She added: "We will have an itinery so that people will be aware of when pupils from the same era will be attending. In the evening we will evening we will celebrate with an end finale party."

The evening will be ticket only, priced £5,

She said many pupils disliked 'A' block, complaining of draughty old corridors and cold uncomfortable classrooms. But now it is being pulled down many have a "nostalgic" feeling about it.

Many former pupils still live in Culcheth and some have children at

the school now.
One of those attending will be Dorothy Lythgoe, who was a pupil at the school when it first opened in 1931 along with four generations of her family who have attended the school right up to the present day.

Former pupils are asked to spread the word so there is a good attendance.





Guest speaker Jane Schaffer told the group how she had started out as a teacher before giving publishing a go at the age of 60, starting with her own work then expanding to publish other authors' writing.

"She was very frank about the pitfalls in publishing and explained about printing, editing, cover design and selling techniques."

Nicola lives and breathes farming

NICOLA Watkinson lives and breathes farming. When she's not managing her parents' farm she is an active member of Croft Young Farmer's Club.

So when the Watkinson family decided to open a farm shop at Red Bank House Farm and to put Nicola in charge of it, she decided it had to be a real FARM shop. She said: "We're not a mini-supermarket - we're a real farm shop

with everything in it either produced on our own farm or from other local farms. We want everything to be local so you know where your food

comes from!"

The idea for the shop came out of the popularity of the Watkinson's 28-day matured, home reared beef sold at the farm gates.

Nicola took on the responsibility for the on-site butchery, learning the trade from an expert and making all the sausages and burgers for the

shop.
All the feed, barley, grass and beans for the animals is grown locally at Red Bank House Farm and the

breeds they use are mainly Limousin heifer cattle.

Their sows are Large Whites which give birth on the farm and the piglets are then raised on the farm to provide the shop with all the pork it needs.

Lambs graze in the fields behind the shop and this is hung for 14 days

the snop and this is hung for 14 days to provide tender and tasty meat.

Nicola said: "The idea of the shop was to sell our own meat and to provide other quality local produce such as milk, jam, honey, vegetables, etc, sourced from around the Burtonwood. Culcheth Burtonwood, Glazebury areas.

"We are considering opening a café and, if there is a demand, might sell crafts, postcards, gifts, e provided they are made locally!"

The shop is open from 11am-6pm Wednesday to Friday and 10am-5pm on Saturdays and Sundays.



It was reported at the March Parish Council Meeting that Culcheth Library will be undergoing some refurbishment work which will include redecorating and recarpeting the main library area, changing the counter for a more modern one as well as introducing self issue machines. This will mean that the Library will be closed from Thursday 13th May until Tuesday 1st June 2010. Grants

There has only been one application this quarter which was from Newchurch Parish Hall for a donation towards a new sound system to enhance the range and quality of their community activities. It was agreed to grant them £250.

Police

The Police reported to the Parish Council that they had carried out a number of enforcement operations at key locations in Culcheth, Glazebury & Croft, including the problem areas that residents had highlighted. They had great successes in tackling speeding in these areas, with more than 80 speeding motorists caught.

Also they have been tackling the problems of anti-social behaviour around the Common Lane and the Co-op area by more visible patrolling at key times such as evenings and weekends. There has been a noticeable reduction in reported incidents.

PCSOs track down young vandals

POLICE Community Support Officers have been praised by the owner of a day nursery for their prompt action in clearing up an offence of vandalism. Young hooligans plastered mud all over the walls and windows at Culcheth Day Nursery in Warrington Road – pushing into an intercom system and putting it out of action

Owner Debbie Byrne-Davies decided to report the matter to police because of the damage to intercom system – and the PCSOs were quickly on the scene.

A check of nearby CCTV cameras soon revealed the identities of the

"But I would like to praise the PCSOs. They often get a bad press, but they were wonderful and soon solved the case. I think the incident also illustrates how useful CCTV has become in the village as a deterrent to crime.


