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Talented apprentice Ryan sees innovative training system go global

A talented software developer from Warrington & Vale Royal College has changed the way Stanley Engineered Fastening operates, with his innovative training and succession system now set to go global.

Ryan Kenny, a software developer apprentice at Stanley's Woolston base, recently returned from an all-expenses paid trip to Miami, where he received the prestigious 'Make the World' award and \$10,000 in Stanley Black & Decker shares, in recognition of his hard work.

During the trip to America, the 17 year old – who has been offered a permanent position with Stanley – was invited to sit on the top table with Stanley Black & Decker President and CEO Jim Loree.

Ryan's incredible success comes less than three years after first walking through Stanley's doors as part of a work placement. He soon wowed his employers, with Stanley's Manufacturing Continuous Improvement Manager – Russell Lodge seeing the potential in him.

After attending an open evening at Warrington & Vale Royal College, Ryan enrolled onto an apprenticeship with Stanley through the college.

He went on to create a cutting edge digital solution to meet the needs of the Stanley's business. Ryan's training and succession software – Centurion – tracks staff development, alerting management ahead of time when they need to put plans in place to replace staff, whether that be through recruiting apprentices, upskilling current staff or employing new people.

On how Centurion has changed the way in which Stanley operates, Russell Lodge said: "As part of our employee engagement programme I have the privilege of working with young talented individuals who show a passion for learning and

development. Ryan initially started on a week's work experience placement working within continuous improvement where we could utilise Ryan's Software skills to support this exciting project.

"During Ryan's time during work experience and his apprenticeship Ryan has developed at an astonishing pace, supported academically by Warrington & Vale College, where he has extended his IT software development skills and a solid understanding of multiple aspects of the business. Ryan has displayed what a young student can achieve with hard work, support and commitment.

"During his trip to America, Ryan demonstrated the Centurion system to colleagues in Chesterfield receiving excellent feedback from all levels of the business, Ryan looks to be key in the system's implementation both in the States and in Europe in the future.

In addition to his core apprenticeship IT technical studies, Ryan also completed the Level 3 ILM Leadership & Management qualification at the college. He is now about to embark on a company-sponsored degree in Business & IT, following the completion of his apprenticeship seven months ahead of schedule.

Ryan is also being promoted to Business Systems Analyst and will work as part of the European Business Services Team.

Ryan said: "When I walk through Stanley's building in Woolston and see my systems and what I have built up there on 80 inch monitors, with numerous people using them, it feels quite humbling. It's such a

privilege to be a part of."

He added: "My apprenticeship with Stanley Black & Decker would not have been possible without Warrington & Vale Royal College. The college has been great, they really have, and my tutor Tim has been so supportive. I couldn't have asked for a better tutor."

The History and Politics students' chance encounter followed a visit to the White House earlier in the day.

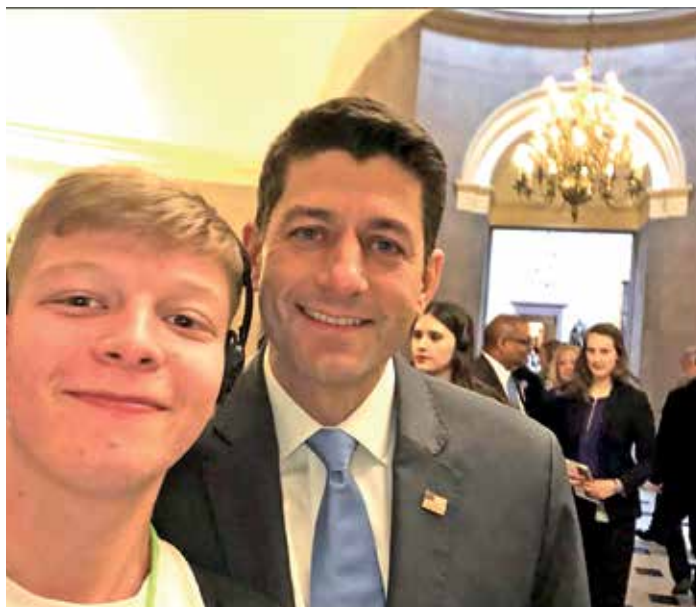
There was no meeting with the current resident there, but it was an informative trip nonetheless.

Traffic Congestion

The cost of traffic congestion to UK business has risen by almost £150 million in the past year, according to research conducted by TomTom.

Latest figures revealed as part of the TomTom Traffic Index, reveal congestion is costing UK business approximately £915 million a year in lost productivity up from £767 million in last year's study.

Traffic across the UK's most

congested cities and towns increases the time each vehicle spends on the road by an average of 129 hours a year (up from 127) which means an average commercial vehicle driver wastes more than 16 working days while sat in traffic.

This translates to an approximate loss of £915,239,520 for businesses across the country.

To compound the situation traffic has been getting continuously worse since 2010 with an average journey now taking 30% longer than it would in free-flowing conditions, up from 25%.

"Traffic remains a serious issue for business and the resulting delays have potential implications for productivity, customer service standards and even employee wellbeing" said Beverley Wise Director UK &

Ireland for TomTom Telematics.

One wonders what the cost is to Warrington businesses.

Rise in Unemployment?

The 46,000 rise in unemployment is the biggest rise since the start of 2013. It took the jobless rate up to 4.4pc from the 42 year low of 4.3pc.

But there is much more to it than that. At the same time employment also increased by 88,000 in the three months to December. These two moves

can co-exist as the population is growing. But the rise in employment outpaced the 75,000 increase in the UK's adult population. Regular

wages in the private sector are up 2.6pc on the year, the fastest pace in 12 months. Public sector pay is up 2pc, its fastest rate since 2012.

HR advice from Kim Hayton, HR Director at FDR Law

QUESTION: What next, now that the Employment Tribunal Fees have been dropped?

ANSWER:

abolished immediately.

In July 2017 the Supreme Court ruled that the Employment Tribunal fees introduced in 2013 were unlawful and as a result were

In the four years when a fee was required in order to put forward a claim, the numbers overall dropped by 80% and there was a 91% drop

in sex discrimination claims.

It was felt that many people who would have normally made a claim were not able to, due to the costs involved and therefore this was considered a discrimination in itself.

Fees are being refunded by the

Government to people who made a claim during the period and as a result of the fees being scrapped, there has already been an increase of 64% in the number of claims made, and that is expected to rise further, and many will likely be from the period when fees were in place.

We would recommend that businesses take a look back over the last 4 years to identify if there could be any potential issues.

Keep a dated paper trail of any current issues, even informally in an email to yourself can help you with remembering details and timings, which may or may not be needed in the future. It's worth noting that in Unfair Dismissal cases, the burden of proof is on the employer to prove that an employee wasn't unfairly dismissed. However, it is the other way around for Constructive Dismissal cases and it is the employee's responsibility to provide the evidence.

New distribution centre could provide 2,000 jobs

A MAJOR new four-unit industrial/distribution centre providing up to 2,000 jobs is to be built at Omega South, Warrington.

The development on a 757,555 square foot site will be built by Omega Warrington Ltd (OWL) for Mountpark Logistics.

Mountpark Logistics EU Sarl, a joint venture between Mountpark Finco and USAA Realco has been established to undertake logistics development across Europe.

OWL have commenced building works on behalf of Mountpark, and a new access road leading off Skyline Drive is underway. When completed and fully occupied, the new cluster of premises, to be named "Mountpark Warrington", could support up to 2,000 jobs on the western part of Omega South.

David Milloy, joint managing director of Miller Developments and OWL said: "This announcement marks the second speculative deal done at Omega. It demonstrates that major UK and overseas investors have confidence in the local market and the attraction of Omega to businesses. We look forward to welcoming further occupiers to Omega South and promoting more jobs to local people."

Mountpark is committed to funding the scheme speculatively – that is, in advance of occupiers being secured, – with three units of 346,153 sq ft, 136,962 sq ft and 90,771 sq ft to be built in a first phase of development and scheduled for completion in November 2018.

A fourth unit totalling 183,669 sq ft is fully consented and will follow as a second phase of construction.



Tom Kilmister, for Mountpark Logistics, said: "We are very excited to be working with OWL on the next phase of development at Omega South. The park has a fantastic reputation as the premier distribution location in the North West, given its excellent connectivity to the National Motorway network and accessibility to the regional population.

"There is currently a distinct shortage of available, good quality industrial and logistics accommodation in Warrington and

the North West, providing limited opportunity for businesses looking to expand in to the area or relocate; Mountpark Warrington will provide much needed state-of-the-art accommodation for occupiers seeking quality workspace."

New occupiers will join ASDA, The Hut Group, Plastic Omnium, Domino's and Amazon on Omega South, neighbours to Brakes, Hermes, Travis Perkins and Haydock Commercial on Omega North.

College chefs put to the test by 167 Catering Support Regiment

Young chefs from Warrington & Vale Royal College have been given an insight into the world of military cooking after putting their culinary skills to the test in a ration-based challenge.

Hospitality and catering students were tasked with producing tasty and nutritional dishes using only basic ration ingredients.

The challenge came as part of a visit from the 167 Catering Support Regiment, who spent an afternoon in the college's kitchens, sharing their skills and experiences of working within the military.

Students were given a strict time limit to produce the meals, which had to hold enough nutritional value to support a soldier in the field.

Mixing only a small amount of fresh ingredients with tinned and long-life produce, the young chefs created appetising meals including pasta dishes, stews and flapjacks.

During the visit, students were able to speak to army staff from 167 – the only regiment of military chefs in the British Army – about

the career opportunities available to them within the forces, as well as gaining experience of a field kitchen.

Trainee chef David Peterken said: "I really enjoyed taking part in the challenge. When I was younger, I wanted to be a chef in the military, and this experience has made me think that I might actually want to do it."

Fellow student Maddie Hannam added: "This was an amazing experience and something that has made me really think about my career options for the future. Using the ration packs to produce a meal was really interesting – we all loved it!"

Andy Macleod, Curriculum Manager for Hospitality & Catering and Travel & Tourism, said: "This was a great opportunity for our students to see what it's like to work within the armed forces as a

chef. It's a career option that many of them had never thought about before.

"We really appreciate the team from 167 Catering Support Regiment taking the time to visit us at the college and share their experiences with us – we hope to

visit their barracks in Lincolnshire over the next few months to further enhance our students' experiences within this area."

College works to raise students' aspirations

A WARRINGTON college is working with two of the world's leading universities to raise the aspirations of young people.

Oxbridge have also asked Priestley to host an event aimed at giving Year 12s the skills they need to secure places at Britain's best universities.

Academics and members of their two universities' admissions and liaison teams will advise students on what they need to do to stand out from the crowd and submit a competitive application. Tutors will also receive advice on writing references.

Students who have applied to Priestley – and who have predicted grades that suggest they could study at one of the UK's top universities – have also been invited to 'An Evening With Oxbridge' later this month.

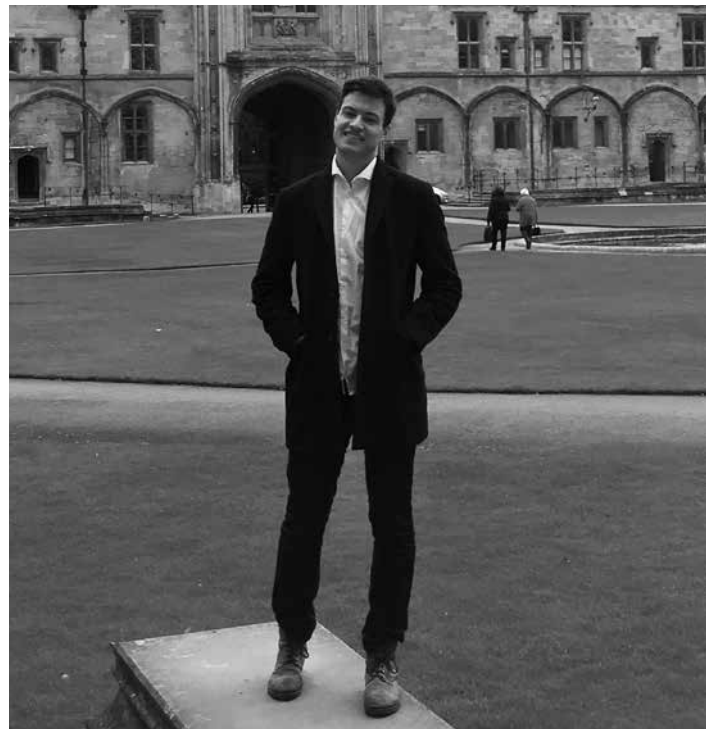
They will hear from academics Dr Catherine Sumnall (Cambridge) and Dr Peter Claus (Oxford) about the admissions process and how their tutorial teaching systems can benefit those who are academically motivated and engaged.

"Events like the one being held at Priestley are important to help provide the extra information and inspiration that some young people need to achieve their full potential," said Dr Claus.

Many of the students who attend

An Evening With Oxbridge will go on to join Priestley's Graduate programme like former Lymm High School pupil Greg Horne.

Now in his second year at Christ Church, Oxford, he said: "The Graduate programme was fantastic because it connected me with intellectually challenging people and made Oxford seem like a real possibility. The activities such as debates boosted my confidence and prepared me for the rigorous interview process."

Bus company to provide shuttle service for music festival

Princess Anne to attend bombing 25th anniversary event



THE Princess Royal, Princess Anne, will be attending the 25th Warrington bombing anniversary event taking place on Bridge Street on March 20.

She will attend a special service to commemorate the bombing which claimed the lives of 12-year-old Tim Parry and three-year-old Johnathan Ball and injured more than 50 shoppers including young mum Bronwen Vickers who later died as a result of her injuries.

Tim's parents Colin and Wendy Parry, who campaigned to raise funds to create the Warrington Peace Centre as a lasting memorial to their son and other victims, will also be at the event, part of a number of events to mark the 25th

anniversary.

The Warrington bombing atrocity, when the IRA planted two bombs in bins on Bridge Street, just weeks after carrying out an attack on the Winwick Road gas works, was seen as a major turning point in the Northern Ireland troubles, leading to the Good Friday agreement.

Warrington as a town, gained respect around the world for the way it responded to the tragedy, offering peace and reconciliation, forging strong links with the island of Ireland and Northern Ireland.

The special commemoration service will be taking place on Bridge Street at 11.30am and members of the public are invited to attend.
