# **Princess** Anne to attend bombing 25th anniversary event

THE Princess Royal, Princess Anne, will be attending the 25th Warrington bombing anniversary event taking place on Bridge Street on March 20

She will attend a special service to commemorate the bombing which claimed the lives of 12-year-old Tim Parry and three-year-old Johnathan Ball and injured more than 50 shoppers including young mum Bronwen Vickers

who later died as a result of her injuries.
Tim's parents Colin and Wendy Parry, who campaigned to raise funds to create the Warrington Peace Centre as a lasting memorial to their son and other victims, will also be at the event, part of a number of events to mark

the 25th anniversary.

The Warrington bombing atrocity, when the IRA planted two bombs in bins on Bridge Street, just weeks after carrying out an attack on the Winwick

Road gas works, was seen as a major turning point in the Northern Ireland troubles, leading to the Good Friday agreement.

Warrington as a town, gained respect around the world for the way it responded to the tragedy, offering peace and reconciliation, forging strong links with the island of Ireland and Northern Ireland.

The special commemoration service will be taking place on Bridge Street at 11.20cm and manbars of the public gree invited to attend

at 11.30am and members of the public are invited to attend.



# Warrington economy continues to fare well

Last month the economic think tank 'Centre for Cities' published its Cities Outlook report; their annual 'Healthcheck' on the UK's 63 cities.

The report provides a useful and independent barometer in assessing how Warrington is performing economically in relation to the rest of the UK and I'm encouraged to report that Warrington continues to fare well.

Warrington is classed as a city in the report due to the size of its population currently standing at 207,000.

207,000.

This year's report focusses on the impact that artificial intelligence, automation and other technological change will have on jobs over the next 12 years to 2030.

The report concludes that all cities are likely to see an increase in jobs, across both the public and private sectors, thus replacing any jobs lost to technology. Indeed the findings conclude that the UK job market and economy is at no more risk now to automation and globalisation that it has been over the last century.

It predicts that cities with relatively weak economies are less likely to prosper and particularly those which are more dependent on welfare.

Warrington's economy continues to perform strongly and Warrington features eighth highest in the UK in terms of the number of private to public sector jobs. Nationally it is the only urban economy in the North to feature in the top 10.

Moreover in its table of 'Cities and jobs likely to see an increase in demand to 2030', i.e. those cities which have been successful in attracting jobs to date and react to the changing labour market, Warrington was ranked as sixth best in the UK, the only city in the

North of England in the top 10 and it ranked higher than London who was placed ninth.

Narrington also has the highest GVA in the North of England with an average of £49,400.

Next month Warrington & Co. will be announcing the findings of our Annual Property Review which looks at the trends and uptake in the commercial and residential the commercial and residential property market over the last 12 months. These stats are now in their 20th year and provide an interesting measure of the growth and strength of Warrington as a residential and business location. I've had a preview of some of the figures and, once again they are very encouraging. I'll report more next time.

# Slydigs prepare for 'true homecoming'

# New community orchard planted

A NEW community orchard has been planted along a greenway between the Westbrook and Callands areas of Warrington thanks to an initiative by local residents and the Land Trust charity.

The Trust, which owns the regenerated Westbrook to Dallam Greenway, is working with a group of enthusiastic residents, the Friends of Westbrook

Orchard, to plant apple, pear, damson and cherry trees.

The Friends group has so far raised more than £3,500 to fund the first 40 trees which will then be available for local residents to harvest fruit and use as an outdoor classroom.

Around a dozen volunteers joined contractor Continental Landscapes and the Land Trust at the first planting day. The Friends will take on the long term management of the orchard, organising harvest events and public signage.

The Land Trust, which has its national headquarters in Birchwood, is keen

to give the Friends group every support.

Landscape and community officer Mary Doyle said: "This is a fantastic project to create a wonderful new orchard which can be enjoyed by everyone.



"We are happy to give the Friends group our full support. They deserve great credit for coming up with the idea and then getting the project off the

# College works to raise students' aspirations

A WARRINGTON college is working with two of the world's leading universities to raise the

aspirations of young people.
Priestley College is hosting several events over the next couple of months with academics from Oxford and Cambridge and some of the college's former students who are now studying at Russell Group universities.

It is hoped these events will inspire young people who might otherwise not have planned to attend university.

"Events like the one being held at Priestley are important to help provide the extra information and inspiration that some young people need to achieve their full potential," said Dr Claus.

Many of the students who attend An Evening With Oxbridge will go on to join Priestley's Graduate programme like former Lymm High School pupil Greg Horne.

Now in his second year at Christ Church, Oxford,he said: "The Graduate programme was fantastic because it connected me with intellectually challenging people and made Oxford seem like a real possibility. The activities such as debates boosted my confidence and prepared me for the rigorous interview process.

She attended a debate on the West Midlands to Crewe proposals for the line and called for "a proper, integrated

This, she said, would make the proposed spur line through Warrington "absolutely redundant." After the debate, Ms Jones said: "I have always maintained that the Hoo Green to Bamfurlong spur is the whitest of white elephants.

"Sadly, if it goes ahead it will devastate two villages in Warrington and inflict serious environmental damage.
"The case for the spur has been seriously undermined with rising costs and crucially the provision of a transport

hub at Crewe which would make it redundant.

"A proper integrated hub at Crewe would also enable many more towns in the North West to benefit from HS2." If the spur line is built, the villages of Culcheth and Hollins Green would be badly effected, and there would also be an impact on Lymm.

# My Warrington Remembers...

By Gordon Gandy

IN a regular feature Radio Warrington's Gordon Gandy, who has been running his "mywarrington" website covering the town's history for many years. looks for many years, looks back at some of the town's famous families and historic buildings.

This month he looks at Robert Garnett & Sons, Furnishing Contractors, Cabinet Makers and Upholsterers.

Robert Garnett Snr was born in 1806. He was a cabinetmaker and founded Garnett & Sons. He died in 1877. It was his son, also called Robert, who was the powerhouse of the company.

Robert Garnett Jnr was born on the 6 June 1830 in Penketh. He

married Mary James on 15 Sep 1859 in Stanwix, Carlisle and they had one daughter. Garnett's was a well-respected firm of cabinetmakers and he was a generous local benefactor to many churches. He laid the foundation stone at Penketh Methodist Church. The workshop was a familiar landmark on the Warrington skyline with its Italianate crenellated water tower.

His showroom on Sankey Street was designed by Chester architect John Douglas. Garnett's described the building as "an imposing four-storey stone edifice to the Gothic style of Architecture". The factory was on Barbauld Street to the rear of the showroom and they had other shops in Chester

and Southport. William Roberts, his younger brother, oversaw the premises in Chester.

Robert Garnett Jnr died on 9 Apr 1903 at Hall Nook, Penketh and was buried in Sankey. Robert left over ten million pounds in today's money in his will. The Garnetts were great philanthropists and gave a lot to the poor, they built churches and schools so the poor of society could be educated.


The Site later became the CWS

printing works, but the building had been empty and derelict for about 60 years before demolition was begun in December 2017. The famous water tower, built in 1906, is also being demolished. Meanwhile, the former



showroom on Sankey Street still exists. From 1913 it was the home of Woolworths until the company closed down in 2009, and is now a pound shop.

# Council secures funding boost for Centre Park Link bridge project

WARRINGTON Council has secured a funding boost of more than £3m towards the Centre Park Link bridge project.

The government announced the £3,685,904 for Warrington as part of an £866 million investment in local housing projects nationwide.

of an £866 million investment in local housing projects nationwide. The Centre Park Link project proposes a bridge crossing across the Mersey from Chester Road, just north of Gainsborough Road. This crossing would join onto an extended Slutchers Lane leading from Wilson Patten Street. A new signal controlled junction is to be constructed at each end of the new link on Chester Road and Wilson Patten Street.

Cllr Hans Mundry (pictured), executive board member for highways, said: "We are delighted to have once again been successful with a bid for major infrastructure funding.

"The plans for the Centre Park Link will deliver a new bridge and link road from Chester Rd to Slutchers Lane to alleviate traffic congestion around Bridge Foot and Chester Road. It will also provide



a link to land south of Centre Park which currently has no access." The Centre Park Link project will

The Centre Park Link project will also bring forward approximately 465 homes in a location that is within a walkable distance from the town centre and both railway stations.

Chancellor of the Exchequer, Philip Hammond, said: "This fund finances vital infrastructure such as roads, schools and bridges, which will kick-start housing development in some of Britain's highest-demand areas."

# Reducing your tax liabilities

As we approach the end of the tax year it is time to look at some tips for reducing your tax liabilities. As usual, however, you should never let the tax tail wag

never let the tax tail wag the dog.

One of the best ways to reduce tax is by making pension contributions. To get the relief in the current year then the contribution must be made before 5th April. The maximum contribution that can be made (gross) is restricted to the lower of £40,000 or pensionable income. However, everyone can contribute £3.500 aross. or £2.8

contribute £3,500 gross, or £2,800 net, even with no pensionable income. Despite threats to the contrary tax relief is given at the tax payers marginal rate. It also reduces relevant earnings when looking at child benefit or the loss of personal allowances. Hence, looking at child benefit or the loss of personal allowances. Hence, if your relevant earnings are just above £50,000 then making a pension contribution could reduce them to below this level enabling you to claim and retain child benefit. A pension contribution could similarly reduce your relevant earnings if you are lucky enough to have earnings above £100,000 and so are losing some or all of your personal allowance.

For example, if your earnings are £123,000 then making a net pension contribution of £18,400 will reduce your tax by £13,800 in total of which £4,600 is given at source, meaning that the tax actually payable is reduced by £9,200. Therefore, you will get an investment of £23,000 for a net cost of £9,200! At the other end of the spectrum, a non-earning spouse can get an investment of

of the spectrum, a non-earning spouse can get an investment of £3,500 at a net cost of £2,800.

Whilst it may be too late for the current year, if you have a spouse or partner being taxed at a lower marginal rate than yourself, then you should ensure that assets are owned, and income received, by the lower earning partner. Following the introduction of the Dividend Allowance and the 0% Savings Tax Band then this now

Dividend Allowance and the 0% Savings Tax Band then this now applies primarily to property income.

And talking of dividends, if you operate through a limited company then you should ensure that you fully utilise the dividend allowance. Up until 5th April 2018 this is £5,000 per person, so the first £5,000 of dividend income is tax free. From 6th April 2018 it is anticipated that this will be reduced to £2,000 per person. Subject to any anti-avoidance provisions, holding shares in your company jointly with your partner means that currently £10,000 can be received tax free, or £4,000 from 6th April plus, in both cases, any unused personal allowance. cases, any unused personal allowance.

As it was, having kept the score at 0-0, the hosts were able to get themselves back on track and their tactical switch on the half hour mark certainly changed the balance of the game in their favour.

But still, in the second half it was the Yellows who were having the better


chances and they should have took the lead on a couple of occasions prior to the most controversial incident of the match.
