Driveway plan approved

PLANNING chiefs have finally given the go-ahead for a new driveway at a house at Culcheth - even though it didn't need planning permission anyway!

The scheme involved a house in Clarke Avenue where the owner wished to provide a second access onto Culcheth Hall Drive.

He applied for planning consent even though, according to planning officers, he didn't need to do so because Culcheth Hall Drive is not a classified road. Eight neighbours objected.

Officers recommended the scheme be approved - even though no planning consent was necessary - because it would be unreasonable to refuse permission for something that didn't need permission.

Residents outraged over pupils' behaviour

PEOPLE living in one of Culcheth's most sought-after residential roads are outraged over the anti-social activities of children walking passed their homes after school.

More than 40 residents from Culcheth Hall Drive claim pupils from Culcheth High School are making their lives a misery, shouting, swearing, trampling on gardens and uprooting trees. They have written a strong letter of complaint to school governors. But other residents say their neighbours are misrepresenting the situation and have complimented the school on the behaviour of pupils generally.

They say the complaints are

"exaggerated" and likely to aggravate the situation. The issue has arisen since the new school opened.

Large numbers of pupils use a passageway between Withington Avenue and Culcheth Hall Drive as a shortcut to and from school.

One group of residents who have signed a letter of complaint to the school says the behaviour of pupils is causing serious problems.

They want the new exit from the school moving just 20-30 yards to

help disperse the number of pupils walking along Culcheth Hall Drive.

In a letter to the school, they claim youngsters walk on grass verges, damage borders and plants and throw rubbish onto gardens.

The letter complains of "excessive noise to include extreme foul language, screaming, shouting, wolf whistling and football songs being chanted by large groups of pupils."

But other residents say the behaviour of pupils in Culcheth Hall Drive is "normally excellent."

They say sometimes groups of pupils walk together and there is some banter. Occasionally, young pupils play tag around the bushes. But most walk quietly home on their own, or in small groups, chatting.

The more important issue is the safety of the children and using Culcheth Hall Drive means they do not have to walk along the main road on a narrow pavement. Sometimes

the school deploys staff in Culcheth Hall Drive - "an unnecessary use of their valuable time."

Local MP Helen Jones and Labour Party spokesperson Chris Vobe have promised to continue liaising with residents - and the High School - to resolve the problem.

In a statement, the school says the vast majority of pupils are well behaved although there are "isolated incidents of unacceptable behaviour."

The statement adds: "When incidents of bad behaviour are reported the school always carries out a full investigation and will discipline any offending student. We have had one such incident reported since the start of September."

"Alternative routes home for these students have been considered but, following a safety assessment by Warrington Borough Council, it has not been possible to make changes since the move to the new building."

Nicola's first great run!

Former Culcheth girl Nicola, aged 27, who now lives in Oakwood, took part in the Bupa Great North Run and raised more than £350 for the charity.

Her mum Judith was diagnosed with breast cancer for a second time last December but has successfully undergone treatment.

"It was the first time I have ever competed in a run but I enjoyed it so much I have put my name down again for next year," said Nicola.

Mum Judith from Culcheth, said she



would like to say a big "thank you" to her consultant Mr Sarfraz and all the staff at Warrington hospital.

Council wants time to pay for elections

CULCHETH and Glazebury Parish Council is willing to meet the cost of parish council elections - but it needs more time to raise the money.

That's the message the parish is sending to Warrington Borough Council following a demand that the parish stump up about £12,000 for next May's elections - and pay for it over two years.

Parish councillors decided to inform the borough that while they understood the parish should pay for

local elections they needed a longer lead-in time before payments started.

Cllr Keith Bland said: "We understand that we have to pay, but we have not budgeted for this - and I don't suppose other parish councils have either."

"We can't afford to pay £6,000-a-year for the next two years."

"Parish council elections are held every four years, so we have decided to tell the borough that payment be phased over four years, starting from the elections to be held in 2016."

"This will give us time to prepare. We can probably pay £2,500-a-year, but £6,000 is too much."

"We would need to increase the precept to raise £6,000-a-year and that's something we don't want to have to do."

Cllr Bland said the irony was that years ago, the parish council used to budget for parish elections but stopped doing so because the borough council never asked for the money.

Call for road safety measures

THREE local councillors are demanding road safety measures at an accident hotspot following the most recent crash.

Just two weeks after a crash barrier in Warrington Road, Culcheth was repaired, it has been damaged again by a vehicle running into it.

Now Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft councillors Keith Bland, Sue Bland and Les Hoyle are calling for urgent action.

The barrier, next to the Thai Paragon restaurant, has been damaged on numerous occasions.

Just two weeks ago, when the last repairs were completed, a chevron was placed on it as a traffic calming measure.

Cllr Keith Bland said: "Unfortunately the chevron didn't work so we are asking for some proper traffic calming to be put on the road urgently before and on the bend."

"Our concerns are that the pavement which is protected by the barrier is used by elderly people going to the shops and young families taking their children to the local school. So it is very important that this work is carried out urgently before someone receives a serious injury."

Dining Out with *Culcheth Life*

at the General Elliott

HISTORY dictates that, outwardly, the General Elliot at Croft, will always look like a typical village pub.

Inside, however, mine hosts Kirk and Anne-Marie have re-written history. For the food in the restaurant is definitely not "pub grub." This is fine dining - with a huge menu, beautifully cooked food, tastefully presented and reasonably priced. A little gem in a charming village location.

With a dozen different starters on the menu, and a couple more on the specials board, we were really spoilt for choice but eventually decided on creamed garlic mushrooms with warm toast and smoked haddock and spring onion fish cake on garlic aioli and rocket. These were delicious and set us up well for our main courses.

For these, we chose Provencale pan friend cod, with a Ratatouille crust, served with sautéed potatoes and a rocket salad, and a Thai green chicken curry - succulent pieces of chicken, garnished with baby corn and mange tout, served with jasmine rice.

These were chosen from a list of 15 meat and fish dishes, ranging from traditional favourites such as fish and chips and Cumberland sausage to crispy Chinese duck, Beef Stroganoff, grilled salmon and Thai green King Prawn curry.

Our meals were beautifully presented in sensible portions and cooked to perfection.



The General Elliot's dessert menu provides a selection of tempting items for those with an appetite for more and we chose sticky toffee pudding with honey comb ice cream and warm chocolate fudge with vanilla ice cream

We could not fault anything about

the meal and were able to choose from an extensive wine list to complement what was an extremely enjoyable evening out.

Fascinating insight into life in New Zealand

MEMBERS of Culcheth WI were given a fascinating insight into life in New Zealand at their monthly meeting at Newchurch Parish Hall.

President Lillian Houghton welcomed everyone, and thanked Jean Pizzey for the lovely roses she had given for the President's table, which were later added to the raffle.

Guest speaker Mrs Lyn Hand gave an illustrated talk of her year in New Zealand where she lived with her family on the North Island after

accepting a job exchange to work as a teacher, teaching 11-18 year olds, some of whom were Maori.

She described how she went to see the construction of a new Maori meeting house where women were not allowed in until it was finished because they were thought to bring evil spirits into the building!

She also revealed that moving house in New Zealand is to actually take your house with you, by transportation at night, to the new

location!

Some of her slides showed unusual road signs including one where drivers were offered free drinks of tea or coffee to make sure they didn't fall asleep at the wheel (this benefit being provided by the Lions Clubs). 

Game set and match to club

CULCHETH Sports Club tennis club has won a battle to erect floodlights on its four courts - two years after they were original refused permission by Warrington Borough Council.

The tennis section of Culcheth Sports Club has been given the go-ahead by an independent appeal inspector after its proposals were twice thrown out by local planning chiefs.

Nearby residents had lodged strong objections on the grounds of noise, disturbance and light pollution.

But the inspector says there will not be serious harm - and that occupiers of nearby houses should have known that a large sports club generates noise.

The club can now erect 10 flood lights, eight metres high, to illuminate its four courts.

But the inspector has ruled they must be switched off by 10pm and that the courts nearest the houses should only be used when necessary.

Houses in Paythorne Close are separated from the courts by small back gardens and a 1.8m fences. The nearest property is 7.5 metres from the courts.

Culcheth Sports Club is the largest in the north of Warrington and the tennis section is its largest single contributor to the club's finances. It also has a football pitch and bowling greens - one of which is already floodlit.

There will be some light spillage into nearby gardens which, while unwelcome, will not prevent their use for sitting out, etc.

The inspector said the club needed longer hours to enable their coaches to earn better incomes. If they could not earn enough they could go elsewhere

Sporty - but 'sensible'



EARLIER this year, the 100,000th Audi A1 rolled off the assembly line - a considerable achievement for a model only introduced in the middle of last year.

The A1 is Audi's most compact model at 3.95 metres (just under 13ft) in length but it packs a lot into the space and with its powerful engines and agile chassis is one of the sportiest cars in its sector. Yet, at the same time, among a clutch of awards it has won are two for "the most sensible car."

There's a choice of six four-cylinder engines, three TFSI engines and three TDI units. All impress with exemplary fuel economy, ranging from 39.87 to 61.90mpg.

Out of the blue – a new colour for a new car!

BLUE is the colour most drivers would choose for their car if they had a choice, closely followed by silver and black, according to a poll of nearly 16,000 AA members.

Brown, gold and yellow were the least popular colours – but these days, quite a few drivers end up with a colour that would not have been their first choice anyway.

Perhaps surprisingly, younger drivers seem to have a preference for black. One in three 18-34 year olds would pick a black car if they had a choice but only one in six actually has a black car.

Just 13 per cent of 18-34 year olds would pick a silver car, yet 22 per cent have one.

Overall, a desire for silver can be satisfied, with 22 per cent of the entire sample wanting a silver car and 25 per cent having one. The same goes for red, blue and white, although the 208 brown car owners (1 per cent) must be the most frustrated as almost no-one wants one (0.27 per cent).

Silver is the favourite of the grey-haired driver, being the number one choice of AA members aged 55-64 (23 per cent) and 65 and over (30 per cent). It is a desire they satisfy, with the highest proportion of 55-64 year olds having one (25 per cent) and also those aged 65 or more (31 per cent).

One of the attractions of silver is the

feeling that it is by far the easiest to keep clean. Some 27 per cent of survey respondents believe it is the colour that shows dirt the least. Gold, yellow, green and white cars were voted the least easy to keep clean.

When it comes to selling a car, AA members consider that there are only two clear contenders for most saleable colours: silver (28 per cent) and black (15 per cent). Once again, the youngest drivers favour black (21 per cent) but AA members aged 25 or more increasingly bet on silver to sell first.

AA president Edmund King said: "Brighter coloured cars, which have been popular in the past when the economy was more buoyant, seem to have slipped way down the league. The results show a discrepancy between desired colour of choice and actual colour of car as often the owner may not have a choice.

"For younger drivers that hanker after black cars but end up with lighter-coloured ones, there is a silver lining in that if they hang on to them they will grow to prefer them.

"Whilst blue was the colour more drivers wanted to own, silver clearly tops the league when it comes to the car colour most likely to sell quickly, most fashionable and easiest to keep clean."
