NO security system will offer 100 per cent protection, but by general assent Culcheth feels a safer place since the CCTV cameras were installed at the junction of Common Lane and Lodge Drive.



Local lad heads to Afghanistan

A SOLDIER from Culcheth has deployed on a six-month operational tour in Afghanistan.

The 4th Battalion, the Mercian Regiment, a Territorial Army infantry battalion, is deploying a company of 120 soldiers to provide force protection duties at Camp Bastion, the main UK base in Helmand Province.

All but one of the soldiers are Territorial Army soldiers, who would normally serve the British Army on a part-time basis.

The one Regular soldier is Warrant Officer Class Two (WO2) Steven Morrison, 36, from Culcheth, who will mentor and assist the TA soldiers throughout the important tour of duty.

The Company of 120 soldiers -known as Normandy Company - will deploy during the next few weeks, but WO2 Morrison has already departed for Afghanistan as a

member of the advance party. The four MERCIAN soldiers will guard Camp Bastion, but will also often leave this camp to carry out patrols in the local vicinity and provide escorts for medical teams and convoys.

An 'experienced soldier, WO2 Morrison, a fother-of-one and a former pupil of Culcheth High School, has served in the Army for 19 years. He has previously served in Bosnia, Northern Ireland and Iraq. This is his first operational tour of duty in

Afghanistan. He said: "My job will be to mentor the soldiers and sort out any issues that may arise. I will also be responsible for any in-theatre training. I will deploy out on the ground with them and give them guidance, where needed. They are all up for it and have adapted quickly. It is the usual mix - they come from all walks of life. We have police officers, students, a

Gardening tips

April

Wildlife in the garden

Many birds will have families of young to feed, so ensure a plentiful supply of food is always available to them.

The fruit garden

It is a good idea to spray fruit trees with an insecticide and a fungicide this month to ensure a clean start to the new season, do not spray when the blossom is open, as this will kill bees and other pollinating insects.

The shrub border

Shrubs will appreciate a feed as they start to come back into growth. Magnolias will be flowering this month and it is an excellent time to visit your local garden centre and select new plants whilst they are in flower.

Care of herbaceous plants

Dahlia tubers may be planted in the garden this month in their flowering positions, Weed, and mulch established borders. A liquid feed may be given to encourage vigorous new growth.

In the greenhouse

There is plenty of work in the greenhouse now. As the temperature rises, plants will require an increased frequency of watering. Cuttings of plants such as Fuchsias & Geraniums which were taken earlier in the season should be stopped by pinching out the growing points, this will ensure a bushy plant with plenty of flowers in the summer.

Pond care

Ponds should be given a spring-cleaning. Overgrown aquatic plants should be split and replanted, discarding the older portions. Fish also will benetit from feeding, giving no more food than is consumed in 5 – 10 minutes.

Lawn maintenance

New lawns may be sown this month, and established grass should be fed now, if weeds & moss are a problem, the lawn may be treated with a combined weed and teed.

And a little extra . . Why not freshen up your flowerbeds and inject an early burst of colour using gorgeous bedding plants such as petunias and begonias. These beautiful blooms will last throughout the summer months so use them freely to enhance your garden's colour scheme.

Cash for losses

It isn't often the taxman offers to write you a cheque but new provisions outlined in the Chancellor's Pre-Budget Report last a cheque but new provisions outlined in the Chancellor's Pre-Budget Report last November will soon be formalised in the Budget on April 22. These could offer a cash lifeline to businesses that have recently started to struggle and be worth up to $\pounds 20,000$ as a repayment of tax. However, good things never seem to last and this benefit will only be available for the 12 months to 23 November 2009.

Background

When companies or unincorporated businesses make trading losses in a given year there are usually only two ways these can be used:

Can be used:
 Against profits of the previous year
 Surplus losses not used in this way are automatically carried forward to use

against future profits

The temporary new rules allow an extension of the 'carry-back' rule above to profits of the previous there years, up to a limit of \$50,000.

How does it work?

If a business has made losses for If a business has made losses for accounting periods ending between 24 November 2008 and 23 November 2009 (e.g. 30 June 2009) these can be used against profits without limit of the previous year (30 June 2008), as before. Furthermore, any remaining losses up to the \$50,000 limit can be used against any profits of earlier years (ending 30 November 2007 and 2006) and generate a cash repayment of tax paid for those years. vears.

For companies this repayment could be worth up to \$9,500 if tax was paid at the small companies rate or even \$15,000 if companies paid at the higher rate for these periods. For unincorporated businesses an income tax repayment of up to £20,000 could be available.

What next?

If your business has recently started to struggle and you answer 'yes' to the following questions it may be worth considering a claim for this relief:

- Considering a claim for this relief:
 Will your business report a loss during the period between 24 November 2008 and 23 November 2009?
 Do your losses for this period exceed profits of the year before?
 Was your business paying tax in 2007 or 2006?
