## Editor's Comment



WE have already voiced concerns over the impact of the proposed HS2 high speed rail line on Culcheth and surrounding areas – and make no excuse for raising them again.

The proposed route runs right past Culcheth, through Taylor Business Park, Culcheth Linear Park and Leigh Golf Course.

This will be the main line from

London to Glasgow and is designed for up to 18 trains per hour (almost one every three minutes) at 225 mph. Around 1000 local properties lie within 500 metres of the line and the effect on the village will be

devastating by any standards.

A major consultation on the proposed line of the route, and sustainability impacts, is now running and will end on January 31 2014. As part of the consultation 2014. As part of the consultation, the HS2 Project will hold a Road Show at Culcheth Sports Club,

Charnock Road on November, 21 from 12.00 midday to 8.00 pm. This is an opportunity for residents to talk to the HS2 staff and raise their concerns, although it will still be important for people to send a formal response to the Consultation

Frank Allen, Chair of Culcheth and District Rail Action Group (CADRAG) says there are many areas of concern - the loss of Taylor Business Park with almost 500 jobs, the loss of the Linear Park, and the noise and other environmental impacts from the trains themselves which will degrade the quality of life in the village. The disruption during construction, including big new bridges on Warrington Road, Wigshaw Lane, and Wilton Lane will have a massive adverse effect on the village and local businesses. For many people of course the major concern will be the effect on the value of their property and their

ability to sell it.

We echo those concerns and urge local residents to make their views known.

Meanwhile CADRAG aims to support local people in combatting the devastation that HS2 will cause the devastation that HS2 will cause and is raising these issues with HS2 Ltd, Warrington Borough Council and with local MP Helen Jones. They are also preparing a detailed submission to the Consultation. The support of the village is obviously crucial. 

## Councillors welcome £10,000 investment to tackle parking chaos

A £10,000 scheme to provide additional residents' parking bays in Poplar Avenue, Culcheth will be carried out during the current financial year – following a lengthy campaign by local residents and councillors.

Residents were concerned that congestion caused by on-street parking in the road could prevent ambulances and fire engines reaching the area in an emergency.

Councillors Matt Smith and Chris

Councillors Matt Smith and Chris Vobe, who took up the residents' cause with the borough council and Golden Gates Housing, are delighted with the result.

Cllr Vobe said: "Matt and I made

CIIr Vobe said: "Matt and I made the case in the strongest possible terms, and left the council and Golden Gates under no illusion that we viewed this as a top priority.

we viewed this as a top priority.

"The money has come from the Local Transport Plan — a fund which

is ring-fenced for improvements in the Eastern part of Warrington.

"I've always argued that Newchurch has not had its fair share from this allocation in the past"

Cllr Smith added: "It was simply unacceptable that residents were unable to park their cars safely, or were having to leave them on the road away from their own home because of the congestion.

"Even worse was the thought of emergency vehicles not being able to reach someone's house because of insufficient parking. The new parking bays that are now going to be installed will be a dream come true for many people in Poplar Avenue."

The two councillors sat down

with officers from the council and Golden Gates Housing to bring the two parties together after both initially refused to commit to the work.

Residents will be consulted soon about which of the grass verges should be converted to parking spaces


CULCHETH Art Group holds its annual exhibition on November 29-30 – as usual at the Jackson Avenue Day Centre.





### **Bus chiefs in partial U-turn**

BUS chiefs have performed a partial U-turn over cuts in services through the village of Glazebury, following a successful campaign by residents and two councillors.

Network Warrington have agreed to amend their proposals as "a gesture of goodwill to the people of Glazebury."

Culcheth and Glazebury

councillors Matt Smith and Chris Vobe say their campaign to restore bus services should be hailed as "a success.

They wrote to the bus company after receiving dozens of complaints

from villagers.
The 19 and 28 services had been reduced outside of peak times, with only one bus an hour running through Glazebury between 10am and 4pm, compared to the previous 15-minute service.

But after the two councillors had pointed out the changes had left villagers feeling "cut-off" company chief executive Ann Marie Slavin replied with the changes.

In a letter to the councillors she confirmed that the 28 service would be extended from Culcheth to the Forresters Arms pub, and turn around at the East Lancashire Road roundabout.

Glazebury would have two buses per hour – the 19 via Croft and Culcheth and the 28 and 28a

via Risley and Culcheth.

Cllr Smith said: "I am delighted that Network Warrington have carefully studied the concerns of residents in Glazebury and made these amendments to their recent timetable changes." timetable changes.
"The lack of adequate bus

services through Glazebury during off-peak hours represented a real inconvenience to people in our village, many of whom felt cut off and effectively 'stranded'.

"These proposals by Network Warrington will help to alleviate much of the anxiety that has been generated in recent weeks and we are grateful to the board and the chief executive for the time they

have taken to address this issue."

Vobe added: represents a great victory for people in Glazebury. The village will now have two buses per hour during the day, with the peak time service arrangements remaining as

they are.
"Local residents petitioned very effectively on this matter, and both Matt and I were determined to make the strongest possible case to rectify the reduction in service. We will continue to monitor all bus services in the village closely and encourage people to make good use of public transport whenever
