Police statistics for the last month seem to bear this out: 15 incidences of anti-social behaviour; 24 incidences of suspicious activity; two burglaries; 11 incidences of theft.

But a closer examination of the figures is revealing. One case of anti-social behaviour relates to two children, aged eight and nine, riding their grandma's mobility scooter! Another to someone being bitten by

Suspicious activity included an unconfirmed report that a para-glider may have crashed and people reporting police officers making doorto-door enquiries.

The 11 cases of theft include eight motorists driving off without paying for petrol from the garage on the East Lancs Road. Yes - serious offences but unlikely to have any connection with Culcheth.

We welcome monthly crime figures from the police. Culcheth probably gets more than its fair share of criminal activity and we want to know about it. But we do question some of the activities classed as "suspicious" or "anti-social."

The vision of youngsters careering through the village on grandma's mobility scooter is surely not that alarming?

THE Black Swan, at Hollins Green has been a local landmark for more than 300 years. But it has changed recently after a major refurbishment which has introduced modern amenities while retaining the atmosphere of a traditional village pub.

Mine hosts Mike and Liz Morrison have run the pub for the last 10 years but little money had been spent on the building for 15 years and it was only last May, when Punch Taverns finally agreed to sell and the pub became a free house, that the improvements could be made. There has been a pub on the site since around 1667 and the present building dates from the mid-1800s

Originally called The Old Swan, legend has it the name changed as a result of black swans, native to Australia, arriving on the Mersey and the Glaze. The first landlord was one Robert Clare, licensed to sell ale and food and stable horses for two stillings a year. Nothing is known of him but it is doubtful if he

horses for two shillings a year. Nothing is known of him, but it is doubtful if he could have envisaged the sort of improvements now introduced.

Local designers Innex, from Lowton, had the task of refurbishing the pub while retaining what local people loved - its character and atmosphere.

Liz said: "We wanted a great pub that sold great pub food and that's what

we got."

The Black Swan re-opened quietly, a day ahead of schedule. By 10pm it was

Mike said: "More than anything, we wanted a good community pub. Now we have something going on most nights and there is a whole new menu of quality pub food. It's a great place for fine food and drink."

Taxing times, watch this space

With the economy in slow recovery but difficult times ahead for many, and with a new government in place in the form of a coalition seemingly intent on cutting the country's deficit starting with immediate effect, the world we live in continues to present uncertainty

on many levels.

Although much will become apparent following George Osborne's first budget on 22 June, we already know about several government proposals and the following observations are worth

The new government has dropped its The new government has dropped its predecessor's intention of increasing the rate of employers' national insurance. As this was effectively a tax on businesses with the cost of employing staff rising by approximately 1%, this is seen as a move intended to protect businesses from additional taxes.

trom additional taxes.

• Employees' national insurance contributions (which come out of employees' pay packets) will still rise in April 2011 by 1% and all employees paying this tax will have less in their pockets from that time.

• Perhaps the highest profile proposed tax rise is the increase in capital against ax on non-business assets for

gains tax on non-business assets (for example investments in listed shares and second properties, main residences being outside the scope of the tax) from 18% to 40%. More details will be known after the budget but it should be understood that this is a tax on gains, not on the entire sales proceeds. Also, individuals currently get an allowance of approximately £10,000 per tax year so can make this level of gain without paying any capital gains tax, but it is suggested that this tax free allowance may reduce substantially. Such a reduction would bring many more people in to the Capital Gain net. Although many people will pay additional tax, there is scope here to shelter agains through careful gains shelter through

planning. Business assets are expected to remain chargeable to capital gains tax at 18% (with a 10% rate applying to the first Ω 2 million of lifetime gain per individual). It is anticipated that this will keep the UK a competitive location for entrepreneurs and their businesses to operate.

The above changes government's proposals and have not yet been passed in to statute. However, all businesses and individuals are recommended to consider their positions and seek professional advice where necessary.
