Editor's Comment

LANDFILL giants Biffa have, apparently, undertaken to be 'good neighbours' over the next two years, as work continues to complete and landscape the Risley tip.

This is all very well, and we applaud the company for its offer to make donations to local good causes.

But the recent public inquiry, which the company LOST, was not only into plans to expand the tip site over valuable farm land, but also into their wish to carry on tipping for two years. So, under the terms of the original planning consent, tipping should already have ceased and the only work continuing should be landscaping and restoration.

In fact, we apparently face another 12 months of tipping before the restoration, which will take another 12 months, even starts.

So how much of a victory was the public inquiry, which cost the borough council in the region of £75,000?

Clearly, acres of farm land has

Clearly, acres of farm land has been saved, and the benefit of this cannot be overestimated.

But much of opposition to the tip related to the nuisance suffered by nearby residents from the operation of the existing site, which is to continue for another 12 months.

Obviously the site cannot be left unfinished. But should not the company have ensured it was in a condition to be completed immediately in the event of them losing their appeal?

It would seem they gambled on winning, lost, but in the event WON an extra 12 months by default.

'New home for old' plan refused

PLANNING chiefs have turned down an application for permission to demolish a house in the Green Belt at Croft to make way for a new, larger dwelling.

The property, in Stone Pit Lane, was formerly a semi-detached dwelling, but has been separated from the re-developed adjacent property.

The application was to demolish the former semi and rebuild it as a larger detached dwelling.

Officers said the proposed new building would have a footprint 65 per cent greater than the original building. But they opposed the scheme because of a glazed front projecting element which, they said, would be out of character

with the rest of the property and the adjoining area.

There were no objections from Croft Parish Council, nor from nearby residents

Students' research published worldwide

TWO local women who are clinical health care practitioners of complementary therapies have had an article published in an international journal.

Julia Heath, from Croft and Wendy Lewis, from Leigh have both recently attained a degree in health sciences from Salford University and Julia has also obtained her teaching certificate in adult and higher education.

Integrated

During their time on the degree, Julia and Wendy initiated an integrated healthcare practice between Wigan and Leigh College and the Renal Haemodialysis Unit, Boston House, Wigan. A pilot study was

undertaken and the findings of this research has been published by the International Journal of Clinical Aromatherapy.

They were also presented at the BRS/RA Medical Conference in Glasgow.

The seven-page article highlights the initiative of the two experienced complementary therapy practitioners who set up a team of therapist volunteers to work with end-stage kidney disease patients. The work

was carried out after an invitation from Dr Janet Heggarty, renal consultant at the centre.

Complementary therapy tutor Beverly Higham said: "I am very proud of the work Julia and Wendy produced during the last four years, however their work at the renal unit was ground breaking! You can imagine how pleased I was to hear that their article had been accepted by this world class journal!"

Bank raid strengthens need for CCTV

THE morning after a public meeting in Culcheth had given enthusiastic support for CCTV cameras in the village centre, raiders struck at Barclay's Bank in Lodge Drive.

If the cameras had been in place they would have given a clear view of the four raiders as they reversed a car into the bank wall in a bid to break in.

Better still, say police, they would have been deterred from attacking the bank in the first place.

As it was, it was a bungled raid and the gun-toting robbers fled empty handed

But it was only the latest in a series of raids on Culcheth banks - and residents and increasingly concerned that Culcheth has become a target for big city gangs because of its proximity the motorway network.

The parish council is currently exploring the possibility of installing CCTV along Common Lane between the NatWest Bank and Barclays.

Some years ago a similar idea was dropped because of the cost. But new technology has brought down the cost - and improved the quality of the cameras.

Coun Keith Bland said: "We are getting quotations soon and we expect the cost to be much less.

Police support the idea - as did the 25 people who attended a Community Action Meeting the night before the raid.

But support will also be needed from traders in the village.

After failing to break through the bank wall, the robbers - having apparently had their getaway car. blocked in by parked cars - made off in a van from the nearby butcher's shop after forcing staff to hand over the_keys.

This van was found later in Twiss Green Lane where, it is believed, the gang transferred to a small, dark coloured car with a registration number thought to include PV03.

A number of people were threatened during the raid but, although badly shocked, none were injured.

November Tips

Spring bulb plantings



Another door closed on station plan

THE door has been closed on a possible source of funding for the re-opening of Glazebury railway station.

Sir Howard Bernstein, chief executive of Manchester City Council and clerk to Greater Manchester Passenger Transport Authority has made it clear there will be no money available for the Glazebury station proposal in funding arising from the plans for congestion charging in Manchester.

Coun Keith Bland was among local council chiefs who met Sir Howard to discuss the availability of funding for transport improvements in the

transport improvements Warrington area to help deal with the

impact of congestion charging.

They were told funding would be available for upgrades to stations such as Birchwood and Sankey.

But when Coun Bland asked Sir

Howard if funding might be available to re-open Glazebury station answer was 'no."

Sir Howard did suggest that there might be a possibility of funding from Network Rail at some time in the future when all other upgrades necessary for the congestion charging scheme had been completed.

Coun Bland said: "We have already been told by Network Rail that no money is available, so it seems unlikely that the station will re-open in the foreseeable future.

"However, as long as local people keep pressing, you never know what might happen.
