The borough's strategy, which will entually replace the Unitary eventually replace Development Plan, currently suggests housing growth should be concentrated in the inner areas and that about 10,500 new homes should be built over the next 15 years. The objectors argue that around 17,000 homes would be more appropriate and that areas such as Culcheth should provide the land. Who is right? And what do local people think?

independent An inspector,

appointed by the government, will look at the borough's proposals and the suggestions put forward by the objectors, and can recommend



amendments which the borough will then have to consider.

Opposition to housing proposals on land adjoining Doeford Close, Culcheth and off Lady Lane, Croft, leaves little doubt that most people think there are already enough houses in the area. They have the backing of local councillors.

Whether this will be enough to counter the arguments of the developers remains to be seen - but developers usually seem to be able to get their own way in the end, so we are not hopeful.

One thing is certain. The borough council must adopt a strategy eventually or it will have less power to influence future development whether we like it or not.

Villagers lose battle over camp

VILLAGERS have lost a long-running planning battle over proposals to build luxury homes on a historic military camp site in the Green Belt. Warrington Borough Council's development management committee

has approved plans for 25 four and five bedroomed houses on the former HMS Gosling site off Lady Lane, Croft.

More than 400 residents had objected and many packed into the Town Hall to hear the committee debate the issue.

But despite strong objections from local councillors Les Hoyle and Chris Yobe and from Croft Parish Council, the committee granted permission to developers Elan Real Estate.

Councillors - who had visited the site previously - were told the developer had offered £30,000 towards the cost of highway improvements near St Lewis RC Primary School and $\pounds240,000$ towards the cost of affordable housing elsewhere in the borough.

The site is said to be the last of a number of wartime military camps that

The parish argued there was no need for more housing in Croft and no sewage or gas supplies to the site, which is home to a wide variety of wildlife.

They believed there could be road safety issues arising from an unsatisfactory access to the site and that the development could lead to increased flooding in Lady Lane.

Additional housing could also exacerbate parking problems at St Lewis' School

Planning officers recommended approval and pointed out that although the site was in the Green Belt, the houses would replace existing campsite buildings, some of which were higher than the houses would be would be.

The planning consent is subject to a number of conditions, including archaeological work on the site, land remediation, landscaping and a

scheme of tree/hedge protection. After the meeting, Cllr Vobe said: "This is a shameful decision which once again shows a planning department that is content to ride roughshod over Croft. "These houses are not the kind we

need and will price the sons and daughters of local people out of the village.

"Inept council officers flew in the face of local residents' wishes, steered the meeting from beginning to end, and acted as a second voice for

Cllr Vobe said he would be seeking a meeting with the borough council's interim chief executive, asking him to investigate a lack of impartiality by planning officials.



Cllr Hoyle said: "It was a disappointing decision. Unfortunately, recent changes in national planning policy have made it more difficult for the council to refuse permission on previously developed sites."

but councillors show a united front

COUNCILLORS are showing a united development on a former wartime camp at Croft, Warrington.

(pictured) has supported calls by Labour councillor Chris Vobe for the coalition Government to intervene over the future development of the HMS Gosling site.

Planners have approved proposals by Elan Homes to build 25 four and five bedroom properties on the site.

Local residents are furious over the decision and have slammed the council's planning department for overlooking crucial details, including an infrastructure and drainage system which they believe will not support extra homés.

Cllr Vobe has called on the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport – Maria Miller MP to intervene. He has written to her to call for the existing wartime training buildings to be added to the national List of Buildings 0

Special Architectural or Historic Interest, which are overseen by English Heritage. Cllr Bland has counter-signed the letter to Mrs Miller. Cllr Vobe said:"There can be no

doubt that people in Croft are united in their desire to protect the land against this unwelcome development. Town Hall officers shamefully brushed aside the historic nature of the former HMS Gosling site in their briefing to councillors. That decision was

unguestionably wrong. "The Secretary of State has the power to add such sites to a national list of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest. This would stop the development in its tracks, and grant English Heritage the power to maintain and restore the site in the long term. I believe, as do people in Croft, that HMS Gosling fits these criteria as it remains the only surviving wartime naval training camp in this area. I am asking the Secretary of State to exercise the power she has to ensure that the wishes of nearly 400 Croft residents are placed above the developer.

The letter calls on the Secretary of State to intervene as a matter of urgency, since planning permission for the additional homes has already been granted.

Musician stunned by Me

A former Culcheth High School pupil was 'stunned' to hear that his band had been nominated for the prestigious Mercury Award.

The awards, hosted by the BBC, will be judged on November 1 and first prize is £20,000. Previous nominees have included stars such as Elbow and Adele.

James Mainwaring (pictured



below) said his jazz band Roller Trio (right), were at a celebrity bash in London when the nominations were officially announced.

He said: "We were absolutely stunned. It is amazing. After the announcement everything went crazy and we were up late doing loads of television and radio interviews."

Tenor saxist James has formed the group Roller Trio with friends Luke Wynter, guitar and Luke Reddin-Williams on drums.

The threesome picked up the prestigious Peter Whittingham Jazz Award last year - an annual award for emerging musicians - and their debut album is on the Fire label.

James says the band combines contemporary jazz and rock traditions, creating a powerful and accessible blend of conventional and experimental sounds.

experimental sounds. He says: "Our original compositions consist of beautiful evocative songs, groovy riffs, thrashy noise and electronic soundscapes creating seminal and atmospheric music."

The band earned praise from a range of critics earlier this year. The nomination means they will get major exposure in the music world. James said: "For a jazz



Extra street cleaning for Newchurch

This month brings more good news for people living in Newchurch. Your Parish Councillors have secured extra street cleaning along Hampson Avenue and Walton Road. The schedule for our local Community Maintenance Officer has been amended to include these roads, giving the area the extra attention needed to stamp out litter.

"Love Where You Live"

The Parish Council is backing the "Love Where You Live" campaign. Warrington Borough Council is working with Keep Britain Tidy on this scheme, which sets out to make our town a cleaner, greener place. The Parish Council has given an enthusiastic OK for the scheme to be implemented in Culcheth and Glazebury, to help combat littering, dog fouling and fly tipping. "Love Where You Live" has been a great success in other areas of Warrington, so we are delighted that it's coming to the villages at last. We hope that it will make a real impact over the coming months. In the meantime, if there are areas that you think would benefit from special attention, just get in touch with your one of your local Parish Councillors and let us know.

Risley Landfill Site Update

Many residents will have received letters concerning the recent request for a further extension to restore Risley Tip. We are concerned and unhappy that the restoration is taking so long, but we have obtained assurances that these new applications are not about waste disposal - that finished last October. The new proposals come with a condition that was secured by Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council; specifically, that no lorries using the site come through the village. In our discussions with the planners, we are maintaining that we want the site finished restored to a high standard as soon as possible.

Local Plan Core Strategy

In June, we told you about the consultation on the Local Plan Core Strategy. Since then, the strategy has been submitted to the Secretary of State for an independent examination. You can follow the progress being made from Warrington Borough Council's website. The Parish Council have made sure that your views have been fed in, and have also examined the plans of neighbouring councils like Wigan for any effect they may have on us.

And finally... Victorian Day/ **Christmas Lights**

The Parish Council will be giving its full support to Victorian Day this year and have committed to donating money for a free children's ride. The new Parish Council are also pleased to guarantee that, this year, the Christmas lights in the centre of the village will be switched on that day. We want to help make Victorian Day a real treat for local families and ensure it is a great start to the festive season.

World's first plug-in hybrid SUV

MITSUBISHI are hailing their new Outlander PHEV as the world's first plug-in hybrid SUV.

It offers the best of three worlds - the environmental performance of an electric vehicle (EV), the cruising range of a conventional internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicle, and the on and off road performance of an SUV.

Using the plug-in hybrid EV system powertrain developed by Mitsubishi and derived from its line-up of all-electric models, the vehicle is due to be available some time next year. The

PHEV however, based on the Outlander, which made its debut in Russia in July and is which being introduced in other European markets around now.

It uses electrical power stored in the drive battery by charging either at home, a charging station or when the

system recovers energy when decelerating. It aims to achieve more than 61km per litre and a cruising range in excess of 880 km, which is on a par with a conventional ICE-powered car.
