Think Pink at Culcheth High School



Many clamping companies used tactics bordering on threats and intimidation

This would now have to stop, with both clampers and landlords in danger of prosecution and large fines if they persisted.

"The people who use the shops

and restaurants in Culcheth will be

only too pleased that they will be able to use the car parks on Lodge Drive without fear of finding their car clamped or towed away," he added.

There has been a long-running controversy in Culcheth over shoppers being clamped and then being forced to pay large fines to have the clamps removed.

Shopkeepers were opposed to the clamping because they believed it was driving shoppers away from the

There is still time for anyone who wants to get involved to contact the Amateur street entertainers and



Simon's £3,000 climb for charity

A FORMER Culcheth man has raised £3,000 for charity - by climbing Mount Kilimanjaro.

Simon Kelly, a former pupil at St Lewis' Primary School, Croft, climbed Africa's highest mountain with a friend.

The 28-year-old chartered tax accountant, decided to climb the 5895m mountain after a casual chat with a friend in a London bar in April.

He prepared with several months of training in the gym, running the streets of central London, where he works, and on climbing expeditions in Snowdonia and the Lake District.

Tougher

Simon decided to climb by the Machame route which is tougher and longer than others, taking seven days and six nights, but provides an

"acclimatisation day."

This turned out to be the third day when he had to climb up to 4600m and then back down to 3900m to camp for the night!

"Climb high, sleep low," was the advice.

Simon did the climb to raise money for MacIntyre Warrington, a charity which supports adults with learning difficulties.

His mother, Pamela, said: "He had never done anything like this before and spent a lot of time in training. He has raised about £3,000 and money is still coming in."







High and was a friend of Dale. He collaborated with Dale's mother, Sharon Orr, of Winwick, who has campaigned against binge drinking since her son's death.

Alex completed a BSc (Honours)
Media Production and Technology
degree at the University of Central
Lancashire after leaving Culcheth

High.

His film is powerful docu-drama based on the events of Dale's tragic

last night out.

He said: "The film was made to help boost Sharon's anti-binge



drinking campaign and aimed to make more young people think when out drinking in the town centre. I entered 'Dale' into the Long Shot festival in an attempt to bring the film to prominence and get our message out there.

"The film, shot mostly in and around Warrington, was very difficult to make having known Dale at school."

Alex is now living in Australia with his partner, former Culcheth High School friend Taryn Lowe, who has her own hairdressing salon 'Down

Last year's inaugural Long Shot festival was won by former Culcheth media student Daniel Briney with a film largely made in Culcheth. He and Alex are due to meet up in

Putting a business plan together



New dispute over tennis floodlights

A NEW bid for the erection of floodlights around the tennis courts at Culcheth Sports Club has again triggered opposition from nearby residents, local councillors and from Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council.

Twenty nearby householders lodged objections, as did borough councillors Keith and Sue Bland (both pictured) and the parish council.

Grounds of objections were light and glare spilling from the courts into the rear windows and gardens of houses near the club and noise created by tennis players.

Last year, similar proposals were thrown out by borough planners on similar grounds.

Officers recommended the new, revised application be approved and argued that the impact of light spillage on nearby properties would be minimal.

They pointed out that noise caused by play would be no greater than at present and that there were no existing restrictions on the hours of use of the courts.

The application was due to be considered by the borough council's planning sub-committee as Culcheth Life went to press.


