Second time lucky for Scout Centre

COMMUNITY groups in Glazebury are celebrating after fundraising and a recycling grant helped them save their local scout hut for the second time.

Glazebury Scout Centre now has a new, pitched roof thanks to a £13,000 grant and £1,800 raised by three charity dinner dances held in

the village.
This is the second time the Centre has been saved. Residents were thrilled when the Centre was built in 2004 with £50,000 funding from Waste Recycling Environment (WREN)Ltd, a not for profit business that halps paged who live does to that helps people who live close to landfill sites by awarding grants for

community projects.

Since then it has been used by including the community groups including the church, Beavers and Cubs as well as

dance classes and private parties. But in March 2009, the flat roof of the new building started to fail and leak and eventually caved in. Repairs were paid for by insurers but it was clear that a new pitched roof was needed.

Susan Leather, a local resident whose children use the centre, said:

Although we managed to repair the flat roof, we knew we had a problem that wouldn't go away.

"It was going to happen again unless we managed to find the funds to build a pitched roof. We went back to WREN and asked for their

help.
"They felt that the extra funds we needed were worthwhile because they would ensure a longer life for the Centre which they had originally paid for. They gave us a further £13,000 grant for the roof - we were thrilled.

"There was also a big fundraising effort from the village. We managed to raise an additional £1,800 for the roof and fundraising is ongoing. The Scout Centre is such an important part of the village and we want to do a few other improvements too.

Now the roof is finished and the Centre and plans to establish a new Scout group are well underway.

The filling station at the junction of Warrington Road with the East Lancs Road was a particular target for petrol thieves.

"It is right on the fringe of our area, but it impacts on our figures" he said. Very often the offenders had false number plates on their vehicles.

Although crime generally has risen, Insp Spedding said he expected a reduction locally following the arrest of a gang from Merseyside who had been targeting Culcheth and Croft.

Police were praised for their work dealing with a burglary at Glazebury Methodist Church when a quantity of bacon, Fairtrade coffee and other property was stolen.

The offender has been arrested, the meeting was told.

with the police

councillor lleyne Hutchinson was invited to go on patrol with the police on what was expected to be a busy Friday night.

This is her report:
"We had a very quiet night, but still very informative and a great eye-

opéner.
"I reported to Birchwood Police Station at 7pm. Then, after being

given a heavy police jacket we set off. I was assigned to two officers.
"We drove around for a while, Shaw Street, Lodge Drive, Culcheth Hall Drive, down to Mee Brow and back to Common Lane. Because of the cold weather the anticipated." the cold weather, the anticipated crowds did not appear, much to the

relief of the police.

"Also on duty that night were four PCSOs, and also an inspector and another constable, who were another constable, who were checking a couple of public houses. People say they never see much police presence in Culcheth, but if

they are needed, they are there.
"Mostly, the people out were youths. We moved some of them off the children's playground on the green, and sent them to the green, and sent them to the skateboard park. One boy was a bit cheeky and he was told that if he carried on, he would be taken home.



Point taken, and no more cheek.
"The reason the youths were so
polite was that the police approached them in a manner. There was respect on both

sides.
"Groups of youths were all around the village by 8.30pm, but all were just either on their way somewhere, or meeting friends. By 9pm, the streets were almost empty and I was told the 15 and 16-year olds were usually home by 9.30pm.
"So, a very quiet night for the police. Even so, most were on duty until 5cm."

until 5am

"We did one last round of the area at 10.15pm and saw a man of about 35 carrying a potted plant, obviously from outside a shop or restaurant. He was when told to put it back! Not all the problems are from teenagers.

"I was very impressed by the way the police spoke to people and also by the way the young people responded. With a local police force like this, we can all rest assured that we are safe in Culcheth."

'Horrendous' parking at school

Tax, tips and news

It is worthwhile periodically reviewing your personal tax affairs to determine whether you are paying the right amount of tax, or whether there are areas in which savings can be made. In this issue we highlight a few issues which may be of relevance to you.

Errors to new PAYE codes

Errors to new PAYE codes

Tax offices have started to issue 2010/11 PAYE codes for the tax year which starts on 6 April 2010. All employees or recipients of pensions will have such a code, and it is this which determines the amount of tax you pay throughout the year. The Inland Revenue has introduced a new computer system and there have been a number of errors to codes being issued. You should ensure that your tax code includes all the tax allowances and other adjustments relevant to you. If you believe there are errors, your employer or tax office should be able to help.

Capital gains tax dilemma

Vith the tax rate reaching an effective highest rate of 51% (income tax plus national insurance) from 5 April 2010, the discrepancy between the rate paid on earnings and the 18% payable on capital gains is enormous. Although the Chancellor has been silent over potential rises to capital gains tax, he has made it known that he sees the discrepancy in rates as a concern. Though it is a complex area, those taxpayers with high levels of earnings and capital assets may levels of earnings and capital assets may make significant tax savings if their affairs can be structured appropriately.

53 Mondays in 2009/10

There are 53 Mondays in the tax year ending 5 April 2010! Although Monday is the payment date for most state pensions, the tax office always treat the state pension accruing to each year as a 52 week period. Tax returns should be submitted on the assumption that all years accrue exactly 52 weeks. This is one of very few examples where taxpayers are not taxed on all their income!

Beware tax scams

There are a growing number of tax scams involving emails to taxpayers which purport to have Inland Revenue backing. However, the Revenue has not adopted email as a way of communication with the public so treat any email offering a tax refund as suspicious and report it to the Revenue. Certainly do not provide any bank, credit card or other payment details or make card or other payment details or make calls to help lines (which may cost \pounds 6 per minute!) before the legitimacy of the businesses sending these emails is

verified.




