Editor's Comment

IT has been a long time coming, and it has not arrived yet, but thanks to the generosity of a local businessman, the initiative of a local councillor and the enthusiasm of a group of local residents, the village of Glazebury should soon have a children's play area.

What's more, it will be a play area with a difference, where local youngsters will be able to learn about nature and the environment while they

The lack of play facilities at Glazebury has been a sore point for years. An earlier attempt to provide one behind the Scout Centre, came to nothing. No other suitable land could be found.

Then, when Cllr Sue Bland heard that Bent's Garden and Home were to convert a former overspill car park into allotments, she approached managing director Matthew Bent and asked if there would be room for a play area.

He agreed - and the result is that parish council will be leasing part of the site for a peppercorn rent and it will be transformed into an environmentally friendly play area.

Instead of the usual brightly painted metal swings, slides and roundabouts, there will be a small woodland, wildflower meadow, etc. There will be play things too, boulders to climb on, a willow tunnel, natural wooden features. Nothing metal.

Much of the credit for all this must go to the residents. They got together

with the village school and came up with the ideas. The borough council has pledged money for the wildflowers, the parish council will fund ongoing maintenance. And of

runa ongoing maintenance. And of course, Bent's made the land available. A fine example of local community teamwork.

It won't be ready this summer, but, if a grant can be obtained, it should be in use next year. While it may be on the fringe of the village, it will sit well with the adjoining allotments and fill a gap in local provision that has existed for far too long.

Congratulations are due all round.

and we look forward to seeing local children playing - and learning - on the site soon.

FIVE times Olympic Gold medallist James Cracknell was on hand to officially open Culcheth's new health and wellbeing centre.

Based on Jackson Avenue, Culcheth, the centre is headed by Mark Airey former Lead Exercise Rehabilitation Instructor at Headley Court - the Defence Medical Rehabilitation Centre that deals with the injured service personnel coming back from Afaanistan.

The studio is one of many facilities to be made available at Culcheth Clinic. Many people will know that district nursing services and podiatry operate from the building as do outpatient services from the hospital. The clinic is hoping to expand outpatient services this year so that more patients can be seen closer to home.

For those who are not aware Culcheth Healthcare covers three practices in Warrington: Chapelford, Dudlow Green, Appleton and Warrington Road. There is also a fourth practice on Jackson Avenue and on April 16 there will be a full merger across both organisations to create one group providing services to the various sites across Warrington. Both Warrington Road and Jackson Avenue operate out of Culcheth Clinic and once the merger is complete will continue to do so.

WHEN Jonathan Akinyemi was a young boy, he wanted a motor bike. But his parents thought it would be too dangerous - and bought him a canoe instead.

Now, the wisdom behind their decision is becoming clear - with the 23-year-old former Culcheth High School pupil the African champion in the K1 kayak category and about to represent Nigeria in the London Olympics.

Whether or not white water canoeing is any less dangerous than motor biking is another issue!

Jonathan was born in Culcheth and started canoeing about 12 years ago Warrington's Fordton Leisure


The Jig Saw festival was the idea of three local women, Irene Johnson, Irene Bromilow and Sue Kadodwala.

£50,000 boost for tennis club


Culcheth Tennis Club chairman, David Ellis, said: "We are absolutely delighted to secure an Inspired Facilities

It is certainly advisable to consider your financial strategy when investing in buy-to-let property; spreading your investment over more than one

property for instance where yields exceed mortgage rates; targeting capital growth as well as strong rental yields; also consider your exit strategy and the tax implications of selling your property.




