



SEPTEMBER will bring new opportunities for local people as Culcheth High School Community Campus comes to life.


While the students and teachers moved into their new home last month and the leisure and community amenities opens in August, September brings a new focus to the state-of-the-art facility.

AN estimated 1,000 former pupils of Culcheth High School took a trip down memory lane for a special 'end of an era' school re-union.

It was a last chance for pupils who have been attending the school since the 1930's to see their old school before it is demolished to make way for a new multi-million pound state of the

The old school buildings will now be demolished to create new playing fields, although one building, the relatively modern G Block, is being retained and sold on to a local business

Former pupils and teachers travelled from far and wide to attend the event, including the Scilly Isles!

The event raised over  $\mathfrak L3,000$  from ticket sales towards the cost of a new mini-bus for the school.

Gary said: "Although I have been back to the school many times over the years covering local news stories I had never been back to my former classroom or the woodwork department."

"They have hardly changed in more than 30 years! "On the one hand it is very sad knowing I will never be able to return to my old school - but on the other it is fantastic that the local community is getting a brand new school which will serve generations to come."

But it will not be an end for school reunions. The class of 79 are already planning another reunion in three years time when everyone will be celebrating their 50th birthdays!





## Farmland will not be sold

## BOROUGH Council chiefs have decided NOT to sell farmland at the rear of Warrington Road, Glazebury.

The site has been removed from a list of properties the council had been

considering for disposal.

When the sale was first proposed there was an uproar from residents of Glazebury and there was opposition from local councillors. More than 60

people attended a protest meeting.

Council officers stressed that the land, estimated to be worth about £25,000, was in the Green Belt and would be sold as agricultural land with the tenant farmer still in occupation.

But residents maintained their opposition and the council's executive board has agreed that, in view of the public opposition and the fact that the land produces a rental income with minimal management responsibility, it can be retained.

Coun Bob Barr, the borough's executive member for planning and regeneration, said: "This never was a done deal. We listened to the public and decided it would be sensible to withdraw this land from sale.




