Former car park recycled as town centre works progress at speed

IT IS easy to forget the speed of progress and change taking place in our town centre. It was only twelve months ago that the old multi storey car park was demolished. The new 1,100 space car park is now nearing completion and has become a striking feature on the landscape. The former car park, you may recall, was completely demolished last year by local contactor 1 & H Brown and they have just won a prestigious award as Construction Recycler of the Year as they managed to recycle 100% of the pre-stressed concrete from the former car park which was crushed and reused as the underfloor fill material and piling mat of the new car park. This saved over 1,000 wagon movements into Warrington town centre and the requirement for 4,500m3 of imported material. Meanwhile there is tangible excitement amongst the traders and public about the market move into its new temporary home which will open August Bank Holiday weekend and be formally opened with celebrations on Saturday 2 September. Demand for stalls in the market has been phenomenal and there will be an exciting mix of traders old and new when it opens.

Their live shows continue to be special events of energy and power and, though now focused on their new material, the band continues to play the old favourites at gigs.



A YOUNG entrepreneur who believes in paying his way in the world has set up a business – restoring old trainers. Tom Davies became a sole trader after collecting a triple Distinction* in BTEC Business following two years at Priestley College. Shoe Shine Boy Restoration already has a two-month waiting list and Tom is repairing two pairs of sneakers every week.

of sneakers every week. He hopes the income will help pay for his time at university as well as fund his own passion for collecting bespoke and fashionable trainers.

"People are sending trainers to me from the top end of Scotland to the far end of Cornwall," said Tom,

"They are in various states including one that had been chewed by a dog, but the challenge for me is to never turn down a pair of trainers that need restoring."

Some sneakers have sentimental value to their owners while others are just too expensive to part with.

That's where Tom steps in. People pack off their favourite pair to him so that he can treat their faded colours and damaged souls.

He mixes his own dyes to match the trainers that arrive and has picked up restoration techniques from various sources including

YouTube. "I watched videos on how you restore old leather sofas and just applied it to trainers," said Tom, who is from Grappenhall.

Tom's passion for trainers began at football matches when saw other fans wearing bespoke

fashions that were too expensive for him.

He decided to find a job and during his time at Priestley College held down a milk round, parttime work at an accountancy firm and worked as a tyre fitter so that he could afford to buy what he wanted.

Now he has a collection of 30 sets of trainers including a pair it took six months to track down - he eventually found them in Japan.

"I like a pair of trainers with a good story behind them," said Tom, whose style also has musical influences including Noel Gallagher.

Tom has been nominated for Priestley College's Student of the Year, the winner of which will be announced at an awards evening in September.

That same month he starts studying International Business Management with American Business Studies at the University of Manchester.

His dream is to set up a workshop in Manchester and have people drop in when their trainers need treatment.

"One of the reasons I wanted to do this was so that I could pay my way through university, but I hope that maybe one day I will be able to set up a franchise," said Tom.

National Insurance for Self-Employed people is changing

National Insurance for Self-Employed people is changing over the next couple of years.

Currently, anyone who is self-employed pays National Insurance in two ways: Class 2 NIC. It is this class of

NIC that counts towards pensions

employment ceases. Liability is notified to HMRC by completing form CWF1

Payment of Class 2 NIC is compulsory if profits exceed the small profits threshold which currently stands at £6,025 per annum. This limit is reduced pro-rata if someone is self-employed for less than the timit is reduced pro-rata it someone is self-employed for less than the whole year. Below that limit payment is voluntary. However, it may be advantageous to pay this to protect benefit rights if profits are below this level as the voluntary class 3 NIC is currently £14.25 per week. Therefore, a self-employed person on small profits can maintain his/ hers contribution record for £592 less each year than someone who is not self-employed. Liability to Class 2 NIC ceases when a person

is not self-employed. Liability to Class 2 NIC ceases when a person reaches state pension age. Whilst it is calculated on a weekly basis, Class 2 NIC is payable on 31st January following the year of assessment together with the remainder of the person's tax liability. Class 4 NIC. This is profit related and is currently payable at a rate of 9% on profits between the lower and upper earnings limit, which are currently £8,164 and £45,000 respectively. Whilst this is considerably more than Class 2 NIC it does not confer any pension or benefit entitlement. This is collected through the self assessment tax system together with any income tax liability. However, from April 2018 the above is due to change. Class 2 NIC will be abolished from that date and from that date it will be the Class 4 NIC contribution record that will determine pension and

NIC will be abolished from that date and from that date it will be the Class 4 NIC contribution record that will determine pension and benefit entitlement. Following the Spring budget you may recall from an earlier column that the rate at which Class 4 NIC is payable was due to increase to 10% from April 2018 and 11% from April 2019. However, these increases broke "promises" that were in the election manifesto and were cancelled after the resulting outcry. However, the promises were not renewed at the recent surprise General Election and use are due for another budget in the Autume. We must avail any we are due for another budget in the Autumn. We must await any changes that may be announced then.

Wolves' legend Bennie Westwood cements place in club's history

WARRINGTON Wolves'legend Bennie Westwood made his 400th club appearance during the 52-24 victory over Catalans Dragons playing his way in to the top 10 appearance makers in the club's history. The Normanton lad has won three Challenge Cup titles, two League Leaders Sheilds and played in two World Cups for England. He enjoyed a testimonial for the club in 2013 and known for his tough style of play, which he often pushed the boundaries, he's a player that opposition fans love to hate. At the young age – 21 when he moved from Wakefield – Westwood uprooted and moved from Yorkshire to join what was then a new Warrington project

project.

project. He arrived at Wilderspool in 2002 alongside Nathan Wood as Paul Cullen steered the club from what could have been a catastrophic relegation. Westwood was then part of the Wolves team that moved over to the new Halliwell Jones Stadium, starting a new era in the club's history. Starting as a centre, Westwood soon made the move to the back-row and was the club's Players Player and Fans Player of the Year in 2007. In 2008, he was named in the Super League Dream Team and earned a place in the England World Cup squad. His first piece of silverware came the following year, when the Wolves

New crisis for Dial-a-Ride

WARRINGTON'S Dial-a-Ride transport charity is facing a new crisis with plans for a new Waste Transfer Centre off Winwick Road set to create even more problems from dust and debris.

Dial-a-Ride has been operating from a site at the far end of Athlone Rd for many years and is currently surrounded by a cement works, skip hire company an access road and now an application for a Waste Transfer an application for a Waste Transfer Centre on the remaining side "being championed" by Warrington Council's Executive Board. Former mayor Cllr Geoff Settle, a former Vice-Chair of Warrington Community Transport said: "Dial-a-Ride will be surrounded by fallout cloud of dust and debris from the neighbouring operations that will the neighbouring operations that will lead to further damage and corrosion to the mini busses and a deteriorating environment for staff to work in. "Dial-a-Ride has always been a cash

poor charity with little or no reserves. Two years ago at one point we had to fund a 3-month gap in our finances or we would have gone bust. If it hadn't been for the Bill Holdroyd Foundation and the NHS it would have been lights out for the charity.

"It was a very stressful time and at one point we were down to only 5 trustees from 10, due to resignations and deaths. A former chair of the charity heard of the situation and helped us formulate a rescue plan. She said that she would join the board and bring people with her if the borough council accepted it, however it led to

two more resignations! Mr Settle added: "The sponsors and partners scrutinised and approved the new business plan. We were also told that if we survived to the start of next financial year we would receive funding albeit at a greatly reduced level.

"Dial-a-Ride didn't collapse and the rescue plan was a success. It did however mean that that we had to halve the fleet and associated drivers, create a new network operational model and take the bold step of not replacing our manager when he retired. At the end of the year. In short it became a self-

"We had to pay out redundancies, eating into the limited reserves, reduce the distances the mini buses could travel. One knock on effect has meant that we couldn't provide a service to Disability Awareness Day this year. "Given that Warrington Borough Council are in favour of the new waste

transfer centre we need to move. We can no longer stay in the current location. I believe that Dial-a-Ride is now at another critical milestone and needs to come up with a second rescue plan. We have looked at many sites to find a suitable location without success. The ones offered by WBC Estate Management have been either inappropriate, too run down or too expensive." Mr Settle added: If anyone knows of

a suitable site that is safe and secure, can accommodate 5 or 6 mini buses and staff vehicles, office space for two to three staff members, a room for drivers to make refreshments and suitable toilet facilities for a reasonable rent pleas let us know!"
