ONCE again the future of the Lymm Hotel is under threat with the owners saying it is no longer viable.

It will be a sad loss to the local community and has played an important part in the village's heritage, none more so when it hosted the Brazilian World Cup team in 1966.

The 50th anniversary event to mark this historic occasion in 2016 was a huge success and the facility was packed with local people.

It is also still a popular wedding venue and with the increasing demand for hotel rooms in Warrington growing, it is difficult to understand how it can not be

The proposal to replace the hotel with a residential care home, retirement apartments and a childrens nursery seems to be a large development for the site.

November 2004 application to build four storey apartment blocks on the site was thrown out by a government inspector following a public enquiry and local councillors and residents are already expressing concerns over the size of the development which was at the pre-planning application stage as Lymm Life went

It will be a big loss to the local community if the hotel is lost but I also realise the demand for retirement apartments and care

homes is a growing market.

We will be watching this planning application with interest.

Lymm Hotel under threat again

THE future of the Lymm Hotel which famously hosted the Brazil football squad during the 1966 world cup is under threat again.

Macdonald Hotels and Resorts Ltd. have written to the local parish council and nearby residents outlining intentions to develop the site as a residential care home with

a block of retirement apartments and a children's nursery. They say the hotel has been making increasing losses over the last ten years and due to the declining nature of the business, the continued use is regrettably no

longer viable. In November In November 2004 an application to build four storey apartment blocks on the site were thrown out by thrown out by a government inspector following a public enquiry.

Now in a joint venture partnership with McGoff Group, the owners are now looking to submit an application for planning consent for the proposed mixed use development.

Pre-application consultation has already taken place with Warrington Council.
Local Cllr lan Marks said: "In November 2004 a planning

November 2004 a planning application to build four-storey apartment blocks on the site of the lymm Hotel was thrown out by a Government Inspector following a

public inquiry.

"The scheme was said to be 'out of character for the area'. We don't know the details of this new proposal yet, but there is a strong

risk that the apartments planned for the front of the site would be equally out of character.

"The original building at the front has a great deal of charm and it would be a big loss if it were pulled down. The site is not far from a Conservation Area and it is vital that we retain the character of our village. At a time when we are trying to attract more people into trying to attract more people into Lymm, I find it very disappointing that we may be losing one of our two hotels. It is very sad that Macdonald's has not been able to make it pay. The Hotel's hosting of the 1966 Brazilian Football team is part of the heritage of our village and this would be lost.

"Until we see the plans it is difficult to comment on the proposed development. There will

be issues about highways and access because Whitbarrow Road in the direction of the Golf Club is extremely narrow. There is no bus route nearby for elderly people who would live in the Care Home. There would need to be plenty of space on the site for vehicles because on-street parking would not be acceptable."

The hotel famously hosted the Brazil World Cup team, including soccer legend Pele in 1966 and in 2016 hosted a successful 50th anniversary event to mark the



The blaze was in Lymmhay Lane, off Danebank Road, shortly after 6am and virtually destroyed

the roof of the bungalow.
It is believed the fire was started by the extractor fan in the bathroom.

The family are currently staying

in Lymm with other family members but will probably look to rent in the area for 12 months while their home is re-built

Mr Taylor added that the family did not require any financial



support but were just grateful to received well wishes from the community.

Entrance exam advice for parents



IT is now approaching the time of year when independent schools run entrance examinations for entry into Year 7

examinations for entry into Year 7.

lan McKenna, director of studies at Withington Girls' School, gives advice on how to approach the examinations so that your child enjoys the challenge: "Sitting an entrance examination needn't be a stressful experience and schools do all they can to make the day as enjoyable as possible. Encourage your child to think about it as a way of finding the school that best suits them. Responsible schools will look at which children they believe can be both successful and happy at their school and balance their academic work with involvement in activities outside of the classroom. Entrance examinations are just one way in which schools can decide whether a child would flourish there; they would also want to meet as many of the children and parents as possible. At Withington, that plays as much of a part as the entrance exam in the decision of whether to offer a place. offer a place.

ofter a place.

"The most important questions for schools and parents are: Where is the right fit for the child? Where did they feel most comfortable and settled when they visited? Where did they feel they were interested in the activities on visits or Open Days? Where will they make friends? The best way parents can help children to prepare for entrance exams is to encourage their child to take ownership of their learning: read widely, discuss a variety of topics, ask questions and talk about their own ideas. Tutoring may make a small difference to a mark in an exam, but on its own, it is unlikely to foster the curiosity and interest in learning that really makes the difference."



Kate and Simon Barber, walked from Warrington Hospital to Lymm as a thank you for the care their daughter Beth, now aged one, received after being born 12 weeks premature

Beth, was born 12 weeks premature, weighing just 2lb 12oz. She was born in St Mary's Hospital in Manchester, but was transferred to Warrington Neonatal Unit when

she was two weeks old and spent two months there before going home just before her due date. Kate explained: "We will be forever grateful to the incredible staff at Warrington Neonatal Unit and as we approached Beth's first birthday, we wanted to do something to raise awareness of

the work they do. About 60,000 babies are born prematurely in the UK each year and the care they receive in neonatal units has a huge impact on the rest of their

Kate added: "Beth spent six months on oxygen treatment after she came home. During that time, we regularly needed to use an oxygen monitoring machine and there is currently only one for the whole of Warrington. We will whole of Warrington. We will therefore be using the funds raised to buy an additional machine for the unit".




