# Editor's Comment

WE doubt if there are too many people in Frodsham, where parking is currently free, who would like to see charges introduced.

Indeed, Cheshire West and Chester Council's "Let's Talk" consultation concluded that there is "significant concern" about the possibility of introducing parking charges in all areas where it is currently free.

Yet apparently the council is considering introducing charges, not just in Frodsham but in all areas where it is free.

We do not believe parking should be a party political issue but it seems to have become one locally – if only because charging locally – it only because charging has only been on the agenda since political control of the council changed at the last local election. Our view is that most Frodsham residents, whatever their political leanings, would prefer to be able to park for free – and that there is good reason for them to think thus.

There are really only two reasons

There are really only two reasons for a council to charge for parking.

One, as a traffic management measure and two, to make a profit. There are those who will disagree, but we don't think the current free parking policy

in Frodsham causes too many problems most of the time. So we don't need charging as a traffic management tool

We are left, then, with the profit motive. Well the experience of other authorities suggests that or other authorities suggests that far from putting money into the council's coffers, most charging schemes actually lose money. Some make a thumping great loss.

Our advice to CW&C would be to forget charging for parking in Frodsham. It will only drive

shoppers away and lead to more empty shops.

CONGRATULATIONS CONGRATULATIONS to Mike Amesbury on winning the Weaver Vale seat in the General Election Mike

 and commiserations to Graham Evans, who lost it.

We at Frodsham Life strive to be politically neutral, so we are less concerned about what party colours our MP wears and more about the amount of attention he, or

she, gives to Frodsham and district. Mr Evans did, in fact, devote considerable time to Frodsham, bearing in mind the size of the Weaver Vale constituency, and undoubtedly fell victim to the political tide which swept the country and caught more than a few people by surprise. We wish him well in the future. We welcome Mr Amesbury and hope to see him just as active in our

local communities.



Question:

My husband and I are divorcing and it's proving difficult to reach an agreement about a holiday abroad for the children this summer. What can I do?

### **Answer:**

In cases where parents are having difficulty co-operating or are in the middle of a court dispute, holidays abroad can be a significant issue, particularly if the parent asking permission is not the one who holds the passports.

In such circumstances, the court can be asked to grant an order known as a Specific Issue order – to ensure passports are produced by a certain date and to order that the holiday take

place.

Hearings for such orders can take time to arrange, so early planning is essential. Ultimately, the test to be applied is the same as in any other matter affecting a child - the welfare of the children is the paramount consideration. Is it in their best interests to go on holiday? Is there any risk of abduction? Is the length of time suitable bearing in mind the ages of the children and the location of the proposed holiday?

Every case is completely different and therefore we would recommend you take legal

advice on your individual situation.

# Wayne finds inspiration in extreme watersport



A FORMER soldier from Frodsham who was injured in Afghanistan has found new inspiration in an extreme watersport which is challenging and highly competitive. Wayne Cox, 32, has lived in Frodsham for almost four years with his wife, Kirsty and four children Aaron, 10, Marlie, 9, Esmé, 6, and Harper, 1.

He joined the Army at 17 and took part in operational tours to Iraq, in 2003 and 2007, Northern Ireland in 2004, Kosovo in 2005 and 2008 before being injured by an IED (Improvised Explosive Device) in Afganistan in 2009.

He said: "Now, within the last few months I have found something which has completely inspired me. I have taken part in Thundercat Racing and, in particular, Team Endeavour Racing."

As part of the Royal Foundation, Team Endeavour Racing is supported financially by the Endeavour Fund.

Set up by the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and Prince Harry, the Endeavour Fund is supporting wounded, injured and sick (WIS) servicemen and veterans.

There will be old time and





# 'Missing name' added to memorial

A "MISSING name" has been added to the Trinity Memorial at Frodsham Methodist Church, following research by members of the Town Council's World War One Working Group.

When the working group arranged for the renovation of the memorial in 2015, the re-engraving of names on the Memorial could not be completed. Space for one name was left blank as the original name could not be deciphered.


Ethel was born in 1891 in


Abertillery, Wales. She served in Liverpool for a period and then in British India and died in Karachi (now in Pakistan) on September 3,
