

25,000 visitors expected at Disability Awareness Day 2017

More than 25,000 people are expected to attend this year's Disability Awareness Day, which will be celebrating its 26th anniversary.

In 1992, who would have thought that a small information event, held in Warrington for local disabled people, would grow in size and stature, and would influence the development of an internationally-recognised Disability Awareness Day.

The annual event has inspired people from all over the world and provided advice and support to 100,000's of disabled people, their families, friends and carers.

DAD is the world's largest not-for-profit, voluntary-led, pan-disability exhibition, which will once again be hosted at Walton Hall Gardens on Sunday, 16 July with the support of joint principal sponsors St George Healthcare Group and St Mark Universal Copts Care.

A huge tented village housing over 250 exhibitors - including equipment suppliers; transport; holidays; leisure and employment providers; and support groups and services - is set to attract visitors to travel from all over the UK and beyond.

Inclusive Arts is just one of the highlights of the event - with a number of disabled artists including nationally recognised performers. The Main Arena will offer visitors a range of family entertainment including guide dog display teams, falconry displays and the ever popular Katumba samba band. Also on-site will be the fully accessible Sports Zone.

A free, accessible Park and Ride service is available from Wilderspool Park; free bus service every 30 minutes from 10am from Warrington Bus Interchange; British Sign Language (BSL) interpreters; trained assistants; and a scooter / wheelchair loans service promises to ensure DAD is fully inclusive to all.

"The background story to DAD is a great example of just how far a 'can do' attitude can take you," says Event Founder and Co-ordinator, Dave Thompson MBE DL.

'What started out as a one-off event is now the highlight of the international disabled community's calendar – inspiring similar events as far afield as India, Cameroon, Uganda and Gibraltar. Our team is also working closely with St Mark Universal Copts Care teams based in the UK and working in Egypt and Sudan'.

The big day on Sunday 16th July from 10am to 5pm - will be a fitting finale to a week comprising a variety of complementary events to savour, which are guaranteed to attract many more visitors.

Sitting in the refined surroundings of the Bridgewater Hall, I always feel somewhat under-dressed and not a little in awe of the beautiful surroundings. Despite hosting many rock concerts the sight of hordes of tour T-shirts, ripped jeans and trainer clad fans never seems quite right in these surroundings, yet when the gentleman who had the seat to my right turned up wearing a very classy two piece suit (definitely not a £50 Matalan job) I couldn't help but wonder whether he had mistakenly bought Procul Harum tickets in expectation of a night of choral delights from a touring company of Benedictine Monks.

Of course, I am still 20 years old in my head, and I easily forget that I and the majority of the audience are past 50, and that on a Monday night, many have no choice but to come straight from work – Long gone are the days of rebellious youth, skipping work early or throwing a 'sickie' in order to see your 'heroes' perform after spending most of the day in the pub.

Indeed when the band walk out onto the stage to 'very polite' applause I did worry that the usual rock concert atmosphere was going to be dampened by the imposing surroundings and the band would find it difficult to whip up much ardour amongst its followers.

Of course Procul Harum are no spring chickens, Gary Brooker (the only original member of the band) is 72 and the rest, whilst they havent been around quite that long, are certainly well out of short pants and their accumulated experience meant they knew just



how to bring the audience alive.

Despite Gary's age, the one thing that struck me from the start, was the strength of his voice. Yes perhaps a little deeper but every bit as strong and distinctive as ever and from the opening track - I Told On You, through to the final encore - his voice wowed the audience, taking everyone on a tour through time from the early days of Conquistador, Homburg, A Salty Dog and of course A White Shade of Pale right through to The Only One from their latest album Novum.

An intimate gig, filled with Gary's natural humour, distinctive vocals and classic songs.

This tour is a must see for any Procul Harum fans, even if you are only familiar with the early material, the more recent songs will not disappoint and if you are not familiar with them get along and discover one of the most underrated bands to come out of the '60s.



Family and friends raise £7,400 in me

Family and friends of 22-year-old Rea Muir, who tragically died less than three weeks after being diagnosed with leukaemia, have raised £7,400 in her memory.

More than 40 family and friends of 22-year-old care home assistant Rea took on Mount Snowden, the highest mountain in England and Wales recently in aid of CLIC Sargent, the UK's leading charity for young cancer patients and families.

Rea from Bruche, Warrington tragically passed away shortly before Christmas last year, less than three weeks after being told that she had leukaemia.

She had started to feel ill last July. She had been delighted to watch her beloved Warrington Wolves Rugby League team go through to the final of the Challenge Cup but that evening she complained of a headache and feeling ill.

A few days later an out of hours GP advised Rea to go to Halton Hospital and she was then sent to the accident and emergency unit at Warrington Hospital. The waiting time was five hours but Rea felt too ill to wait to be seen and returned the next day when doctors told her that she had Pneumonia and Sepsis. A bone marrow biopsy was later carried out and showed that she had blood disorder myelodysplastic syndrome and

would need stem cell treatment.

Her mother, Lesley Whyte, aged 55 said: "Although we were worried about Rea we thought it was quite straight forward and there seemed no urgency for her to be treated."

Rea's condition was not improving and in late November Rea and her family received worrying news. They were told that Rea had acute myeloid leukaemia and needed to go to the Royal Liverpool Hospital to begin chemotherapy treatment.

Lesley said: "When we were told it was leukaemia I felt sick. It completely takes your breath away and you feel like you're going to throw up and can't stop shaking."

The family was supported by a CLIC Sargent social worker who arranged financial support and helped Rea and her boyfriend Robert to plan a trip to Devon for what would have been their first holiday together on their own. Sadly the young couple, who had planned to get engaged on Christmas Day, never got the chance.

Rea was admitted to the bone marrow unit in Liverpool on 28 November but urgent chemotherapy treatment had to be delayed because she had a lung infection and high temperature which needed to be brought under control. She

was moved to the intensive care unit on 12 December but sadly passed away on 14, December 2016.

"It all happened so quickly. Watching your child suffer is the worst thing but thankfully she didn't suffer for too long and afterwards she looked so peaceful," said Lesley.

Rea's funeral took place after Christmas and her family made sure it reflected her love of Warrington Wolves. Rea was laid to rest in her new Warrington top and had a flag signed by the team on her mother's car which has the registration LE5 1 REA. Warrington player Westwood also sent a tribute video message to Rea's family on the day of the funeral. While Rea was having treatment in Warrington Hospital, Wolves winger Kevin Penny visited her.

Rea's family and friends decided to take on the Mount Snowdon challenge to celebrate her memory and have already raised more than £7,400 for CLIC Sargent.

Lesley said: "Rea was just a naturally happy and positive person who had the widest smile that would light up any room, she was sincerely kind and caring and always had time for everyone. CLIC Sargent is such an amazing charity and we'd like more people to know about the work it does. I can't tell you how humbled, Rea's father Tony and I feel. The support and generosity shown by all our wonderful family and friends has just been amazing."

Jayne Moran, Fundraising Manager at CLIC Sargent, said: "When cancer strikes young lives we fight tirelessly to limit the damage it causes beyond their health. We rely entirely on donations to fund our vital work and so we can't thank Rea's



family and friends enough for their fantastic efforts climbing Mt Snowdon."

Atomic Kitten star warns of dangers of temporary black henna tattoos

She has joined a campaign warning the public of the dangers of so-called 'black henna' temporary tattoos (BHTTs) after her son suffered a reaction earlier this year.

Upon returning from a holiday in Morocco, Alfie aged six was left with a scar on his leg where the BHTT had been.

Natasha said, "I am backing the British Skin Foundation's #AvoidBlackHenna campaign as there needs to be a greater awareness of the potential permanent dangers posed by Black Henna tattoos. Sharing my photograph of Alfie's scarred leg will hopefully highlight these dangers and will act as a warning to parents who might not know the risks attached to these so-called temporary 'black henna' tattoos. Having witnessed first-hand Alfie's terrible reaction to Black Henna, it's just not worth the risk of permanent damage and letting your children have one done at home or abroad."

The majority of BHTTs are not based on henna at all, but a substance called para-phenylenediamine (PPD) which is found in hair dyes. PPD is allowed for use in hair dye, but its use for skin contact products such as temporary tattoos is illegal in the European Union.

When PPD is used on the skin in this way it can cause blistering, painful skin burns and may even lead to scarring. It can also leave the person with a lifelong sensitivity to PPD, which increases the risk of a severe allergic reaction when using hair dye in the future.

Research among dermatologists in 2015 revealed that they were seeing an increase in reactions at their clinics across the UK.

• 4 out of 10 dermatologists asked had seen patients with skin reactions to BHTTs.



- 1 in 20 dermatologists approached said that over 80% of the BHTT reactions they had seen were in children aged under 16.
- Dermatologists asked confirmed that around half of the patients got a BHTT outside of the EU, where the legal status of PPD is not always clear; however the other half got a BHTT within the EU, with 27% of these in the UK.
- About two-thirds of dermatologists approached have seen an increase in patients with reactions to hair dyes, many of whom have previously had a BHTT.

Dr Anjali Mahto, Consultant Dermatologist & British Skin Foundation Spokesperson reinforced these findings saying, "Black henna is well known to cause skin reactions and should be treated with caution, particularly in children."

The decision to re-issue this warning in 2017 is backed by the Cosmetic, Toiletry & Perfumery Association (CTPA). "The message is clear: having a 'black henna' temporary tattoo presents a significant risk of a very nasty adverse reaction to the tattoo itself. It also increases the risk of either not being able to use most hair dyes in the future or having a bad reaction to them if the warnings are ignored. Most importantly, parents will want to safeguard their children this summer by steering clear of so-called 'black henna' temporary tattoos." Dr Christopher Flower, Director-General CTPA

So remember, avoid black henna this summer at festivals, funfairs and on holiday!

It's not just what you eat, but when you eat

A nutritionist's guide to the best foods to eat from dawn till dusk

We all know we need to be eating a healthy, balanced diet but knowing what to eat at certain points of the day can be confusing if you're not in the know. Therefore we asked Nutritionist Cassandra Barns to guide us through what we should be eating when from dawn till dusk.

7-8am: Scrambled eggs on rye toast with rocket and cherry tomatoes

"Breakfast should always focus on protein. Protein helps to wake you up in the morning, as well as helping to balance your blood sugar for steady energy throughout the day. The eggs provide the protein, and this is combined with some slow-releasing carbohydrates in the rye bread, and one to two servings of vegetables in the rocket and tomatoes."

10-11am: 2 teaspoons of almond or peanut butter on 2 oatcakes

"To keep your energy levels balanced Cassandra advises, "If you're peckish mid-morning, go for a snack that combines some more slow-releasing carbohydrates, Nairn's superseded wholegrain oatcakes [RRP £1.40, Sainsbury's] with protein and/or healthy fats. The carbs are provided by the oatcakes and the protein and fats by the nut butter."

1pm: Salmon salad with quinoa, avocado and green beans (or other mixed salad veg)

"A focus on protein is important at lunch too. Keeping protein levels up and limiting carbohydrates to a smallish serving will help keep your blood sugar levels steady and help prevent the afternoon 'slump' around 3 or 4pm. Salmon provides not only protein but also vital healthy omega-3 fats for your brain."

3-4pm: Matcha Green Tea with 1 or 2 chunks of raw dark chocolate

"Many of us feel like an afternoon pickme-up, even if we've eaten healthy meals at breakfast and lunch. But coffee can keep you buzzing for hours and may affect your sleep" says Cassandra. Instead she advises, "Go for Clearspring's Matcha Shots [RRP £6.25, www. clearspring.co.uk] you'll get a much smaller dose of caffeine for a gentle lift, together with theanine – a natural substance found in green tea that can help you feel calmer and more focused. As an afternoon treat, you could have a couple of chunks of dark chocolate – as long as it's at least 70% cocoa, such as OMBAR 72% [RRP £1.99, Ocado] to limit your sugar intake. Raw chocolate is a great option as you'll get higher levels of antioxidants compared to standard chocolate."

6.30pm: Chicken and veggie stir-fry with buckwheat soba noodles

"For your evening meal, you can put more focus on the carbohydrates by having a good serving of wholegrain noodles or wholegrain pasta. Opt for Clearspring's Japanese Soba Buckwheat Noodles [RRP £3.99, www.clearspring.co.uk]. Eating more slow-releasing carbs in the evening can help to calm the nervous system and aid sleep. Buckwheat noodles are ideal for this. Emphasize the veggies too, with just a small to moderate serving of chicken or other protein."

9pm: A small bowl of oats

Finally just before bed Cassandra suggests "If you tend to feel a bit hungry before you go to bed, or you have problems sleeping, then an extra small serving of slow-releasing carbohydrates an hour or so before bed can be helpful. Try a half bowl of porridge made with Nairn's Scottish Porridge Oats [RRP £2.00, Sainsbury's] . Oats may also have natural calming properties – in herbal medicine, they're classed as 'nervines', meaning they can support the nervous system – ideal before bed."
