Editor's Comment

Warrington?

Well with at least four tram companies expressing an interest, they certainly think it is a financially viable proposition, even though the town's last tram system ground to a halt in the 1930s due to competition from cars and buses and lack of investment.

With an urgent need to do something to resolve the town's chronic highway issues trams could indeed be the future - but it would have to be a pretty impressive system to meet needs and would take some huge investment.

It would also need to be quickly linked in with the Local Plan, which has quite rightly caused a huge outcry across the town, with up to 9,000 homes earmarked for Green Belt Land.

Like many of those opposing Green Belt development I also believe not enough has been done to examine alternative brown field

and town centre sites for new housing.

Green Belt must be Our

Dur Green beit must be protected at all cost and only ever be developed as a "last resort."

Meanwhile if a tram system is going to be of any real benefit it must be well connected to our outer communities or it will do little to alleviate the near daily traffic issues commuters face.

But what Warrington Borough Council must do is ensure all the infrastructure is in place to cope with the town's additional needs BEFORE pressing ahead with any development.

Warrington simply can not cope with more than 20,000 new homes, which could bring up to 40,000 additional cars onto our local highways, without huge improvements to our infrastructure.

Whether trams could be part of the answer, only time will tell.

Tram firms have their eyes on Warrington

AT least two and possibly up to four organisations are eying Warrington as a suitable location for a tram system that would help solve the town's chronic traffic problems.

Two have made approaches to the borough council – including Trampower, the group behind the £25 million Preston Guild tramway, which is being funded privately.

They have prepared a pre-feasibility study report which claims Warrington could have a tram network at no cost to the public purse.

More than 80 per cent of Warrington people are dependant on car travel, with only 7.6 per cent using buses. But the report claims a tram system would attract about 25 per cent of the car users.

Warrington-based Light Rail UK is also urging the council to look seriously at a tram system.

Managing director James Harkins has lodged an objection to the council's controversial Local Plan proposals recently announced road

and housing plans.

He has dismissed the proposals as "yesterday's planning" and believes Warrington's congestion and transport problems can be best be tackled to provision of high quality public transport - particularly a tramway.

Estates & Lettings

Warrington resident lan Buttress, former principal transportation officer with Greater Manchester Council and leader of the team that developed the highly successful Metrolink tram system, is also championing the

cause.

He has written to the council, enclosing a copy of Trampower's pre-feasibility study report, which suggests that private funding would 'available' for a Warrington

system.

Mr Buttress said generally, he was not against the extra housing proposed for Warrington, most of which was proposed in the original Warrington New Town plans. But they would have to be linked into adequate infrastructure improvements.

improvements.

The tramway system proposed was in the form of a cross, with tramlines going north-south and east-west, but it could be extended to serve the it could be extended to serve the proposed "garden city suburb" and other major developments, such as Grappenhall.

Mr Buttress hopes the Trampower

report will be considered by the council.

But Mr Harkins says he has been disappointed with the lack of interest shown by the council after several years of trying to get his ideas examined.

He says he knows of other consortiums interested in trams systems for Warrington but does not

see any of them as rivals.

"They are more complementary," he said.

The Liberal Democrat Group on the borough council says it is "extremely interested" in the proposals and hopes to set up talks with the tramway organisations

Local party chairman Cllr Ian Marks said: "It is certainly worth looking into because it offers cost

savings and environmental benefits. Until 1935, Warrington had a fiveline tramway service linking the town centre with Stockton Heath, Sankey Bridges, Latchford and Bruche. It was a victim of competition from cars and buses and under-investment

Warrington could be the next digital 'Supertown'

Encouragingly almost every month another independent report cites the strength and potential of Warrington's economy.

Last month it was good to see a report produced by Vodafone which cited Warrington as having the potential to become Britain's next

potential to become Britain's next digital "Supertown" and see massive digital growth in the next few years. The report looked for towns with populations of over 40,000 (Warrington's has 207,000) with strong existing digital sectors and the potential to grow still further. It rated them in three sectors – economy, skills and infrastructure – as either high-performing "pacesetters", solid "pillars" or early "prospects".

Warrington was praised as a "pacesetter, with huge potential" in all three areas in the report written by Steve Hughes, a former Bank of England economist.

Slydigs coming home



WARRINGTON rock 'n' roll band Slydigs are set to headline their first ever gig at the town's Parr Hall to help celebrate five years of local music promotion via WarringtonMusic.co.uk

The show next March is the first to be booked at the Parr Hall with a Warrington band headlining since Viola Beach, who were scheduled to play in October 2016 before being tragically killed while on tour in Sweden.

The announcement comes on the back of months of planning and bringing different groups of people together by WArringtonMusic.co.uk founder Lee Harman. As far back as the Warrington Music Festival at the the varringion Music restival at the end of May, a big birthday show at the Parr Hall was spoken about with Warrington Worldwide Editor Gary Skentelbery gave Lee the push he needed.

Lee said: "This is the first event announced to celebrate five years of WArrington Music.co.uk, but I am looking forward to many more!

As part of celebrations for the 5th year of WarringtonMusic.co.uk, [WAM] a showcase of music from the town will be taking place at the Parr Hall on Friday, March 16.

Joining headline act Slydigs are special guests, Funk Rock Soul Collective The Winachi Tribe, Psychadelic Rockers, Psyblings and Fuzz Pop four piece, The K's.

Last year saw Slydigs embark on a 19 date North American & European arena tour supporting

on a 19 date North American & European arena tour supporting The Who, earning themselves rave reviews. In 2017, the band released their latest EP, 'How Animal Are You' supporting it with a headline tour across UK & Europe proving that Slydigs have a thriving and ever review for have

The show will also be filmed and broadcast at a later date by the local University and College media students from the town, as well as being broadcast live on Radio Warrington. The show is the first to be announced by [WAM] since May 2015

WarringtonMusic.co.uk has spent the past 8 months establishing partnerships with local organisations including Warrington Wolves, which has led to local artists having their tracks played in front of over 10,000 Rugby League fans at half time. Over the years, as well as hosting gigs across the town including two in the Bus Interchange, over 6000 tracks have also been downloaded from the WarringtonMusic.co.uk website with 125,000 cumulative views on over 400 Youtube videos produced since [WAM] formed.

The Sankey Canal Partnership The Sankey Canal Restoration Society, the Canal & River Trust, plus St Helens, Warrington and Halton borough councils, all came together at the St Helens World of Glass, to pledge their support for the regeneration of the 14 mile Sankey Canal corridor Sankey Canal corridor.

The man-made waterway begins in St Helens and runs through Newton-le-Willows, Winwick, Warrington and ends at Spike Island in Widnes, where it connects

into the River Mersey.

Opened in 1757, the Sankey pre-dates the Bridgewater Canal by four years and was built primarily to carry coal from the Lancashire coalfields to the growing port of Liverpool. Its construction and later extensions led to the birth of the chemical industry on the banks of the Mersey at Widnes.

The canal is remarkable for featuring Britain's first staircase lock and first viaduct crossing of a canal by a railway – George Stephenson's original line from

Liverpool to Manchester.
After canal cargoes declined in the early 20th century, the Sankey was officially closed in 1963. Today much of the canal remains in water but the navigation is now severed by the M62 motorway, several roads, a footbridge and a

railway line.

In the 21st century the canal route has been successfully reinvented as the Sankey Valley Trail, converting almost the entire length of the former towpath into a long-distance, off-road footpath suitable for cyclists, walkers, prams and wheelchairs. Thriving boat clubs operate at the two locks into the River Mersey at Fiddlers Ferry and Spike Island, and the trail is popular with a wide range of groups and individuals from anglers to dog-

walkers.
The Sankey Canal Restoration
Society (SCARS) was formed in
1985 with the aim of returning the canal to navigation. Since then hundreds of volunteers have donated many hours to renovating locks and bridges, and improving pathways. The borough councils of St Helens, Warrington and Halton have also played a major role delivering improvement projects in their own areas.

Now the Canal & River Trust, the charity which cares for 2,000 miles of the nation's waterways, has joined forces with the three councils and SCARS to form the Sankey Canal Partnership. volunteering on the Sankey Canal, please contact SCARS. 





again in the November budget David Watkinson and Margaret Black in the same terms. It will apply from last April as originally intended. Provided only that it is introduced in this way the allowance cannot be used for letting income which is eligible for Rent-A-Room relief, even if that relief is not claimed. Also, it cannot be claimed where the restriction on tax deductible loan interest applies. Other than that, it applies to any form of letting income such as renting out your driveway for parking.

If the income is less that £1,000 in the tax year then the exemption applies automatically. There is no need to claim it. If income exceeds £1,000 then it will be possible to claim a deduction of £1,000 against that income instead of the actual costs incurred. Of course, this is a choice that will only be made if costs are lower than £1,000. The allowance is a per person and not per property, so can only be claimed once in the year.

The second change is that HMRC has updated its advisory fuel rates (AFRs), which can be used to claim back the cost of fuel purchased privately but used for eligible business travel in a company car, with effect from 1 September 2017. The rates are worked out using average pump prices over the previous quarter, which saw fuel prices reducing slightly. The trouble is that prices began to rise in late August and so the new AFR's don't reflect this. In fact, they have been reduced for some of cars.
