Residents urged to attend Lymm Neighbourhood Plan meeting

LOCAL residents are being urged to attend the first public meeting to discuss the Lymm Neighbourhood Plan which takes place in the village hall on Saturday October 14 from 11am-3pm.

Council has Lymm Parish Lymm Parish Council has responded to Warrington Borough Council's Local Plan Preferred Development Option expressing concern over the number of houses that have been proposed for Lymm, most of which will require the release of land in the greenbelt. Councillor John Bamforth,

Councillor John Bamforth, Chairman of Lymm Parish Council, commented: "We are concerned over the lack of clarity on what the Preferred Development Option means for Lymm. Our main concern is the lack of infrastructure to accommodate 500 extra houses and the effect additional developments are going to have on the character of Lymm and the loss of greenbelt." "The Parish Council voted

"The Parish Council voted unanimously to delegate powers and provide an initial budget to the Lymm Neighbourhood Plan Group to research, write and consult on a Neighbourhood Plan for the village. The group will be independently run by Lymm residents and will seek the views of the public on how they see our village developing over the next 20 years. The group will

have the full backing of the Parish Council", he continued." Councillor Bob Barr, who is acting as advisor to the Neighbourhood Plan group, together with Councillor Anna Fradgley, said "Some development is insuitable and 'on chango' is inevitable and 'no change' is not an option. However, it is crucial that local residents have their say, otherwise development will take place anywhere in Lymm,

will take place anywhere in Lymm, regardless." "The first public consultation meeting, open to all Lymm residents, is on Saturday 14th October 11am to 3pm, Lymm Village Hall, Pepper Street. Here, residents can learn more about what the group will be doing and have their say on how they want to shape Lymm for the futúre.

Dr Natalie Palmer, chair of the Lymm Neighbourhood Plan Group added, "It is vital that residents attend so they can have a say on what they want for our village, which will ultimately be taken to a referendum and if successful, will have the same statutory weight as have the same statutory weight as the Local Plan."

Neighbours lose battle over 'granny flat' plan

SIX neighbours have lost a battle to block plans for a garage and "granny flat"

At Lymm. Members of the borough's development management committee approved proposals for the scheme in Elmtree Road despite objections from the neighbours. The plan involved demolition of an existing garage in the grounds of a detached house and construction of a new garage with a granny flat above it. Two trees would have to be demolished to make way for it.

Neighbours claimed the proposal amounted to "garden grabbing" and could lead to a more extensive proposal in the future. A granny flat was not credible as it would be upstairs, would be too small and would have no kitchen facilities, they claimed. Over 3000 visitors give new Heritage Centre thumbs up

LYMM'S new heritage centre has already been given the thumbs up by more than 3,000 visitors.

During a time when thge village has seen many challenges, like the bank and post office closures, Heritage Centre Chair Alan Williams says it is great to be able to report on an initiative that has the potential to make a positive difference for Warrington residents and visitors.

and visitors. The new Lymm Heritage Centre opened with a bang in time for Lymm Festival and received over 1,000 visitors on Historic Transport Day alone. Since then it has maintained a steady stream of visitors during its Thursday to Sunday opening periods, clocking up more than 3,000.

it has maintained a steady stream of visitors during its Thursday to Sunday opening periods, clocking up more than 3,000. Alan said: "We are delighted at the level of interest and the overwhelmingly positive feedback – but this is really just the beginning. There are teams working in the background now in a number of areas and Lymm should start to see the results of that over the next twelve months. These include a set of resources and activities of schools to help them deliver local history in an exciting and engaging way. Another group is developing a digital archive. The aim is for both to share and secure for the future as many photographs and other images of Lymm as possible risitors. for research, education and enjoyment."

Team member Glynis Allen said: "We recently had an email from some-one who visits an old lady who lives alone in the south of England. She had been very excited to discover that she would have access to so much material about the village where she grew up and is looking forward to sharing her memories with us".

up and is looking forward to sharing her memories with us". The first exhibition "A Quiet Revolution" about the impact that cycling had on the area at the turn of the last century has now finished. The Centre will then open with a brand new exhibition in October that will launch the digital archive project.

Alan said: "This will essentially be an exhibition of historical photographs of the village and will be our first chance to show off some of the fascinating new material that has already been donated"

Alan, whose own photographs of Lymm in the 50s and 60s will feature in the exhibition "but we will also be encouraging people to bring in their own photographs to the centre where they can be scanned and immediately returned before being added to both the archive and the exhibition". Work is also proceeding in the background on the design and creation of a more lasting exhibition that will tell the Lymm Story through the themes of Trades, Transport and Tradition. That is planned to open in the first half of 2018. The whole project is supported by The Heritage Lottery Fund. 

AN Outdoor Gym is being planned for Ridgway Grundy Park in Lymm for the benefit of sports groups and local residents.

Cllr Ian Marks said: "This would encourage villagers to improve their health and fitness using a range of apparatus for building both muscle tone and cardio-vascular fitness. The facility would be free to use seven days a week.

Warrington Borough Council owns the Park and suggested applying for landfill tax funding from WREN. In February 2017, the application was submitted. The proposal was supported by a contribution of £2,750 from the Parish Council and £2,500 from Lymm Round Table – the rest to come hopefully from WREN. Unfortunately, it was turned down but WREN said we could apply again in the next funding round in November."

Denis McAllister said: "They said our bid was sound but we fell short on two criteria – not enough 3rd party funding and not enough public consultation.

to establish a Partnership Board has been agreed by our Working Group and that this can now be put to the council's executive board.

"Warrington's Working Group is held extremely positive has extremely discussions over the past few months and made good progress. It's important, once the final recommendations of the group are made, that we do not lose momentum and are able to move forward with our efforts to sustain and develop the future of our libraries service. A new partnership board would give us the focus and expertise to achieve that.'


