



OK, he shouldn't have created the lay-by without permission. We accept that. We can't have people carrying out developments, even small ones, all over the place.


small ones, all over the place.

We know the personal circumstances of an applicant do not carry much weight in planning law, but really...in this case?



Fortunately, members of the borough council's development management committee shared their views and decided the lay-by could stay. So one little bit of bad and, in this case, rather heartless planning has been avoided.

She will be holding the event in memory of her late partner, Carl Greenaway, of Culcheth, who died tragically after a road accident – and also raising money for two charities.

The afternoon tea will be served at Bold Street Methodist Church's coffee shop, Warrington, where Nina will be on her bike on a turbo

Nina will be on her bike on a turbo trainer riding for six hours – her target time for a 100 mile ride.
Carl, aged 36, a father-of-four died after a car accident in June last year – shortly after re-introducing Nina to the world of cycling. They had planned to compete in the 100 mile Manchester cycle event in 100-mile Manchester cycle event in

September this year.
Nine, 31, said: "Carl and I never got the chance to start a family. But we had planned to marry.
"After seeing his children's heartbreak at losing their dad, it broke my heart even more. I am fundraising and trying to raise awareness of the fantastic charities who supported us through this very, very difficult time.

"Winston's Wish is the UK's childhood bereavement charity, supporting children and parents after they have lost a parent or

Nina, like Carl, is a huge sports

She will be taking on the Manchester 100 in September for Carl and herself – and to raise

money for the charities.

But she also loves baking cakes and Carl loved eating them – hence

Speed indicator devices help slow down traffic

ADDITIONAL speed indicator devices installed in Culcheth have

helped reduce the speed of traffic travelling through the village. This was revealed in a report on the last 12 months by Cllr Peter Holmes, chairman of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council.

He said the devices – on Warrington Road and Common Lane – had gathered data showing a significant drop in speed when entering the villages which should improve road safety in the area.

Whilst some people continue to speed, they have been successful in reducing the number of speeding vehicles.

Cllr Holmes said the parish council was particularly proud that, aided by the borough councillors, they had been able to reach an agreement to level and implement a drainage system on Culcheth village green, where excess water would now able to be taken away through United Utilities pipes.
"This took significant discussion

and negotiations with the borough council and United Utilities but we are glad that this has been signed off, and that the preparatory stages have commenced."

second stage

The second stage would hopefully begin in May.
"This is a major development and has involved significant investment, but it should hopefully allow villagers the opportunity to



use the Green more often.

Councillors had been involved in fighting the proposed closure of Culcheth Library, and the Friends of Culcheth Library group had now been formed and were taking the lead in securing its future. "Whilst nothing is ever guaranteed, we are now very confident that the library will remain, and recommend that all residents visit the library and make use of the building, not just for borrowing books, but also for the classes which have been set up, which include a variety of subjects.

"We also recommend that you become a member of the Friends of Culcheth Library and help retain

the library for future generations." In Glazebury, additional Christmas lights are to be provided and extended over future years.

Cllr Holmes' last act as chairman of the parish council will be to open Community Day on May 7.

Caravan park can stay open – for 10 months a year

THE long-established Holly Bank Caravan Park at Rixton is to be allowed to stay in business – for 10 months of the year.

Warrington Borough Council's development management committee decided an application for permission for a permanent residential carayan site could be approved, subject to it being closed for two months each

The site already had permission for use by touring caravans – but the committee was told there were 121 caravans on the site and about 100 of them had been there for more than 11 years and were the main, or only, place of residence for the occupants.

Rixton-with-Glazebrook Parish Council had opposed the application for a permanent site but had suggested the two-

month closure.

The site was originally granted permission for 30 touring caravans in 1978. Subsequently the number was increased and permission was

given for five static caravans. In 2005 permission was refused for an extension to the

Board and are part of the Libraries


Networking Group by which Friends of various libraries support each other.

Cllr Grime said: "The Friends of Culcheth Library group is now established financially as well as fully constituted, and fund-raising is one of our next major tasks.





- Help the environment by composting as much of your garden waste as possible

There were no portraits painted of Shakespeare during his lifetime and the most famous likeness is actually a wood-cut completed after his death. There are 17,677 words in his plays and 1,700 words used for the first There are 17,677 words in his plays and 1,700 words used for the first time within them, for example; accommodation, fitful, lack-lustre, road and numerous other words we use in everyday speech. Shakespeare died on the same date that he was born, April 23 – St. George's Day and countless other fascinating facts were included in the talk.

Coral's vast knowledge of the many famous passages from the plays, recited from memory with all the necessary acting intonations, was very impressive and her anecdotes relating to her teaching career were hilarious. A very enthusiastic vote of thanks was given by Sheila Glass.

Father wins fight for safe bus stop for disabled son

PLANNING chiefs have agreed to let a father keep an unauthorised lay-by outside his home after hearing it provides a safe place for his disabled son to be picked up by a school bus.

a school bus.

The lay-by had been constructed without planning consent in Bank Street, Glazebrook and the borough's development management committee was being urged to refuse a retrospective

urged to refuse a retrospective planning application.
Planning officers recommended refusal, highways chiefs objected on the grounds of inadequate visibility and Rixton with Glazebrook Parish Council objected on Green Belt

grounds.

But after a lengthy debate, the committee voted to allow the application.

application.

Borough councillor Pat Wright had urged them to consider the "serious detrimental impact" refusal would have on the quality of life of the both the father and his eight-year-old son.

The committee was told the applicant had three children, one of which suffers from various disabilities.

The area of hardstanding created allowed the family to park a second vehicle off road, provided a safe boarding area when the school bus called and allowed a carer to park



off-road overnight.
Planning officers argued that the development was inappropriate in the Green Belt. Although the personal circumstances of an applicant could be taken into

account they were seldom sufficient to amount to the very special circumstances necessary for approval in the Green Belt.

The removal of trees and shrubs

from the site had made it more

prominent in the Green Belt and 'urbanised" the area.

A letter of support for the applicant was received from the school his son attends

usual freebies.




Goalkeeper Joe gets England call
