The work will be carried out in phases to minimise disruption and alternative routes will be signposted.

The school crossing patrol is to be restored after a lengthy campaign by local borough councillors Chris Vobe and Les Hoyle.

The post has been vacant for about six months since the previous employee left the post.

Parents, governors and pupils joined in the campaign to impress the urgency of the situation on the borough council.

Cllr Vobe said: "The delays in this instance have been very disappointing but, after speaking with the council's chief executive, I have been pleased to reassure governors at the school that measures are now in place to make sure that the recruitment process is much speedier in the future. "The end result is great news for Croft Primary School. Mustard Lane is a busy road, with a high volume of traffic at school opening times. Children's safety must always come first."

first." Cllr Hoyle (pictured right), who organised a 200-name petition calling for a new crossing patrol, said: "I am very pleased the borough council has been able to attract someone to fill this position.

"They should be in post before the end of the summer term."

Clir Hoyle added that he would be continuing to campaign for a permanent "Zebra" crossing on Mustard Lane.

"It is an extremely busy road and it can be difficult for people to cross at time."

# **Rate reduction** campaign stepped up

# TWO councillors have renewed their calls for Warrington Borough Council to provide a rates reduction for traders throughout Culcheth and Glazebury.

Cllrs Matt Smith and Chris Vobe are asking the authority to reduce the amount of business rates for "goodwill gesture" following the lengthy closure of Wilton Lane last year.

Their renewed calls following electricity extensive works throughout the area, which they say cut off access to business on Common Lane for long periods. Cllr Smith said: "In Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft, we value our local businesses and the services

they provide to the community. It is vital that we help our small to medium firms thrive, so that they can continue to offer jobs for Warrington people and, in turn, boost the growth of our economy. Traders have still yet to receive any recompense from the council for the loss of custom they suffered from the poorly-managed closure of Wilton Lane.

"It is only right that the council acknowledges the impact of these works and offer assistance to Culcheth and Glazebury businesses. As local councillors, we will continue to support all our

businesses and work to ensure they get a fair deal." Cllr Vobe added: "The council should not be seeking to brush this issue under the proverbial carpet. The recent electricity works have only added to the problems with loss of trade. During the extensive works on Common Lane, the council failed to erect signs to tell motorists that the businesses were still open. That was nothing short of a blunder which should have been avoided

"During the works, one restaurant faced an evening where, 45 minutes after opening time, they hadn't had a single customer through the door.

"The council must play their part in helping to give traders a much-needed boost. We are not seeking a permanent rates reduction – but it is right to give shop owners a 'helping hand'. That is why I extend an invitation for the council's Executive Director to come to the village and meet with the traders. Instead of polishing their CVs with elaborate forward plans, council officers need to ground themselves in reality and show business owners

that the authority is on their side." Both councillors have pledged not to let the matter rest and are writing to local traders to update them on the progress of their campaign.

They launched the scheme earlier in 2013 alongside Warrington North MP Helen Jones and the owner of Culcheth's "forget-me-not toys and books" Naomi Simpson.


#### Summer Play Scheme

# **Council slamme**

TWO councillors have slammed borough council officers in the wake of a stream of complaints about the maintenance of grass verges and open spaces in Culcheth.

Borough and parish councillor Chris Vobe says the lack of adequate grass cutting is now in debacle territory

Parish councillor Matt Smith has called on the borough to do more for residents in Newchurch, which he says has been the worst affected area

Over the past month, a number of verges in Culcheth and Croft villages have been left to grow and in some instances – have reached knee height.

councillors two have The received a significant numbers of complaints from residents.

Cllr Vobe accepted the borough had been forced to find new and innovative ways of delivering services as a result of "cruel and pernicious" cuts imposed by the government.

But he said: "Residents rightly

expect basic services to be maintained and we believe it is only right that grass cutting is kept up to standard so that the village continues to offer a well-kept environment, which is welcoming to all. Having the verges left in this untidy state recently is uncorrectable untidy state recently is unacceptable – and, in some areas, has reached debacle territory!"

Cllr Smith added: "We are simply not content to allow Newchurch, or the wider communities of Culcheth and Croft, to be forgotten.

"That is why we have been pro-actively working with council officers to make sure that, from this point forward, the grass verges are well-maintained and that the errors we have seen recently are put right as soon as possible. "We have secured a forward

plan for maintenance in Newchurch which we believe will be as strong


- Keep mowing your lawn regularly, except in extremely dry weather.

## THE memories came flooding back as I took a trip down memory lane to visit the General Elliot in Croft, which was my regular watering hole from the age of 18, meeting up with my old school mates from Culcheth High School.

It has been many years since I visited - and I have got to say I was really impressed by the ambience of the venue as a restaurant and bai

The General Elliot was built in the 1700's and has always stood as a public house or hotel.

Although modernised it has retained its original character and has a light and airy interior making it the perfect venue to dine whilst overlooking the garden. Home cooked food, fine ales

and wines are the key ingredients. Run by Kirk and Anne Marie Garbutt, Kirk is also Head Chef and

takes great pride in his cooking. For starters I enjoyed the Yates and Greer Bury Black Pudding, topped with melted goats cheese and cranberry jam - simple but very tasty and well presented.

For main course I chose the rump steak, which was probably the most tender rump I have tasted in a long time, containing not an ounce of fat.

Again it was cooked to perfection and well presented.

The ample portion meant there was sadly no room for dessert! I would certainly recommend the General Elliot as the perfect venue to dine out for a special occasion or simply a place to enjoy a great night out in a lovely pub restaurant in a countryside location.

# <u>History inspires art student</u>

A STUDENT from Culcheth delved into the past to help promote an art project that tells the story of a major Second World War battle.

Andrew Harrison, an Art Foundation student at Priestley College, was asked to design a promotional poster for 'Stranded' which revisits the stories of Merchant and Royal Navy seamen as well as the WRENS who served in Battle of the Atlantic operations during the Second World War.

The 19-year-old, of Doeford Close, Culcheth, studied posters from the period to help inspire his design which features a lone ship lit by the moon. It is surrounded by a white border, which was a common feature in Second World War posters.


"I wanted it to be the best it possibly could be," said Andrew. "It was for such a worthy event that I wanted it to work for them and it was my first real client so it was also important to me in that way.

'I visited the Maritime War Museum to look at the kind of styles they used on posters from this period and used similar blocky, hard-hitting praise from the organisers Blind Spot Collective and approval from the Liverpool Art Council which had to agree his design before it was posted

agree his design before in the period around the city. Andrew, a former student at St Ambrose School, has wanted to become a graphic designer since he was 12 and will be heading to Attrachector Metropolitan University Manchester Metropolitan University in September to study it in further detail.

His main goal with the poster to promote Stranded – part of international photography festival Look13 held in Liverpool – was to have immediate impact.

# A warning to holiday home owners - don't get caught out by recent tax changes

For many it's a lifelong dream to own a second home in the sun but it's a luxury that some can only afford by renting it out to other holiday makers.

The special tax rules for Furnished Holiday Lets (FHLs) have been around for a while but the tax breaks have been severely restricted since April 2012 when conditions were tightened and some of the income tax advantages were removed. Things got worse recently when a Tribunal regarding inheritance tax relief ruled in favour of HMRC.

For your holiday home to qualify as a FHL the key conditions include being available for commercial letting to the public for at least 210 days a year and actually being let out for a minimum of 105 days a year.

If this is the case then your letting income is treated as a trade but from April 2012 you can no longer set off losses against any other income you receive in the year. This drastically reduces the usefulness of FHL status. On the positive side, if you sell the property you could still be entitled to a reduced rate of capital gains tax

property you could still be entitled to a reduced rate of capital gains tax of 10% (compared to the full rate of 28%) but there are further conditions to be met which mean that the sale of a single holiday property may not gualify.

ualify. The final blow came recently when a taxpayer lost their case in claiming100% business property relief on a FHL and IHT became payable on its full value. Previously even HMRC guidance had stated that relief should be available.

This all adds up to holiday home owners being potentially worse off than they were just over a year ago! If you own a holiday home and would like further advice on your tax position the please contact Sarah Salton on 01925 761600.





# Bees keep Steve busy as wasp season wings in!

LOCAL pest controller Steve Caslin has been kept busy in the spring and early summer, collecting honey bee swarms and bumble bee nests - relocating them unharmed back into nature.

Into nature. Steve said: "I relocate the bumble nests - unharmed, to places who are kind enough to accept them. Allotments always welcome them as they are "super pollinators" of tomato plants. Many thanks as usual to Brian Webber who has allowed me to place many colonies in Moore Nature Reserve and Warrington Borough Council for giving excellent advice to residents with bee problems. Bees are protected and must never be treated with insecticides except in extreme cases.

Steve added: "Wasp season is upon us once again and the colonies of this rather unpopular insect are growing daily. Wasps nests can be treated with insecticide and once destroyed, the nest can be left in place as it's never used again. Have you ever noticed grooves in wooden garden furniture and fencing? Wasps remove very fine layers of wood and mix it with
