CULCHETH High School's new head teacher David Terry is "delighted" with the schools "Good" OFSTED inspection.

The school hosted a visit from a team of five OFSTED Inspectors earlier this month and the inspection, which was carried out over two days, involved a rigorous scrutiny of the

school's quality of provision.

Mr Terry said: "I am delighted to report that Culcheth High School has been judged to be a good school in

all areas

It has been rated as good in Overall Effectiveness, Achievement, Quality of Teaching, Behaviour and Safety of Students and Leadership

and Management.

He said it was worth noting that
OFSTED have significantly raised

official and the standards of the standards of the standards of the previous years' inspections.

"I have no doubt that the commitment, dedication and sheer hard work of staff, students, parents, governors and wider community partners have culminated in a very positive report, an endorsement of the school over time that I think we can all be very proud of. "The OFSTED team have given very clear areas for Culcheth High

School to improve upon to achieve an outstanding judgement in time.

"It is my very strong belief that the Culcheth community deserve to have an outstanding school at the heart of our locality. At Culcheth High School we do not intend to rest on our laurely but rather to appears and our laurels but rather to engage and work towards a vision of outstanding school status.

Highlights of the report stated that 'Culcheth High is a good school – it provides a good education for students.

knowledge, skills and understanding well in most subjects, including English and mathematics.'

Students consistently achieve results that are well above those of results that are well above those of students nationally. Parking restrictions lifted for six month trial
