

'HS2 will reinforce town's status as a transport hub'

TEAMS from HS2 Ltd will be visiting locations in Culcheth, Lowton and Rixton to talk to people about how the design of Britain's new high speed railway is progressing.

Three community information events will be held in June and July as part of a wider engagement programme along the entire route between the West Midlands and Leeds, and Crewe and Manchester.

The Government confirmed its preferred route for Phase 2b of the railway last year. Achieving this significant milestone has enabled HS2 Ltd to spend the last 10 months progressing its early design and construction proposals.

construction proposals.

HS2 Phase Two director Paul
Griffiths said: "The benefits that
HS2 will deliver are significant and
should not be underestimated. The
new railway will play a crucial role
in rebalancing Britain's economy,

driving business growth, creating jobs and securing investment right across the country.

"Understandably, people have questions and concerns about construction and operation of the railway, and how it will affect them. These events present an ideal opportunity to talk to us about the project and find out more information.

At the events, HS2 representatives will be on hand to answer questions about a range of topics including engineering plans, environmental mitigation, and the impacts on land and property. Members of the public are encouraged to attend so they can review the plans and talk to the team about the emerging designs and understand what this means for them.

A public consultation on HS2 Ltd's draft' environmental statement and proposals to minimise the railway's potential impacts will be held later this year. This provides everyone with the opportunity to have their say and play a part in ensuring that we design and deliver the best possible

The arrival of HS2 services at Warrington Bank Quay will reinforce the town's status as a transport hub

and its reputation as a great place to live, work and do business. With journey times from Warrington to journey times from Warrington to London cut to just over an hour, HS2 represents a significant uplift in connectivity for the three million people who live within 30 minutes' drive of Warrington.

The drop-in events will be on June 29 from 2pm until 8pm at Rixton Community Hall, on July 2 from 2pm to 8pm at Culcheth Sports Club and on July 3, from 2pm to 8pm at Lowton Social Club.



WHEN Lymm resident Alan Williams organised the first Lymm Historic Transport Day in June 2013 it was meant to be a one off to help raise funds for the ten day Lymm Festival.

But it was so successful, in spite of atrocious weather, that it has now become a key event on the region's transport event calendar as well as generating a wide range of education and heritage spin-off benefits.

"We do have a unique setting" explained Alan, who is still the Event Director.

"The Bridgewater Canal cuts right through the heart of our beautiful Cheshire village. We also have access to a glorious seven acre main event field close by and a tarmacked area next to the canal that can accommodate over a dozen traction engines." And this year for the second time the show takes to the skies too with a flypast by a Battle of Britain Memorial Fund Spitfire marking the centenary of the RAF.

"There are some great contributions from the Warrington area too. North West Casual Classics Car Club has been supporting the event since year one and describe it as one of their favourite events in the calendar while the Burtonwood Association will be marking the 70th anniversary to the day of the start of the Berlin Blockade. This year too for the first time Network Warrington will be getting more involved by providing a vintage double decker shuttle for the centre of Warrington.



How Jane encountered hope after years of anxiety

ENCOUNTER Hope – the free, confidential programme helping people with emotional problems and addictions – has now been operating in Culcheth for more than 18 months.

Based at Culcheth Christian Fellowship, in Hob Hey Lane, it runs on Tuesday evenings from 7pm to 9.30pm.

One person who has been helped by the group is Jane, who struggles with anxiety.

She has written an article about ow she has been helped by

how she has been helped by attending the group's programme. Jane wrote: "As far as I can remember, life has always been a struggle.....from being second best, controlled, told what to do as a child and adult, abused, bullied, divorced, having long periods of physical and mental illness and now lately, coping with the love of my life having a terminal illness. Life sucks!

Life sucks! "Life is "Life is all about balance. Wheel balancing on cars means they run better, smoother and with less damage. The problem is the damage may be on the inside and set again, seen. Encounter, Hope not easily seen. Encounter Hope is my tow truck. It can't fix me! It can't make me a new creation underneath. However it CAN support me with my journey through

life, direct me and transport me to a 'garage of grace' where the Almighty Mechanic God can repair and renew me.

"I am not invincible, but He is! I am human. I fail, I sin, and I struggle. Through Encounter Hope, I realise I am not alone in this. I am not judged I am supported. I am not shunned, I am loved. I am a sinner...aren't we all! Welcome to

sinner...aren't we all! vveicome to the club!

From the 1st of April 2018 the law requires that any new let's or renewals within the private sector have a minimum grade E energy rating and any existing tenancies must have it by April 2020 this will be displayed on the compulsory Energy Performance certificates (EPC) that must be issued before a property is rented.

What does this actually mean for landlords?

Basically if you rent out a property with a rating of F or G after April the 1st 2018 you will no longer be able to rent it out, unless you have made the necessary upgrades to improve the rating to an E. There are some exceptions: - If the works are deemed inappropriate for the house, or the works could devalue the home, or you are unlikely to be granted consent for the work (e.g. listed buildings) then landlords could apply for a 5 year exemption.

These regulations are compulsory and apply to any new and assured tenancies, any renewed or extended tenancies and if a fixed term ends but becomes a 'rolling' or periodic tenancy, the rating must be an E grade, following the end of the fixed term and before the rolling period starts.

What if I ignore this?

It is unlawful to rent a property that breaches these rules, a civil penalty of up to £4,000 will be imposed for breaches and you will not be able to rent out your property.
