# Rare breed is no dog's life for Christina!

ONE of the world's rarest dog breeds has arrived in Culcheth - just one of only two currently in England!

But that could change thanks to a new association being launched by local resident Christina Savage, proud owner of "Jelske", who has helped set up the UK "Stabyhoun" Association, of which she is now President.

The Stabyhoun is a Dutch breed of Pointer dog of which there are only an estimated 3,500 currently in existence in the world.

The UK Stabyhoun Association board also consists of Janice Vittachi, Vice President and owner of the UK's other Stabyhoun, 5-year old Rikje and Helen Withey, Secretary and owner of the Norfolk

Dog Training Centre.
Generally considered amongst the world's 10 rarest dog breeds, the Stabyhoun finds its origin in the Netherlands. About the size of a small labrador, it was originally a small Labrador, it was originally bred as an all-round family and farm dog - required to work alongside the farmer during the day and to live in harmony with children and other pets inside the family home.

The name Stabyhoun is most likely from the Dutch "sta me bij" which means the 'Stand by me dog' – an accurate reflection of its loyal nature.

Christina started working on the project early in 2012. She said: "I grew up in Denmark with a wonderful female Stabyhoun named Blijke.

"She was an amazing family dog; completely loving, loyal and

extremely child-friendly. With such fond memories of a very special dog, I decided to help other dog, I decided to help other families in England who might be interested in getting their very own Stabyhoun.

"Boasting a very gentle temperament, this is a dog that gets on extremely well with cats and other dogs. It is intelligent and active but easy going inside the house - never aggressive and very safe around children. It has a beautiful, soft self-cleaning coat that requires no maintenance and which amazingly doesn't have that 'doggy' smell."

The role of the UK Stabyhoun

Association is to manage the introduction of the Stabyhoun to the UK as well as implement a controlled and closely monitored breeding programme to protect the health and temperament of the

Christina added: "Most of this year's Stabyhoun puppies will be arriving from Holland but the UK's first ever litter is also planned for this summer.

Families who might be interested in letting their Stabyhoun have a litter of puppies will play an important role in establishing this breed of dog in the UK. I want to hear from anyone who might be interested in owning one of these rather special dogs."

# Parenting workshop to fund mercy mission

A MOTHER is to run an innovative three week "communicating with teens" parenting workshop in Culcheth - to raise funds for her daughter to go on a mercy mission to India.

Former Culcheth High School pupil Samantha Harrison, 19, (pictured) last year worked in Africa helping

to build accommodation for needy children through the organisation Lasallian Developing World Projects. Now she wants to take a break from studying psychology at Bath University to carry out similar work

She needs to raise £1,100

towards the cost of travel and building materials for the project. Proud Mum Tricia Harrison, a lecturer at Liverpool John Moores lecturer at Liverpool John Moores University has decided to help raise the money with a "communicating with teens" parenting workshop at Culcheth Methodist Church on June 11, 18 and 25 from 8-9.30pm

The purpose is to facilitate understanding of how to communicate with teenagers and the workshop is

with teenagers and the workshop is aimed at parents of teenagers to help with communication generally.

The issues that may surface include general communication, friendships, working towards GCSE's or the switch from GCSE's to A levels etc. The purpose is to explore different ways to communicate with teenagers and learn about the way we personally communicate.

Tricia said: "As a university lecturer, I tend to agree with the research that suggests anxiety is high



among teenagers, affecting their mental health and predisposing them to diseases, such as depression and

schizophrenia.
"Although I have designed the workshop I am not a specialist in child psychology, however, I have been teaching communication skills etc, for over 25 years."

There is a charge of £30, with all proceeds going to help fundraise for Samantha's trip to India with Lasallian World Projects.

The work Samantha undertook

The work Samantha undertook in Africa last year meant that the children benefitted immediately from the building.

It was challenging as the accommodation was extremely basic and there were emotional times as same age as her at the time, who were raising five siblings on the equivalent of £3 per week.





# Call for pot hole review

LOCAL councillor Chris Vobe has called on the Borough Council to undertake a complete review of the condition of roads and pavements in Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft.

Pavements in Culcheth, Glazel
He has written to the council's
Chief Executive Steven Broomhead
and Assistant Director Andy Farrall
to convey the concerns of "dozens"
of local residents over the poor
condition of the highways throughout
the villages.
In his letter, Cllr Vobe states that the
number of pot holes in the villages are
on the increase, and residents who
have contacted him are increasingly
worried that not everything is being
done to address the problems in the
best possible way.
Cllr Vobe's letter to Professor
Broomhead says: "It is very clear, from
even a cursory examination of my

ward, that the need for improvements to many of our roads is paramount. In Culcheth village, the Newchurch and Hob Hey areas in particular have suffered from considerable deterioration over a period of time, and little seems to have been done to rectify the situation. Common Lane is especially badly affected.

"In Croft, there are areas of the village which have been flagged up with the authority on a number of occasions yet, despite assurances to the contrary, are still awaiting repairs. Lady Lane is an example of this."

of Culcheth village where work has been carried out, but repairs have had to be re-visited after just a few weeks when the newly-laid tarmac has broken up and caused further damage. He says this does not represent good value for taxpayers' money and needs to be reviewed.

Clir Vobe concluded his letter by

Cllr Vobe concluded his letter by asking Professor Broomhead to carry out a complete review of the roads in all three villages, to assess the condition of every one, with a view to repairing as many pot holes as possible. He says that the scheme should be carried out "with a view to residents being able to clearly see some tangible results at the conclusion of the process."


LOCAL councillors have welcomed the Parish Plan for Culcheth, Mee Brow and Glazebury which has now been produced and distributed.



#### Planners approve another restaurant

PLANNING chiefs have given the go-ahead for another new restaurant in the centre of Culcheth - despite opposition from Culcheth and Glazebury

The borough council's planning committee has approved a change of use from retail to restaurant for a single-storey unit currently under construction

in Common Lane.

Members of the parish council had argued that residents consulted in connection with the Parish Plan and indicated there were already "more than enough" restaurants in the village.

One restaurant had recently ceased trading, confirming that the local

market was saturated.

They also argued the development would seriously affect the viability of

the village centre because ot its impact on available parking.

A total of 41 parking spaces would be inadequate for a 136-seat

restaurant.

But officers recommended the scheme be approved. They said the development would create jobs and have a positive impact on the evening vitality of the village, and the existing car park would be able to

accommodate any increased parking.

They pointed out that even including pubs and takeaways, the number of units with food and drink uses in the village was less than 20 per cent.

# High Speed Rail shock for business park boss

IT came as a huge surprise and shock for business park boss Paul Taylor when the northern stage of HS2 (Phase 2) was announced.

Although he believes the project will bring future prosperity to the whole of the north west, seeing the line on the plan as it passed through Taylor Business Park from corner to corner was quite an eye opener!

Now Paul has joined forces with local campaigners in the hope that some small tweaks can be made to the plan - to save the business park - and most importantly the livelihoods of the 500 people who work there!

Paul said: "We're a third generation family managed business with the fourth on the way. We like what we do and we're actually quite good at it. This isn't your average business park.
"We have around fifty properties

and have consistently run at around 98% occupancy for the last ten years, and those haven't been easy years for anyone.

"There around are companies on here and around five hundred employees, a lot of them live locally too. If we were to vanish from the map that's five hundred families instantly affected, local businesses in the village would lose those companies and those families as daily customers, the economic repercussions for the village itself would be huge. We intend to make sure they've put as much thought into this part of the route (which will be the main route up to Scotland, not a spur to Wigan as most seem to think) as they have to the rest of the route down south."

Paul believes a lot of the changes made to the Northern part of the route were done at the last minute and he cannot see how the cheapest way through the area is through the business park and the village. He says it makes no sense. "The council have been extremely

sympathetic and supportive, and they are aware that without us there would be £750,000 less in rates per year being collected in the borough, as well as he increased costs of providing for those who are out of work, or losing companies that are based on here to other local authorities as there isn't anywhere else in Warrington that offers the same level of security and service that we do here," added

Paul.
"We run the site like a family business should be run. We employ our own maintenance staff, gardeners and security guards. We don't use agencies at all for that sort of thing which is why our tenants like it here. We're always on site to help our tenants with anything they need. Most other (probably London based) landlords would point their tenants in the direction of Yell.Com and tell them to look for a plumber or whatever else it was

they needed.

"The good thing is that it will be a long time before the railway is built so the immediate impact is minor, but the long term impact is worrying and we only have 12-16 months to make a difference to the route, if we can. We are putting our own solution forward by means of tweaking the existing route so that it misses the site, and also gives the village a wider berth. We will be approaching HS2 directly with our proposal and reasoning behind it

and we will also be supporting the local HS2 action group (CADRAG) in their efforts.

in their efforts.
"I must say it's been a breath of fresh air, especially after some of the campaigning that went on in the last election, to see the local councillors, past and present, all working together in the interests of Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft; Keith and Sue Bland, Paul Campbell, Matt Smith, Chris Vobe and Jacqui Johnson have all been instrumental in bringing the villages. instrumental in bringing the villages together and finding people who have the time and ability to help with the problems we're facing at

the moment.
"Our MP, Helen Jones, and Terry
O'Neill the leader of the council have also been very supportive throughout the process and their support will be crucial to our

success in this.

"Time is of the essence now though. It may be a while before we'll see a train leave a platform in Manchester and set off to London at 200+ mph, but there's only a short time where we can attempt to make a difference to the existing route.

Paul concluded: "If you want to help then get in touch with CADRAG and see what you can do. The more the merrier!"



## Campaigners say HS2 will bring no benefits to village

CAMPAIGNERS fighting plans for the controversial High Speed rail link (HS2) which is proposed to plough through Culcheth, have drawn up their battle plans.

They have published a leaflet, which is being distributed through the village providing information about the current and "woeful" compensation scheme and how residents can respond to it.

residents can respond to it.

This information has been produced and issued by the local HS2 Action Group, known as CADRAG (Culcheth And District Rail Action Group) which was established following an initial meeting held earlier in the year organised by local councillors and Friends of Culcheth linear Park who will continue to Linear Park, who will continue to work with the aim of ensuring that the concerns of the local community are heard.

The proposed route will run straight through the Linear Park with devastating effects. This pleasant and cherished amenity, within walking distance of the village centre

will be irrevocably ruined.

CADRAG Chair Jo Nordovics said:
"It is hard to believe that Big Society and Localism are being flaunted on the political agenda, when we have to fight so hard to retain the charm

and tranquillity that makes Culcheth so attractive. You may have seen in the national press, numerous communities around the country who are affected by HS2 being accused of NIMBY. It may sound cynical, but this seems far more a case of NITBY (not in their back yard), judging by some of the questionable activities that have been reported."

Numerous Culcheth properties will be within metres of the tracks and will be particularly vulnerable to noise and visual blight.

Campaigners fear most of the village will be negatively impacted if the scheme goes ahead, suffering a decrease in property values and significant disruption during surveying and construction periods, as both road routes to Warrington are crossed by the HS2 route.

Local businesses are also concerned about the potential lack of visitors to the village and also whether they would be eligible for compensation should the value of business drop as a result of . Most are excluded in the

current compensation arrangements.
With Culcheth not getting a station, campaigners say there are no benefits to Culcheth, or indeed Warrington itself, with the currently

proposed route.
"By raising awareness and challenging the HS2 proposals, we are determined to improve this situation and get a better deal for the people of Culcheth. We believe we deserve it," added Jo.

Local councillor Jacqui Johnson added: "For well over twenty years I have been an active member of action groups in our Parish and at regional and national level, taking part in inquiries and policy campaigns. These links and experiences will help now we are fighting to protect our district from HS2. The creation

of "our spur" has had an impact

on the route literally "further down the line" and we need to link with those campaigning against it. I think that it is not only because of the impact on our residents, countryside and businesses that this has to be opposed but because of the wider effect on Warrington."

Dave, who runs his own personal training business, has been undergoing rigorous physical and scientific tests at the world renowned Gatoraid Sports Science Institute based at Loughborough University to ensure his body is up to the physical challenges ahead.

The results have certainly been impressive, revealing he has the fitness levels of a 25-year-old Premiership footballer and less than 10 per cent body fat!

completed his marathon in Paris at the age of 20 purely for recreational purposesbut has certainly gone on to make up for his lack of sporting prowess at school - having now completed well over 100 triathlons all over the world including, Germany, Canada, Mexico and Holland.

In 2011 he ran from London to Rome covering a distance of 1,357 miles in just 30 days, helping raise funds for Parkinson's Disease after his friend Alex Flynn was diagnosed with the condition aged just 28 with the cime of beloing just 38, with the aim of helping raise £1 million for which fund-

raising is still ongoing.

He followed this up by running the Paris Marathon raising over £4,000 for bowel cancer after one of his clients was diagnosed with the condition.

To break the world record in July he will have to complete the Nottingham Triathlon in Under 9 hours - while if he wins the Triple Decker Challenge in Italy it will certainly be a new world record as it has never been done before!

Dave has some international pedigree as an athlete, winning a silver medal in the European

Championships in Germany in 1995 as a member of the GB elite team. In 2002 he came third in the European Double Iron Man Championships and more recently came runner up in the Deca (10x) Iron Man challenge in Mexico.

He will be one of just 30 selected to take part in the Triple Decker event after the scientific testing proved he was up to the task of completing a sub nine hour challenge

He will be continuing with fundraising for bowel cancer and is currently undergoing more than 20 hours of intensive training a week. "The fact that I had no sporting talent as a school boy just goes to show your best days are certainly not behind you in your 30s, 40s and even 50s," said Dave.

"It is all about pushing yourself

outside your comfort zones. If something scares you a bit it is a good reason to do it. We all only tap into a small percentage of what we are capable of."

Dave wouldn't be able complete bis challenges without the support of his sponsors like Styles & Co Accountants, who have donated his £2k bike and Adele Carr Recruitment who have donated his work wear and Orca sportswear.
