Editor's Comment



WE have said it before and we will say it again: If ever there was a story to bring the planning system into disrepute, surely it is the continuing saga of the Risley Landfill Site.

Tipping by site operators Biffa apparently ended in April – in accordance with the most recent planning conditions.

But before we rush to congratulate

the company, we should consider two things. Firstly, the original planning consent in 1992 stipulated the work

should be completed in 2008. Secondly, the company now says it is unable to complete restoration work by the due date of October 19.

No wonder angry residents turned up at the monthly meeting of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council to express disquiet. How much longer, they want to know, will they have suffer noise, pests, traffic and other problems?

Over the years, through repeated applications for extensions, Biffa has managed to extend the life of the site.

When the borough council refused planning consent in 2008 for a further three years tipping, the company appealed and forced the council to spend some £75,000 fighting a public inquiry. The council won - but the company still got its own way by persuading planners it needed more

There have always been excuses. The work has proved more difficult than expected. The recession has led to a shortage of materials for tipping. And, of course, getting tough with the tip operators is not easy, because who else is going to finish the job? An unfinished landfill site, would be a blot on the landscape for years.

The fact remains that work is still continuing on a tip that should have been completed four years ago and the only people paying are the public. Either through living near to it, or through the public money wasted on an inquiry that made little difference.

Travellers play a cat-and-mouse game

A CAT-and-mouse game involving police, borough council officers and members of the travelling community left many Culcheth and Glazebury residents fuming - especially after a local man was injured when he was struck by a van towing a caravan.

The travellers were in the area over a period of several days, continually moving from site to site.

Eventually they departed for a destination believed to be in Lancashire - leaving angry and frustrated villagers behind them.

The travellers occupied a number of sites in the Birchwood area before moving into Culcheth and occupying the car park at the Shaw Street playing fields.

When police and council officers moved them on they re-located to the car park of the M&S discount store at Glazebury.

They then appear to have split up, with reports of them at Heyshoots Lane, Glazebury, on land near The Noggin Inn at Risley.

There was a confrontation with residents in Heyshoots Lane which resulted in a 54-year-old local man being taken to hospital with leg

A rumour circulated suggesting travellers were gathering in the area because they were negotiating to buy land at Croft.

Another suggested that one of the travellers' children was seriously ill and was being treated at

Warrington.
Police said they went to Heyshoots
Lane following a call from the
ambulance service concerning a man
having been struck by a van towing a
caravan.

The man was taken to Warrington Hospital where he underwent treatment for a leg injury and was later discharged

later discharged.

The van driver, believed to be a member of the travelling community who had voluntarily moved earlier the same day from the M&S site had left the scene prior to arrival of police patrols.

A white Ford Transit van and caravan involved in the incident were

seized by police for examination and investigation into the circumstances of the incident.

Chief Inspector Jon Ward said: "We have resources committed to investigating this incident and are keen to trace the driver of the van. I would urge the driver to come forward and make contact with ourselves so this matter can be progressed and the full circumstances of the incident can be established. I would also like to take this opportunity to remind local residents that the safety and well-being of our

communities, including the traveller communities in our area, remain our priority and would urge anyone with any information regarding this incident, particularly any witnesses who saw the incident take place, to contact Cheshire Police on 101."



This is GM's bold claim for a car which they say is not a hybrid and offers drivers all the benefits of electric driving without any of the range anxiety normally associated with electric vehicles.

Electricity powers the wheels of the Ampera at all times, with a 16kWh lithiumion battery pack feeding an advanced 150PS electric drive unit, delivering
between 25-50 miles of battery-powered electric drive and zero tailpipe
emissions. What sets the car apart from other electric vehicles is its range

extender, which boosts the car's range by up to 310 miles.

A small 1.4-litre petrol-fuelled engine/generator runs at optimum efficiency, generating enough electricity to power the electric motor (but not the wheels) generating enough electricity to power the electric motor (but not the wheels) and operates seamlessly as part of the Ampera's powertrain.
