OUR cover picture this month is of Andrew Cronin, the youth worker whose activities on the streets of Culcheth are drawing widespread praise from councillors, voluntary groups, the churches and others concerned for the well-being of the community.

Andrew modestly makes few claims for himself.

"I am a professional youth worker,

just doing my job," he says.
That may be true, but from all accounts, he is doing it well.
He spends just 20 hours a week in Culcheth, Glazebury and Rixton, working alongside the youth clubs and the borough council's youth service.

Although he does work in the youth

clubs, he spends more time out-andabout of an evening, challenging the "drinking culture" which seems so attractive to many teenagers

He has a firm belief that most young people are fine - even those who would never darken the door of a youth club. He meets them wherever they congregate offering advice on alcohol, drugs, smoking. sexual behaviour, etc.

He believes he can relate to the youngsters because he was once like them himself. He does not try to stop young people drinking and smoking. He urges moderation - because he finds that way, youngsters listen to him. He finds many underage drinkers see no wrong in what they are doing because their parents drink heavily themselves and we agree with him.

Andrew will not be in Culcheth forever, but he is not just here for the short term. He will not solve all problems associated with young people, but he seems to be doing pretty

We wish him well for the future.

Andrew's challenge on the streets

YOUTH worker Andrew Cronin, 33, found his early professional challenges in far flung places, climbing mountains like Kilimanjaro and Mont Blanc.

He was working for an adventure holiday company, teaching outdoor pursuits such as canoeing and climbina.

climbing.
Today his challenges are still mainly outdoors - but on street corners, parks and in shop doorways in Culcheth.

and in shop doorways in Culcheth.

Andrew, pictured on front page, is working with the young people so often blamed for anti-social behaviour, underage drinking and other problems on the streets of Culcheth.

He meets them, befriends them, advises them and earns their trust. He can relate to them because, as he says: "I used to be one of them. I used to think Friday night was a night for going out and having too much to drink."

Now he is doing his best to make sure they don't cause trouble.

"The vast majority of them are great kids," he says. "I am getting to know them and, more importantly, they are getting to know me. They know I am there to help - and that I won't snitch on them."

Andrew works 20 hours a week in Culcheth, Glazebury and Rixton as part of an initiative of Culcheth Methodist Church, funded jointly by the church, the borough council and the parish council.

He only started work locally in September and is already in regular contact with nearly 200 youngsters and has met many more.

Although many are from Culcheth, significant numbers are attracted to the

village from places such as Rixton, Cadishead and Winwick, he says. But few come from larger towns such as Leigh. Andrew's mother was a youth worker and his wife, Lynn, is training to be a teacher so, although he has no children himself, he has a background of working with young people.

Motorists warned – park at your own risk

THE borough council sign at a Culcheth car park says it all: 'Users of this car park do so at their own risk.'

And the council is not kidding. For the car park at the Shaw Street Recreation Ground, Culcheth, looks more like a lake during the winter months.

At times more than half the car park is unusable because of deep pools of dirty water and a rutted and muddy surface

Residents have been complaining for some time because there is a demand for parking spaces particularly at weekends when soccer and rugby matches are being played at Shaw Street.

Coun Sue Bland, chairman of

Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council, said: "We have received a number of complaints and we have taken the matter up with the borough council. But they say they haven't the money to resurface the car park but can fill in potholes with second hand scree left over from other projects."

- Tools will benefit from sharpening & oiling to prepare for the coming season.

Row over house that took 17 years to build

DEVELOPMENT control chiefs have decided there is no action they can take over a long running neighbour dispute at Culcheth involving a house first granted planning permission 17 years ago.

The dispute centres on access to a house built in the grounds of an existing house in Twiss Green Lane.

Outline planning consent for the house was granted in 1992, with reserved matters approved the following year.

But the scheme was not implemented and planning consent was renewed in 1997 and again in 2002. Work on site started in 2007.

In a report to the borough council's development, control committee.

development control committee, planning chief John Groves, says breaches of planning conditions have been alleged over a considerable

period.
Conditions were attached to ensure access to Twiss Green Lane was mproved and available for use prior to the new house being occupied. The developer chose to create an access for construction traffic via Marton Close and the occupiers of two properties in Marton Close raised concerns over its legitimacy. Enquiries with the developer

indicated the access was intended for the period of construction only.

Mr Groves said this information was passed on to the complainants, together with assurances that the Twiss Green Lane access would have to be provided before the house was occupied. The council assumed once the house was completed the access to Marton Close would cease.

Eventually the Twiss Green Lane access was provided - but the Marton Close access remained in place to the annoyance of the complainants. They claimed it caused a loss of amenity.

Mr Groves said the use of this access perpetuated a longstanding neighbour dispute which had required the

intervention of the police and the courts. But it had been concluded it would not be appropriate to take enforcement action as there was nothing to indicate the new access would raise any highway safety or amenity objections. Nor was there any condition which precluded a second access.

It was considered there were no legitimate planning grounds to justify enforcement action to require the removal of the access.

The obvious route for the Marton Close residents was to pursue the matter with the Local Government Ombudsman. The council had pointed this out to them but no such action had vet been taken.

Funding for business

2009 was a year in which the recession dominated the headlines. We all hope that 2010 will see a

We all hope that 2010 will see a return to economic growth – and the banks must play their part.

Although the lack of available funding has been given many media column inches, prior to the recession there was surely too much credit available in certain areas.

At the heart of any offer by a bank to lend money, it should consider both the borrower's available security and their ability to repay the debt (serviceability).

borrower's available security and their ability to repay the debt (serviceability). Although there may be viable lending opportunities where full security cannot be provided by the borrower (see later), serviceability is essential. However, how many of us have been offered a 'guaranteed' amount if we take out a personal loan or new credit card? Our personal circumstances aren't known in personal circumstances aren't known in detail by the potential lender and so it is impossible that they have properly assessed our ability to repay.

Over the past 12 months many businesses have seen their banks focusing on reducing their exposure to

focusing on reducing their exposure to debt rather than looking at new lending

opportunities.

However, in order for businesses, and therefore the economy, to grow it is essential that banks support viable businesses and that funding is available on realistic terms.

Banks are now telling us that they are looking for new business. In addition to this, the government has put in place certain schemes which will enable the banks to lend where, otherwise, they might have perceived there being too

One such scheme, the Enterprise Finance Guarantee Scheme ("EFGS" intended to support businesses based in the UK with turnovers of up to £25million. Although some restrictions apply, loans of between £10,000 and £1 million are available under the scheme and applications are made scheme and applications are middle through high street banks. Critically, the government will guarantee 75% of the loan. This enables businesses without the levels of security normally required by banks to raise funding.

However, EFGS is not a soft lending

scheme and banks must apply the same lending criteria as they do to other loans

- the business must be viable and this must be demonstrated in a business plan

backed up by robust financial forecasts. We have had success in obtaining this form of funding for clients and we look forward to helping more businesses in this way over the coming year



THE controversial plan to install floodlighting on the tennis courts at Culcheth Sports and Social Club has been thrown out by planning

Numerous nearby householders had opposed the plan and Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council had also objected.

The scheme was turned down by officers without ever going before the borough council's development control committee.

Residents had opposed the proposals on the grounds their homes would be affected by glare caused

by the 10, 26ft high floodlights proposed and also by noise of an

The parish council admitted it was reluctant to oppose a proposal which would benefit the community but felt the interests of the residents had to take precedent.

Tennis club officials had pointed out the floodlights would enable the club to offer after-school coaching for junior members

They said their contractors had assured them the lights would be directed down onto the courts and would cause minimal light spillage.


