, said: "BT approached us proactively to help find a way to upgrade our slow broadband and I'm very pleased that we have been able to work together to come up with a solution to vastly improve on

pleased that we have been able to work together to come up with a solution to vastly improve on our current poor broadband speeds.

"Not only do we have families living on the development who need high-speed fibre broadband to watch internet TV, snop online and do homework, but we also have people working from home needing it to enable them to do their jobs efficiently. The arrival of high-speed broadband will make a big difference to all our lives."

Kieran Charleson, BT's regional director, said:
"We have been working closely with the people
of Kingswood Park to agree this funding solution
to bring superfast fibre to the local community and
it's great news that the contract has now been
signed and the service will be up and running by
Spring 2018. We're keen to have conversations
with other communities who might be able to
benefit from this approach."

#### **Question:**

How often should I review my Will?

Regularly and particularly after there has been a life changing event either directly with yourself, a loved one or someone you have named in your Will.

For example consider these scenarios:

After a marriage or partnership has been dissolved then any gift to the former partner in their Will generally will be void. This provision does not apply to any other relatives i.e. a former son or daughter-

A client was divorced but discovered his mother's Will A client was divorced but discovered his mother's Will left the estate to him, however provision had been made that if he died before her then his share would pass to his 'lovely wife'. His mother had lost capacity to deal with her financial affairs and changing her Will would be a difficult process even though the relationship with her former daughter-in-law had broken down Some people will, of course, still want to make provision for a former son or daughter-in-law after a divorce but in our experience this is a rare law after a divorce but in our experience this is a rare

2. If a relationship breaks down and the parties were never married, gifts to one party in the other's Will are not affected. A client discovered that his father's Will pre-dated a relationship breakup with the girlfriend being the sole beneficiary. They were no longer in contact and she had moved overseas. The current situation meant that his father's ex-partner was entitled to administer the estate and benefit from it, and in the event of his death our client would need to track down and locate the former girlfriend and pass the estate to her.

# Kingsley Players make a 'Grand Gesture'

KINGSLEY Players return to the stage with a hilarious black comedy 'The Grand Gesture', Deborah McAndrew's witty adaptation of the 1928 Russian play 'The Suicide' by Nikolai Erdman.




# Mayor goes back to his roots with fund-raising Ceilidh
