Parish council launches appeal to keep villages clean and tidy


CULCHETH & Glazebury Parish Council is appealing to local residents and business owners to help ensure the local area remains as attactive as possible.

They believe it is important for residents to have clean green areas to walk their dogs and for children to play in.

They also believe it is important for visitors to see that they are in an environment where they feel comfortable and for businesses to thrive it is essential that both visitors and residents come into the area to shop and use the facilities.

Members of the parish council have been surprised to see a proliferation of advertising banners and "A" boards, presumably exhibited without planning permission, that change the visual character of the village centres.





There is also the issue of dog fouling. There are still a number of dog owners who think it is acceptable to allow their dogs to

acceptable to allow their dogs to litter streets and lovely green areas. Clir. Peter Holmes, Chairman of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council, said: "We appreciate that businesses need to advertise but would ask them to consider the impact on the area and if they are adding to or detracting from the attractiveness of it. We also send out a plea to dog owners to clean up after their pets."

"The Parish Council spends a considerable amount of ratepayers money employing staff to keep, particularly the green, areas of the parish free of litter which is currently being done to a very high standard. However, we are experiencing great difficulty recruiting sufficient staff and our concern is that we may not be able to maintain these standards going forward."

Chairman of Culcheth Village Club Paul Campbell, who made the appeal, said he had been

"amazed" by the response. He said: "It is only four weeks since I put out an appeal for financial support to help in the repair and upgrade of the war memorial at Newchurch Parish Church.

"It was while attending last year's Remembrance Sunday service and wreath laying that I noticed the names on the WW2 section of the memorial were beginning to fade due to the weather.

"I then made enquiries regarding the cost of repair and after receiving a satisfactory tender I followed this up with an appeal to help complete

"I have been amazed with the response and I can now report that we have the necessary funds to complete the work which will be carried out by the stonemasons before the end of summer."

Mr Campbell said the appeal had been made with the support of Newchurch Parish Church, the Culcheth branch of the Royal British Legion, the Village Club,




local residents and Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council - who had madé a substantial input.

This meant the whole of the memorial would be upgraded and cleaned in time for this year Remembrance Sunday which would be on the 11th day of the 11th month exactly 100 years since the end of World War One.

"This shows what our community can do when we all pull together. Once again we will have a fitting memorial to those from the surrounding district who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

There will also be a Quiz Night in Newchurch Parish Hall in the village on April 6 and any funds above and beyond that needed for the repair of the memorial will be evenly divided between the church and this year's Poppy Appeal.

MP hits out over HS2 "white elephant"

MP Helen Jones has again hit out over the controversial HS2 high speed railway.

She attended a debate on the West Midlands to Crewe proposals for the line and called for "a proper, integrated hub at Crewe".

This, she said, would make the proposed spur line through the Culcheth area "absolutely redundant." After the debate, the Warrington North MP, who lives in Culcheth, said: "I have always maintained that the Hoo

Green to Bamfurlong spur is the whitest of white elephants. "Sadly, if it goes ahead it will devastate two villages and inflict serious environmental damage.

"The case for the spur has been seriously undermined with rising costs and crucially the provision of a transport hub at Crewe which would make it redundant.

"A proper integrated hub at Crewe would also enable many more towns in the North West to benefit from HS2." If the spur line is built, the villages of Culcheth and Rixton would be badly effected, and there would also be an impact on Lymm.

This is the best month to plant strawberries to get them established in their first season.

- Lawns should be swept and raked before having their first cut and then given a spring feed towards the end of the month
- Early spring is an ideal time to plant herbaceous perennials e.g. Geraniums and Oriental Poppies
- If tender bulbs produce new shoots quickly, protect them with fleece or mulch until the weather improves
- Weeding should start in earnest! Weeding now will save you so much time later on in the year

Councils join forces to oppose employment area projects

CULCHETH and Glazebury and Croft parish councils have joined forces to object to plans for a major employment area at Haydock.

Members of the two councils are worried about the traffic implications of the Haydock Point scheme, on land north east of the A580 East Lancs Road near the A498 Lodge Lane, Haydock.

They are particularly concerned because of two other major employment schemes in the area – the Florida Farm scheme, which has already won planning approval – and the controversial proposals for the former Parkside Colliery site at

Newton-le-Willows.

Councillors fear all three projects will result in hundreds of heavy lorries flooding the narrow roads of Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft. Cllr Jaqui Johnson said: "We

are particularly concerned because these scheme are being considered separately.

"We believe they should be looked at together, rather than as three individual schemes. "Only in that way can the traffic implications be considered

properly. "Our

"Our roads are frequently gridlocked as it is and this hampers residents and businesses.

"When there is an incident of some kind on one of the motorways - the M6, the M62 or the M56 - it can cause chaos.

The two councils have suggested that the traffic issues connected with the Haydock Point scheme should be considered alongside the traffic issues of the Parkside development. As yet they have not submitted an objection to the Parkside scheme,

but one is likely. Another possible course of action

is to ask the Secretary of State to "call in#" both schemes so they can be considered together.

1 visit Culcheth regularly and have attended quite a few reunions of former pupils of the secondary modern school. The last one I went to was just before the old, original






Opposition growing to nursery housing plan
