New Tax Year - Happy New ISA Allowance

As we go into another new financial year it is well worth looking at both your new ISA allowance and the new rules for ISAs. In 2017-18 the ISA allowance has increased to a generous £20000. This means that a couple can save £40000pa in a tax efficient savings vehicle. The increase in the ISA allowance should be a welcome boost for savers, especially with the more recent reduction in the pension allowances. But, you have to make use of them.

The ISA has been a fantastic success story over the last 10 years with billions of pounds being put into them. I am not a great advocate of some of the recent changes, like the addition of the lifetime ISA. I just think that it complicates what is basically a very simple financial product, with petty little rules and regulation. But, we are where are and we now have the Lifetime ISA. This allows savers up to age 39 to save £4000pa into an ISA and receive tax relief from the government. Should people consider this? Absolutely they should. It will not only allow younger savers to save towards their first property, but will also incentivise people that prefer to save into an ISA for retirement. And for people that just

want to make additional pension savings.

And for the older generations there is good news too. For some clients with an Inheritance Tax (IHT) liability may want to consider an ISA which also benefits from Inheritance tax savings for future ISA contributions. Last year it became possibly to save into an AIM ISA. Alternative Investment Market as it is known is for smaller companies on the London Stock Exchange. The AIM ISA is particularly attractive because it allows people to transfer previous years ISA allowances into it. And after a 2-year qualifying period the proceeds are free from IHT liability.

Goodbye to Stockton Heath.

On a final note Simple Solutions are moving from Stockton Heath to Warrington town centre next month. It will be sad to leave the village in many ways, having set up there in November 2009. However, we are very excited at the prospect of our new home because the offices are fantastic.... More on this in the coming months.

Editor's comment

THERE are people in Stockton Heath who take a dim view of the fact that while neighbouring Lymm was able to persuade borough council chiefs to restore a full, free hour of parking on village car parks, Stockton Heath was not.

After reviewing the parking situation in both villages, the powers-that-be apparently came to the conclusion that 15-minutes free parking was reasonable in Stockton

Heath but was not in Lymm.

Traders in both villages had claimed drastic reductions in business after the full free hour was abolished. Some claimed trade had fallen by as much as 30 per cent. So why the borough should differentiate between the two we do not know.

Stockton Heath Parish Council accepts that the same solution to parking problems might not be appropriate for both villages. Lymm has had to accept a £1 charge for evening parking as a "trade off" for the restoration of the free hour. Stockton Heath did not want that as they do not want to discourage the

thriving evening economy the village enjoys, nor do they want to see residential areas close to the village centre cluttered with parked cars of an evening.

However, they would still like their free hour back - and so would most of the shopkeepers.

Elsewhere in this issue report disquiet in Stockton Heath at the number of food and drink establishments which are taking over retail areas. There are those who fear the success of the evening economy is being achieved at an unsustainable cost to the day-time trade.

If they are right, car parking charges of any description don't exactly help.

Just what the answer is for Stockton Heath we don't pretend to know. There are those who argue that if someone can afford the high cost of motoring these days, an extra pound or two for parking is something they can also afford to pay. It is a reasonable argument - but a fair proportion of car owners seem to think differently and refuse to pay to park on principle.



One argument we hear frequently is that drivers would not mind paying to park if it gave them some security - as in the "old days" when there was a parking attendant paid to look after parked cars. Today's "parking attendants" are there not to protect cars but to detect erring motorists and stick a penalty ticket on their windscreens.

Is it just possible that a system that offered some protection to motorists rather than seeking to penalise them could actually be made to work?

Cycle Museum curator set to recreate history

GLOBETROTTING bicycle collector Paul Adams, who runs the Cycle Museum at Walton Gardens, Warrington, is set to embark on his travels again, this time recreating history.

In June Paul, aged 75 and friends from the Cycle Museum will be travelling to Nancy in France to cycle to Karlsruhe, capital of Baden, Germany, recreating a ride by inventor Baron von Drais, riding a bicycle from his collection made in 1893.

Karl Drais (29 April 1785 - 10

December 1851) was a German inventor, invented Laufmaschine ("running machine"), also later called the draisine (English) or velocipede, draisienne (French), also nicknamed the dandy horse. This incorporated the twowheeler principle that is basic to the bicycle and motorcycle and was the beginning of mechanised personal transport. Drais also invented the earliest typewriter with a keyboard in 1821.


Prior to recreating history, Paul

is heading off to Canada later this month to a bicycle auction where he is hoping to acquire some more rarities for his collection.

Paul, who runs the Cycle Museum on a voluntary basis, freely admits that his obsession for old bicycles has become a "disease.

Residents' fears over massive housing proposals

CONCERNED residents distributed more than 1,500 leaflets across a wide area of Appleton and Grappenhall to flag up local worries over the proposed major housing developments planned by the Homes and Community Agency.

They fear many local people were not aware that the deadline for objections or other representations to the 1,000-home developments was April 10 and 11 which has now passed.

Land at Grappenhall Heys, Appleton Cross and Pewterspear Green has been zoned for housing since the days of the Warrington New Town, more than 20 years ago.

The HCA has already been granted permission for 180 houses at Stretton and is now seeking consent for the other areas.

The residents' group wanted to ensure that all residents in the area didn't miss out on making their voices heard and, possibly, influencing the outcome of the planning applications.

Annette Cumbo, a member of the group, said: "Between the three housing developments, around 1,000 houses are proposed which will put pressure on the road infrastructure, traffic congestion, health services, education services, and the environment and will lead to the loss of green spaces.

Just imagine an additional 2,000

to 3,000 cars going through Stockton Heath!

"We think this is an important issue for all residents of South Warrington, not just the people who live adjacent to the proposed housing developments.

Councillors from the Stockton Heath, Appleton and Grappenhall areas have been warning of the traffic implications of the developments for some time.

There was massive opposition to the Stretton proposals – with three parish councils, more than 70 residents and local borough councillors all opposing it. But planning chiefs gave the scheme the go-ahead.

Warrington South MP David Mowat said: "This land has been reserved for development for about two decades so we always knew it was going to be built on at some point.

Our country desperately needs more housing if future generations are going to be able to afford a home of their own."

"Obviously, adding so many houses in a small area is going to put major strain on the surrounding road network.

"I've made it clear to both the HCA and the Council that upgrades to the local infrastructure need to take place at an early stage to keep the town moving."





No change to village parking charges

THERE will be no changes made to the controversial car park charges at Stockton Heath – despite objections from Stockton Heath and Appleton parish councils.

But although local councillors are unhappy the "first hour free" policy is not to be re-instated on Stockton Heath's Forge car park as it is at Lymm, they accept that the Lymmsolution would not work at Stockton Heath.

Cllr Peter Walker, chairman of Stockton Heath Parish Council, said: "Of course, we would have liked the one hour free parking back. We don't see a 15-minute free period as being much good in terms of encouraging shoppers to stay in the village.

"But there has been a trade off at

Lymm. They have got their free hour back, but at the cost of a £1 parking charge in the evening. We don't think that would work in Stockton Heath.

"We have a lot of terraced streets where there are more cars than parking spaces and we don't want to see visitors using them for parking in the evening. We want to encourage the village's evening economy but we want to see people using the Forge car park. Introducing a charge there in the evening would simply encourage more drivers to park in the side roads, to inconvenience of residents."

Both Stockton Heath and Appleton parish councils have long believed the south of the borough is being used as a "cash cow" to subsidise other car parks in the borough which remain completely free.



Historic riding school to be brought back to life

THE long-abandoned riding school building at Walton Hall and Gardens is to be brought back to life.

Unknown to many people, the building is tucked away behind the heritage court yard at Walton Hall, beside the Bridgewater Canal.

It was built in the latter part of the 19th century and is shown completed on the 1899 Ordnance Survey map. The riding school was built as part

of a massive investment by the first Lord Daresbury. It consisted of stables equestrian training facilities and was used to train and exercise Lord Daresbury's extensive stable of hunting and riding horses.

Even in the heyday of equestrianism, an indoor riding arena was seen as an extreme luxury, that only those most committed to the sport could afford.

After the sale of the Walton Estate Warrington Borough Council in 1938, the building was used during the Second World War to house ancillary fire engines, while troops were billeted in the stables.

After the war, it was used for storage until the past few years.

Trees along the canal have grown and damaged the roof, making the building unsafe.

The plan is to return the building

to full use as a multi-purpose events space allowing the public to use and enjoy it for the first time.

Cllr Peter Carey, chairman of the Walton Liaison Group, said: "We have been wanting to restore the old iding school building and poon it up. riding school building and open it up for public use for a long time. It is a wonderful structure that will add a much-needed, covered space to the Walton Estate, enabling us to hold events there, whatever the weather.

"Few people even knew the building existed, so it will be absolutely fantastic to get it up and running and open to our many visitors for the first time in more than 100 years."

Cllr Tony Higgins, the borough council's lead member for culture, leisure and community, "Warrington is more than just a great place to do business - it's also a great place to live. We are working very hard to try to boost the borough's cultural and leisure offering which is perfectly demonstrated by our bid to be City of Culture 2021."

The aim is to get the building restored over the summer and autumn this year, subject to planning and executive board approval.

Beavering away to beat a Spanish invader

Cllr Andrew Malloy and Cllr Hayley Wells-Bradshaw joined the Beavers and Cubs to plant the bulbs together with Red Campion and wild garlic to provide a colourful edge to the woodland.

They were advised by local environmental expert David Hackett and the Town Council are now removing the invasive Spanish bluebells which threaten the traditional, English variety.

Town clerk Adam Keppel-Garner said: "Bluebells are an iconic part of a woodland and once established will provide a fantastic flash of colour to Wallwood as well as supporting bees and butterflies.

"This is part of a few environmental improvements we are looking at in Wallwood to promote wildlife and improve the little woodland for the community."

Friends welcome £2m lottery boost for Walton Gardens

THE Friends of Walton Estate are delighted with the news that the Heritage Lottery Fund has finally released almost £2m which will enable Warrington Council to start work renovating the old Conservatory at Walton Gardens.

Malcolm Eldridge Chairman, Friends of Walton Estate said: "The Friends group started in 2001 with several objectives but its main ambition was the restoration of the Conservatory. Throughout this time, we have been very aware of the public sadness at the loss of such an outstanding feature.

"We have campaigned for its restoration and have spent many hours in and around the conservatory, clearing it so that the public could appreciate its potential.

"We predict there will be plenty of public support for various schemes

that we will announce shortly which will provide an opportunity for people to contribute to the rebuild.

to contribute to the rebuild.

"We appreciate that it will take some time to complete the project. Meanwhile, Warrington Borough Council will continue to invest in the Estate, for example in the renovation of the Old Riding School and the old Laundry building. With all the investment over the present period, Walton Gardens will continue to provide recreational opportunities for all sections of the community.

Malcolm added: "Walton Gardens has been Warrington's favourite open space for almost 70 years and many people have happy memories. One of our projects is to capture stories from the past. We have other projects and need volunteers to help us make progress."

Warrington Borough Council worked with partners Myerscough College, Walton Lea Partnership and the Friends of Walton Estate on the winning bid which includes plans to restore the historic conservatory and stable buildings and transform the old buildings into a dedicated learning centre

The stable yard, once occupied by Lady Daresbury's prized Kerry cattle, will become classrooms and offices, with the historic conservatory and vinery used as teaching, growing and display space. The subjects taught at the new learning centre will include horticulture and animal care, with students carrying out project work on the Walton Estate and in the

Children's Zoo as part of their course.

Walton Lea Partnership's work will be carried out side by side with the College, allowing people of all ages and abilities to learn and thrive together.

An important part of the National Lottery-funded project will be to reopen the conservatory area to visitors to Walton. Part of the main conservatory will be a public space where visitors can learn about the horticultural heritage of the site and see development and training work being undertaken.

being undertaken.

Cllr Tony Higgins, executive board member for culture, leisure and community, said: "I'm delighted that this integral part of our borough's cultural heritage is receiving this massive cash injection. We have worked very hard with our partners to bring in this funding which will benefit the whole Walton Estate.

"Thanks to National Lottery players we will now be able to restore the grand conservatories and beautiful buildings to their former glory and setting within the gardens."

As part of the project, a programme of events and activities will be planned that will aim to connect visitors to the popular gardens to the heritage and history of the site.



Tax rates and allowances for 2017

You may already be aware of some of the changes that have been made to the tax rates and allowances which came into effect from 6th April 2016. The overall outcome of the announcements in the Autumn Statement are as follows:

- \bullet The personal tax free allowance is now $\mathfrak{L}11,\!500$
- The basic rate of tax, i.e. taxed at 20% has risen from £32,000 to £33,500, this has the knock on effect in that the 40% higher rate tax band will now stand at £45,000
- The threshold to which the 45% higher tax rate payable remains at £150,000

Transfer of 'personal allowances'

It has been possible since 6th April 2015 for an individual, who is not liable to pay any tax or who is not earning above the basic rate, to transfer part of their personal allowance to their spouse, or civil partner on condition that the beneficiary is not liable to income tax above the basic rate. The transferor's personal allowance will be reduced accordingly

The maximum amount that can be transferred for 2017-2018 is £1,150. This means that the recipient of the transferred allowance will benefit by a reduced tax liability of £230

'Married couples' allowance'

Please note that 'married couples allowance' can only be claimed if at least one of the people associated with either the marriage or the civil partnership was born before 6th April 1935

one of the people associated with either the marriage of the civil partnership was born before 6th April 1935.

The allowance for 2017 – 2018 has been increased from £8,355 to £8,445

Please also note that those who are entitled to the 'married couples allowance' are not entitled to the 'transfer of allowances'

'Blind person's allowance'

The allowance has been increased from £2,290 to £2,320 for 2017 – 2018. This relief is given in addition to the personal allowance, thus reducing the individual's taxable income

Please note here that a married blind person, who cannot use all the relief, may transfer the unused part to their spouse or civil partner whether they are blind or not. A married couple or civil partners, if both blind, can claim the relief individually

relief individually.

This relief can only be claimed by an individual who is registered as blind (but not partially sighted) A person may register as blind even if not totally without sight.

Savings income

A 'tax-free allowance' of £1,000 for basic rate tax payers and £500 for higher rate tax payers on savings income was introduced in 2016 – 2017, this will remain the same for 2017 – 2018


