Editor's Comment

IN these times of austerity, when councils are being expected to save money at every opportunity, it is quite understandable that we see examples of temporary repairs being carried out to try and put off more costly work.

But how often does this "make do and mend" policy actually end up saving money?

We suspect not - and two local

examples spring to mind.
In Warrington Road, Culcheth,
local parish councillors are to press local parish councillors are to press the borough council to do a proper job on replacing railings which are continually being demolished when speeding cars career off the road. In Mustard Lane, Croft, local parish councillors are grateful for pothole repairs recently carried out

by the borough – but wonder if a full resurfacing job would have been more effective on this busy road. The Warrington Road, Culcheth,

situation is not new, of course. We recall the issue being raised several times over the years. Each time there is an incident the railings are replaced – but only with the same type as before. Each time, the opportunity of upgrading to a more suitable barrier is missed.

Whether this is to save money, we don't know. But we are pretty sure that in the long run it hasn't saved any. And if there should ever be a fatality involving a pedestrian being crushed behind the railings it will certainly be shown to have been a

false economy.
At Croft, local councillors were receiving complaints from cyclists finding the potholes difficult to negotiate. One, apparently fell from his bike as a result of riding into a

deep hole.

The pothole repairs have been reluctantly welcomed by the parish council – probably on the basis that it was better than nothing. But we have already heard of one cyclist who finds the repair work has done little to smooth a bump ride. So one wonders how long it will be before the holes need filling again. Make do and mend can be acceptable in some circumstances –

but not when road safety is involved.

Council in new call for late night buses

CROFT Parish Council is to renew its call for a late night bus service for the village.

Councillors have, for some time, complained about the fact that there are no buses from Croft at 7pm. But their calls have been in vain

Now a development on the other side of the borough has rubbed salt in the sound.

Bus company Network Warrington has announced a new service to Knutsford.

Knutsford.
Croft Parish Council chairman
Keith Bland said: "I'm all for new
services and I have no doubt
extending a service to Knutsford will
greatly benefit people in Lymm and
High Legh. But it is no good to us.
"We have been asked for buses
later than 7pm for Croft for years.
There is nothing in either direction –
neither to Warrington nor to Leigh.
"If you live in Croft and you haven't

got your own transport, you are trapped in the village. Young people who might want to go for a night out to the cinema in either Warrington or

Leigh just can't get home.
"I appreciate that there may not be many people using such a service, but sometimes services have to be subsidised.

"We don't begrudge people on the other side of Warrington getting an improved service, but it is trustrating when there is a need here that is being ignored."

Network Warrington spokesperson said: "We will always take residents' feedback on board take residents reearded on booth at to look at how we can improve our service across the network.

"We would love to be able to serve all areas of Warrington with a

frequent service and are committed to connecting as many of our communities as possible, but the number of customers using the bus in Croft is declining significantly. It is important that people in Croft use the buses in order to keep them running patronage has reduced by 8 per cent year on year. This means less income to cover the costs of operation.

"The Croft service curr erates hourly, including currently operates weekends, but the small number of people who use the service are such that a commercial evening service after 7pm would be unsustainable

Planners defer decision on caravan

PLANNING chiefs have agreed to allow a long-standing site for touring caravans at Rixton to stay in business - but have deferred a decision on an application to allow the site to be used for permanent residential caravans.

Members of the borough council's development management committee put off the second decision at Holly Bank Caravan Park, in Warburton Bridge Road, after hearing there was an objection from Rixton Parish Council.

Officers recommended both applications for approval - but admitted that at present it could only be concluded that currently the site operated mainly as an unauthorised permanent résidential site, with only 21 out 121 pitches being used by touring caravans.

Some 100 caravans were said to have been on the site for more than 11 years and it was assumed they were the main, or sole, place of residence for their occupants. The site is in the Green Belt – and

Rixton Parish Council's objection is on the grounds that the site would become a permanent residential site and not, as permitted, a transit

site for touring caravans for periods of up to 28-days only. They suggested that if a change was approved, use of the site should be limited to a 10-month period with the site closed, possibly,

The committee was told the site was granted permission for 30 touring caravans in 1978. Subsequently the number was increased and permission given for five static caravans.

In 2005 permission was refused for an extension to the site - but no pitches were in fact created and an enforcement notice was served.

The owner now wished to regularise the situation but with a reduced number of pitches.



Safety fencing needed

CULCHETH and Glazebury Parish Council is calling for improved fencing at an accident blackspot where pedestrians are at risk from vehicles careering off the road.

The danger spot is in Warrington Road, near the former New Inn where railings on the left hand side of the road, heading towards the village, have been repeatedly hit by cars.

On one occasion, the railings were pushed inwards hard up against the wall of nearby flats.

Cllr Keith Bland said: "Parents walk along here, taking their children to school. If anyone had been there at the time of the crash they could have been killed or

seriously injured.
"We have approached the borough council but have been told that neither they nor the police

"It may be that there have been no accidents involving injuries but there have been three or four collisions with the fence in recent months. I am sure the borough council must have a record of the number of times they have had to repair the railings – and how much it has cost.

"What is needed is stronger, motorway-style railings which would prevent vehicles from coming off the road.
"We could also to do with

something to slow traffic down at this point."

The parish council is pressing the borough for action - before there is a serious accident.



Bungalow extension given the green light

PLANNING chiefs have given the green light for an extension to a dormer bungalow in Wellfield Road, Culcheth.

Members of the borough council's development management committee approved the scheme after planning officers had assured them a cabrio balcony window at the rear would not cause any significant overlooking for loss of

privacy for neighbours.
Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council had not opposed the scheme but had suggested the impact of the balcony window on neighbours should be considered.

Councillors

property had a small garden and area of hardstanding at the front but a large garden at the rear.

The extension would have a flat roof and uPVC roof lantern. It would enable a reconfigured kitchen and dining area to be created.

The loft conversion would be used for a new bedroom with ensuite but the property would still have two bedrooms as an existing ground floor bedroom would be replaced by an additional lounge

Three roof lights would be installed in addition to the balcony window.

added Gary.

This year sees the 25th anniversary of the Warrington bombing, which claimed the lives of the two young boys. It is something incredibly close to the heart of Gary.

"I remember the day vividly," he said. "I was heading to play in a football match—so I was dressed in my goalkeeper kit - when I received the call into Orbit News from a national newspaper asking us to get to Bridge Street. I rushed to the scene, walking through the back

scene, waiking through the back streets and stepped straight into where the bomb had gone off. It was a scene I will never forget "Despite all the pain the town went through – and the families in particular - Colin and Wendy have since gone on to become special friends and we're incredibly proud friends and we're incredibly proud to champion the charity and all the amazing work they do in our 50th year," said Gary, who is now the Peace Foundation's longest serving

patron. He also sits on the board of the town's Chamber of Commerce and Warrington Disability Partnership.

He also spent 10 years on the board at local football club, Warrington Town, serving as Warrington Town, serving as Chairman for several years before retiring as a director last year.

As well as a series of fundraising challenges throughout 2018, Orbit News is sponsoring the Warrington Business Awards and will be giving back through a range of events and activities to support young people and businesses in the town.

The Chairman of the Parish Council Cllr Peter Holmes confirmed "On receiving the request and viewing the monument it is clear that it deserved some attention, especially in regards to the names of the fallen, which needed to be made clear once more. Over the years the monument has weathered. I proposed that we made the contribution, which was unanimously passed, and we are proud to significantly contribute and assist the British Legion in renovating the memorial"

Law and Order

The Police hold Community Meetings/ Surgeries in Culcheth Library. For up to date information go on the Cheshire Police website and put in your postcode. Information is also in the Library.

The HS2 engineers and environmental researchers are preparing information on route 2b which includes the Golborne Link. Their report will go out for consultation in Autumn/Winter this year. In the meantime if you have any information on the route, or questions, let us know. Plans are in the Library. There are also proposals being made by Transport for the North and other groups which are about East - West rail connections.

The Draft Local Plan

This will also appear later this year but we expect a new timetable from the Borough Council before then. The NPPF, the National Planning Policy Framework which our Local Plan has to satisfy, is currently being revised.

Logistics Proposals

We have objected to the proposals for Parkside and asked that they and Haydock Point be called in to be considered together because of the traffic impact on Motorways and Local roads. More generally there needs to be an overview of the combined impact of all large proposals that put even more traffic on our roads and motorways.

The Parish Council has adopted a publication of Information scheme. Details of who we are, what we do and how the public can access information is published on the main notice boards, in Culcheth Library and on our website www.culchethandglazebury.org.uk

Their main jobs were weaving and cleaning and the working day began at 6 a.m. In 1770 the workhouse had 50 inmates including children. They

all received free medical care, provided by three doctors.


Message for dog owners

Landlords set to have their purse strings tightened further

THE FACTS!

It appears never ending, the constant attacks that threaten to drive your once thriving business into despair. So what's going on?

The three main things are:

• Tenant fee ban • 3% additional stamp duty on second home purchases • Withdrawal of mortgage relief

Fee ban changes

The draft bill awaiting parliamentary consent indicates that reference fees and indeed all fees normally charged by the landlord (or acting agent) other than contractual default fees will be banned. Furthermore tenancy deposits will be limited to 6 weeks rent and holding deposits are limited to one week's rent.

3% additional stamp duty

If you buy a property as a buy to let or a holiday home and you already own a property as a main residence then you are now subject to an additional 3% stamp duty on top of the standard stamp duty applied to property purchases.

Withdrawal of mortgage relief

This measure will restrict relief for finance costs on residential properties to the basic rate of Income Tax. This will be introduced gradually from 6 April 2017. Landlords will no longer be able to deduct all of their finance costs from their property income to arrive at their property profits. They will instead receive a basic rate reduction from their income tax liability for their finance costs.

Before April 2017, landlords could deduct their mortgage interest costs from their income when calculating their tax bill. And up until now, tenants have tended to foot the bill for tenancy agreements, referencing and credit checks. But under the announced changes, these costs would be passed on to landlords.

So what can be done to help ease the financial squeeze on landlords?

The number of landlords planning to reduce the volume of properties across their portfolios has hit a 10-year high – a trend which the National Landlords Association's attributes to tax changes. Whilst others are looking to up the rents to offset them, but is this really a good idea?
